Certification Guidelines For ART-Providers.

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FOREWORD

The Medical Council of Zambia is a Statutory Body established under an Act of Parliament – CAP. 297 of the Laws of Zambia. It is a regulatory body with statutory obligations to regulate the registration of health care facilities and health practitioners, as well as to maintain optimal standards of competence, care and professional conduct. Its mission is to set, promote and regulate ethical and professional conduct of practice amongst health care professionals so as to ensure the provision of quality health care for the public.

In line with this statutory mandate, the Council has developed certification guidelines for all health care providers working in the public or private sector, who are providing ART Services.

The advent of the HIV/AIDS pandemic together with its opportunistic infections has proved to be of great concern not only to the Government, but to the general public as well. The pandemic has drastically affected the country's life expectancy, labour productivity and economic growth potential. The pandemic has further caused a severe strain on the national health care delivery system.

In order to address this situation, the Government took the decision to introduce ART services in public health facilities. ART Services have proved to be one of the most important interventions to be included in the basic health care package for mitigation against HIV and AIDS. It is against this background, that it was decided to invest time and resources to develop certification guidelines for ART providers.

The Certification Guidelines have been developed to provide guidance for recognizing ART trainers, training institutions /organizations, ensuring usage of MOH approved training packages and the requirements involved to have an ART health care provider certified.

It is the Council's hope that these guidelines for certification of ART health care providers will be useful in enhancing quality in the provision of ART and health care in general.

PREAMBLE

The Certification Guidelines have been developed to regulate and unite all ART providers in order to ensure uniformity in basic knowledge, skills and attitudes and to standardize the quality of care.

BACKGROUND

In the early 1990s, the Government of the Republic of Zambia (GRZ) embarked on health reforms with the vision "to provide equity of access to cost-effective, quality health care as close to the family as possible". To achieve this vision, Zambia needed a health system that was robust enough to embrace all the key elements of health care delivery, such as a strong health system structure and the availability of necessary inputs to ensure effective delivery of services.

With the emerging challenges of HIV/AIDS and the introduction of Antiretroviral Therapy (ART), the Government through Ministry of Health (MoH) is committed to improving the quality of health care in both the private and public health facilities. Therefore the medical council has developed systems for supervision, monitoring and evaluating standards for health care providers and training institutions.

The Medical Council of Zambia (MCZ) provides services and an institutional framework that directs its efforts towards the provision of quality health care through an effective monitoring of the medical practice and improvement of health facilities in both the public and private sector. As a consequence of this, and mindful of the need to scale up HIV/AIDS interventions in the country, the MCZ in collaboration and consultation with all the relevant stake-holders, has come up with certification system.

The provision of antiretroviral therapy is an essential step in the continuum of care and support for persons living with HIV and AIDS. Since, it is important to bring this service as close to all Persons Living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA) as possible in order to ensure that the best quality of care is provided by adequately trained providers. This assures uniformity of quality of care. In order to ensure the attainment of the above, all individuals who provide or wish to provide antiretroviral therapy shall be subjected to a certification process.

RECOGNITION OF TRAININGS

There are various training programs that are being offered in ART by Training institutions and Organizations. For purposes of ART Accreditation the training programs shall be streamlined to ensure focus on Domains of the ART Accreditation guidelines. Emphasis shall be on training programs recommended in the ART Accreditation Guidelines.

The following are the essential training programs that will be considered and recognized for Certification of ART Providers:

- 1) Management of HIV with Antiretroviral Therapy-Advanced Course
- 2) Paediatric HIV Care Training Course
- 3) Prevention of Mother to Child Transmission of HIV
- 4) SmartCare
- 5) Management of National ARV Logistics System
- 6) HIV Test Logistics System
- 7) Pharmacovigilance
- 8) Psycho-Social Counseling Course

Description of Trainings

(1) Management of HIV with Antiretroviral Therapy and Management of Opportunistic Infections:

RECOGNIZING TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Besides mandatory training programs, there are other training programs which are desirable but important for Continuing Professional Development .These training programs will be helpful under Domain 6 (Human Resource and Continuing Professional Development) for purposes of ART Accreditation. The same training programs might be useful for annual renewal of practitioners' registration licenses at the Medical Council of Zambia:

RECOGNIZING TRAINING INSTITUTIONS AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS OFFERINGS TRAINING PROGRAMS RELATED TO HIV

There are a number institutions and organisations offering trainings related to HIV. In this document, for purposes of recognition and regulation the institutions have been categorized into two these are:

(a) Formal Training institutions

These are institutions whose core business is training and are recognised by the Government of Zambia as such. These are:

Note: That training of ART providers is not limited to the organisations mentioned above.

REGULATION

Regulation of all formal training institutions shall be done by Medical Council of Zambia with an exception of Nursing Schools which shall be regulated by General Nursing Council. The institutions categorized as 'Other organizations offering HIV related trainings' shall be regulated by Ministry of Health.

Approval of Training Institutions

Institutions or organizations intending to commence training programs related to HIV should send the request to an appropriate regulator. If they are formal training institutions they should send the request to Medical Council of Zambia, while nursing related institutions should go through General Nursing Council.

Organizations which fall under institutions categorized as 'Other organizations' offering HIV related training programs shall be required to go through the Ministry of Health.

The request should include the following details:

- Name or Title of the course
- Curriculum
- Duration of the course

- Annual training plan
- Cadres Targeted
- Qualifications of Trainers
- Budget Estimates

RECOGNIZING TRAINERS

The Ministry of Health undertakes different ART related training programs in order to ensure uniformity in basic knowledge, skills, attitudes and the quality of teaching. The trainers shall be required to undertake the same type of Training of Trainers course which shall be recognised by the Medical Council of Zambia and General Nursing Council.

The Training of Trainers (TOT)

The training of trainers shall be the responsibility of the Ministry of Health in order to co-ordinate and for easy dissemination of any changes to the national guidelines. For the trainers to be recognized by MCZ they should have undergone a TOT organised by MOH .These trainers must be in good standing and duly registered by MCZ or GNC. If an organisation wishes to have its staff trained as TOT's they should contact appropriate directorates at the Ministry of Health.

Validity of Certificate for Trainers

The Medical Council shall issue Certificates to trainers valid for two (2) years. Renewal of Certificate as trainers shall be based on the production of evidence of relevant Continuing Professional Development.

Mentorship

Evidence of mentorship and support supervision to the trainees is an added advantage for renewal of trainers' certificates.

CERTIFICATION OF ART PROVIDERS

The members of the clinical team (as stipulated in the revised ART Accreditation guidelines, May 2009) should attend the training courses relevant to their responsibilities in the clinical team .The required training courses are categorized into two Mandatory and Desirable. A member of the clinical team shall be deemed Certified as an ART Provider upon attendance of a mandatory training.

The following are mandatory and desirable training courses for each member of the clinical team:

Clinicians

(Medical Practitioner, Medical Licentiate, Clinical Officer)

- Adult ART/OI (Mandatory)
- Paediatric ART (Mandatory)
- PMTCT (Desirable)
- Pharmacovigilance (Desirable)

Nurses/Nurse Practitioner

- Adult ART/OI (Mandatory)
- Paediatric ART (Mandatory)
- PMTCT (Desirable)
- Psychosocial Counseling (Desirable)
- Pharmacovigilance (Desirable)

Pharmacy Personnel

- Management of National ARV Logistics (Mandatory)
- Pharmacovigilance (Desirable)
- ART/OI (Desirable)

Laboratory Personnel

- HIV Test Logistics System (Mandatory)
- ART/O.I (Desirable)

Data Personnel:

SmartCare/HMIS- (Mandatory)

THE CERTIFICATION PROCESS

For a clinical team member to be Certified he/she should be in good standing with the Medical Council of Zambia or the General Nursing School. The Mandatory training courses are required for a member of the team to be certified as an ART provider.

The process shall be as follows:

- Immediately after training, the training institutions shall forward names of all trainees to MCZ, except nurses whose names shall be sent to GNC
- Other organizations offering training programs shall forward names of trainees to the Ministry of Health and MCZ
- Once these names have been submitted to the appropriate regulatory body they are automatically certified as ART providers.

However, trainees are required to practice after the training to sharpen their competencies.

The pre-service ART trained students should be certified as such if their curriculum is in line according to the Ministry of Health approved packages.

STREAMLINING THE CURRENT SITUATION

Data Capture

There will be a central data base at the Medical Council of Zambia were all trained clinical team members will be captured nationwide, except nurses whose data base shall be based at the General Nursing Council.

All formal training institutions will be required to send the names of all trainees to MCZ or GNC while 'other organizations offering trainings will be required to send the names of all trainees to MOH and MCZ.

All training programs which were conducted before these guidelines were developed and were using the MOH approved packages shall also be required to forward the names of trainees to the appropriate regulatory body.

Training Institutions

- Those training institutions and Other Organisation offering training programs but not using the MOH approved package should ensure that they begin using the MOH approved training packages for respective training programs.
- If the training being offered is new and not in the MOH package the training institution shall seek approval of the appropriate regulator.

Trainers

 All trainers who wish to provide training programs shall undergo the MOH approved package for TOT.

Trainees

- All trainees who were trained using MOH approved package shall automatically become certified
- Those who never used the MOH approved trainings shall be re-trained using the MOH approved package
- Those who were trained using MOH approved package but not given certificates shall be given certificates

ART PROVIDERS TRAINED OUTSIDE ZAMBIA

All ART Providers trained outside Zambia shall be required to under go an orientation training course according to the MOH approved package for ART providers.

IMPLEMENTATION PLAN FOR CERTIFICATION

- (1) Dissemination of Certification Guidelines 3rd July, 2009
- (2) Medical Council of Zambia to ensure that all ART Providers who were trained using the Ministry of Health package but not given certificates to be given certificates 6th July, 2009.
- (3) Installation of Data base at the Medical Council of Zambia 15th July, 2009.
- (4) Request all Training Institutions to provide names of those who have been trained in courses relevant to ART Accreditation. 15th July, 2009.
- (5) Request the Ministry of Health to provide names of all trainers who have undergone Trainer of Trainers Course 15th July, 2009.
- (6) Come up with the aggregated list of known Certified ART Providers 14th August, 2009.
- (7) Come up with the list of providers, who need re-training 14th August, 2009.

(8)	Training institutions will be required to submit names to MCZ within a week after training.
