


ARTICLE I - OBJECTIVE

To assist the Peruvian Multisectorial Commission for the Infrastructure Works Program with Food Support in the Pueblos Jóvenes of Lima and Callao (of which the Ministry of Housing and Construction is the lead agency) to plan, program and coordinate the actions of the referenced program.

ARTICLE II - STATEMENT OF WORK

A. Background

As a result of a study conducted by the Office of Development Support/Housing of AID/W, USAID/Peru designed a technical assistance program to assist the GOP in the planning, programming and coordination of integrated infrastructure and other services for Lima's pueblos jovenes.

Since the study was completed: (1) the GOP has created a Multisectorial Commission chaired by the Ministry of Housing and Construction (MOHC) and integrated by high level officials of the Ministries of Health, Education, Agriculture, Economy and Finance and the National Planning Institute. The Commission is charged with focusing on Lima - Callao pueblos jovenes to: (a) establish geographic priorities for implementing upgrading and services projects based upon service deficits, (b) review and approve multisectorial plans, and (c) define policy guidelines for effective multisectorial planning; (2) the Office of Development Support/Housing has entered into a contract with a consulting firm to provide 25 days of U.S. senior level urban planner and senior level social planner. This team will assist the Multisectorial Commission in: (a) Priority Setting: To determine how and in which pueblos jovenes the Commission should invest resources; and (b) Neighborhood Upgrading: To develop a preliminary analytical framework to be used in conducting neighborhood studies and designing individual neighborhood plans. The planners will provide the Multisectorial Commission with reports that suggest the parameters to be considered in developing a metropolitan wide study to determine which communities should get resources. The technicians will also prepare a report delineating parameters for a model neighborhood upgrading plan that would identify the kinds of issues that need to be considered in developing plans for individual neighborhoods.

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B. Responsibilities and Contribution of the Parties

1. USAID/Peru:

Under this agreement USAID/Peru will contract highly qualified Peruvians to further develop the study on metropolitan overview that identifies neighborhoods that should participate in upgrading program; will adapt proposed U.S. consultant neighborhood upgrading approach, will also provide limited ongoing technical assistance to Commission during the first year of activities, to conduct field work and to further design and help the Commission carry out neighborhood upgrading plans for up to nine participating communities during the first year. Funds will also be used to procure local materials (e.g. maps, aerial photos, reports, etc.).

Funds provided by AID for this purpose will not exceed the amount of US\$83,800. Subject to the availability of funds, and to the mutual agreement of the parties to proceed, AID will provide additional funds during the second year of activities.

2. Government of Peru (GOP):

The GOP has made available to the Multisectorial Commission US\$2.0 million in Title I (P.L. 480) resources for infrastructure projects, with the understanding that a similar or greater amount in Title I funding will be made available in future years, plus Commission and participating Ministries staff time.

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
