Gentlemen:

We are pleased to submit this report on the acceptors' audit we conducted in four randomly selected clinics of the Family Planning Organization of the Philippines (FPOP). This audit was conducted in accordance with Task Order No. 492-332-03 dated April 16, 1973.

As agreed, only acceptors registered in 1972 by USAID - assisted clinics which were operating in Luzon as of December 31, 1971 were verified. The audit was conducted to give the Commission on Population and the USAID some indication on the validity of reports on new acceptors issued by family planning clinics in 1972.

Because of the limited number of clinics audited, the survey has been largely exploratory and provides indications rather than conclusions on the operations of these clinics. The results of this survey, therefore, should not be taken as a final evaluation of the performance of FPOP. A more comprehensive survey should be undertaken from which conclusions on the operations of FPOP clinics may be derived.

We thank the staff of the four clinics of the Family Planning Organization of the Philippines for their cooperation which greatly facilitated our work. We shall be glad to discuss with you any question you may have about this report.

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SCOPE AND METHODOLOGY

The scope and methodology of the study were agreed upon among POPCOM, USAID, and SGV.

Sample Size of Clinics and Acceptors

The number of FPOP clinics and the total number of acceptors audited were limited because of financial and time constraints. Four USAID-assisted FPOP clinics were randomly selected, in each of which 50 acceptors, also chosen at random, were verified. A sample size of 200 is considered sufficient to generalize on the acceptors of an institution participating in the family planning program.

A more detailed explanation of the sample design was submitted to POPCOM and USAID before the start of the audit.

Selection of Clinics

The four FPOP clinics audited were selected using a table of random numbers from a list of USAID-assisted agroindustrial and city health office family planning clinics existing as of December 31, 1971 and assumed to be in full operation in 1972.

Selection of Samples

In each of the four clinics, 50 acceptors were randomly selected for interview from a list of acceptors who were registered in calendar year 1972 according to the clinic logbooks.

The names of the sample members were tabulated in numerical sequence (based on their ID numbers) instead of in the sequence in which they were drawn. This facilitated checking for duplication and assembly of the list of reported acceptors for interview.

Selection of Replacements

To ensure that the sample size is maintained, the selection of replacements through the same procedure as the selection of the original sample members was prescribed for any of the following reasons:

1. If the selected acceptor's residence is in such a remote area that she can be reached for an interview only with extreme difficulty and inconvenience on the interviewer's part.

2. If the selected acceptor has moved to another location and her new address is not known or is quite far from the area covered by the interviewer.
3. If the selected acceptor's residence is not available from the clinic or if the address is so vague that locating it would be quite impractical.
4. If the selected acceptor is away and is not expected to be back within the duration of the survey.
5. If the selected acceptor cannot be reached for an interview for any other reason.

Status of Acceptors

The following terms are used in this report to indicate the status of acceptors as of interview date:

1. Continuing acceptor: one who was practicing birth control at the time of the interview and who had affirmed that she was registered at the clinic being audited as a family planning acceptor.
2. Dropout: one who registered at the clinic as a family planning acceptor but who was verified to have permanently or temporarily stopped practicing birth control.
3. Nonuser: one who denied having been registered as a family planning acceptor and using any of the birth control methods or one who admitted having been registered but had not been able to practice birth control for one reason or another.
4. Not located: one who did not live in the address given and who was not known in the neighborhood or one whose given address was nonexistent and who could not be located with reasonable effort.
5. Subfertility: one who went to the clinic for assistance in having children rather than for family planning purposes.
6. Acceptor elsewhere: one who admitted practicing or having practiced birth control either on her own or under the supervision of another clinic or of a private physician but who denied having been registered as an acceptor in the clinic being audited.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Four FPOP clinics, two in Laguna and one each in Rizal and Benguet provinces, were selected for verification. The interviews were undertaken by SGV & Co. staff members.

The five cases listed as nonusers denied ever having practiced birth control. However, three of these admitted having received pills or condoms on the day that they were registered at the clinic but were not

able to use the contraceptives received for one reason or another. The other two denied receiving any contraceptives on the dates they were recorded as acceptors although one claimed she received her first pack of pills only recently but has not yet taken any of it..

The four classified as acceptors elsewhere from the Benguet Consolidated, Inc. Family Planning Clinic claimed that they learned rhythm from another family planning agency. Two of these admitted having received pills from the clinic but were not able to consume any.

One of the two cases classified as acceptors elsewhere from the San Pablo CHO was formerly registered at another family planning clinic; she transferred to the San Pablo clinic only in April 1973. The other case classified as an acceptor elsewhere was practicing birth control on her own.

One acceptor was classified as a subfertility case because she claimed that she went to the clinic for assistance in having children rather than for help in birth control.

The nine cases classified as not located were reported acceptors who were not known in the given addresses nor in the neighborhood. Before classifying an acceptor as not located, we generally enlist the help of the clinic staff and/or the barrio captains in determining the acceptor's whereabouts.

A review of the clinic records of these nine unlocated cases showed that five visited the clinic only at the time of registration and the rest made more than one visit. Seven of these cases stopped visiting the clinic more than a year ago and the remaining two, more than three months before interview date.

Thirty-six or 73% of 49 dropouts discontinued contraception within three months from date of acceptance. Eleven of them (mostly in San Pablo CHO) did not continue beyond the month of acceptance.

Conclusion

Overall results indicate that the acceptor reports issued by the family planning clinics of FPOP are sufficiently reliable. Of the 200 reported acceptors in the sample, 179 or 89.5% were confirmed acceptors. Five reported acceptors or 2.5% of the sample denied having practiced birth control, although four of them admitted having received pills or condoms from the clinics but not having used them. Six reported acceptors or 3% of the sample denied having registered with these clinics in 1972, although they admitted practicing birth control on their own or under the supervision of other clinics. Nine reported acceptors or 4.5% of the sample could not be located because they were not known in their reported addresses nor in the neighborhood.

In evaluating the results of the survey, we submit for consideration some possibilities which can explain the status of the "unconfirmed" acceptors. Acceptors who could not be located might be fictitious acceptors; on the other hand, they may well be legitimate acceptors who merely wish to hide their identities or addresses. Those classified as nonusers may in fact be nonusers who have never registered as acceptors; however, they could also be valid acceptors who, for some reason, may not have wanted to admit that they were practicing birth control.

DETAILED FINDINGS AND OBSERVATIONS

The results of our interviews conducted from May 9 to 12, 1973 with randomly selected acceptors of the Benguet Consolidated, Inc. Family Planning Clinic are summarized below. Our detailed findings are discussed in the accompanying schedule.

Of the 50 acceptors constituting the sample, 30 were confirmed as acceptors, 3 were classified as nonusers, 3 were classified as acceptors elsewhere, 2 could not be located, and 12 were replaced in accordance with the prescribed rules for replacements.

Eleven of the 12 replacements were confirmed as acceptors, the other replacement was classified as an acceptor elsewhere bringing the total number of confirmed acceptors to 41 and the acceptors elsewhere to 4.

The nonusers, and the reasons for classifying them as such are given below:

1. Julio Carcha (ID #05-08-167-329): claimed that he first got condoms from the clinic in October 1972 and not in April 1972, his acceptance date per clinic record; at that time did not know that his wife was already pregnant so that he was not able to use the condoms.

2. Arturo Malong (ID #05-08-167-546): claimed that he was home-visited by a motivator and given condoms; did not use them as it was against his religion; has no intention of practicing family planning.
3. Benita Kesofen (ID #05-08-167-679): claimed that she went to the clinic for IUD insertion but was told by the clinic doctor to ask for her husband's approval; did not go back to the clinic and is not practicing birth control; listed as a condom user but denied having received condoms.

The circumstances supporting the classification of four acceptors as acceptors elsewhere are presented below:

1. Teresita Lazaro (ID #05-08-167-648): listed as rhythm acceptor but claimed she learned rhythm from another family planning agency, the Asian Social Institute (ASI), and had been practicing it even before alleged acceptance at clinic; recalled having been called upon to give some information in a lecture sponsored by the clinic.
2. Remedios Serrano (ID #05-08-167-669): denied having gone to the clinic to register as a family planning acceptor; claimed to have learned the rhythm method from somebody from ASI who home-visits her.
3. Peregrina Castañeda (ID #05-08-167-203): claimed that she attended a lecture given by the clinic and received a pack of pills but was not able to use them; instead, practiced rhythm which she learned from another organization.
4. Mercedes Labsan (ID #05-08-167-257): claimed that she learned rhythm from another family planning agency; visited the clinic once to consult about bad feeling which she attributed to the practice of rhythm; was given pills but did not consume any.

Two acceptors, Angelina Dulawen (ID #05-08-167-650) and Ereka Halog (ID #05-08-167-247), could not be located in their given addresses and were not known in the neighborhood.

A review of the clinic records of these two showed that their last recorded visits to the clinic were more than a year ago. Ereka Halog made more than one visit while Angelina Dulawen visited the clinic only on her acceptance date.

Our other findings and observations during the survey which may be of interest are presented on the next page.

1. Of the 41 confirmed acceptors, 32 were found to be continuing and 9 were classified as dropouts. These dropouts gave various reasons for discontinuing family planning but all except two indicated intentions to resume the practice.
2. A distribution of the 41 confirmed acceptors according to method used shows a predominance of pill-users.

Ten acceptors had switched methods since their acceptance at the clinic.

3. Of the 41 confirmed acceptors, 9 have become pregnant since they became acceptors of the clinic. Except for one, all pregnancies occurred after the acceptors dropped out for one reason or another. One attributed her pregnancy to a "failure" of her method, a combination of condom and rhythm.
4. As a matter of policy, the clinic does not collect any fees. However, it started soliciting voluntary contributions from acceptors in February 1973.
5. The clinic has been participating in the family planning program since December 1971. Its operations have covered the areas of Acupan, Antamok, and Bobok. However, in October 1972, Antamok was assigned a new ID number (05-08-189), making it a new and separate clinic. Upon reviewing the clinic logbook of Antamok, we found out that on March 13, 1973, acceptors residing in Antamok and registered in the Acupan clinic were assigned ID numbers for Antamok. Therefore, 13 among the 41 confirmed acceptors have two ID numbers each, one for Acupan and another for Antamok.
6. Based on our discussions with the clinic staff, the physician went on leave from January to April 1973 so that acceptors during this period were not given the standard examinations prior to registration with the clinic.

Of the 50 acceptors constituting the sample, 46 were confirmed as acceptors, one could not be located, 3 were replaced either because they had transferred residence and their specific addresses were not known or they were out of town for the duration of the survey. All of the three replacements were confirmed as acceptors.

The only reported acceptor who could not be located was Anita Flores (ID #05-20-147-104). She was not known in the address given nor to the people in the neighborhood. A review of her clinic records showed that she visited the clinic more than once and her last recorded visit was more than three months ago.

The following are our other significant findings:

1. Among the 49 confirmed acceptors, 36 were continuing acceptors and 13 were classified as dropouts. The reasons given for their dropping out are as follows:

Except for one, all of the dropouts indicated an intention to continue the practice of contraception. Eleven of them were either pregnant at the time of interview or had just given birth. Two others became pregnant after their acceptance at the clinic but resumed birth control after giving birth.

- The distribution of the 49 confirmed acceptors according to the contraceptive method last used shows a predominance of pill users.

Nineteen acceptors in the sample had switched contraceptive methods.

- Generally, the clinic does not solicit donations of any kind from acceptors.
- Two random numbers drawn from the sample belong to the same acceptor, Amelia Bautista. The ID numbers corresponding to the random numbers are #05-20-147-069 and #05-20-147-073. According to the clinic staff, the reason for this is that the acceptor dropped out but returned later and was assigned a new ID number.

Presented below are the results of our interviews conducted from May 30 to June 3, 1973 with randomly selected acceptors of the Franklin Baker Company clinic in San Pablo City. Our detailed findings are shown in the accompanying schedule.

Of the 50 acceptors constituting the sample, 40 were confirmed as acceptors, 1 was classified as a subfertility case, and 9 were replaced in conformity with the rules for replacements.

All 9 replacements interviewed confirmed that they were acceptors of the clinic, bringing the total number of confirmed acceptors to 49.

The only case classified as subfertility was Raymunda Rubico (ID #05-23-116-446). She is 37 years old and has no child. She claimed that she went to the clinic to consult on her chances of bearing children. She was given pills and took them for three months. When interviewed, Mrs. Rubico was five months pregnant.

Our other findings and observations during the survey are as follows:

1. Of the 49 confirmed acceptors, 43 were found to be continuing and 6 were considered as dropouts. Various reasons were given for discontinuing contraception.

All six dropouts were pregnant when interviewed but they indicated their desire to practice contraception after giving

birth although some of them may switch to another method. Two more acceptors became pregnant once after acceptance but they resumed contraception after delivery.

2. Grouped according to the method of contraception last used, the 49 confirmed acceptors are distributed as follows:

Of the 50 acceptors constituting the sample, 33 were confirmed as acceptors, 2 were considered as nonusers, one was verified as an acceptor elsewhere, 6 could not be located, and 8 were replaced in accordance with the prescribed rules for replacements. Of the 8 replacements, 7 were confirmed as acceptors and one was considered an acceptor elsewhere, bringing the total number of confirmed acceptors to 40 and acceptors elsewhere to 2.

The two nonusers and the reasons for their being classified as such are as follows:

1. Helen Kalaw (ID #05-23-081-430): reported by clinic as using pills; denied having visited the clinic in 1972 for family planning purposes or ever having practiced family planning; claimed she got her first supply of pills only in July 1973 when a clinic staff home-visited her; has not taken any of the pills pending further instructions on how to use them.

- 2. Victoria Raymundo (ID #05-23-081-438): reported by clinic as using pills; denied having practiced birth control; claimed she received pills from a clinic midwife but she never took them as she had already reached menopause; midwife was aware of her having reached such stage.

The two acceptors elsewhere and the reasons for their being classified as such are as follows:

- 1. Elena Mantopan (ID #05-23-081-440): reported by clinic as using foam; denied having registered at the clinic; at one instance, had somebody buy foam tablets for her from the clinic; practicing family planning on her own.
- 2. Gloria Dialino (ID #05-23-081-678): reported by clinic as using pills; denied having been an acceptor of the clinic in 1972 as she was then registered at another clinic; transferred to and received pills from the clinic in April 1973.

The six acceptors classified as not located were not known in the addresses given nor to the people in the neighborhood. A review of their clinic records showed that of their last recorded visits, five were more than a year ago; the other acceptor stopped visiting the clinic more than eight months ago. The records also show that four of the acceptors not located visited the clinic only on their acceptance date; the other two made more than one visit.

Our other findings and observations during the survey which may be of interest are discussed below:

- 1. Of the 40 confirmed acceptors, 19 were found to be continuing and 21 were classified as dropouts. These dropouts gave the following reasons for discontinuing the practice of contraception:

Of the 40 confirmed acceptors, eight had switched methods once after acceptance while two had switched methods twice.

3. Twelve of the confirmed acceptors became pregnant once after acceptance at the clinic. Eleven of these pregnancies resulted from dropping out while one resulted from the irregular use of the rhythm method.
4. For contraceptives given, acceptors are asked to give an amount ranging from ₱0.50 to ₱5.00 depending on the acceptor's financial capabilities.
5. Generally, the clinic registers an acceptor only after verifying from the acceptor that she has her menstruation at the time of her visit. Otherwise, the acceptor is given pills to induce menstruation and requested to return when her menstruation comes.
