

FOREWORD and ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

During the last two decades, non-governmental organizations (NGOs) in developing countries have played an increasingly important role in helping their countries define and address critical public policy issues — including not only the more traditional development sectors but also those sectors which impact on the environment and resource management. Since 1986 the focus of Island Resources Foundation's NGO Institutional Development Program has been those non-governmental organizations in the Eastern Caribbean whose programs deal exclusively or in part with conservation and resource management.

As part of this Program, in 1991 the Foundation published a *Directory of Environmental NGOs in the Eastern Caribbean*. This document was designed to facilitate the involvement of environmental NGOs in the development process by increasing their visibility to donor organizations and technical assistance agencies working in the Caribbean. The current publication is an updated and revised version of the 1991 Directory.

While the non-governmental organizations listed in the Directory all have an interest in the environment, the level of their involvement and their focus on specific issues differ widely. Some organizations are quasi-governmental in that their boards and official mandates were established by legislative authority (e.g., the national trusts), but these groups function in the private sector and are membership-based, and have therefore been included. We have generally focused on organizations that are non-governmental, non-profit, non-partisan, and show evidence of some kind of environmental agenda. Most groups are membership-based, and our geographic locus is the English-speaking islands of the Eastern Caribbean.

All NGOs which were listed in the 1991 Directory and are still active in environmental work were requested to provide updated information for the 1995 edition. Environmental groups not organized in 1991 but now active in the Eastern Caribbean were also contacted. In a few cases, NGOs did not respond to requests for information, and when this occurred, the information used in the 1995 Directory may be somewhat dated or the organization may not be listed at all in the revised Directory. We apologize for any oversights, although every reasonable effort was made to obtain full and accurate data.

Information for the Directory was compiled by Island Resources Foundation, with additional assistance provided by the Environmental Awareness Group of Antigua. Island Resources Foundation's participation in this project was made possible, in part, under a Cooperative Agreement with the U.S. Agency for International Development (Cooperative Agreement No. OTR-0158-A-00-9161-00),

and with the support of a grant from the Jackson Hole Preserve. Additional funding for republication has been generously provided by the Natural Resources Management Unit of the Organization of Eastern Caribbean States, and its ENCORE Project, which is funded by USAID and receives technical support from the World Wildlife Fund-US.
