The population 5-14 years of age has been used as the primary school age population. It does not reflect the legal school age of any individual country, nor does the enrolled population correspond to the legal school ages. Since many children in Latin America enter school late, repeat one or more grades, or drop out to return at a later date, there is no precise age grouping that accurately defines the primary school age population. The category 5-14 years of age serves as a good approximation and is the range most widely used for international comparisons.

The prescribed secondary school age population has been defined as the age range beginning with the legal starting age for secondary school and extending the number of years needed to graduate from secondary school. For example, if a student enters secondary school at age 13 and the course of study requires 6 years, then the prescribed age range is 13 through 18. Where two or more courses of study of different lengths are offered, the number of years needed to complete General Secondary school has been used.

It should be noted that Bolivia and Chile altered the structure of their school systems in the later part of the 1960's. The prescribed secondary school age population of these two countries have been adjusted to correspond to the new school system.

The data on Central Government Revenues were compiled from information supplied by the Office of Statistics and Reports, Bureau for Program and Policy Coordination, A.I.D. While every effort has been made to facilitate intercountry comparisons, it should be remembered that there is a wide variety of governmental structures in Latin America and these governments have variations in budgetary procedures.

The figures are not necessarily the official figures of the individual countries; in some cases they are merely the best estimates of AID analysts. As a result, any individual number may be subject to large error, and should therefore be used only to represent the general trend or relative magnitude.

These data deal with revenues of central governments only and do not include the revenues collected by state or local governments, which, in some cases, are quite large.

Since complete information on central government finances in Ecuador has not been available since 1968, the data for domestic revenues and tax revenues in Ecuador from 1969 to 1971 were estimated in the following manner: The ratio of revenues to Gross National Product was computed for the years 1966-1968 and averaged for each series. These averages were then applied to the Gross National Product in 1969, 1970 and 1971 to provide an order-of-magnitude figure to add into the regional total.

Domestic revenues include all revenues originating within the country accruing to the central government but not foreign grants or surpluses retained by government enterprises.

Data on Central Government Expenditures have been compiled from information supplied by the Office of Statistics and Reports, Bureau of Program and Policy Coordination, A.I.D. While every effort has been made to facilitate inter-country comparison, it should be remembered that there is a wide variety of governmental structures in Latin America, and that these governments have variations in budgetary procedures.

These figures are not necessarily the official figures of the individual countries; in some cases they are merely the best estimates of AID analysts. As a result, any individual number may be subject to large error and should therefore be used only to represent the general trend or relative magnitude.

These data reflect central government expenses only and do not include expenditures by state and local governments which in some countries are quite large.

Since complete information on central government finances in Ecuador has not been available since 1968, the data on total expenditures and capital expenditures in Ecuador from 1969 to 1971 were estimated in the following manner: The ratio of expenditures to Gross National Product was computed in each series for the years 1966-1968 and averaged for each series. These averages were then applied to the Gross National Product in 1969, 1970 and 1971 to provide an order of magnitude figure to add into the regional total.

Total expenditures include all expenditures of the Central Government including capital expenditures by government enterprises, where reported, and foreign grants. Thus, these series include expenditures in several countries which are not financed by domestic revenues and are therefore not comparable to the revenues series.
