




SUBJECT: Managing Benefits for the Poor (936-5308) -  
National Academy of Public Administration Unsolicited  
Proposal for Project on Lessons of Industrialized  
Countries' Anti-Poverty Programs Applicable to Less  
Developed Nations

Problem: What lessons learned from experiences of industrialized nations with antipoverty programs are applicable to programs in less developed nations addressed to the needs of the poor majority?

Discussion: The proposed first phase of this project will fund an unsolicited proposal from the National Academy of Public Administration to carry out a seminar and to derive lessons from the experiences of industrialized nations with antipoverty programs that might be applicable to the efforts of less developed nations to help the poor majority. The seminar is to be constructed in such a way that DS/RAD will identify for the individuals writing the papers for the seminar what it regards as the key questions that ought to be addressed in order to help develop the Managing Benefits for the Poor Project (936-5308). Individuals designated to write the papers will attend a pre-seminar session during which these authors, DS/RAD personnel and other interested parties can develop, in effect, the research design for the papers. The individuals to write the papers will be selected on the basis of close collaboration between the National Academy for Public Administration and DS/RAD.

The papers for the seminar will address five topics:  
(1) approaches to identifying target populations, (2) planning programs to alleviate poverty, (3) administrative structures for poverty programs, (4) ways and means of engaging the participation of the poor in designing and implementing programs for their benefit, and (5) appropriate techniques for assessing the impact of such programs. At the seminar itself, the paper authors, invited participants, and representatives of A.I.D. will discuss the findings and attempt to distill what has been learned from industrialized countries' antipoverty programs that can be effectively applied to programs addressing

the needs of the poor in less developed countries. While much of the expertise will focus on the United States' experience, efforts will be made to draw on the experiences of Canada and European nations as well. The papers, with appropriate introductory and concluding chapters, will be assembled in a volume and reproduced.

Recommendation: That you approve and authorize the obligation of \$29,166 from funds budgeted in our FY 1980 budget for project development work for Project 936-5308, Managing Benefits to the Poor, by signing the attached PAF so that the National Academy of Public Administration can carry out these activities as described in the attached draft PIO/T.
