

## I INTRODUCTION

The African Graduate Fellowship Program (AFGRAD), administered by the African-American Institute (AAI), is a cooperative effort of the Council of Graduate Schools in the United States (CGS), the African-American Institute, the Agency for International Development (AID) and the participating African governments. The aim of the program is to offer quality graduate education for selected African students in order to prepare those individuals to assume high level positions of responsibility in the service of their governments, their national universities or the private sector.

The AFGRAD Program was launched in March 1963 when Dr. Gustave O. Arlt, the President of the Council of Graduate Schools in the United States, appealed to the member institutions of the Council to participate in the AFGRAD Program by providing tuition and fee scholarships or waivers for the successful candidates. By September 1963 23 AFGRAD Fellowships to 18 graduate schools were awarded to candidates from eight African countries. During the 14-year period from 1963 through 1976, the AFGRAD I Program provided 1,301 graduate awards to participants from 33 African countries.

In January 1977 the African-American Institute and the Agency for International Development, in recognition of the continuing need for U.S.-based graduate training for African manpower development, signed Contract AID/afr-C-1292 for the AFGRAD II Program. As a component of the AID's African Manpower Development Project, Contract AID/afr-c-1292 provided 360 AFGRAD II Fellowships over the four year period from 1977 to 1980.

The AFGRAD II Program was continued under Cooperative Agreement No. AFR-0433-A-00-2034-00 which provided 330 additional AFGRAD Fellowships over the four year period from 1981 through 1985. This Cooperative Agreement also included a component for undergraduate scholarships for students from Cape Verde, Guinea Bissau, and Sao Tome & Principe, titled the Development Education for Portuguese-speaking Africa (DEPSA) Program.

The AFGRAD II Program continued the cooperative effort established by AFGRAD I, in which the African governments nominated the candidates for awards and paid for their round-trip international transportation (except for countries classified as "relatively least developed", which contributed only one-way fares). The receiving American universities provided tuition waivers or scholarships to the AFGRAD Fellows, who are selected from among the government nominees by a panel of graduate deans representing the Council of Graduate Schools in the United States (CGS). The Agency for International Development granted funds to the AAI to meet student costs and to administer and coordinate the entire AFGRAD effort, including selection, placement, academic and social counseling, financial disbursements and visa sponsorship. The program is administered by the AFGRAD Secretariat in AAI's New York office with extensive assistance from AAI's field representatives during the recruitment, repatriation and follow-up phases of programming. Appendix A includes a list of the AFGRAD Secretariat, the AAI Program Representatives and the AFGRAD Executive Committee of Graduate Deans.

The Executive Committee of Graduate Deans, whose membership is drawn from the CGS, has played a major role in the success of the AFGRAD Programs. This committee helps the program maintain its close liaison with American universities and provides guidance to AAI on AFGRAD program policy and issues related to U.S. higher education. Members of this committee accompany AFGRAD program staff on annual trips to Africa to discuss manpower development needs with government and university officials, and to participate on the national selection committees. The AFGRAD Deans' Committee meets in New York in January each year to review all dossiers and make recommendation on the applications. This close collaboration with the CGS has ensured quality selection, appropriate graduate placement at member institutions, and financial contributions, in the form of tuition and fee waivers or grants, by the host institutions.

This is the final report for Cooperative Agreement No. AFR-0433-A-2034-00 which ended September 30, 1988. The report covers both phases of AFGRAD II including the 360 awards made under the previous contract.

## II THE AFGRAD II PROGRAM

### A. COUNTRY PARTICIPATION

The AFGRAD II Program, as a component of the African Manpower Development Project, required that the USAID Missions in Africa consult annually with host government officials to identify country training needs and submit reports on the country's training priorities to AID/Washington. These reports were then reviewed in Washington by the Office of Regional Affairs (AFR/RA) and the AAI, and were used to establish AFGRAD quotas for each participating country for that year. The number of AFGRAD awards available varied from 80 to 100 per year and Mission requests far exceeded that total.

Under the AFGRAD I Program six countries (Cameroon, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Nigeria and Uganda) received over 60% of the AFGRAD Fellowships. Under the AFGRAD II Program an effort was made to distribute the awards evenly between Anglophone and Francophone countries. Of the 690 awards made under the AFGRAD II Program, 346 or 50% were made to Anglophone countries, 336 or 49% to Francophone countries and 8 awards to Lusophone countries. In contrast, under the AFGRAD I Program, only 25 percent of the awards (326 out of 1,301) were made to Francophone countries, including 8 awards to Morocco and 26 to Tunisia, countries which were ineligible for participation in the AFGRAD II Program. As an OPEC country, Nigeria, which benefitted greatly from AFGRAD I, was also ineligible to participate.

The distribution of the AFGRAD II awards by country is provided in Table I below.

B. FIELDS OF STUDY AND DEGREE OBJECTIVES

The priority training areas under the AFGRAD II program were identified as agriculture, education, health, rural development, public administration, economic planning and management. Table II below is the distribution of AFGRAD II awards by field of study. Over 75% of the AFGRAD II awards were made in agriculture, economics, business administration, education and engineering.

The distribution of AFGRAD II awards by degree level is summarized in Table III below. Although 39 awards were made for combined Masters/Doctoral programs in Waves I-III, there were no awards made for successive degrees in Waves IV through VIII as a result of notification from AID/Washington, and subsequent amendment to the contract, that the AFGRAD Program can no longer fund consecutive degree programs as was possible under the AFGRAD I Program for Fellows who were to become university faculty.

Of the 690 AFGRAD II awards, 546 or 79.1 percent of the awards were for Master's degrees. However, this apparent emphasis on Master's level training may be more indicative of the terms of the contract rather than lack of interest or need for doctoral level training as an additional 69 of those who received Master's degrees under AFGRAD II, remained in the United States for Ph.D. programs with other funding.

C. PARTICIPATION BY WOMEN

Under AFGRAD II 127 of the awards, or 18 percent, were made to women candidates. While we have yet to achieve an equitable distribution of awards to women, this represents a significant increase over the AFGRAD I Program under which only 7.4 percent (96 out of 1,301) were made to women. Table IV shows the women participants by country. Only 8 of the 37 countries which participated in the AFGRAD II Program did not send at least one woman AFGRAD Fellow.

D. PROGRAM COMPLETIONS AND REPATRIATIONS

As of September 30, 1988, 658 AFGRAD II Fellows had terminated their AID-sponsored AFGRAD programs. The 32 remaining AFGRAD II Fellows were transferred to AFGRAD III funding to complete their degree programs. Of these 32, 12 have now completed their academic programs while 20 are current AFGRAD III Fellows.

The AFGRAD program continues to have an outstanding academic success rate. Of the 670 AFGRAD II Fellows who have concluded their AFGRAD Fellowships, 621 (92.7%) were program graduates who achieved their original degree objective and only 49 (7.3%) were program withdrawals.

Twenty-five of these students are continuing their studies in the United States with AID approval and under AFGRAD visa sponsorship. Thus, there are 645 AFGRAD Fellows for whom both financial and visa sponsorship has been terminated.

As 563 of these 645 participants have returned to Africa, the repatriation rate for the AFGRAD II Program is currently 87.2%. Of those who have not yet returned to Africa, 19 are pursuing further studies with alternate financial and visa sponsorship, 1 is in Saudi Arabia and 1 in New Guinea, 32 are known to be living in the United States and the whereabouts of 29 is unknown. It is expected that the repatriation rate will approach 90% as those who are pursuing further studies complete their programs and return to Africa.

Appendix C gives the distribution of the AFGRAD II Fellows by country. Appendix D is a listing of all AFGRAD II Fellows including the most recent employment information available in the files.

### III. THE DEPSA PROGRAM

#### A. Background

Under the Development Training Program for Portuguese-speaking Africa (DTPSA) 360 scholarships for undergraduate and technical training in Africa, Portugal and the United States were granted to the Lusophone countries in Africa. The last intake under the DTPSA Program was in 1979. After an interruption of approximately two years in the granting of scholarships to Portuguese-speaking Africa other than through bilateral projects and AFGRAD, AAI was awarded the cooperative agreement for the AFGRAD II Program which included a component for under-graduate scholarships to Cape Verde, Guinea Bissau, and Sao Tome & Principe. Under this cooperative agreement training was to be provided for undergraduate studies in the United States only.

#### B. STATISTICAL SUMMARY

Under the DEPSA Program there were three years of intake, FY 1982 to FY 1984, for a total of 47 undergraduate awards. Cape Verde received 20 awards; Guinea Bissau, 18; and Sao Tome & Principe, 9. Of the DEPSA awards, almost half of the awards, 22 out of 47, or 46.8% were made to women.

The majority of the participants were nominated for agricultural-related programs, following the development priorities established by the home governments and the USAID-funded activities being implemented in those countries. Table V shows the distribution of awards by field of study.

C. COMPLETIONS AND REPATRIATIONS

As detailed in Appendix F, 30 of the 39 DEPSA students who have completed their programs have returned to Africa for a repatriation rate of 76.9%. Three of the DEPSA students are completing their undergraduate programs under funding from the AFGRAD III program and five are pursuing further studies with the approval of the USAID Mission and with AAI visa sponsorship.

Of the 42 who have completed their DEPSA undergraduate programs, 36 have done so successfully and 6 have been program withdrawals for a success for of 85.7%.

IV. CONCLUSION

From the foregoing text and tables and the appendices that follow, it is evident that the AFGRAD II Program has continued impressively in the tradition of its predecessor. The repatriation and academic success rates for both the graduate and the undergraduate components are high. Progress has also been made in the participation of women in these programs.

These efforts are continuing under the AFGRAD III Program which mandates 30 percent participation by women as well as greater private sector involvement. The AFGRAD III Program has an added short-term postgraduate component as well as continuing the undergraduate and graduate components of AFGRAD II.
