



The fiscal year 2004 obligations are subject to funding modification.




Matching Grant Program

The Matching Grant Program allows U.S. private voluntary organizations (PVOs) working overseas to expand successful projects to new locations and initiate new projects. The program also enables U.S. PVOs to undertake experimental and innovative projects that offer the potential for learning and replication.


For 27 years, the Matching Grant Program has helped U.S. PVOs develop their community-based programs overseas. Managed by the Office of Private Voluntary Cooperation-American Schools and Hospitals Abroad (PVC-ASHA), the program matches dollar-for-dollar a PVO's own resources. Grants support programs consistent with the U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID's) evolving program priorities (e.g., microenterprise development, strategic partnerships) and geographical interests (e.g., Central Asia, Africa). The program awarded its last grant in Fiscal Year 2002; ongoing activities are due to be phased out by Fiscal Year 2007.

Matching grants to PVOs support clearly defined, field-oriented programs. The programs are fully conceived and incorporate rigorous evaluation criteria. They can be as broad as the overall scope of a PVO's work or as specific as community-based health services or microenterprise development, but must stay within USAID's legislative mandate and development priorities.


Until Fiscal Year 2002, PVOs were awarded these grants based on a demonstrated ability to implement successful, sustainable development programs. Ongoing activities to meet the program's four major objectives are as follows:

- to expand and strengthen the field programs of U.S. PVOs in program areas to increase sustainability and results that are consistent with USAID policies and priorities;
- to assist U.S. PVOs to further enhance their planning systems, management systems, and technical competencies so they can carry out development programs;
- to build the capacity of local nongovernmental organizations, governmental organizations, and community-based organizations through formalized partnerships with U.S. PVOs; and
- to increase U.S. private resources for development assistance through a combined public/private partnership by matching private contributions on a dollar-for-dollar basis.


The NGO Sector Strengthening Program is a follow-on to the U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID's) Matching Grant Program, which helped strengthen U.S. private voluntary organizations (PVOs) and their in-country partners. USAID's experience in building the capacity of individual PVOs and networks over the past 10 years provides insights into effective interventions and approaches. However, unlike programs that focus on strengthening single NGOs, this program seeks to address the NGO sector more broadly by improving the service delivery of organizations that have constituencies at the local level, and the networks and ISOs that strengthen and link them to a broad array of partners.

Anticipated results from this program will contribute to the following:


- strengthened operational, technical, financial, and advocacy capabilities of NGOs, networks, and ISOs;
- wide and effective learning dissemination by development partners of tested innovations, best practices, lessons learned, and standards;





Ocean Freight Reimbursement Program


The Ocean Freight Reimbursement (OFR) Program provides subsidies to private voluntary organizations (PVOs) to ship humanitarian supplies and equipment overseas in support of privately funded development and humanitarian assistance programs.

The OFR Program is the oldest ongoing PVO support program. The Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, Section 123 (b), authorized the creation of the program and, as amended, allows the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to subsidize registered U.S. PVOs for their ocean freight transportation costs. The program is unique because it allows small and newly registered PVOs to participate in the highly competitive, yet less complex Office of Private Voluntary Cooperation – American Schools and Hospitals Abroad (PVC-ASHA) grant processes.


Small competitive grants are provided by the program to U.S. PVOs each year. Funds are used to reimburse the PVOs for the cost of transporting donated commodities (such as medical supplies, agricultural equipment, educational supplies, and building equipment) to developing countries.

The OFR Program helps USAID expand its pool of developing partners by reaching out to small and newly registered PVOs and by providing grants to many first-time applicants; in Fiscal Year 2004, the Agency funded 59 PVOs. Although USAID reimburses the costs of ocean freight, participating PVOs are responsible for ancillary costs, such as commodity acquisition, warehousing, insurance, local transportation, and distribution. The program leverages resources many times the size of USAID funding.



The CAP Program aims to achieve the following:


- strengthen the capacity of local organizations, NGOs, networks, and intermediate support organizations (ISOs) to deliver development services;


ASHA grants are generally used to support capital improvements, such as the construction of academic buildings and medical facilities, and the procurement of medical and educational equipment.






PVC-ASHA plays a leadership role in managing SPA by encouraging USAID Missions and Offices to participate in the program. Peace Corps volunteers bid for funds allocated by USAID through a proposal process. Nearly any country in which Peace Corps operates is eligible to initiate and participate in the SPA program.

In keeping with the mission of the Office of PVC-ASHA, SPA-sponsored projects focus on developing local nongovernmental organizations (NGOs). Volunteers help to establish new NGOs, strengthen existing NGOs, and to improve services provided to surrounding communities.




