I) SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work for this study was to:

-find the names, addresses and information about all non-government organizations (NGOs) and community based organizations (CBOs) in the NWFP

-locate this information by interviewing knowledgeable people, visiting government and NGO offices, libraries, documentation and resource centres

-prepare a report and directory of all NGOs and CBOs discovered and provide some analysis

-The purpose of this study was to create an information starting base on NGOs/CBOs in the NWFP. From this base more research can be done to identify NGOs and CBOs that could be interested to set up community-based girls' schools especially in rural areas of NWFP.

III) METHODOLOGY:

The approach this study took was to build on existing information. This meant using mainly two directories published in 1993 by Coverdale Inc., which closed in 1994. The Coverdale Directory of Umbrella Groups and Projects in NWFP (**Annex 10**) was used to contact umbrella groups to identify their "village organizations". Names and numbers of NGOs/CBOs collected from government, are in addition to those in the Coverdale Directory of NGOs in NWFP (**Annex 11**). Other sources listed are from individual contacts. As time was short, all information was collected by telephone or in meetings with main contacts.

IV) WHO'S WHO:

a) Government and Government Registration:

There are five separate Acts or sets of law under which non-profit organizations may register in the NWFP. Each of these are administered by a different Ministry or department within government. The five are:

i) Directorate of Social Welfare (DSW)

In NWFP, the department most relevant to this study is the Directorate of Social Welfare (DSW), which administers the Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies Registration and Control Ordinance of 1961. Eight hundred thirty (830) such "social welfare" groups are registered. These range from the Association for the Blind (Peshawar) to an orphanage in Abbottabad, to the Muslim Womens' Social Welfare Society of Mardan.

However, the number 830 is a little misleading: this is the number that have registered since the DSW began 35 years ago. None have been de-registered and the number just keeps piling up. DSW has no way of knowing for sure how many of these still actually exist, or if they are active. DSW guesses that 400 to 500 are active, with 150 being "very active". The DSW does have rules about reporting annually but few report: why so little is known.

In 1993, Coverdale sent out questionnaires to 900 organizations whose addresses were supplied mainly by the DSW. Of these, 233 replied. These responses were entered into a computer data base and published in the form of a "Directory of Local NGOs, North West Frontier Province", (December 1993).

The data base has been retained in Peshawar but not obtained for this study as it contains only the same information as is in the directory. (For the record: Coverdale gave copies of the data base on diskette to SPO and US/AID. As the US/AID office is closing, this set of diskettes has been handed to the Special Development Unit, PE&D, Masood Khan Bangash.)

For the current study DSW provided a list of all the NGOs registering since July 1992 to July 1994. (**Annex 1**). This is 162 NGOs, only 6 of which are listed in the Coverdale directory.

-DSW has 28 Social Welfare Officers (**Annex 3**) in all the districts and agencies of NWFP. Their main responsibility is to develop community based activities and encourage NGOs, especially in such activities as literacy, adult education centres and the rehabilitation of disabled children.

-To register under this Act, applicants must provide a completed application form, the bylaws of organization and an address. Main office bearers must have their designation stamps. The organization is required to keep minutes and cash books and bank only at registered banks.

-The DSW gives token grants. When an organization is granted funds it is required to file annual progress reports, audited financial statements and submit to inspection by the local DSW office. About 120 organizations have been getting grants and these are the only ones reporting annually.

-According to DSW, NGOs/CBOs also may be in contact with and get some assistance from other branches of government such as PE&D, Youth and Culture, Womens' Development, Narcotics, Population Welfare, Local Government, Health, etc. but to get government assistance each NGO/CBO is supposed to be registered with government. These NGOs/CBOs would be repeats of those listed with DSW and the Department of Industries.

ii) Department of Industries:

Non-profit agencies may also register with the Department of Industries, which administers the Societies Registration Act of 1860. Again, the number registered -2,531- is misleading as this is the number that has registered from the very beginning over 130 years ago. For the current study, a list of 178 societies was provided: all those registering between January 1990 and July 1994. (**Annex 3**).

From this list, we can see these organizations are in the arts, agriculture, science, youth, religion, health, business, as well as some social welfare groups. Those registered range from the People's Poultry Association, to the Pakistan Railway Contractors; the NWFP Football Association to the Kalash Environmental Protection Society; the Thal Welfare Society to Save the Children Pakistan.

Judging by names only, of the 178 listed, approximately 59 are "welfare" or "development" oriented. None of these are listed in the Coverdale directory. It is impossible to know which are actually community-based.

To register under this Act, applicants are required to submit the usual kinds of information; name, address, names of office bearers, objectives, etc. Once registered, NGOs are required to submit annual reports but few do and there is no monitoring. Unlike the Directorate of Social Welfare, Industries has no staff in the field. No checking is done on the organizations that register. None have been de-registered.

Other Government Departments Registering NGOs:

- iii) Cooperatives register with the Cooperatives Department. It is estimated that about 3,000 co-ops are active. Almost all are agricultural co-ops, dealing in credit for inputs, for commercial and self, not community benefit. Not contacted for this study.
- iv) Non-profit companies register with the Registrar of Joint Stock Companies (Companies Ordinance of 1984), Government of Pakistan. Only 10 are listed, one being Sarhad Rural Support Corporation. (Opposite PIA Building, Peshawar Cantt. Director: Moh'd Sadiq Khan, tel: 271560)
- v) Trusts fall under the jurisdiction of the Trust Act of 1882 and Charitable Endowment Act of 1890. Information filed on trusts is confidential, therefore inaccessible to this study.

b) Umbrella Groups

In the NWFP, a number of larger organizations exist, each of which are associated with smaller ones. The large organizations are non-government, government or semi/quasi government organizations. The small organizations are "village organizations (VOs)", or groups of one kind or another in villages. Due to confusion in terminology about "community based organizations" (see page 16), this study concentrated on locating the more specific "village organizations". Following are what is believed to be all the umbrella groups operating now and the VOs with which they work:

IRDP encourages VOs to convert to NGOs, registering with the Directorate of Social Welfare (DSW). One unusual activity of this IRDP, is their work with jirgas. Five now operate as village organizations and one has become so motivated, it has formed five other VOs and registered itself as an NGO with the DSW. IRDP says this jirga registration as an NGO is a first in the history of NWFP.

IV) Notes to Above:**a) Terminology**

During this study, it was shown how confused the terminology has become. Often "NGO" and "CBO" are used as if they are synonymous, which indeed they may be in some cases. An NGO can be community-based and visa versa. But just as often, top-down

welfare groups are being called "community based". Lots of questions arise about when an NGO is community-based or not.

Further research will need to be more specific about identifying the kinds of organizations it wishes to find. If the idea is to locate self-help, truly grass-roots groups you may wish to ask for "village organizations" (why this study emphasized at least getting the numbers of these). There does seem to be more common understanding about what village organizations are although the terminology also varies: Village Development Committees (VDCs); Village Development Organizations (VDOs).

b) Lists of Village Organizations

All of the umbrella groups contacted agreed to provide their lists of village organizations. Each was contacted two or three times but some did not follow through doing so. These groups need to be contacted again: AKRSP, Malakand Social Forestry, Mansera Village Support Programme and Sungi Foundation (which sent a newsletter and latest annual report but not a list of VOs).

c) Possible Follow-Up

1. Survey the 215 NGOs most recently registered with DSW and Industries (lists provided) to ascertain interests and activity
2. Contact the 153 NGOs in Coverdale directory which say they work in education.
3. Get more information about the village organizations:

Some of these villages and VOs will already have girls schools. How many? Which ones? If lists of VOs had been provided by each umbrella group, it might have been possible to identify which already have functioning girls' schools. Refer to such studies as the Ministry's Human Resource Survey (of 8,000 village schools), the Aga Khan Education NGO in Chitral, etc.

4. Identify and prioritize districts and tehsils and contract studies to be done there, like those done by Khwendo Kor and SPO which contact the jirga first. If the objective is to locate the real authorities in a village who can solicit wider participation and village commitment to form any kind of Village Education Committee, the Jirga may still be the closest thing there is to a real "community-based organization". Members may not be elected, they may not be what we think of as an organization with continuity but there usually is no other greater authority in a village.

These centres were opened on the request of villagers where there are no education facilities available for female population and the villagers are willing to provide a room & a minimum 5th class passed girls as tutor for a reasonable salary.

To implement the approach & ensure participation of local people in the Dev. process VDF sector is supporting local

people in formation of community based organization i.e.
Village Organization (VOs) & now women organization (W.O).

There are 111 VOs & WOs out of 115 villages in the area.

STRATEGY FOR HOME TUITION CENTRES

Introduction

After realizing the enormous lack of female educational facilities, 1988 KIDP opened on trial basis two Girls Home Tuition Centres (HTCs) in Kalam Tensil. Thanks the continuously increasing interest of the population in female education, during the following six years many more HTCs could be opened and some were closed for reasons of different nature. Nowadays VDP runs 23 HTCs out of which two are for adult women.

Since September 1992 KIDP and the Education Department are working together on the conversion of the HTCs into government schools. For the coming time both parties aim at converting HTCs every year. Nowadays in seven villages where HTCs are established, the Education Department has constructed girls schools, while the students of two HTCs have already been admitted in the government schools existing in the village upon provision of certificates by KIDP (see annexes). Efforts are made to get employed the concerned matriculated tutors by the Education Department. In the meanwhile KIDP subsidize their PTC in service training. In order to ensure a smooth transition of the HTCs from the project to the government, the supervision of the new govt. girls schools will stay for at least one year with KIDP.

Many applications for new HTCs still come to KIDP. This is a sign of a big and positive change of attitude towards female education. Nevertheless according to the present policy and because of the idea of phasing out of this activity, KIDP does not have for the moment any provision for the establishment of new HTCs. Seeing the big interest of the locals in female education, the possibility of a policy revision could be considered.

Objectives

As the name partly indicates, the HTCs are primary girls schools which, in order to respect the purdah traditions of the area and to allow at the same time the attendance of girls students, are based in private houses.

Through this particular activity in the education sector KIDP aims at:

- raising the literacy rate of the female population of the project area;
- increasing the awareness among local people on the importance of female education;

- promoting equality of chances for the female population in their access to educational facilities in or outside the project area;
- improving the quality of life of the female folk of the project area through raised awareness on their potentials, and on health, hygiene and environment issues;
- increasing the confidence between KIDP and the local people on issues related to the development of women by using the HTC as nucleus for women activities;
- promoting professional training of local female teachers and enhancing in this way the quality of teaching;
- supporting the employment of local qualified women as teachers by the Education Department;
- ensuring continuity of the HTCs educational programme through conversion of them into government or private schools.
- ensuring continuity of the women activities in the village after conversion of the HTCs into government schools by utilizing the HTC facilities for a female community centre.

Procedure

a) Establishment of new HTCs

In its HTCs approach KIDP gives priority to the most deserved communities in which no facilities for female education are available.

- conditions

Once received a request by the villagers for a HTC the female staff of the Women Programme has to make sure that the following conditions are fulfilled:

- * no girls school is available in the village;
- * there is an educated woman with the level of min. 5th class passed and not younger than 16 who is accepted by the community, is willing and capable to work as tutor (an examination to check her knowledge and ability will be carried out by the WID staff);
- * the villagers are willing to provide free of costs a suitable room to be used as classroom;

* min. 10 girls living in the neighbourhood are interested in getting primary education.

- admission of students

For the admission priority is given to girls who have no access to any government school. The admission takes place once a year, after the yearly examinations.

The students have to pay admission and monthly fees (Rs. 5 and 2 respectively). Each tutor has to keep an accurate record of any income and expenses for the HTC and to show it to any parent or HTC Supervisor who asks for it.

- material

KIDP will provide only once books and teaching material to the students and tutors. The students have to pay 30% of the prices of the books. The furniture of the classroom (i.e. blackboard, chair, table mats, stove and samovar) is given by the project. The tutor and the students have to pay 15% each of its price. If the furniture has to be provided a second time the tutor only has to pay 30% of its price.

With the HTCs funds collected through admission and monthly fees the tutors have to buy chalks and any other material necessary for the HTC.

- latrines

In order to contribute to an increased awareness on hygiene and sanitation issues, VDP will assist in the construction of latrines for the HTCs according to its PVI's policy. The owner of the house in which the HTC has been established will contribute 25% of the total costs in cash before the begin of the construction.

- tutors

The tutor has to teach daily for 4 hours according to the rules and regulations and to the syllabus. In case the number of students is more than 25 and the tutor's qualification is at least 8th class, two sessions of 3 hours each will be run.

The salary of the tutor is paid by the project according to the tutor's qualification. If the tutor is running two sessions, she will get more salary. The amount is fixed by KIDP. Rs. 400 out of the salary have to be paid by the tutor to a private teacher in order to improve her own educational standard. The tutor who appears in matric or FA examinations

is eligible for scholarship by KIDP for books and examinations fees. To enhance the teaching capacity of the tutors internal and external training will be facilitated by the concerned WID staff. Scholarships will also be provided for PTC and CT in service training.

- examinations

Yearly examinations of the students are prepared and given by the two HTC Supervisors, who visit 2 to 3 times a month the HTCs. During their visits the educational level of the students will be regularly assessed.

- mothers and fathers days

In order to ensure the communication between the families of the students, the tutors and the project, mothers and/or fathers days will take place once a year.

b) Conversion of HTCs into govt. or private schools

For reasons of sustainability of the programme it is suitable that the HTCs will be converted into govt. or private schools and the tutors will be employed as teachers. Though the cooperation started in 1992 with the Education Department is promising, efforts have still to be made to ensure the continuity of the education programme of the HTCs. The possibility of privatization of the HTCs has to be explored.

c) Cooperation with the Health Department

Because of the bad health conditions of the inhabitants of the project area primarily due to lack of knowledge about preventive health care and hygiene, there is scope for cooperation with the Health Department by training the tutors in primary health care and in giving vaccination for the six most important preventable diseases. On this way the particular role of the tutors in the community will be utilized to reach women and children with health related messages.

d) The HTCs as nucleus for WID activities

Since the idea of female education through HTCs is quite well accepted and confidence in this regard is already built

among the local people, it is suitable to use the HTC as nucleus for other women activities like extension of agriculture and health messages, income generation and establishment of women organizations. These activities should continue also after conversion of the HTC into govt. or private school.





STRATEGY FOR LOCAL INSTITUTION BUILDING

INTRODUCTION:

On the premise that self sustaining institutions, i.e. the organizations of individuals into a decentralised broad based homogeneous interest groups at local level are the essential key elements towards a sustainable development, the development philosophy of KIDP is based on the principle of involving local communities in the whole development process i.e. from needs assesment, to ranking priorities, planning, implementation and maintenance of any village development activity.

To implement this approach to ensure the participation of local people in the development process, the VDP sector in collaboration with other sectors of the project, is supporting local people in formation/strengthening of community based organizations i.e. Village organizations (V.O) who represent the people in the area and to whom the whole development process can be transferred in the future.

The need to support people in this activity is felt because of disintegration and weaknesses of local level traditional institutions and non emergence of new development oriented organizations. The Govt. agencies and community representatives who have an important role to play in the development process, while the existing jirga system which is more effective in setting aside the major disputes at village level, could not be better substitutes for local participatory development oriented institutions, because the better management of local environment for a sustainable development requires the participation and better integration of all the actors i.e. the Govt., agencies, community representatives and community organizations.

OBJECTIVE:

There has always been a need to increase awareness among people to create and strengthen local level, village development oriented organizations, who can fillup the vacuum created due to weaknesses and disintegration of the traditional village institutions. These organizations are not parallel structures to the Govt. institutions and community representatives but are built upon the existing traditional village institutions, and are able to supplement and contribute to the efficiency of the Govt. agencies and community representatives. These are permanent structures at village level where the people from all walks of life i.e. poor depressed & ignored segments of the population are represented in the decision making (Jirga system in the area) and are capable to;

- > manage common assets in a productive and sustainable manner
- > ensure better micro level planning through participation of all segments of the society. The tested techniques of Participatory Rural Appraisal(PRA) could be used for village level planning (A shift from centralised to decentralised approach).
- > create an atmosphere which ensures an easy approach to reach the poor and needy people through an effective, cost efficient and democratic mechanism
- > assess and mobilise resources for local development on a continuing basis
- > create a social consensus on development issues
- > increase their bargaining power to draw down the external support into their villages, AND.
- > improve their internal coordination by developing a net work of community organizations.

To reach this objective, the over all aim of the VDP sector is;

TO STRENGTHEN COLLECTIVE LOCAL INITIATIVES AND ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURES TO CREATE SELF RELIANT STRUCTURE OF VILLAGE ORGANIZATIONS IN THE AREA.

DEFINITION OF VILLAGE ORGANIZATION:

In the light of above mentioned objectives a VO can be defined as; A MASS COALITION OF THE PEOPLE LIVING IN A CERTAIN DEFINED GEOGRAPHICAL SETTING WITH HAVING COMMON SOCIO ECONOMIC INTERESTS WHICH ARE BEST SERVED BY ORGANIZING AS AN INTEREST GROUP. THEY WORK PERMANENTLY TOGETHER IN AN ORGANISED WAY FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THEIR AREA BY USING THE AVAILABLE RESOURCES, BOTH OF THEIR OWN AND THOSE OFFERED BY THE GOVT. AGENCIES.

PROCEDURE:

It is totally up to the people what procedure and rules and regulations they like to adopt to run their organization. However there are certain things which need to be considered, i.e. preferably a majority of the people living in a certain defined setting should be members of the Village organization but not necessarily. Formation of no. of competing VOs in one village(setting) will be discouraged, except in very special cases. The representatives of the VO should be elected in a democratic manner by majority members, for a specified time period. The VO shall have regular meetings, minimum once a month, where they are discussing the issues of common interest. Decisions are taken by the members in a democratic manner by providing equal opportunity to every member to express his point of view. All the proceedings including decisions and discussions are recorded in a minutes register.

The VO will generate common funds by regular individual savings for their communal activities, which are deposited in a Bank or with the treasurer of the VO in case where there is no banking facility available.

The treasurer will maintain proper saving record in a cash book and pass books of the individual vo members.

Each VO should have a constitution to run the affairs of the Village organization in an organised manner.

APPROACH OF THE PROJECT:

1) Motivation campaigns.

1) Any KIDP activity can be used as an appropriate action around which, a VO can be organised, which means that facilitating VO formation is not an activity of the VDP sector only but the other sectors of the project will adopt the same approach to implement their activities and programmes in the area.

VDP will be having close collaboration with other sectors in this regard. The sector will play its catalytic role in establishing & strengthening contacts between VOs and other Govt. and non Govt. agencies working in the area.

2) Preliminary meetings.

Preliminary meetings will be held in the villages with out vos, to motivate & facilitate them in VO formation. The Social organizers and extension staff of the other sectors of the project will facilitate these meetings.

3) Follow up meetings.

The preliminary meetings will be followed by series of follow up meetings until the formation of a Village organization. At this stage the vo will be provided with pass books and registers.

4) Field Days.

To facilitate exchange of views and sharing experiences among the VOs, field days will be organised by the project, where weaker VOs are taken to relatively better ones within the area. These meetings will also serve as good base for discussion about the future NGO set up in the area.

In all the above meetings the KIDP leaflets about the strategies and activities of different sectors and deptts. will be explained to the people, generally by the concerned staff of different sectors and in most cases by the Social organizers.

5)Income generation programmes:

Efforts will be continued to assist VOs in implementing vo based income generation programmes through the utilization of VOs savings,which will encourage vo formation and collective funds raising.
A separate strategy will be developed for this activity.

6)Saving/credit schemes:

To encourage VO capital raisingng, saving/credit schemes will be encouraged by utilizing the vo funds as collateral.The sector will assist VOs in establishing links with credit institutions through its catalytic role.Pilot saving/credit schemes will be tried out by the project to motivate the people to get loans both for individual and communal interests and benefits.This will encourage saving habits of the vo members, because the vo joint funds are used for the benefits of individuals (an argument in favour ofimportance of organization for the benefits of individuals).

B)TRAININGS/MANAGEMENT COURSES:

After the creation of a VO, they will be provided with vo registers and individual pass books.The office bearers/members of VO will be provided basic trainings in improving their managerial skills,through internal and external means and apportunities.

C)MONITORING:

It will be a permanent activity of the Social organizers to pay regular visits to the VOs to evaluate their performance by inspecting their registers and frequency of their meetings,saving situation and working on communal ventures without any outside support.

The social organizers will be mostly present in the schedule VO meetings as observer.They will announce the dates of the VO meetings to other sectors of the project and agencies working in the area,to enable them to attend these meetings and to use these VOs forums for an easy delivery of their services.

The VDP sector will collect informations about the performance and effeciency of the Village Organizations on a Sixth monthly basis.These informations together with the VOs directory and VO maps are provided to the other sectors of the project and departments working in the area for direct links and access to the VOs.

D) CLASSIFICATION OF THE VOs:

Based on the evaluation of the VO performance, they are categorised into four classes.

1. Good vos:

The VOs who have regular meetings and they save regularly into a joint vo pool funds. All or part of their savings are used in communal ventures. They have been provided with VO registers and individual pass books and are using them on regular basis.

2. Moderate vos:

Those who have elected their representatives. They are having meetings and savings which are not regular. They do not have any communal ventures, started with their own savings.

3) Weak vos:

The vos who have elected their representatives once. They do not have any meetings and savings.

4) Dormant vos:

They are the ones, which are organised once & have become dormant which need re-awakening, the same way as new vos.

E) NETWORK DEVELOPMENT:

To increase the bargaining power and to improve the internal coordination of the grass root village organizations in the area, a net work of community organizations is envisaged by the following major facilitating steps;

1. CIRCLE COMMITTEE:

Once established, the VOs of a specific circle may form a circle committee or apex organization. This organization is supposed to handle and channelise the common interests of the VOs, to act as mediator in cases of conflicting interests and to represent the VOs to, and establish links with outside institutions. Based on ethnical differences, traditional geographical set up and dispersing interests, the project area is divided into 12 circles. (see annex).

11. NGOS:

If after some experiences with circle committees, the need is felt to improve and to simplify the coordination of the coming funds, and to improve the communications with the outside organizations, a joint forum could be created for the circle committees i.e. an umbrella NGO.

Considering the cultural and geographical differences between the two tehsils, two NGOs could be envisaged, one for Kalam and one for Behrain tehsil in the area.

About the structure of these NGOs, if it could be a self supporting NGO formed by the VOs, supporting NGO, formed by converting VDP into an NGO or a mixed of both, is a question which can be replied in the year 1994-95, after the recommendations of the joint mid term review mission.

Note: Strategy for formation of Women Organizations is dealt with separately in WID programme.
