# PARTICIPANT BIOGRAPHIES

## **ABYE, Tasse**

Dr. Abye is a social work educator. As part of a two-year sabbatical leave as Head of the Regional Institute for Social Work Education in Normandy, France, he has been appointed Dean of the new School of Social Work at Addis Ababa University in Ethiopia. He has also been working to develop social work education in other parts of the world, including Romania, Cameroon, and Ethiopia. Dr. Abye's areas of research are social work and migration, social work and ethnicity, and comparative research on migration.

## **ADEGNIKA, Moutairou**

Dr. Adegnika attended university in the former Soviet Union where he obtained his masters degree in Finance and Credit (1990) and his PhD in Economics (1993). He has been an assistant professor at the University of Abomey-Calavi in Benin since 1994 and Assistant Director and Director of Academic Affairs of ENEAM since 2003.

## **ADERIBIGBE, Adeshina Oladapo**

Dr. Aderibigbe received a BS from California State University, Fresno (1976) and an MS and PhD from Oregon State University (1977-1981). Aderibigbe is currently Professor of Comparative Animal Nutrition and Dean of Agriculture, and research focuses include: evaluation of nutritive value of environmental wastes as livestock and poultry feeds; use of *in vitro* bovine rumen and rabbit cecum digestibilities of feed ingredient and feeds to predict *in vivo* utilization by animals; and evaluation of toxic components of potential feedstuffs and detoxification for livestock and poultry production.

## **AGUILERA SANDOVAL, Gladys**

Prof. Aguilera is a professor of Environmental Conservation, Agroecology, and Agroclimatology at the School of Agricultural Sciences, Universidad Autónoma Gabriel René Moreno, in Santa Cruz, Bolivia. Her research focuses on the interaction between environmental conditions and crop performance. She has been working along with the Center for Biodiversity and Conservation at the American Museum of Natural History in Bolivia for several years. As a result of the ALO partnership project, 14 educational modules for professors are being produced in Bolivia.

Mr. Ahmed has a masters degree in Research Psychology from the University of the Western Cape and specialises in measurement design, research methodology and advanced data analysis. His interests include research methodology, marketing/advertising/public relations, marketing/advertising strategy, information management, data analysis, political psychology, policy development, and community development. Mr. Allen is the Dean of Instruction for Professional/Technical Education at Highline Community College (HCC) in Des Moines, Washington where he is responsible for managing HCC's workforce training and education programs. He earned his Juris Doctor from the University of Washington. With an emphasis on developing training programs that respond to business needs and industry standards, he has participated in HCC's international initiatives since 1998 to promote economic development and entrepreneurship through workforce education.

In addition to his academic work, he has developed and participated in partnership programs with Egyptian universities.

**ANNETT, Cynthia**

Dr. Annett holds a PhD from the University of California-Berkeley in Aquatic Ecology, and has worked on scientific exchanges in Russia since 1991. She participated in the USAID-sponsored project to develop an ecologically sustainable economic development plan for the Altai Republic in Siberia, and has helped Gorno Altai State University to develop the water quality monitoring program partially funded by USAID/ALO. **BAGBY, Lewis**

Dr. Bagby has extensive experience in evaluating academic programs, developing strategic plans for institutions of higher education, assessing international programming at universities, and in designing new departments both in the U.S. and in the former Soviet Union. In Russia, he has designed, implemented, and managed

federally-funded development grants in the fields of business education, university finance and administration, federalism, rule of law, and social science. He has organized and currently manages faculty, administrator, and citizen exchanges with partner institutions in Russia, China, South Africa, Australia, and Guatemala.

**BAWDEN, Richard John**

Dr. Bawden served as the Dean of Agriculture and Rural Development at Hawkesbury College University of Western Sydney from 1978 to 1993, and from 1994 to 1999, he was the Director of the Centre for Systemic Development at the same institution. Since then, he has been a Visiting Distinguished University Professor at Michigan State University. His interests focus on the role of universities in rural development from a perspective that draws significantly on

systems theories and philosophies. Over the past 30 years or so, he has worked with projects in more than a dozen different countries across five continents.

**BEDIAKO, Frank Setsoafia**

Mr. Bediako is a senior lecturer at the University of Cape Coast, where he has taught Health/Physical Education for over 20 years. After obtaining an advanced degree in Health/Physical Education in 1970 at the Specialist Training College at Winneba (now University of Education) and an advanced diploma in coaching in 1974 (Romania), he taught at the Specialist Training College at Winneba. He then obtained an MS in Physical Education in 1983 from Indiana University. Additionally, he has worked under the auspices of the National Access Consortium Western Cape with the full range of South African educational institutions. Dr. Bermingham is currently the project director on an ALO/USAID-funded entrepreneurship initiative with Cape Technikon as well as a training and employment for the disabled project with False Bay College.

**BEUTE, Nico**

Dr. Beute, Dean of the Engineering Faculty at Cape Technikon, Cape Town, South Africa, serves as the South Africa project director for their joint project with Highline Community College, "Entrepreneurship Across the Curriculum in Science Engineering, and Technology." Dr. Beute's experience includes work in South Africa's public and private sectors before coming to Cape Technikon in 1969, continuous service on the Engineering Council of South Africa since 1996, and Board Chair of the Gateway Discovery Centre

**BICKNELL, William J.**

Dr. Bicknell, MD, MPH, Professor of International Health at the School of Public Health at Boston University, founded the Center and Department of International Health and is former Associate Vice-President for International Health at Boston University. He has worked in over 46 countries and has held posts ranging from Senior Physician for Peace Corps/Ethiopia, Medical Director of the Job Corps to Commissioner of Public Health for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Dr. Bicknell's interests include: policy, management, and program development; international health; public health and medical education; bioterrorism and emergency preparedness; and, most recently, developing and implementing a long-term cooperative program with the government of Lesotho to minimize the human capital impact of HIV/AIDS.

**BISHAW, Badege**

Dr. Bishaw received his BS in Agriculture from Addis Ababa University, Ethiopia, his MS in Tropical Forestry from the University of Dresden, Germany, and his PhD in Forest Resources from Oregon State University (OSU). He is currently a Research Associate in the Department of Forest Science at OSU where he teaches International Forestry and Agroforestry courses to undergraduate and graduate students. Beginning with U.S. Peace Corps service in Peru, Dr. Blake worked 35 years in outreach, teaching, and research in Latin America, Africa and the U.S. His international program emphasizes economic, genetic, and nutritional issues of management of livestock and mixed farming systems in these regions. Program foci include: livestock systems; economic evaluation and decision making; modeling the livestock component of agrosilvopastoral systems,

especially local feed resources to improve economic returns and productivity from animal, land and labor resources; nutrition and reproduction management; and genetic-environmental interactions. Dr. Blake is currently a professor in the Department of Animal Science with Cornell University.

**BOGGS, George R.**

Dr. Boggs is President and Chief Executive Officer of the American Association of Community Colleges. He holds a bachelors in Chemistry from The Ohio State University, a masters in Chemistry from the University of California, Santa Barbara, and a PhD in Educational Administration from the University of Texas, Austin. Dr. Boggs served as a faculty member, Division Chair, and Associate Dean of Instruction at Butte College in California and, for 15 years, he served as the Superintendent/President of Palomar College in California.

**BOLOGNESE, Kerry D.**

Mr. Bolognese joined the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges in 1993 as Assistant Director for Federal Relations in the areas of environment and natural resources. In 2003, he became the Director for Federal Relations, International, Marine and Environmental Affairs. From 1984-1992, he worked on the professional staff for the House Foreign Affairs Committee, and its Subcommittee on Human Rights and International Organizations. **BRAVO-URETA, Boris E.**

His research has focused on the U.S. dairy sector and on peasant economies in West Africa and Latin America. He has taught courses in agricultural marketing, production economics, benefit-cost analysis, microeconomic theory, managerial economics and economic development.

His research interests focus on the function of nickel, boron, and zinc in plants. As Director he has managed several research grants targeting various developing countries, including Afghanistan, Egypt, India, Nicaragua, and Panama.

**BUKONDA, Ngoyi Kashiba Zacharie**

Dr. Bukonda, Associate Professor of Public Health at Northern Illinois University, Dr. is the Director of the

newly formed "Partnership to Mitigate Iatrogenic HIV Transmission through Infection Control Quality Improvement Teams in Eastern Kasai Province" (Democratic Republic of Congo). He previously served in various leadership positions within the Congolese health care system such as president of the Association des Administrateurs-Gestionnaires des Institutions de Santé. His research has focused on commitment to primary health care strategy, adoption of essential drugs, hospital accreditation, teamwork, and male involvement in the prevention of HIV transmission.

**BYNUM, Nora**

Dr. Bynum steers the global activities of the Center for Biodiversity and Conservation's Network of Conservation Educators and Practitioners within the American Museum of Natural History. She has extensive experience teaching conservation biology and environmental science, and has specialized in the design and implementation of intensive, student-active, and field-based learning experiences. She is also an Adjunct Associate Professor at the Duke University Nicholas School of the Environment and Earth Sciences, and at the Center for Environmental Research and Conservation at Columbia University. She has worked extensively in the fields of tropical ecology, conservation, and education in Latin America and Asia.

**CABALLERO, Luis Alonso**

Prof. Caballero received his MS in Watershed Sciences from the Colorado State University School of Natural Resources. Since 1996, he has been an Associate Professor in Watershed Sciences and GIS for the Socioeconomic and Development Program at Zamorano University, Honduras. He has broad experience in various areas, including: the formulation and implementation of natural resources management projects, with a particular focus on watershed management and rehabilitation; applied research; undergraduate teaching; professional development; and community training. He is presently conducting applied research for the restoration of degraded upper watershed lands.

**CAMPANA, Michael E.**

Dr. Campana is Professor of Hydrogeology and Director of the Water Resources Program at the University of New Mexico. He has designed and implemented undergraduate and graduate curricula in water resources, hydrology, and environmental science. His research includes water resources in developing countries, transboundary water resources issues, and the effects of climate change on water allocation and availability. His international work is primarily in Honduras, Panama, and the South Caucasus. Dr. Campana earned a BS in Geology from the College of William and Mary and MS and PhD degrees in Hydrology from the University of Arizona.

**CAMPOS, David**

Dr. Campos is a Professor at the Universidad Nacional Agraria, la Molina in Peru. His PhD in Agronomic Sciences, with a concentration in Food Biotechnology, is from Gembloux-Belgium. His current research deals with the processing of fresh crops and characterization of their bioactive properties

Dr. Carter, Director of International Programs at Tuskegee University, has over 20 years of experience in international development work in areas including women's issues, education, agriculture, health, nutrition, risk assessment, and trade. She has been involved with development projects in Africa, the Caribbean, Asia, and Latin America. She spent two years on a joint appointment between USAID and the U.S. Department of Agriculture's International Cooperation and Development Office.

His research focuses on the effects of environmental contaminants on human health.

He was a visiting scientist at Kansas State University, and also served as a member of an advisory team for the government of Senegal to revive the cultivation of cotton.
