Report of Activity January 1st to  
March 31st 1984

Activity Description

The purpose of this grant is to provide means to engage transport for PL-480 commodities destined for drought and civil strife-affected areas where normal sustenance-giving crop producing activities have been disturbed or unfruitful. This grant also permits the Grantee to participate actively in the distribution and monitoring sectors of emergency PL-480 commodity programs by providing the means to :

1. Cover travel expenses for Government of Chad distribution agents and to;
2. Cover travel rented costs for expatriate and Chadian end use monitors working for the grantee.

Implementation:

This quarter's activity has been particularly sporadic in both realms, that of Grantee effected deliveries of P.L. 480 sorghum as well as hired (Cooperative of Chadian Transporters, C.T.T.) transport of like commodities.

Deliveries to Biltine Prefecture which were begun last quarter by C.T.T. members were carried through to completion by January 13th. In the meantime, deliveries to the Lake Prefecture were undertaken using the Grantee's fleet of trucks. Deliveries were carried out from January 6th through February 3rd.

Closely following the Lake Prefecture deliveries, census figures were received from Mao, the capital of the Kanem Prefecture, and requests were received by the Ministry of the Struggle Against Natural

Disasters (M.L.C.C.N.) from Ouaddai and Batha Prefectures so 209 M.T. were programmed for delivery to Mao from the 17th to 24th of February by the Grantee's fleet and 500 M.T. were programmed for Batha and Ouaddai Prefectures. The deliveries for Ouaddai and Batha were carried out by C.T.T. members, 250 M.T. being delivered to Am Dam (Ouaddai), 250 M.T. to Oum Hadjer and 150 M.T. to Djeddah (both in Batha Prefecture). Since travel was being restricted in these areas, Direction of the Struggle Against Natural Disasters (D.L.C.C.N.) agents were employed to assist the local distribution committees with the distributions and documentation of said operations. Deliveries were carried out from February 20th to March 3rd.

A lull in activities was then experienced until, upon recommendation by World Food Program whose agent had visited the area, deliveries were undertaken to 4 cantons in the Bitkine Sub-Prefecture of Guera Prefecture. 100 M.T. were thus delivered to Bitkine Sub-Prefecture between the 26th and 31st of March by trucks of the Grantee's fleet.


The Grantee fielded end use monitors three times during this quarter and employed D.L.C.C.N. agents to assist in distributing cereals where travel restrictions precluded expatriate visits to the distribution sites. The first field trip was from February 4th to 11th, to the N'Gouri (Lake) area to be present at the last distribution (at N'Gouri) and to recover documents concerning the preceding distributions in the surrounding cantons. From February 26th to March 3rd a local employee of the Grantee was present at Mao to oversee the distribution of 209 M.T. of commodities in the town. The third and final trip took place from March 27th to 30th. The four cantons of Bitkine Sub-Prefecture were visited during this trip and modalities of distribution and documentation were presented to local committees at each distribution site.

To conclude this report it must be noted that 728.5 M.T. transported by C.T.T. members and reported last quarter (September 26 th to December 31st, 1983) under this project were transferred to the Grantee's Procurement Authorization N° 3155 which was nearing

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expiration. Transport costs associated with the transport of the 728.5 M.T. were thus debited from the Procurement Authorization and credited to this Grant. The deliveries concerned were: Goumssou (Mao Sub-Prefecture, Kanem Prefecture) 35.5 M.T., Kekedina (Mao Sub-Prefecture) 14 M.T., Koleh (Mao Sub-Prefecture) 24 M.T., Guereda. (Biltine Prefecture) 629 M.T. and Am Zoer (Biltine Prefecture) 26 M.T.
