I. BACKGROUND

The National Police Support Project is divided into nine discrete activities as follows: (1) National Police Directorate Support; (2) National Police Field Forces; (3) National Police Identification and Records; (4) Training; (5) Marine Police; (6) Saigon Metropolitan Police Directorate; (7) National Police Jail Administration; (8) General Support, and (9) National Police Reporting System.

With the increased success of pacification efforts in the rural areas; the role of the NP in consolidating these gains assumes even greater importance and provides one of the major priority thrusts of the Pacification Program, which is to assist the GVN in bringing more of the populace under its protection and improving the protection provided. US and GVN resources and assistance are required to enable the National Police to recruit, train, organize, equip, administer and support a force capable of achieving its objectives.

II. DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

The objective is to assist all elements of the GVN National Police (NP) force to assume increased responsibility for law and order and internal security in the urban and pacified areas within the Republic of Vietnam. Public Safety Directorate support to the GVN will be channeled through the nine activities with specific objectives as indicated.

A. National Police Directorate Support

This activity will assist the various elements of the NP to improve their organization, administration and operation and to develop and implement the Pacification and Development Plan. The various elements of the NP supported under this activity are:

Judicial (criminal investigations), Administrative (regulatory investigations), Internal Security (investigation of misfeasance and malfeasance of police personnel), Traffic and Patrol, Central Records, Forensic Laboratory, and Research and Legal.

B. National Police Field Force (NPF)

This activity will support the expansion of the para-military NPF organization of the NP to provide an effective force capable of locating, combating and eliminating the Viet Cong infrastructure; to control civil disturbances; to conduct rural patrols; and to protect the NP deployed in the rural areas.

I. General Support

This activity will provide support to all other activities of this project. The goal is to increase the general effectiveness, mobility and efficiency of the NP by providing advisory and operational assistance covering general budgetary, logistical and manpower support to all NP functions not covered herein by other activities, including support of the special police.

III. IMPLEMENTATION PLAN AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A. USAID

1. National Police Directorate Support (Coordinator: Chief, Police Staff Operations Division, PSD)

During FY 71, 13 US direct hire and 3 British advisors will be assigned to this activity. They will be augmented by field advisors as necessary. They will advise, assist and participate with the GVN Project Manager in preparing and disseminating legislation, directives, and police orders; conducting general, regional and local staff and operational inspections and anti-corruption activities; improving and refining criminal and regulatory (scientific and conventional) investigative procedures and practices; improving NP effectiveness in narcotics suppression; developing a juvenile delinquency investigation and prevention capability; establishing a central criminal, subversive and regulatory personal identification system; developing an effective uniform traffic enforcement and accident investigative service; developing traffic education and traffic safety programs; developing and implementing improved police patrols; and developing and implementing standard guidelines and procedures for personnel, document and facilities security of the NP.

Commodity support will include office machines, typewriters, filing and storage cabinets, photo equipment and supplies.

2. National Police Field Force (NFFF) (Coordinator: Chief, Security Support Division, PSD)

Fourteen US direct hire advisors will be assigned to this activity in FY 71. They will advise and assist the GVN Project Manager in assigning, equipping and training 11,099 personnel during FY 71; deploying NFFF units to all districts; monitoring and assessing operations against the VC infrastructure; and allocating the DOD commodities supplied to this activity.

Commodity support requested under the FY 71 AID/DOD Realignment Program includes items such as vehicles, ammo, weapons, radios, rations, clothing, office equipment, barrier materials, and other miscellaneous requirements.

Also, USAID will provide commodities such as training aids, training films, books, manuals, and training supplies.

5. Marine Police Activity (Coordinator: Chief, Security Support Division, PSD)

Six US direct hire and two British advisors are to be assigned to this activity during FY 71. They will be augmented by PSD field advisors, when necessary.

They will advise and assist the GVN Project Manager in improving the efficiency and effectiveness of the Marine Police in: assigning, equipping and training a Marine Police Force of 3,150; completing the construction of 11 provincial Marine Police bases, including Can Tho, and a headquarters facility at Phu Xuan during FY 71; maintaining all Marine Police boat and engines; supporting the Harbor Police in the ports of Saigon, Qui Nhon and Danang with water craft and boat operators; planning, implementing and issuing operational and maintenance directives as required; and establishing roles and missions of the Marine Police vis-a-vis the VN Navy and other GVN Maritime agencies.

During FY 71, USAID will provide outboard engines for interceptor patrol boats, repair parts support for the maintenance of 408 75/85 HP outboard engines, photographic equipment and supplies, fire trucks and other miscellaneous marine equipment and supplies. USAID will provide additional funds for the construction and construction supervision of the Phu Xuan and Can Tho Marine Police Bases.

DOD funds will be requested in FY 71 to procure dry rations for Marine Police personnel engaged in operational missions.

6. Saigon Metropolitan Police Directorate (SMPD) (Coordinator: Chief, SMPD, PSD)

Fourteen US direct hire and one British advisor will be assigned to this activity in FY 71. They will advise and assist the GVN Project Manager in improving law enforcement services in the Saigon Metropolitan area by: standardizing police operations and establishing more effective administrative practices; increasing in-service training in each of the 11 precincts and traffic police; expanding mobile patrols and initiating a program of foot patrols; increasing the effectiveness of harbor/airport security by adding 50 additional trained personnel; reassigning 550 police officers from administrative to field duties; and increasing basic and advanced training from 600 to 3,000 and 3,200 to 4,000 per year, respectively.

Commodity support programmed for FY 71 includes traffic supplies and office equipment.

7. National Police Jail Administration (Coordinator: Chief, Corrections and Detentions Division, PSD)

Three US direct hire advisors will be assigned to this activity during FY 71. They will be assisted by military personnel assigned to PSD operations in the regions and provinces.

They will advise and assist the GVN Project Manager in strengthening the administrative and operational aspects of jail administration by: planning, constructing, equipping and staffing 10 facilities during FY 71; improving the administrative procedures and the processing of detained persons; preparing training material to support training of custodial personnel; procuring and distributing support commodities; improving the prisoner records system; and encouraging the GVN to furnish adequate food allowances and improved training and welfare programs for detained persons.

8. National Police Reporting System (Coordinator: Chief, Police Staff Operations Division, PSD)

During FY 71, one US direct hire advisor will be assigned to this activity. Field advisors will assist to assure accurate field inputs to the NP Reporting System.

Advice and assistance will be given to the GVN Project Manager in the development of reporting systems with an automatic data processing capability. These reporting systems will be used for collecting, preparing, reporting and analyzing meaningful information in order to coordinate the DGNP management information requirements; establish a suitable DGNP organizational unit responsible for the management and direction of the ADP reporting system; and assist in the development of systems and sub-systems for arrest accountability, manpower management, activity reporting, and logistic management. IBM equipment rental, cards, and computer time is being funded by DOD.

9. General Support (Coordinator: Assistant Director, P&M, PSD)

Twenty-nine US direct hire and one British advisor directly support this activity to fulfill administrative and technical requirements of the project. Included in the above are the Director, Deputy Director, senior staff members, supervisors, and program and support personnel who

also have the responsibility for supporting the Correction Centers project. Most of the above personnel directly perform advisory functions with their designated senior GVN counterparts. Administratively, 102 additional field and area advisors are carried within this activity.

They will advise and assist the GVN Project Manager in increasing the general effectiveness, mobility and efficiency of the NP in achieving a force level of 107,000 by the end of FY 71; improving budgetary and personnel management procedures, records and reports; assigning 50 percent of the uniformed police (exclusive of NPTF and Marine Police) at province level to district level and below; establishing 2,000 subdistrict offices; seeking an increase in GVN budgeted piasters in order that the DGNP might assume greater responsibility for procurement of services, commodities and equipment; obtaining transportation services for personnel and commodities when the NP are unable to do so with GVN resources; and operating the NP logistics center which includes the print shop, a weapons repair shop, and equipment maintenance shop.

During FY 71 USAID will provide commodity assistance in the form of ammo reload supplies, office machines, typewriters, file and storage cabinets, printing and reproduction supplies, repair parts and supplies, and other commodities in support of the DGNP.

USAID will also provide funds to conduct an A & E survey of the electrical system at the DGNP compound in Saigon. GVN will be requested to provide for the renovation and installation of the electrical system within their CY72 National Budget.

B. GVN

Any land needed for construction purposes will be financed by the GVN from its own resources, and title to land sites will be vested in the GVN prior to the start of construction. The DGNP will provide proper servicing, operation and maintenance of AID financed equipment, vehicles, facilities and structures in use or to be procured or constructed for this project.

The DGNP will assure that individuals selected for participant training satisfy course prerequisites as outlined in the Public Safety Training Program Guide. In addition, the DGNP agrees that upon completion of training, returned participants will be retained in the employ of the NP

for at least three years in command or supervisory positions at least equal to or higher than the positions they held prior to completion of AID-financed participant training.

Suitable office space and vehicle transportation for US technical advisors assigned to this project will be provided by the GVN Project and Activity Managers.

C. OTHER

During FY 70, the United Kingdom contributed nine technical advisors, and the Federation of Malaysia is providing training to the GVN National Police forces. These services are to continue in FY 71, as noted in para IV, above. Equalization pay for the British advisors in FY 71 will be provided by the US.

IV. DESIGNATIONS

A. The Director, Public Safety Directorate, or his designee, will serve as overall US Project Manager for this project. In this capacity, he will coordinate the USAID assistance provided for the project, and work closely with the GVN Project Manager in all phases of implementation.

B. The Director General of National Police, or his designee, will serve as GVN Project Manager. In this capacity, he will be responsible primarily for the overall implementation of the program.

V. FINANCIAL OBLIGATION

A. AID

The dollars obligated on the face sheet will fund personnel services, participant training for selected NP personnel, commodity support, and the A&E services planned for this project. Details will be contained in the appropriate implementing documents.

The dollar funds obligated on block 8d of the face sheet will be used to implement the CY71 piaster budget. See attached.

B. GVN

The Ministry of Interior agrees to support this project through the normal revenues made available to the Ministry for its operation.

VI. REPORTING AND EVALUATION

The US and GVN Project Managers shall prepare jointly and submit to their respective agencies quarterly progress reports and other reports as may be requested, in a format mutually acceptable to the GVN and USAID. Distribution will include DGBFA and other GVN agencies, as appropriate.

VII. SPECIAL PROVISIONS

A. With the approval of the US and GVN Project Managers, piaster shifts of up to 20% between budget articles or items may be made without amendment to this agreement.

B. All plans and specifications for construction to be accomplished under this agreement shall be examined and approved by both the GVN and US Project Managers prior to implementation of said construction.

C. The GVN Project Manager will establish a system of delivery, accountability, and related procedures to insure that commodities programmed for the National Police Support Project will be delivered to the intended activity upon receipt by the National Police and that adequate physical facilities and utilities are furnished for such commodities.

D. Title to the commodities procured under this agreement shall pass to the GVN at the time, place, and under the conditions specified below as applicable.

1. Irrespective of Authorized Agent, when project commodities are shipped via the United States Defense Transportation System or APO/FPO mail, title shall pass when delivery is made to an agency of the GVN.

2. Irrespective of Authorized Agent, when project commodities are shipped via commercial carriers or international mail, title shall be vested in the GVN at the time and place of loading/mailling.

E. The dollars provided in block 8d of the face sheet will be converted into piasters by the United States Disbursing Officer (USDO) on an as needed basis up to an amount not to exceed \$424,000 in accordance with the CY71 budget attached. Such piasters will be considered as a grant to the GVN and will be deposited in the Counterpart Special Account. This portion of the funds, obligated in block 8d, will be governed by standard counterpart procedures.

5. Marine Police Activity

In FY 72, 3 US direct hire advisors are to be assigned to this activity. Also, 2 British advisors and 1 US Military advisor will be assigned in FY 72. They will be augmented by PSD field advisors when necessary.

During FY 72 USAID will provide outboard motors, marine maintenance material and engine repair parts not available through CLA/RPD. DOD funds will be requested in FY 72 to procure dry rations for Marine Police personnel on security missions in the delta area.

6. National Police Field Operations Activity

In FY 72, 4 US direct hire advisors will be assigned to this activity. In addition, 5 US military and one British advisor will be assigned in FY 72. Commodity support of NP field elements are included in General Support Activity.

7. General Support Activity

In FY 72, 28 US direct hire advisors will be assigned to this activity to fulfill one project's administrative and management requirements. Included are the Director, Deputy Director, senior staff members, supervisors and program support personnel. Most of these personnel have advisory functions in relations to senior NP counterparts. They also provide management support for the PSD Correction Centers and Telecommunications projects. Also, 1 British and 5 US military advisors will be assigned in FY 72 to this activity.

A. The dollars obligated on prior and subsequent revisions to this Project Agreement will be used to provide personnel services through contract, commodity support, and participant training for this project. Details will be contained in the appropriate implementing documents.

B. The Ministry of Interior agrees to support this project through the normal GVN revenues made available to the Ministry for its operation.

VI. REPORTING AND EVALUATION

The US and GVN Project Managers shall jointly prepare and submit to their respective agencies quarterly progress reports and other reports, as may be requested, in a format mutually acceptable to the GVN and USAID. Distribution will include DGBFA and other GVN agencies, as appropriate. These reports should cover progress in the attainment of specific goals and identify any problems or delays which are deterring progress of the project.

VII. SPECIAL PROVISIONS

A. Any land needed for construction purposes will be financed by the GVN from its own resources. Titles to land sites will be vested in GVN prior to the start of construction.

B. All plans and specifications for construction to be accomplished under this agreement shall be examined and approved by both the GVN and US Project Managers prior to implementation of said construction.

C. The NPC shall provide proper servicing, operation and maintenance of US financed equipment, vehicles, boats, facilities and structures in use or to be procured or constructed for this project.

I. BACKGROUND

In a meeting in late November 1971 attended by the GVN Prime Minister, the Commander, National Police Command (NPC) and the Director, CORDS Public Safety Directorate (CORDS/PSD), the Prime Minister requested that the U.S. support in CY 1972 the total NPC requirement for gasoline and diesel fuel, as is currently done for the Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces (RVNAF). This matter was subsequently brought to the attention of the Acting DEPCORDS/MACV, who concurred in the Prime Minister's request subject to the availability of required funds.

In their CY 1972 GVN budget proposal, the NPC requested VN\$276,445,768 for 31,936,960 liters of gasoline and diesel fuel for operations. The GVN National Assembly reduced this budget item to VN\$235,000,000. The sufficiency of gasoline and diesel fuel for NPC operations has been affected by GVN actions to adjust tax and currency exchange rates. These actions resulted in a substantial increase in the cost of petroleum products. When previously authorized to purchase tax exempt PCL, the NPC purchased gasoline for VN\$7.57 per liter and diesel fuel for VN\$6.02 per liter delivered in Saigon. (The prices varied up to VN\$3.00 per liter additional for delivery outside of Saigon depending on actual delivery location). Gasoline and diesel fuel costs now are approximately VN\$17.00 per liter. The NPC is unable to absorb this increased cost within their limited CY 1972 budget and, as a result, they are unable to provide sufficient gasoline to support the extensive deployment of personnel to rural areas and/or carry out their greatly expanded patrolling requirements. Adequate support of these efforts is essential if the NPC are to achieve their Community Defense and Local Development (CDLD) Plan goals for creating a secure and stable environment within which civil development can progress.

II. DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVE

The provision of PCL to the National Police Command will assist in the attainment of national pacification objectives through the extension and increase of police/security patrols on roads and waterways throughout the Republic of Vietnam, with the resulting increase in nation-wide security and the development and expansion of the civil sector and its supporting economy will be greatly enhanced.

3. National Police Identification and Records (Coordinator: Chief, Police Staff Operations Division, PSD)

Three US direct hire advisors, augmented by field personnel as necessary, will be provided to this activity during FY 71. They will advise and assist the GVN Project Manager in accelerating the registration of all Vietnamese of ages 15 years and older to a target of 4,640,000 during FY 71; training replacement personnel for the ID teams; fingerprinting all civil and military government employees and all war prisoners; and participating in the arrest accountability system, Hoi Chanh Tracking System, and Judicial Police investigative follow-up system.

Commodity support for FY 71 includes fingerprint and identification equipment and photographic supplies. In addition, DOD funds will be requested in FY 71 for the procurement of ID cards and supplies.

4. Training (Coordinator: Chief, Manpower and Training Div. PSD)

A total of 24 US direct hire and 2 British advisors will be assigned to this activity during FY 71. Additional assistance at the local NP unit level will be provided by the regional and area advisors, as necessary. They will advise and assist their NP counterparts in training instructors for the existing and proposed training centers; upgrading and revising training curricula and associated training aids; providing officer and advanced training for 5,600 personnel, specialized training for 4,000 personnel, and basic training for 20,000 personnel; completing the construction, equipping and staffing of training facilities at Cam Ranh, Bien Hoa and Can Tho; constructing the NP Academy at Thu Duc (Phase V), using CY 70 plasters previously committed; and providing for the modification and renovation of the Rach Dua Basic Training Center.

During FY 71, funds will be provided for an estimated 100 participants in academic and non-academic courses. The type of training/duration/place/number of participants follows: Vehicle Maintenance Management, 7 mos/US/2; Criminalistics, 10 mos/US/2; Document Analysis, 12 mos/US/2; Traffic Administration, 9 mos/US/2; Data Processing, 3 mos/US/4; Maritime Law Enforcement, 5 mos/US/3; IPA Police Executive Training, 1 mo/US/7; IPA Senior Officers Course, 4 mos/US/7; IPA General Course (English), 4 mos/US/33; IPA General Course (French), 4 mos/US/6; Logistics Management, 5 mos/US/3; Mechanical Maintenance, 3 mos/US/3; Marine Diesel Maintenance, 5 mos/US/3; Audio Visual Communication, 4 mos/US/1; Boat Handling, 3 mos/US/5; Jail Administration, 5 mos/US/2; and Detention Practices, 1 mo/Taiwan/15. C. National Police Identification and Records (I&R)

This activity will support the Identification Service (IB) of the DGNP in its responsibility for registering and issuing identification cards to all Vietnamese, effectively maintaining the national repository for all fingerprint and other identification documents, and providing technical guidance to and standard operating procedures for all identification and records functions of the NP.

VI. SPECIAL PROVISIONS

A. The National Police Command will designate a Disbursing Officer and establish an Imprest Account specifically for this project. The official designation and name of the Disbursing Officer shall be noted in the space below.

B. Within ten days of this Agreement, USAID/ADFM will transfer to the Prime Minister's Special Fund the sum of VN\$112,800,000 which will then be transferred to the Imprest Account of the National Police Command. (The VN\$112.8 million is one-fourth of the total funding requirement.)

C. The Disbursing Officer of the National Police Command will maintain accounting records for all expenditures made. He will submit a monthly expenditure report to the Prime Minister, USAID/ADFM and CORDS/PSD. Further, he will establish the controls necessary to safeguard all funds. Commencing with the report of expenditures for the month following execution of this Agreement, USAID/ADFM will, at the request of the Commander, NPC, purchase and transfer through the Prime Minister's Special Fund to the Imprest Account of the NPC, an amount equal to the expenditures reported monthly.

D. Upon completion of the project, the Commander, NPC, will present a final statement of finance to the USAID/ADFM and CORDS/PSD and return all remaining funds to the Prime Minister's Office which will return them to USAID/ADFM.

E. The GVN and USAID may conduct audits of expenditures at both the national and province levels as they deem necessary and advisable.

Designation of Disbursing Officer:

Major Kieu Duc Thoi, Chief, Budget & Accounting Service, NPC, is hereby designated as the Disbursing Officer responsible for the funds allocated herein.





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

1. In 1955, at the request of the Government of Vietnam (GVN), the United States Government (USG) began its support of the GVN law enforcement agencies.
2. During the period FY 1955 through FY 1958, the predecessor agencies of USAID furnished support, under contractual arrangements, to the Saigon Metropolitan Police Directorate and the Surete in Saigon and in the then six regions. The USG assistance included advisory support, commodities, participant training and generation of counterpart piasters to supplement the GVN Police budget.
3. In FY 1959, the Office of the Public Safety was established in the predecessor agencies of USAID and assumed the responsibility for program management. Since FY 1959, the USG support has been at various levels depending on the evolutionary stages of development of an effective National Police force.
4. The National Police Support project, as it currently exists, provides assistance to the GVN National Police Command (NPC) under the following three major activities:
 - a. Police operations
 - b. Training
 - c. General support
5. The continuing success of the pacification effort is placing an ever increasing importance on the role of the NPC in providing protection and law and order to the populace. In order to discharge its responsibilities effectively to the people and the government, continued US and GVN resources and support are essential to enable the NPC to recruit, train, organize, equip, administer and maintain a force capable of achieving its objectives.

B. GOAL STATEMENT

The goal of the Public Safety sector, under which this project is assigned, is to develop viable civil institutions for the GVN which will be capable of maintaining internal security and enforcing law and order in the Republic of Vietnam (RVN).

b. Training Activity

(b) DOD commodity support will consist of: uniform materials and accessories, dry rations, individual and organizational equipment, barrier materials, dry cell batteries, parts and tools for weapons and vehicles, construction material, IBM equipment and supplies, black light, and other security related commodities in support of the NPC.

(3) Other Costs - Under the AID/DOD Realignment Program, DOD dollar funds will be made available to purchase plasters to finance the NPC CY 1973 AAC budget. 2. The US and GVN Project Managers will prepare jointly an annual evaluation of the project based on the criteria set forth in this Agreement.

I. SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. All plans and specifications for construction to be accomplished under this Agreement shall be approved by both the GVN and US Project Managers prior to implementation of construction.

2. The GVN Project Manager will establish a system of delivery, accountability, and related procedures to insure that commodities programmed for the National Police Support project will be delivered to the intended activity upon receipt by the NPC and that adequate physical facilities and utilities are furnished for such commodities.

3. Title to the commodities procured under this Agreement shall pass to the GVN at the time, place, and under the conditions specified below, as applicable:

a. Irrespective of authorized agent, when project commodities are shipped via the United States Defense Transportation System or APO/FPO mail, title shall vest in the United States Government until such commodities are unloaded and received by an agent of the GVN. At the time such commodities are unloaded and received, title shall pass to the GVN.

b. Irrespective of authorized agent, when project commodities are shipped via commercial carriers or international mail, title shall be vested in the GVN at the time and place of loading/mailling.

4. The GVN Project Manager will insure that individuals selected for participant training satisfy course prerequisites as outlined in the Public Safety Training Program Guide. Also, the GVN Project Manager agrees that, upon completion of training, returned participants will be retained in the employ of the NPC for three (3) years in command or supervisory positions equal to or higher than the positions they held on departure for training.

A. As used herein, the term «AID» refers to the Agency for International Development, any component agency, or any successor agency. References to «this Project Agreement» shall mean the original Project Agreement as modified by any revisions which have entered into effect.

B. (x) AID will make available the amounts specified in Block 8 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may be further described in Annex A, as required by Block 5 hereof. In addition, as may be further specified in Annex A, AID will, subject to the availability of funds and (where required by AID procedures) as provided for in Project Implementation Orders (PIOs) issued by AID in accordance with its procedures, make available funds (a) to pay costs of furnishing technical services to be performed by United States Government employees in connection with the project, (b) to pay a share of the costs of providing training outside the cooperating country in connection with the project for qualified persons from the cooperating country, and (c) to pay such additional costs as may be specified.

(a) The Cooperating Government Agency will make available the amounts specified in Block 9 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may further be described in Annex A. The Cooperating Government Agency will also make, or arrange to have made, additional contributions of property, services, facilities and funds required for carrying out the project as may be specified in Annex A, or as may subsequently be agreed upon by the two parties.

C. AID and the Cooperating Agency may obtain the assistance of other public and private agencies in carrying out their respective obligations under this Project Agreement. The two parties may agree to accept contributions of property, services, facilities and funds for purposes of this Project Agreement from other public and private agencies, and may agree upon the participation of any such third party in carrying out activities under this Project Agreement.

D. AID shall not be required to make any contribution after the expiration of six months following the estimated final contribution date (Block 13 of the Project Agreement form AID 1330-1) or any amended final contribution date specified herein. Except as otherwise specified herein or subsequently

agreed by the parties, all contributions of the Cooperating Agency pursuant to this Project Agreement shall be made on or before said estimated termination date, or amended date. A contribution of goods or services shall be considered to have been made when the goods or services, provided or financed by the contributing party, are delivered in accordance with commercial practice.

E. The procurement of commodities and contract services to be financed in whole or in part by AID may (where so required by AID procedures) be undertaken only pursuant to PIOs issued by AID in accordance with its procedures.

F. Unless otherwise specified in the applicable PIO, the procurement of commodities financed with the AID contribution referred to in Block 8 of this Project Agreement shall be subject to the provisions of AID Regulation 2.

G. Unless otherwise specified in the applicable PIO, title to all property procured through financing by AID pursuant to Block 8 (c) of this Project Agreement shall be in the Cooperating Agency, or such public or private agency as it may authorize. This provision is inapplicable to any property which may be used in connection with the project but is not financed pursuant to said Block 8 (c).

H. Any property furnished to either party through financing by the other party pursuant to this Project Agreement shall, unless otherwise agreed by the party which financed the procurement, be devoted to the project until completion of the project, and thereafter shall be used so as to further the objectives sought in carrying out the project. Funds in the Special Account may be used only as agreed upon by AID and the Cooperating Agency; provided, that such portion of the funds in the Special Account as may be designated by AID shall be made available to AID to meet the requirements of the United States.

B. (x) AID will make available the amounts specified in Block 8 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may be further described in Block 5 hereof.

(a) The Cooperating Agency will make available the amounts specified in Block 9 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may further be described in Block 5 hereof. The Cooperating Agency will also make, or arrange to have made, additional contributions of property, services, facilities and funds required for carrying out the project as may be specified in Block 5 hereof or as may subsequently be agreed upon by the two parties.

C. AID and the Cooperating Agency may obtain the assistance of other public and private agencies in carrying out their respective obligations under this Project Agreement. The two parties may agree to accept contributions of property, services, facilities and funds for purposes of this Project Agreement from other public and private agencies, and may agree upon the participation of any such third party in carrying out activities under this Project Agreement.

D. All contributions of AID pursuant to this Project Agreement shall be made within a six months grace period extending beyond the estimated final contribution date specified herein. Except as otherwise specified herein or subsequently agreed by the two parties, all contributions of the Cooperating Agency pursuant to this Project Agreement shall be made on or before that same date. A contribution of goods or services shall be considered to have been made when the goods or services, provided or financed by the contributing party, are delivered in accordance with commercial practice.

E. The procurement of commodities and contract services to be financed with an AID contribution of currency other than that of the United States or of the Cooperating Country shall be subject to all provisions of, and regulations governing, Foreign Currency Authorizations issued by AID.

F. AID reimbursements or advances shall, in general, not exceed the amount obtained by applying the ratio of AID to Cooperating Agency contributions specified in the Project Agreement to the amount currently contributed by the Cooperating Agency. For example, if the Project Agreement provides for total contributions of \$400,000 by AID and \$600,000 by the Cooperating Agency and if the Cooperating Agency has currently contributed \$6,000 then AID will, in general, reimburse or advance no more than \$4,000. Commodities and services financed with an AID contribution of local currency shall be subject to the following requirements:

(x) Reimbursement

As mutually agreed between AID and the Cooperating Agency, either of the following methods may be employed for reimbursement by AID of local currency expenditures made by the Cooperating Agency:

(a) Direct Reimbursement

Once monthly or at such other intervals as may be mutually agreed between AID and the Cooperating Agency, AID will reimburse the Cooperating Agency for local currency expenditures made by the Cooperating Agency in the procurement of approved project requirements. Each such claim for reimbursement must be supported by the following documentation:

- (i) Public Voucher, SF-1094, signed by the properly accredited representative of the Cooperating Agency, and embodying the following additional certification: «The total amount claimed hereunder was expended for the purposes authorized in Project Agreement N° _____ and is supported by the documentation required by said Project Agreement on file in the Cooperating Agency».
- (ii) A report in the format prescribed by the AID Controller, certified as true and accurate by the properly accredited representative of the Cooperating Agency, in support of each such claim for reimbursement.

(b) Advances

Once monthly or at such other intervals as may be mutually agreed upon between AID and the Cooperating Agency, AID may advance local currency to the Cooperating Agency for operating purposes. The

Initial advance will be in an amount agreed upon between AID and the Cooperating Agency as necessary to cover estimated project expenditures for a specified time period, and will be supported by a budget developed and approved by both AID and the Cooperating Agency. All expenditures made by the Cooperating Agency against such advances must be supported by the documentation prescribed in paragraph (c) (i) above and such documentation in support of the final expenditures of the Cooperating Agency must be submitted to AID not later than 90 days after the date of the final expenditure.

(2) Documentation

With respect to all AID contributed local currency made available to it, the Cooperating Agency agrees to maintain a separate set of accounts for all transactions financed or to be financed, and the Cooperating Agency further agrees to obtain and retain in its files, for inspection and review by AID at any time as requested by AID, the documents listed below in support of each transaction financed with such funds.

(a) Commodity Transactions :

- (i) Applicable contract or purchase order between supplier and purchaser;
- (ii) Supplier's detailed invoice and satisfactory evidence of payment;
- (iii) Ocean or inland bill of lading, or other document evidencing delivery to the purchaser;
- (iv) Such additional documentation (e.g. inspection certificate) as may be required from the supplier by the purchaser.

(b) Contract Services Transactions :

- (i) Applicable contract between contractor and purchaser;
- (ii) Contractor's detailed invoice and satisfactory evidence of payment;
- (iii) A certificate by the Cooperating Agency as follows: "The undersigned certifies that the services for which reimbursement is requested have been satisfactorily rendered and the costs thereof

(c) Payroll Costs :

One copy of certified payroll listings and vouchers, together with satisfactory evidence of payment. Each payroll listing must show for each employee at least the following data: name, applicable job title, salary or wage rate, period covered, and amount paid.

(d) Other Project Costs :

One copy of the appropriate authorization documents and invoices covering travel, utility costs, etc.

(3) Refund Provision :

With respect to AID contributed local currency made available to the Cooperating Agency under the methods of financing herein described, the Cooperating Agency agrees to refund promptly to AID, upon demand by AID and pursuant to AID instructions, the entire amount of such currency expended by the Cooperating Agency (or such lesser amount as AID may demand) whenever AID determines that such expenditure was improper as being in violation of the terms and conditions of this Project Agreement and/or any applicable agreement or arrangement between AID and the Cooperating Agency.
