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FINAL REPORT

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Summary

CEELI's Proposal for Additional Support for the Legal System in Kosovo, submitted September 2000, outlined one primary activity to be supported by the grant: CEELI would directly support the efforts of the United Nations Mission In Kosovo (UNMIK) to establish a functional, independent system of justice in Kosovo.

Specifically, CEELI would use the funds under this award to support its ongoing activities (funded through a USAID grant) supporting rule of law development in Kosovo. This grant supported CEELI's enhancement of the capacity of its Secretariat to provide technical support for UNMIK-sponsored legal institutions, notably the Joint Advisory Council on Legislative Matters (JAC/LM) with translation, administrative, and research support on legislative matters. CEELI engaged UNMIK legal institutions to ameliorate legislative efforts in Kosovo through the provision of specialized legal expertise, the creation of novel legal research tools, and the encouragement of public consultations.

Below are highlights of CEELI's work in each of these areas during the grant period. Detailed information on CEELI activities and impact for this period is included in the quarterly reports submitted to USAID and also attached here.

The CEELI Legislative Secretariat

During the grant period, CEELI was an active member of the Executive Board of the Joint Advisory Council for Legislative Matters (JAC/LM). The primary projects undertaken by the JAC/LM during this period were the revision of the criminal code and criminal procedure code. Some focus was also placed on the Minor Offences and Juvenile Justice codes with an eye toward their complete revision during the fall of 2001 and early in 2002 (outside the grant period).

By the end of the grant period, the JAC/LM completed its revision of the criminal code, pursuant to the recommendations it received from CEELI and the Council of Europe. This draft was then sent to the Council of Europe headquarters for further review. During this period, the JAC/LM also drafted legislation addressing juvenile justice, travel and identification documents, gender, and commercial issues. CEELI also provided members of the JAC/LM with training in legislative drafting.

In addition to substantive legal support, by the end of the grant period, CEELI formalized the provision of additional assistance to the JAC/LM through the continued development and enhancement of the CEELI Legislative Secretariat. This office provides the administrative support integral to the work of the JAC/LM, including translation and interpretation services, documentation and distribution of the minutes of JAC/LM meetings, and constant revision of all working drafts of new legislation to incorporate comments and suggested changes. By the end of the grant period, the CEELI Secretariat was providing the JAC/LM with new, improved meeting space, regular transportation, improved translation support, supplemental distribution services, and other general administrative support.

1. Legal Drafting and Analysis

Objective: Support the development of a body of law acceptable to local legal professionals, as well as to the international community; provide training on legislative drafting; and establish a legislative secretariat to provide basic administrative support for the drafting process.

Criminal and Criminal Procedure codes

Throughout the grant period, the JAC/LM worked diligently on revising the Criminal and Criminal Procedure codes, while simultaneously providing comment to the UNMIK legal advisor on those regulations the legal advisor chose to forward to the JAC/LM for review. JAC/LM members and principal drafters and revisers of the criminal and criminal procedure codes, Professors Salihu and Sahiti respectively, worked with the CEELI Secretariat and Council of Europe experts Zoran Klemencic and Peter Pavlin of Slovenia to revise the two codes. The drafting process involved small group meetings between the professors (separately) and Messrs. Klemencic and/or Pavlin; when available, members of the JAC criminal working group also attend. These meetings were facilitated, translated, and hosted by the CEELI Secretariat. The CEELI Secretariat also summarized these meetings, incorporated changes, and helped the working group staff to correct translation issues.

Once the drafting was complete, the Secretariat staff worked daily with the two professors and the COE experts to integrate the changes and ensure that the English and Albanian versions matched. Then, CEELI coordinated the production and distribution of copies of the codes to the Supreme Court, District Court Presidents, prosecutors' offices, police organizations, various

UNMIK entities, KFOR, Chamber of Advocates, and Judges Association for comments. Once the comments were received, the Secretariat collated them, produced a collection of comments, and again supported the final revision process.

Regulations

Also throughout the grant period, the JAC/LM would regularly consider and comment upon draft regulations forwarded by the UNMIK Office of Legal Adviser. Too often the Legal Adviser allowed for insufficient time, given known UNMIK deadlines for enactment of draft regulations, for full consideration of various regulations. However, JAC/LM members labored significantly to provide substantive comment within the imposed deadlines. Regularly, the CEELI Secretariat would be called upon, under significant time pressure, to translate and distribute such commentary. Only through the timely and energetic translation and administrative support of the Secretariat, was the JAC/LM able to provide as much substantive commentary as it did.

During the grant period, CEELI Foreign Legal Counsel Alma Saliu , along with the Secretariat, collaborated with counterparts at the European Union (EU), OSCE, UNMIK, and the World Bank, working to create a legal framework and building institutions to foster economic development in Kosovo. CEELI provided analysis and expertise in the area of economic and commercial law development, specifically on a draft bankruptcy law. The Secretariat also helped to facilitate meetings with national and international commercial experts from the EU on the draft commercial regulations and provided translation services for a workshop presentation on the draft Regulation on Business Organizations.

Other translation efforts

The Secretariat completed revision of a translation into English of the FRY Law on Administrative Procedure and Law on Non-Contested Procedure in anticipation of the JAC completing work on the criminal and criminal procedure codes. These translations were provided to the UNMIK Department of Judicial Affairs.

Other coordination and general support efforts

The head of the CEELI Secretariat, Foreign Legal Counsel Brikena Hoxha, together with her staff attempted to organize efforts to improve translation capacity in Kosovo, especially as they relate to legal matters. The Secretariat and representatives of other international organizations created an *ad hoc* Working Group on Coordination of Translation to make suggestions that would lead to the preparation of a regulation on interpreters/translators requirements and, thereby, the establishment of qualification standards. These ideas were taken under advisement by UNMIK, but have not yet been acted upon.

2. Legal Index of UNMIK Legal Acts

Objective: Develop a system of classifying and indexing new laws and track amendments; ensure that this system is user-friendly, free of charge, widely distributed, available electronically, and available to all those interested in legal reform in Kosovo in the three major languages in use in Kosovo: English, Albanian, and Serbian.

CEELI initially prepared and, subsequently, updated quarterly and annually its *Cumulative Index* of UNMIK regulations. Quarterly, the *Index* was prepared and distributed in Albanian and English. Once available, the *Index* was distributed in English and Albanian with copies of the Official Gazette/*Fletorja Zyrtare* (prepared by UNMIK). CEELI coordinated with UNMIK's Department of Judicial Affairs International Judicial Support Section (DJA/IJSS) to distribute the English version of CEELI's *Cumulative Index* for 1999 – 2000 to all international judges and prosecutors. CEELI also distributed the *Index* at each of the judges' association meetings.

The Serbian translation of the *Cumulative Index* was completed in 2001.

The Secretariat initiated discussions with the UNMIK Press and Public Information Office in the Department of Justice regarding the creation of a website for legal information, including all UNMIK regulations and administrative directions. This website could also potentially provide links to judicial decisions to the extent that they are available. Unfortunately, throughout the grant period, CEELI labored to gain access to UNMIK's official versions of applicable laws, UNMIK regulations and administrative directions, and other pertinent legal documents. Ostensibly, these documents were publicly available; in reality, UNMIK staff would often check with more senior staff before releasing hard copies, much less electronic versions. Eventually, CEELI managed to obtain electronic copies of many regulations in all three languages and distributed a CD ROM containing these statutes. Consequently, the UNMIK Department of Public Service brought on line a website containing many more regulations than were originally available on the regular UNMIK website. Still, not all applicable regulations were available publicly and the DPS website continued to experience regular problems.

3. Public Participation

Objective: Advocate in favor of increased public participation in the process of legislative drafting and propose a system for accomplishing this goal.

In anticipation of the SRSG's plans to establish a working group to draft a Legal Framework for planned province-wide elections in November 2001, CEELI sought opportunities to facilitate public participation in this process. During the grant period, CEELI worked closely with the Co-head of the Joint Administrative Department for Democratic Governance and Civil Society (DDGCS) and USAID to develop strategy for public participation in the law making process in Kosovo. CEELI drafted an initial concept paper on public participation and submitted it to representatives of USAID and OSCE to assist them in their efforts to promote this idea with UNMIK.

Ultimately, UNMIK decided against any public participation efforts. CEELI continues its efforts to encourage public participation with respect to regulations and the future work of the Legislative Assembly of Kosovo, once it is constituted following the November elections.

Program: Rule of Law

During the reporting period, CEELI posted two new Foreign Legal Counsel and its In-Country Country Director in the Kosovo office. Alma Saliu joined CEELI in October. Ms. Saliu has extensive background in conducting legal reform projects in cooperation with international organizations. She has been providing expertise to the JAC on commercial issues and is working on the creation of the judges' association. Brixhena Hoxha joined CEELI in November as the Director of the Secretariat. Ms. Hoxha received her legal training at the University of Tirana and most recently worked for a firm in Canada.

Project One: Legal Training and Materials

Judges and Prosecutors

In November, CEELI, in conjunction with its training partners, conducted three seminars for the judges and prosecutors appointed in June 2000. CEELI liaisons Ed Villmoare and Sheryl Goldstein served as facilitators for the plenary sessions and as moderators of numerous small group workshops. The participants received training in general legal skills, the applicable law, and international fair trial standards. As of the end of the reporting period, all judges and prosecutors appointed by the Special Representative of the Secretary General have received training in the applicable law and international human rights standards, particularly the articles of the European Convention on Human Rights pertaining to due process.

CEELI has continued its involvement in the *ad hoc* task force formed to encourage cooperation and avoid duplication in rule of law and legal training activities. Representatives of CEELI, OSCE, Council of Europe (CoE), ICTY, and the recently-constituted Ombudsman's office regularly attend. As of the end of the reporting period, this group was reviewing the proposed KJI training schedule for the first quarter of 2001.

In response to requests from the local legal community, CEELI and the US Department of Justice Resident Legal Advisors are exploring the potential for a seminar on organized crime for judges and prosecutors. The proposed training would be developed in collaboration with the Kosovo Judicial Institute (KJI). CEELI intends to discuss this proposal further with the US Department of Justice and the Director of the CEELI/DOJ program.

Training for Defense Counsel

Ed Villmoare and Sheryl Goldstein delivered a redesigned Defense Counsel Training seminar in Peja on December 8-9, 2000. Twenty-four lawyers attended the training of which seventeen were defense counsel, five were judges and four were prosecutors. The new training package addressed problems identified in the OSCE Report, "Kosovo: A Review of the Criminal Justice System, 1 February 2000 - 1 July 2000", human rights standards, OSCE's new Office of Defense, an introduction to the Office of Ombudsperson, and an overview of the new draft Code of Criminal Procedure, currently being discussed in the JAC.

CEELI was able to obtain the services of Professor Ejup Sahiti, drafter of the new Criminal and Criminal Procedure Codes, to serve as an expert on local law. Andreana Esposito, from the Council of Europe, served as an international expert. Professor Sahiti's lecture on the FRY Code of Criminal Procedure and the dramatic changes that would result from the new draft code was well received by the participants. Ms. Esposito, a research scholar at the University of Naples and former law clerk at the Hague Tribunal, made an extremely valuable presentation on Articles 5 and 6 of the European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR).

A final training session for attorneys from Gjilan and Mitrovica is currently scheduled for Spring 2001.

Project Two: Judges' Association

Ed Villmoare and Alma Saliu met with Judge Xhevat Bici, the author of the draft statute for the Judges' Association of Kosovo to discuss the draft statute and develop a comprehensive plan for forming the association. CEELI raised concerns with the Judge regarding the proposed structure of the association as outlined in the draft statute. The judges are compiling comments and recommendations from judges in each of the districts in order to further revise the statute.

A meeting of representatives of Kosovo's five judicial districts, the Supreme Court, the municipal courts, and the Commercial Court is scheduled for January 2001. The draft action plan calls for the association to have an operating office by May 2001. The association will need initial resources in cash or kind to operate a small office until the association can operate independently on dues collected from the judges.

Project Three: Legal Drafting and Analysis

With the draft Criminal Code under review by the Council of Europe, the Joint Advisory Committee on Legislative Matters (JAC) has begun revising the draft Criminal Procedure Code. The original draft of the Criminal Procedure Code created in Fall 1999 has been discarded and a new draft is under development. One focus of the discussions regarding the new draft is the role of investigating judge. CEELI continued to participate in meetings of the JAC and provide expertise on redrafting the Criminal Procedure Code. During the reporting period, CEELI also assisted in the revision of the regulations on Foreign Investments; Pledges; and the Sale of Goods

Through its Secretariat, CEELI continued to facilitate the flow of communication regarding draft legislation between international legal experts and the drafters of the new legislation. CEELI translated and distributed the following areas materials:

- Working Group on Mental Health recommendations on the Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure Law
- Working Group on Mental Health comments on Trafficking and Domestic Violence regulations
- Council of Europe comments on the Criminal Law provisions, drafted by the working groups of OSCE, related to juvenile justice, domestic violence, mental health and economics
- Council of Europe comments on the draft Labor Law
- OSCE's memorandum commenting on the chapter on Crimes against Sexual Integrity of the draft Criminal Law
- UNMIK Program for the Development of Economic Law summaries and explanatory notes on the Regulation on the Contract of Sales of Goods and the Regulation of Business Organization
- Local experts comments prepared for the workshop on Privatization and Property in Kosovo
- Local expert summaries and presentations prepared for the conference "Joint Advisory Council on Legislative Matters and New Legislation for Kosovo"

In addition, the Secretariat provided translation/interpretation, prepared agendas and participant lists, and kept and distributed minutes for all JAC meetings during the reporting period.

CEELI continued to maintain its *Cumulative Index* of UNMIK regulations, in Albanian and English. CEELI expects to have the Serbian translation of the *Cumulative Index* completed in early 2001. The Secretariat has begun discussions with the UNMIK Press and Public Information Office in the Department of Justice regarding the creation of a website for legal information, including all UNMIK regulations and administrative directions. This website could also potentially provide links to judicial decisions to the extent that they are available.

Commercial Law

Ms. Saliu has created links with counterparts at the European Union (EU), OSCE, UNMIK, and the World Bank who are focusing on creating a legal framework and building institutions to foster economic development in Kosovo. Ms. Saliu is representing CEELI by providing analysis and expertise in the area of economic and commercial law development.

Ms. Saliu was also invited to join the UNMIK Program for the Development of Economic Law to provide expertise and assistance on the draft bankruptcy law. CEELI is the only nongovernmental organization that has been invited to join the working group. Ms. Saliu will continue to work with UNMIK to finalizing the draft that will be presented to the JAC.

CEELI has also been instrumental in getting local input and increasing transparency with respect to the new economic legislation. Ms. Saliu has established links with local Kosovar experts in the economic field, including judges from the Economic Court in Prishtina, professors of the Law Faculty, and members of the Chamber of Commerce in Prishtina to gather their input on the new draft economic regulations.

The Secretariat helped to facilitate meetings with national and international commercial experts from the EU, about the draft commercial regulations and provided translation services for a workshop presentation on the draft Regulation on Business Organizations.

Gender Issues

Sheryl Goldstein has been serving as a member of the Domestic Violence Working Group run by OSCE. The working group will be drafting domestic violence regulations and conducting public education and outreach on women's rights and domestic violence. CEELI is collaborating with two working groups to develop training material for victim advocates and police to assist women who are victims of domestic violence. These trainings will be implemented in concert with local NGO's in Peje and Gjilane.

Project Four: University of Prishtina Faculty of Law

During the reporting period, the Faculty of Law of the University of Prishtina officially adopted the new law school curriculum. This curriculum call for a three-year bachelor of laws program and a four-year master of laws program with specialization in commercial law, criminal law, administrative law, or international law.

The Kosovo Law Center has sought assistance from CEELI to address the material needs of the law school, the relationship between the new curriculum and the bar exam currently being developed by the Department of Justice at UNMIK, and introduction of English classes into the law school. However, CEELI's primary commitment to the Law Faculty is the offer to conduct a course on comparative legal systems in the Fall. CEELI was also named a Steering Board Member for the newly created University Centre for Human Rights of the Law Faculty. Edwin Villmoare currently represents CEELI on this Board.

Project Five: Kosovar Private Lawyers: Bar Association and Legal Aid Clinics**Kosovo Chamber of Advocates**

During the reporting period, CEELI held a series of meetings with Mrs. Osmani, president of the Kosovo Chamber of Advocates, to discuss the funding of several projects the Chamber is interested in undertaking. One of these projects is the revision of the draft code of attorney ethics. CEELI has provided the Chamber with copies of similar draft codes from other countries and has translated a copy of the Chamber's draft code from Albanian into English for review. CEELI has been invited to provide expertise in the revision of the draft code.

CEELI also held a number of meetings with the Chamber to discuss the development of a praktikant program and the establishment of permanent office space for the Chamber. In Fall 2000, the Chamber received funding from the Open Society Institute for a law library and has since purchased books and shelves. The Chamber has also approached the World Bank with a request for funding for infrastructure development. The Chamber hopes that with the support of other international organizations and CEELI it will be able to procure permanent office space.

CEELI has begun working with the Chamber and OSCE's Office of Legal Community Support Services (LCSS) to develop a 20-person praktikant program to be implemented by the Chamber. In January, the partners will continue to meet to finalize the proposal, concept paper and budget.

CEELI is also exploring the possibility of collaborating with the Chamber of Advocates, OSCE's LCSS and UNMIK Department of Judicial Affairs (DJA) to locate and organize the law students educated under the parallel education system to assess their needs and advocate for their admission to the bar. Both CEELI and DJA have gathered information about these students; however, no one has the capacity to compile this information into a useful format. CEELI is considering undertaking the development of a database to catalogue these 1000 plus students. The database would contain the students' names, educational background, internship experiences and eligibility to take the professional exam. Such a database would be invaluable to DJA, the Chamber and the commission ultimately appointed to constitute the exam.

Criminal Defense Resource Center

Mr. Villmoare attended planning sessions with Mr. Rolf Welbert, Ms. Kathleen Banar, and others concerning deficiencies in criminal defense and possible means for correcting these deficiencies. One suggestion considered during these discussions was the development of criminal legal aid clinics that could be operated by the Chamber of Advocates, Kosovo Law Center, and the Criminal Defense Resource Center. Current OSCE plans call for establishing the Criminal Defense Resource Center as a new NGO in mid-January.

Women's Resource Center

The Task Force in Gjilan has submitted a proposal to UNMIK to develop a Women's Resource Center in the region. UNMIK has agreed to provide office space for the Women's Resource Center, but no other funding so far. The Task Force has requested assistance from CEELI in developing the Center. CEELI is exploring the feasibility of funding a small number of praktikants through the Center.

Project Six: Structure of the Judiciary

CEELI continued to serve in its capacity as an international member of the Advisory Judicial Commission (AJC). However, as of the end of the reporting period, UNMIK had dissolved the AJC. Discussions are currently underway regarding the formation of a successor organization.



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Program: Rule of Law

Project One: Legal Training and Materials

Judicial and Prosecutorial Training

During the reporting period, CEELI expanded its work with the Kosovo Judicial Institute (KJI). Marie-Françoise Verdun, a French investigating magistrate and the current director of the KJI, has agreed to stay on through the end of June 2001. Council of Europe (COE), which funds the director position, is currently looking for another candidate and ensuring that it will have the necessary funding to continue its support for the KJI in this fashion. In addition, KJI held its inauguration ceremonies in March in its new facilities in Pristina. The new facilities feature two large training rooms with interpreting equipment, a large conference room, office space, and a kitchen.

Under Mme. Verdun's leadership, KJI has begun to put forward ideas and plans with the goal of systemizing its work and work objectives. For example, KJI assembled and made publicly available a schedule for its trainings for a four-month period, from January to April 2001. In addition, KJI has resolved to identify 'contact persons' in each of the five judicial districts. KJI staff has begun to conduct interviews with the Presidents of each district court to request them to nominate someone (a judge) to serve as the KJI contact person.

During the reporting period, CEELI met frequently with KJI staff to encourage this effort and to discuss joint training endeavors. KJI has signaled a new desire to cooperate with CEELI, and

KJI has specifically requested that CEELI provide an expert to conduct a "training-of-trainers" session for KJI's international and national training staff. CEELI and the KJI resolved to begin planning this project with the expectation that CEELI would provide the substantive expertise and experts for the training. At KJI's request, this training will be limited to KJI staff (national and international) and KJI's "contact persons," which it hopes to have identified within 30 days. CEELI has requested that KJI allow representatives of the Kosovo Judges Association (see reporting below for Project Two), which CEELI expects will exist by the time this training session is held, to attend. KJI has, in principle, agreed. Accordingly, CEELI intends to post a legal specialist to Kosovo to work on this project in Summer 2001.

KJI has indicated no other training projects requiring CEELI's assistance at this time, but has pointedly requested that, upon inauguration of the Kosovo Judges Association, cooperative training endeavors involving the association, KJI, and CEELI should be discussed further. KJI has, however, explored the possibility of other assistance from CEELI. KJI's plans for its new facility include creation of a library; CEELI has suggested that this library be coordinated with those in existence at the KLC and the Chamber of Advocates. KJI has agreed in principle and has made some preliminary overtures to ABA/CEELI for assistance in this regard.

Commercial Law Training

UNMIK's Office for the Development of Economic Law in the DTI requested CEELI's assistance in organizing training seminars for lawyers on the new economic legislation drafted by UNMIK. In accordance with AID's initial request (in its RFA to CEELI) that CEELI cooperate with DTI (and its AID funded personnel from the consulting firm Barents), CEELI was amenable to this request, so long as the cooperation did not detract from CEELI's primary missions. Accordingly, USAID Rule of Law personnel organized a meeting to include CEELI personnel, AID Rule of Law and Commercial Law personnel, and representatives of Barents/DTI to coordinate and avoid the duplication of efforts in this area. CEELI Country Director Greg Gisvold and Foreign Legal Counsel Alma Saliu attended. The group determined that good coordination was already in place and DTI could organize commercial law trainings without ABA/CEELI's assistance. Nevertheless, CEELI offered Ms. Saliu's expert assistance to contribute to organizing these training seminars once DTI clarifies the nature of assistance it requires.

Rule of Law and Legal Training Ad Hoc Task Force

During the reporting period, CEELI continued its involvement in this task force. The task force's primary function is to encourage cooperation and avoid duplication among assistance providers in the Rule of Law/Legal Training arena. All legal training in Kosovo is discussed and reviewed at these meetings. Representatives of CEELI, OSCE, KJI, COE, the new Ombudsman, and ICTY regularly attend.

Project Two: Judges' Association

In January, CEELI held a meeting in Pristina to discuss the formation of a Judges' Association of Kosovo. The Chief Judges from all of Kosovo's judicial districts, the Supreme Court, Economic Court, and Court for Misdemeanors, or their representatives, were invited to attend. Representatives from UNMIK and OSCE also attended. The focus of this meeting was a discussion of the need for a judges' association and its role in giving the judges a strong, unified voice to advocate for issues of concern to them. The primary goal was to develop a strategy and implementation timeline for the establishment of the association and to ensure significant

input and participation from judges from all the judicial districts in the process. The attendees agreed to organize a series of meetings, in each judicial district, in which judges from the municipal courts, misdemeanors courts, and the district court would be invited to participate. The draft statute and the draft code of ethics would be distributed to all the judges, prior to the meetings, in order to allow them to comment at the meeting. The attendees also approved in principle of a CEELI suggestion that a working group be created to revise the draft statute upon the collection of the comments from these district meetings.

During the reporting period, CEELI organized five meetings, held in each of the five judicial districts in Kosovo, to present the draft statute to the judges and elicit their comments. These sessions were attended by nearly 100% of the judges in each district. During the sessions, the participants also signed a declaration in support of the creation of judges' association and elected representatives to attend the first Founding Assembly of the association.

In addition to the review of the statute by the judges, CEELI reviewed the document and provided its suggestions. Ms. Saliu prepared a graphic representation of the proposed structure of the association as outlined in the statute. It was clear from the graphic that the structure proposed in the initial draft was more elaborate and cumbersome than was appropriate for the association in its beginning phase. Ms. Saliu held a series of meetings with the statute's primary drafter, Judge Bici, to discuss this issue. Judge Bici eventually agreed to a simplification of the statute.

Accordingly, CEELI staff organized a meeting of the group of experts, identified in collaboration with Judge Bici and other judges active in the effort to found an association. These judges were identified on the basis of their participation in the regional meetings, willingness to devote personal time to the improvement of the draft statute, and stature within the Kosovar judicial community. CEELI provided this group with a summary of the points raised during the district meetings, comparative materials, and Ms. Saliu's suggestions for improvement of the statute.

Judge Bici, Ms. Saliu, and other CEELI staff also began working on plans for the Founding Assembly, tentatively scheduled for May 2001. In addition to logistical matters, Ms. Saliu, CEELI staff, and Judge Bici worked together to identify other issues in the statute that would adversely affect the envisioned procedures for convening and founding the association. Together, the two prepared suggestions for changes and presented them to the group of judges tasked with preparing the final draft of the statute for the Founding Assembly.

During the reporting period, CEELI also organized a roundtable discussion with the statute drafters and Judge Maria Teresa Romer, a member of the Supreme Court of Poland and Chairperson of the Judges' Association of Poland. CEELI provided Judge Romer with the statute in advance so she could review the proposed draft statute and comment on it during the roundtable. Judge Romer also spoke to the Kosovar judges regarding her experience with the Judges Association of Poland. She addressed the difficulties that her association faced, particularly in the first years of its establishment. These problems ranged from those of obtaining funding for the activities of the Association to acquiring office space, and further to problems of leadership and faithfulness to the ideals and purposes for which the Association was created. It was very beneficial for the Kosovar judges to hear firsthand about the success of the Judges' Association in Poland. Judge Romer also answered questions from the group regarding the way her Association is structured, the activities the Association organizes for the judges, and other services the Association provides its members and the public. Overall, Judge Romer's comments on the draft statute were very positive and the discussion of her experiences was encouraging for all members of the drafting group.

In March, CEELI Country Director Greg Gisvold spoke at the KJI inauguration ceremonies on the importance of judges associations to the development of the judiciary in Kosovo.

UNMIK's Task Force on Judicial and Prosecutor Ethics

UNMIK has created a Task Force on Judicial and Prosecutor Ethics and prepared a draft Code of Ethics for Judges. At the first meeting of the Task Force, Ed Villmoare and Alma Saliu made presentations on codes of judicial ethics from other Balkan and east European countries and recommended changes to UNMIK's draft Code of Judicial Ethics. They also provided written and oral comments on the draft at this meeting (see also reporting below under Project Three regarding draft regulation on Kosovo Judicial Council).

Project Three: Legal Drafting and Analysis*Secretariat*

During the reporting period, the CEELI Secretariat, supervised by Foreign Legal Counsel Brikena Hoxha, continued to oversee translation, incorporation and revision of all the provisions drafted by the Joint Advisory Committee on Legislative Matters (JAC), as well as the OSCE working groups on juvenile justice, domestic violence, mental health, and economics. In addition to this work, the Secretariat also continued to assist the JAC in its regular meetings by providing translation/interpretation, preparing meeting agendas and participant lists, and drafting and distributing the minutes of all JAC meetings in Albanian and English.

The Secretariat and representatives of other international organizations have been working to improve the international community's capacity for legal translation in Kosovo. As part of this effort, Ms. Hoxha joined a working group on coordination of translation. The group held two meetings and resolved to set priorities for future translation efforts and develop a plan for coordination. The JAC has also requested that CEELI provide a dedicated technical secretary to it to assist in legislative drafting and revision. However, CEELI cannot act upon this request until the JAC locates appropriate office space.

Five new members joined the JAC during the reporting period. They include: Gani Oruci (co-head of the KLC), Nerxhivane Dauti, Gjyljeta Mushkolaj (an expert in civil law and procedure), Halil Halilaj, Riza Smakaj (an expert in administrative law).

*Legislative Drafting**Criminal and Criminal Procedure Codes*

The JAC maintained its diligent work on the Criminal and Criminal Procedure codes, while simultaneously providing comment to the UNMIK legal advisor on those regulations the legal advisor forwarded to the JAC for this purpose. Professors Salihu and Sahiti, principal drafters and revisers of the criminal and criminal procedure codes respectively, continued to work with COE representative Zoran Klemencic of Slovenia and members of the JAC criminal working group on revisions to the two codes.

The drafting process involves small group meetings between the professors (separately) and Mr. Klemencic; when available, members of the JAC criminal working group also attend. These meetings are facilitated, translated, and hosted by the CEELI Secretariat. The CEELI Secretariat also summarizes these meetings, incorporates changes, and works with the working group staff to correct translation issues. During the reporting period, the latest revisions agreed upon by the professors and Mr. Klemencic in consultation with Secretariat staff were

incorporated. Once a new draft was prepared, it was considered by the criminal working group, which has begun to meet more steadily as summer approaches.

Regulations

During March, the JAC also considered the draft regulation on the proposed Kosovo Judicial Council and Judicial Inspection Unit. Although insufficient time was allotted for full consideration of the issues raised by this regulation, the JAC, with timely and energetic translation and administrative support from the Secretariat, provided as much substantive commentary as was possible.

Also during March, the JAC considered the draft regulation on domestic violence prepared by the OSCE domestic violence working group. The Secretariat administratively assisted the working group with revisions to its English and Albanian versions of the draft regulation.

CEELI also assisted in the revisions of the draft regulations on Foreign Investments, on Pledges, Mortgages, and on the Sale of Goods prepared by UNMIK's Program for the Development of Economic Law. The draft regulation on Foreign Investments prepared by UNMIK's Program for the Development of Economic Law was signed by the SRSG and came into force on January 12, 2001. The draft regulation on the Sale of Goods drafted by UNMIK's Program for the Development of Economic Law was signed by the SRSG and came into force on December 29, 2000. The draft regulations on Pledges and on Business Organizations are pending signature from the SRSG. The draft regulation on Mortgages is undergoing further revision. CEELI has made written comments and suggestions for changes.

Other Laws

UNMIK's Program for the Development of Economic Law has prepared a draft law on Bankruptcy. Alma Saliu was invited to join the group to provide expertise and assistance on the draft. In recognition of Ms. Saliu's substantial expertise and CEELI's unique role within the legal reform process, CEELI was the only NGO invited to join the working group. Ms. Saliu will continue to work with UNMIK to finalize the draft that will eventually be presented to the JAC for review and comment.

The Secretariat completed revision of a translation into English of the FRY Law on Administrative Procedure and Law on Non-Contested Procedure in anticipation of the JAC completing work on the criminal and criminal procedure codes. These translations were provided to the UNMIK Department of Judicial Affairs.

Cumulative Index of United Nations Legal Materials Produced and Applied in Kosovo

The cumulative index for 1999-2000 is ready for distribution in all three languages. A copy of the introduction to the latest version (in English) is attached to the electronic version of this report. Now that the Office of Official Gazette (UNMIK) finalized the *Fletorja Zyrtare* (Official Gazette) for 1999, the Index prepared by CEELI will be even more useful. CEELI Secretariat is coordinating with DOJ to distribute the Index to the courts. CEELI Secretariat contacted Ms. Elizabeth Press, Administrator at the International Judicial Support Section of the Department of Judicial Affairs (IJSS/DJA), who expressed her interest in making the *Index* available to international judges and prosecutors. CEELI also distributed the *Index* at each of the judges association meetings (see Project Two, described above).

CEELI has also held discussions with representatives of the Joint Interim Administrative Department (JIAS) of Public Services regarding cooperating on distribution of the applicable law in Kosovo. The DPS sought CEELI's assistance in compiling legal analyses of the points where the applicable law is either a) internally contradictory, b) contradictory with applicable FRY laws, or c) contrary to applicable regulations or human rights standards. DPS also wished to enlist CEELI support for transferring assembled hard copies of applicable laws to electronic form by scanning and correcting them. CEELI indicated it did not have the resources or mandate for the former, but was already engaged in the latter. CEELI proposed to develop a website that would provide access to the applicable law, UNMIK legal acts, and the *Index*. CEELI and DPS will continue their discussions.

Public Participation

In anticipation of the SRSB's plans to establish a working group to draft a Legal Framework for planned province-wide elections in November 2001, CEELI sought opportunities to facilitate public participation in this process. During the reporting period, CEELI worked closely with Robert Pulver, Co-head of the Joint Administrative Department for Democratic Governance and Civil Society (DDGCS), Michael Stechow, head of the DDGCS NGO Unit, and Ben Allen of USAID to develop strategy for public participation in the law making process in Kosovo. CEELI drafted a short concept paper on public participation and submitted it to representatives of USAID and OSCE to assist them in their efforts to promote this idea with UNMIK. CEELI plans to continue its efforts to encourage public participation with respect to the Legal Framework, the law reform process generally, and the work of the Chamber and prospective judges association into the next reporting period.

On a related front, CEELI has been instrumental in getting local input and increasing transparency with respect to the new economic legislation. Ms. Saliu has established links with local Kosovar experts in the economic field. Ms. Saliu has met with judges from the Economic Court in Pristina, professors of the Law Faculty, and members of the Chamber of Commerce in Pristina to gather their input on the new draft economic regulations.

Project Four: University of Pristina Faculty of Law

During the reporting period, Ms. Saliu was asked by the Kosovo Law Center (KLC) to co-teach a course on International Commercial Law for the University of Pristina, Law Faculty as part of the efforts to support the adoption and implementation of the new curricula of the Law Faculty. The idea for co-teaching this course was first discussed in October 2000. However, due to the resistance of some Law Faculty members, the reform of the curricula was extended only to first and second year law students, and not to third and fourth year students for which this course was designed. However, upon the request of the law students, the KLC decided to extend the new curricula to the third and fourth year students for the second semester beginning mid-February.

Unfortunately, the professor currently teaching this course does not support the KLC curriculum reform effort. The professor would only allow Ms. Saliu to teach a few sessions and only after the book he planned to publish was in fact published. (The professor's position was that everyone teaching at the law faculty must start as an assistant to an existing professor and that Ms. Saliu could eventually teach, but only when he determined her to be qualified). As this was not the plan agreed upon with KLC, Ms. Saliu reported this to KLC officials and withdrew her offer of assistance. KLC took the matter seriously and is addressing this issue with the dean of

the law faculty. KLC has indicated its strong desire that Ms. Saliu plan to lecture on these commercial topics at a future point to be determined.

The University of Pristina Law Faculty has also become the home to the newly established Human Rights Center. A US law professor named Theodore Orlin from the Syracuse University is serving as an advisor to the Human Rights Center. CEELI has been given a seat on the Center's board of directors. An inaugural event is planned for the next reporting period.

Project Five: Kosovar Private Lawyers: Bar Association and Legal Aid Clinics

Kosovo Chamber of Advocates

During the reporting period, CEELI worked with Mrs. Osmani, President of the Kosovo Chamber of Advocates, to finalize the Chamber's proposals to develop a *praktikant* program and obtain suitable office space. The Chamber received funding from the Open Society Institute to develop a law library and has purchased books and shelves. (CEELI plans, during the next reporting period, to work with the KJI and KLC to ensure that their libraries and that planned by the Chamber are complementary). The Chamber also obtained partial financing to purchase suitable office space.

In March, the Chamber concluded a subgrant agreement with CEELI for the remaining building funds. The Chamber intends to move into its new facility next quarter. CEELI and the Chamber also concluded a subgrant agreement for funding for a twelve-month *praktikant* program for 20 people. The funds for this program will be disbursed in the next quarter.

CEELI also worked with Mrs. Osmani to plan and identify candidates for a US study tour on bar association development to be held in April 2001. During February and March CEELI selected participants, compiled briefing materials, arranged the logistics, and developed the training agenda. Thirteen members of the Chamber will participate in the program, including eight Kosovar Albanians, one Kosovar Turk, and three Kosovar Serbs.

Bar Exam

CEELI Liaison Sheryl Goldstein met with representatives of the Department of Judicial Affairs (DJA) to discuss ideas for reconstituting the bar exam in Kosovo. The exam has not been offered in Kosovo since 1989 and as many as 1,500 qualified applicants have been denied the right to take the exam and enter the profession. DJA plans to offer the bar exam by the end of 2001. At the present, UNMIK and OSCE continue to discuss, in private meetings, a strategy for organizing the exam. Currently, the plan appears to envision that the exam will consist of three stages, once eligibility to take the exam has been ascertained. The first stage, as proposed by UNMIK, includes a preliminary exam, which will test the ability of the candidates in legal writing and basic knowledge of criminal and civil law subjects. The second stage will consist of training for up to three to five months in different topics of applicable law, as well as new UNMIK legislation. The KJI will be responsible for organizing the training, with assistance from CEELI. The third stage will be the final examination itself, which will include written and oral portions.

To assist with eligibility determination and training planning and delivery, CEELI staff collected and organized information from the Pristina Law Faculty records on students who were educated in the parallel law school system and students who were educated in the official law school but were denied the opportunity to take the bar exam. CEELI has compiled this

information into a searchable electronic database. CEELI plans multiple uses for such a database. First, it will assist the Department of Judicial Affairs in the staging of the bar exam in its eligibility determinations. Second, such a database will be useful to the OSCE, KJI, and CEELI in planning and delivering necessary training to those eligible for the exam, and to those who do not pass the first time and plan to take it again. Third, this database will provide an invaluable tool to other organizations, such as KLC and the Chamber of Advocates for planning either additional training or facilitating participation in the *praktikant* programs.

Criminal Defense Resource Center (CDRC)

OSCE continued its efforts, aided by CEELI Liaisons Ed Villmoare and Sheryl Goldstein, to establish an independent Office of Defense (renamed Criminal Defense Resource Center), which will assist criminal defense lawyers throughout Kosovo raise human rights defenses. (During the reporting period, Ms. Goldstein announced that she would resign from CEELI and take a position with OSCE as the first Project Manager for the CDRC).

OSCE has finalized a summary paper and Statute; it plans to file the Statute and obtain NGO status during the next reporting period. During this reporting period, the CDRC planned to establish itself within office space of the Kosovo Law Center. However, this plan collapsed and CDRC will now secure office space nearer to OSCE using startup funds from the OSCE and additional funding promised by the United States Department of State.

CEELI remains prepared to provide technical assistance to the CDRC once established. CEELI also plans to renew its defense counsel trainings once the CDRC is established and new liaisons have been identified, placed, and established on-ground in Pristina.

Project Six: Structure of the Judiciary

As the work of the Advisory Judicial Commission has been suspended, no significant activity was undertaken in this area during the reporting period.



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Program: Rule of Law

Project One: Legal Training and Materials

Targets

The targets of the Legal Training and Materials project for the workplan period are:

1. By the end of the workplan period, curriculum for training of judges, prosecutors, and defense counsel will be developed, in collaboration with local members of the legal community. This curriculum will focus on interactive training techniques, including roundtable discussions, case studies, and mock trials.
2. By the end of the workplan period, training workshops will be held, in all judicial districts, for the 135 recently appointed judges and prosecutors on substantive topics. There will be a concentrated focus on applicable law and the practical application of international human rights standards.
3. By the end of the workplan period, a core group of potential judicial trainers will be identified and have received "train-the-trainer" training in order to enhance the local capacity for ongoing professional development.
4. By the end of the workplan period, a benchbook on international human rights standards will be developed and distributed to judges.

Progress Achieved:

- (1) This target was substantially met in Fall 2000. A curriculum was developed as previously reported and several seminars given in three of the five judicial districts. Additional trainings are scheduled over the next six months.
- (2) This target was met, as previously reported with the final, first-round training seminar held in November 2000. Additional training seminars, some in conjunction with the Kosovo Judicial Institute, are scheduled over the next six months. It is hoped that the new international co-head of KJI will support CEELI's initiative to develop a training plan for KJI.
- (3) *Train The Trainers Seminar*

During this reporting period, CEELI substantially met its workplan target of holding a "Train the Trainers" seminar for judicial trainers in Kosovo (Workplan Project 1, Target 3). CEELI deployed Kathleen Murphy, a law professor from Lewis & Clark University's Northwestern College of Law in Portland, Oregon, to Kosovo to conduct a train the trainers course with the Kosovo Judicial Institute (KJI). Ms. Murphy met with KJI training staff Reinhold Gallmetzer and Pierre-Luigi Gentile to review information gathered by the KJI in the course of selecting contact persons for the five judicial districts. The data did not necessarily rise to the level of a training needs assessment data, but it was useful in evaluating training needs. However, recognizing the necessity for actual needs assessment data, Ms. Murphy and CEELI staff conducted a series of targeted interviews with advocates and judges to discern existing challenges in training judges in Kosovo and perceptions regarding training subject matter needs. Individuals providing information for the training program design included:

- Rexhep Haximusa, Chief Judge of the Kosovo Supreme Court
- Qerim Metaj, Chairman of the Judges' Association of Kosovo
- Fatmir Kutllovci, Legal Advisor, NCSC Kosovo Court Administration Project
- Adem Bajri, Advocat, Peja
- Lirije Osmani, Advocat, Prishtina
- Haki Lecaj, Judge in Pristina and KJI trainer
- Kapllan Barutti, President of the District Court of Mitrovica
- Maria Teresa Romer, Judge, Polish Supreme Court and COE Expert

CEELI analyzed the needs assessment data and, on the basis of this information and its institutional resources, developed a four-day Train-the-Trainers seminar for KJI's international and Kosovar trainers and sitting judges, who as members of the recently formed Judges' Association of Kosovo (see discussion under Workplan Project Two), had expressed an interest in acting as trainers for their colleagues. The KJI staff is responsible for training sitting judges and, in future months, newly-appointed judges. Previously, their training plan had consisted of organizing training seminars on any subject matter of interest to the individual trainer. The seminar design addressed pedagogical techniques, but also focused on particular substantive areas of law identified as posing particular challenges for judges.

The training seminar included the following topics:

- Conducting a Needs Assessment;
- Adult Learning Theory, Research, and Techniques;
- Training Techniques;
- Court Monitoring Techniques;
- Implementation of Training Techniques and Preparation of Lesson Plan; and
- Organization Planning, Resources, Logistics

(see Appendix A for a detailed listing of the topics). The seminar also included remarks by Judge Patrice de Charette, who shared his experiences as an international judge working closely with the local legal community. CEELI conducted the seminar in an interactive manner geared specifically to demonstrate many of the techniques that were the subject of the seminar. Specifically, when discussing the conduct of targeted needs assessments, the participants completed an exercise wherein they identified the type of data they would need to gather, the persons to whom they would speak with to gather the necessary data, and what questions are best to ask to collect broad, useful data.

The seminar was well received by KJI, the staff of which indicated repeatedly that such training was vital to increasing the efficiency and training capacity of its local staff. Some national staff privately indicated that the seminar was quite useful for them as well. CEELI used the opportunity to urge KJI staff to begin the process of compiling a comprehensive curriculum for judicial training as well as a long term (at least one year) training plan. CEELI liaison Beth Miller will follow up on these goals.

- (4) No significant progress was made on this workplan target during the reporting period.

Other Legal Training Initiatives

Commercial Law Training

During the previous quarter, USAID requested coordination among the various USAID projects in Kosovo, including between CEELI's Rule of Law development efforts and Barents commercial law programs. Barents essentially provides the staff to UNMIK's Department of Trade and Industry (DTI).

During this quarter, DTI requested CEELI's assistance in DTI's effort to organize training seminars for lawyers on the new economic regulations. These regulations had been prepared by DTI staff and promulgated by the Special Representative of the Secretary General. DTI envisioned that these seminars will take place in Pristina as well as in some other regions. Per DTI's specific request, CEELI provided lists of the judges who should be invited to participate in these training sessions.

In addition, during this reporting period, UNMIK's Unit for Professional Training within the Department of Judicial Affairs (DJA) requested CEELI's cooperation and inclusion in the working group for the drafting of a regulation on the registration of property. DJA suggested CEELI might be a useful partner in organizing training in this area. CEELI made no commitments and DJA agreed to revisit the issue in future.

Law Faculty

In May, CEELI staff met with the Dean of the Law Faculty to discuss future cooperation efforts aimed at furthering the reforms of the Law Faculty. These discussions were not particular, but instead focused on general areas of work. The Dean was interested in having CEELI staff teach courses full time at the law school.

Constitutional Training

During this reporting period, CEELI followed up on its efforts during the previous reporting period to develop a public participation process for the development of a Constitutional Framework for Kosovo (UNMIK essentially vetoed CEELI's coordinated overtures with other organizations, including USAID, OSCE, and certain UNMIK JIAS structures for a public participation process. In this quarter, CEELI assessed the need for a training program on the recently-adopted Constitutional Framework. The SRSG officially promulgated the Framework on 15 May 2001.

The Framework represents a powerful legal tool available for use by Kosovo's legal professional, yet, months after its adoption, the Framework is not yet in the hands of most lawyers and judges, and has not been the focus of much study nor analysis. Accordingly, CEELI undertook to distribute copies of the Framework at each of its seminars during the reporting period and CEELI Legal Specialists Kathleen Murphy and Darian Pavli conducted interviews to determine the need for and focus of a future training program on the Framework and methods for its interpretation and use as an advocacy tool.

All those to whom CEELI staff spoke agreed that training on the Framework constitutes a pressing need; further, they expressed concern that the Framework had not been distributed to legal professionals. There has been little, if any, focus on the meaning and application of the Framework and academics appeared to be the only persons to have thoroughly read the document. On the basis of this interview data, CEELI Legal Specialists outlined the components of a proposed Constitutional Framework and Legal Interpretation Training:

- Recognition and use of the Framework as a component of the Applicable Law;
- Development of basic skills necessary to interpret and apply the Framework;
- Expand understanding of the protections for human rights, general government structure, independence of the judiciary and separation of powers as each concept is reflected in the Framework;
- Increase understanding of the role of an independent judiciary in relation to other bodies of government as outlined in the Framework;
- Understanding of the usefulness of the Framework's incorporation into Kosovo's legal system of various international human rights instruments and treaties; and
- Concomitant development of the skills necessary to interpret and apply provisions and case law of these international human rights instruments and the decisions of their respective interpretive bodies.

CEELI will continue to follow up on this training program, including discussions with both the Chamber of Advocates and the Judges' Association during the next workplan period.

Project Two: Judges' Association

Targets

The targets of the judges' association project for the workplan period are as follows:

1. By the end of the workplan period, the judges' association will have adopted an organizational statute.
2. By the end of the workplan period, the judges' association will have established its physical infrastructure and developed strategic, financial, and implementation plans.
3. By the end of the workplan period, the judges' association will have drafted and vetted a code of ethics.
4. By the end of the workplan period, judges will have been trained on the code of ethics.
5. By the end of the workplan period, the judges' association will have been introduced to the concept of acting as a voice for judicial reform in Kosovo.

Progress Achieved:

- (1-5) By the close of this quarter, CEELI met its goal of having the Judges' Association come into existence by adopting an organizational statute, and made significant progress towards the separate goal of introducing the association to the concept of acting as a voice for its members and for judicial reform in Kosovo. To achieve the former, CEELI in the previous quarter held regular meetings with a group of judges who had volunteered to draft an organizational statute.

Judges' Association

During this quarter, CEELI organized meetings in each judicial district to enable the judges of the district to consider and comment on the draft statute. Attendance at these seminars was excellent and the judges were quite vocal. Many suggested changes to the structure of the draft were made and incorporated. At the close of each meeting, those in attendance that agreed signed a declaration that they wanted to form an association and to become members. In addition to the suggested changes, CEELI offered a number of enhancements to include principles from the European Charter on the Statute of Judges. CEELI Foreign Legal Counsel Alma Saliu worked to incorporate all the changes suggested and subsequently agreed upon by the drafting committee to the Albanian, Serbian and English versions of the statute.

During these comment meetings, the judges also discussed the modalities and organizational issues for the first founding assembly of the Judges' Association. Each judicial district agreed to send a delegation, rather than attempt to gather all 300+ judges in one place at one time. In addition, a procedure was agreed to whereby each judicial district in Kosovo would nominate at least two candidates for each seat on the proposed association's Board of Directors and one candidate each for the positions of Chairperson and Deputy Chairpersons of the Association. The judges agreed that candidates should not be chosen solely from those selected to be district representatives to the Founding

Assembly, but from the entire pool of judges that signed the declaration (noted above) regarding membership in the association.

This process was not without some disagreement. CEELI strictly maintained that it was only assisting in the process and would not become involved any disputes over the selection of candidates. To minimize such disputes, however, CEELI suggested that to make the selection process as democratic and inclusive as possible a secret ballot might prove useful. The judges in some districts, and at the Assembly, adopted CEELI's suggestion.

Founding Assembly

On May 11, 2001, the Founding Assembly of the Judges' Association took place in the UNMIK Government Building Auditorium in Pristina. Over 100 judges elected as representatives of judges and about 30 guests were invited to this event. International guests included John Cubbin, UNMIK Department of Justice, Andrew Sisson, Deputy Head of Mission, USAID Kosovo, Patrice de Charette, International Judge, and Marie-Francoise Verdun, Co-Head of KJI. The representative judges discussed and voted approval for the statute of the Association and the governing bodies of the Association. The judges also elected officers, including Mr. Qerim Metaj, Chairman of the Association and Mr. Kapllan Baruti, Deputy Chairman. Mr. Ymer Huruglica (Gjilan), Mrs. Elmaze Syka (Peja), Mr. Gani Rexha (Mitrovica), Mr. Ymer Hoxha (Prizren), Mr. Adem Ajvazi and Mr. Mehmet Neziri (Pristina) were elected as members of the Association's Board of Directors.

CEELI and Judge Metaj, Chairman of the Association, continued to work on the registration of the Association as an NGO and the preparation of all the necessary documentation. UNMIK's Office for NGO Registration informed CEELI that it was overloaded with work and registration of the Association would take at least 2 months. CEELI and Judge Metaj explained that it was necessary that the Association's registration be expedited so that a representative from the Association might represent the Association at the next meeting of MEDEL (European Magistrates for Democracy and Freedom). Judge Patrice de Charette, who is active in MEDEL, had previously secured an invitation for a representative of the Kosovo Judges' Association to attend.

Board of Directors Meeting

CEELI also helped organize and facilitate the first meeting of the Association's Board of Directors on May 30th at the CEELI office. All board members attend save for the representative from Prizren. The Board decided to appoint Mr. Sabit Beqiri as Secretary of the Association. The Board also discussed the creation of the Branches of the Association in the five judicial districts as contemplated by the Statute. In addition, the Chairman informed the Board that UNMIK had forwarded to him a copy of draft Code of Ethics for judges prepared by UNMIK.

Code of Ethics

- (3) During the previous workplan period, UNMIK created the Kosovo Judicial and Prosecutorial Council, charging it, *inter alia*, with the creation of a code of ethics for judges, thereby obviating the need for and plans of the Judges' Association to do so.

In this quarter, the Chairman of UNMIK's Judicial and Prosecutorial Council had allotted two weeks for Kosovo's judges to review and make comments on the draft. CEELI assisted the Association in its efforts to comply with this deadline by distributing the draft code to all the judges of Kosovo. The Board set a short deadline within which all judges wishing to do so to have to give their written comments to their chief judges in the court where they work. Upon receipt of the comments, the chief judges were invited to participate in a round table at which they would be able to contribute recommendations to the Council.

In conjunction with the Judges' Association of Kosovo, CEELI organized the roundtable at the Kosovo Judicial Institute on June 8, 2001. CEELI Foreign Legal Counsel Alma Saliu and Legal Specialist Kathleen Murphy served on the panel of experts – which also included Kosovar judges and a Council of Europe expert – that led the roundtable discussion. The panel and the roundtable focused on specific recommendations to UNMIK regarding its draft Code of Ethics. Ms. Murphy had prepared an analysis and a set of proposed revisions to the draft in a redline format. In her presentation, she went over analysis and proposed changes, explaining the importance of strengthening the sections on conflict of interest and judicial independence. As the draft included judicial disciplinary procedures, CEELI and the Council of Europe experts also commented upon these with an eye towards their improvement.

- (4) Ms. Murphy also identified areas in which training would enhance means of ensuring judicial independence. CEELI ROL Liaison Beth Miller has begun to plan a training seminar, in cooperation with the Judges' Association, on the Code of Ethics to be held after it is adopted.

Project Three: Legislative Drafting and Analysis

Targets

The targets of the Legislative Drafting and Analysis project for the workplan period are as follows:

1. By the end of the workplan period, the *Index* will be updated regularly.
2. By the end of the workplan period, the *Index* will be available in Albanian, English, and Serbian.
3. By the end of the workplan period, the legal community will have access to the *Index* and other relevant legal resource materials via Internet and CD Rom.
4. By the end of the workplan period, the revision of the draft criminal and criminal procedure codes will be completed.
5. By the end of the workplan period, drafting of the civil and civil procedure codes will have begun.
6. By the end of the workplan period, if there is progress toward drafting a charter or constitution, a process for public participation will have been developed.

Progress Achieved:*Cumulative Index*

- (1-2) CEELI continued during this quarter to meet its workplan goal of regularly updating the Index in all three languages.

In this reporting period, CEELI coordinated with UNMIK's Department of Judicial Affairs International Judicial Support Section (DJA/IJSS) to distribute the English version of CEELI's Cumulative Index for 1999 – 2000 to all international judges and prosecutors. DJA/IJSS was also distributed the current Official Gazette. The CEELI Secretariat also supplied 70 copies of the Cumulative Index 1999-2000 (in each of three languages) to the DJA to be distributed to the Kosovar courts along with the Official Gazette.

Using the Index as a model, CEELI has begun a library of UNMIK Regulations and Administrative Directions, which it plans to make available in the CEELI Secretariat office. As regulations are issued in English long before they are prepared in either Albanian or Serbian, the library will be ready in English soon, with Albanian and Serbian to follow thereafter.

Legal Website

- (3) CEELI continued to work during the past quarter with the UNMIK Department of Public Service (DPS) to gain access to UNMIK's official versions of applicable laws, UNMIK regulations and administrative directions, and other pertinent legal documents. CEELI would then publish these on a CD ROM disk and a website. CEELI hopes to distribute the CD ROM to every court, judge, and advocate with a computer. The website would, of course, be available for all those with web access. DPS has repeatedly signaled its desire to cooperate, but continues to seek permission to distribute UNMIK material outside of UNMIK.

Joint Advisory Council on Legislative Matters

- (4) As in the previous reporting period, CEELI continued to support the work of the Joint Advisory Council on Legislative Matters (JAC/LM) in the course of its regular weekly meetings. CEELI provides translation/interpretation during JAC/LM meetings; prepares JAC/LM agendas and participant lists; keeps, compiles, translates, and distributes minutes of all JAC/LM meetings in Albanian and English. CEELI also provides translation, administrative and secretarial support, and (often) transport.

During this quarter, the JAC experts completed their drafting of the Criminal Code for Kosovo. Professors Salihu and Sahiti, JAC members and the principal drafters and revisers of the criminal and criminal procedure codes respectively, worked extensively with Peter Pavlin, a Council of Europe expert, and three translators of the Secretariat.

During the month of June, this working group met every day. CEELI hosted all of these meetings at its offices. CEELI Secretariat staff organized these drafting meetings, *providing administrative, secretarial, translation, and transport for all of these meetings.* In addition, CEELI took minutes and provided research facilities and legal reference materials. The overall goal of these intensive meetings has been to translate the text of each article. Secretariat staff worked closely with the drafters and experts to incorporate the changes in both languages. This painstaking procedure is imperative to ensure that the ultimate product is consistent in all three languages (for example, “due process” must be translated into Albanian and Serbian into the correct legal terms of art in the appropriate language). To ensure the effectiveness of these important codes required not only the contribution of the translators but also the experience and legal vocabulary of Mr. Pavlin and Professors Salihu and Sahiti. Indeed, inasmuch as provisions of the criminal code touch on aspects of other codes – domestic violence, mental health, family law – the group tried to ensure that the terms chosen would not unduly prejudice on going or subsequent revisions to these other codes.

- (5) During this workplan period, Country Director Greg Gisvold urged the JAC to develop a process by which it could identify the codes it planned to revise following completion of its work on the criminal and criminal procedure codes. Mr. Gisvold suggested that the civil, civil procedure, and administrative codes would be ripe for revision. The JAC requested two of its members, Ms. Julieta Mushkoli and Mr. Riza Smaka, to review the civil and administrative codes respectively and compile a list of those most in need of review. They did so, but also suggested a number of additional experts the JAC should employ for these reviews. The discussion became sidetracked as the international co-chair balked at the prospective cost of such additional members of the JAC.
- (6) This workplan target was attempted during the previous quarter, but vetoed by the *Special Representative of the Secretary General.* As previously reported, CEELI, the JIAS for Democratic Governance and Civil Society, the OSCE, and USAID developed a process and, through the DGCS JIAS proposed it to the UN administration. No response was ever achieved, but a Constitutional Framework was adopted on 15 May 2001.

Other Secretariat accomplishments

Other Substantive Legal Advice

During the reporting period, CEELI Foreign Legal Counsel Alma Saliu met with Mr. Val Chodsky of DTI to discuss her comments on the draft regulation on mortgages. DTI had previously requested CEELI’s comments, which CEELI provided in conjunction its efforts to provide substantive legal expertise to the Joint Advisory Council on Legislative Matters (JAC/LM). Ms. Saliu voiced concern that the draft failed to repeal existing provisions from other applicable codes thereby raising the spectre of future confusion over applicable provisions.

Translation Working Group

CEELI Foreign Legal Counsel Brikena Hoxha, members of the CEELI Secretariat, and representatives of other international organizations *continued to meet during the reporting period* to try to improve the international community’s capacity for legal translation in Kosovo. As a part of this effort, this *ad hoc* (and so-called) Working Group

on Coordination of Translation has been preparing a proposal on drafting a regulation on interpreters/translators requirements and qualification standards.

Other Translation Work

Upon a request, the Secretariat has offered translation/interpreter service to the Kosovo Law Center (KLC) for a session of their legal clinic on contracts. The Secretariat has also periodically assisted international lawyers teaching commercial law in the law school, University of Pristina, providing interpretation/translation services (see discussion under Workplan Project 1 regarding coordination with USAID Commercial Law programs).

Legal Dictionary

CEELI has also provided expertise, based on its institutional experience elsewhere in Central and Eastern Europe, regarding the feasibility and work necessary to preparing a legal dictionary in Albanian to assist the law faculty, practicing advocates, and UNMIK.

Project Four: Kosovar Private Lawyers: Bar Association and Legal Aid Clinics

Targets

The targets of the Kosovo Private Lawyers project for the workplan period are as follows:

1. By the end of the workplan period, the Kosovo Chamber of Advocates will have created an organizational structure capable of addressing management, strategic planning, budgeting, and day-to-day operations of the association.
2. By the end of the workplan period, the Chamber's organizational documents will have been assessed, vetted, and adopted.
3. By the end of the workplan period, the Chamber will have identified and contacted potential sources of outside funding.
4. By the end of the workplan period, the Chamber will have developed strategic, financial, and implementation plans.
5. By the end of the workplan period, the Chamber will have begun implementation of its strategic, financial, and implementation plans.
6. By the end of the workplan period, the Code of Ethics will have been revised, assessed, vetted, and adopted.
7. By the end of the workplan period, the Chamber will be familiarized with its role in legal reform and professional advocacy
8. By the end of the workplan period, organizations capable of placing legal interns will be identified.

9. By the end of the workplan period, CEELI and these organizations will have developed a process for identification, selection, and placement of legal interns.
10. By the end of the workplan period, the legal community will have adopted a model for a legal aid system in Kosovo and CEELI will have identified partner organizations for the establishment of legal aid clinics.

Progress Achieved:

U.S. Based Training

(1-7) During this reporting period, CEELI organized and conducted a two-week U.S.-based training for members of the Kosovo Chamber of Advocates (KCA). The general purpose of this study tour program was to provide training to lawyers from Kosovo regarding the activities of their counterpart bar associations in the United States. In particular, the training focused on the basics of operating a legal professional association, including the related topics of

- Recruiting and communicating with members;
- Providing services of particular value to members;
- Acting as a voice in the community for the membership as a whole;
- Developing and promoting ethical standards of practice; and
- Providing continuing legal education programming.

This trip was essential in familiarizing the participants with the role and functions of independent and voluntary bar associations. By meeting with representatives of legal associations of varying size and scope, the participants were exposed to the breadth of activities that U.S. bar associations conduct with different levels of funding and resources.

During the training, the members of the KCA had the opportunity to meet with the Hennepin County Bar Association and the Minnesota Bar Association, in Minneapolis, to discuss the role a bar association plays in the administration of justice; how a bar association arranges its corporate structure; and the varying services associations offer their members. The participants also were briefed on bar association continuing legal education programs; cooperation between courts and the bar association in ethics enforcement and encouragement; and legal aid activities. The participants observed court proceedings in Stillwater, Minnesota, visited the US District Court in Minneapolis, and met with two Minnesota Supreme Court justices.

At the close of the first week in Minnesota, the Kosovar attorneys gathered on a Saturday with a panel of Minnesota attorneys that included the former head of ethics for the Minnesota Attorney General's office, the chief prosecutor for Minnesota's Lawyers Professional Responsibility Board, representatives of the Hennepin County Bar Association's district ethics committee, and private attorneys specializing in ethics matters. The Minnesota attorneys made presentations on the different roles they played in their professional life in the development and enforcement of a code of ethics for attorneys in Minnesota. Then, in response to many questions from the Kosovars, the group conducted a four hour discussion on ethics and the necessary components of a competent ethics system.

The participants then traveled to Washington, DC where they continued meeting with bar associations, visiting the District of Columbia Bar and the Arlington County Bar Association. The group had two days of extensive meetings with staff from the American Bar Association, during which they learned about government lobbying and acting as voice for an entire profession from staff of the ABA's Government Relations section. The group met informally with the President-elect of the ABA, who pronounced the meeting so inspiring he indicated a desire to travel to Kosovo. Finally, the training participants had the opportunity to tour the US Supreme Court and meet with Justice Sandra Day O'Connor. (See Appendix B below)

- (4-5) The tour was a complete success and the participants left with a much broader and profound comprehension of the US of bar associations. The members of the Kosovar delegation were extremely impressed and excited about their itinerary. Since their return to Kosovo, the Chamber of Advocates has indicated a desire to hold executive board meetings throughout Kosovo to solicit input, based on the information the participants gleaned in the U.S., on changes to the Chamber's operation. The Chamber requested CEELI's assistance with its annual assembly, at which new officers will be selected. In response to a CEELI request, the Chamber has agreed to hold a strategic planning session in Pristina in early July. The session will involve the participants in the US based-training as well as Chamber Executive Board members.

Legal Aid

- (10) During this quarter, the Council of Europe and the European Agency for Reconstruction initiated a project to develop a formal legal aid system in Kosovo. CEELI provided COE with a substantial amount of background material on other legal aid projects in the region. COE held a meeting in Kosovo and one in Strasbourg to develop rules for legal aid. EAR agreed to provide substantial start up funding. EAR hired a local attorney with close ties to the Chamber of Advocates to direct the project. CEELI will continue to coordinate with both COE and the local project director.
- (8) No progress on this target was achieved during the reporting period. However, as previously reported, the Chamber of Advocates has, in cooperation with CEELI, previously compiled a list of prospective host advocats of praktikants.

Project Five: Structure of the Judiciary

Targets

The targets of the Structure of the Judiciary project for the workplan period are as follows:

1. By the end of the workplan period, clear judicial disciplinary procedures will be in place.
2. By the end of the workplan period, mechanisms for implementing the judicial disciplinary procedures will be in place.
3. By the end of the workplan period, public awareness and understanding of judicial disciplinary procedures will have increased.

Progress Achieved:

- (1-3) As a part of a panel of experts on the draft Code of Ethics before the Judges' Association of Kosovo, CEELI provided substantive expertise on UNMIK's proposed code of ethics and its associated judicial disciplinary procedure (see discussion under Workplan Project 2).

Other Workplan Related Activities

During this quarter, CEELI began to work aggressively towards the re-establishment of the bar exam. This work has been supported by the USAID mission and enhances CEELI's related work designing and implementing a program with the Chamber of Advocates to support law graduates completing their praktikant service, a bar exam eligibility prerequisite (Workplan Project 4, Targets 8 and 9).

Bar Exam

During this quarter, Nikibe Kelmendi, the Co-Head of the Department of Judicial Affairs, appointed a commission of prominent Kosovar attorneys, judges, and academics to prepare a bar exam (For the membership of the Commission, see Appendix B. The Commission is composed of five members and five alternates). The international co-head of DJA subsequently decided that because the proposed bar exam would serve to qualify attorneys as well as judges, DJA would play no part in its development or implementation. This decision effectively put the obligation for staging the bar exam at the doorstep of OSCE. OSCE convened a meeting involving several international and national organizations, including the Chamber of Advocates, KJI, CEELI, Council of Europe, and various OSCE departments. OSCE urged those present to cooperate in making the bar exam a success.

At the request of the OSCE, CEELI accepted a prominent role in *encouraging progress* among the various actors in the bar exam and in developing training program to prepare those young lawyers, who have not studied or practiced law for many years, for the exam. CEELI deployed a Legal Specialist, Darian Pavli, an Albanian attorney who recently completed an LLM at New York University Law School, to spearhead CEELI's efforts on the bar exam.

Working with the various international agencies involved in the bar exam process, Mr. Pavli determined that special procedures would need to be adopted for the November exam. The DJA estimates that the number of eligible candidates accumulated during the 1990s is between 700 and 1.100, most of who are eager to take the exam at the earliest opportunity. This means that *new procedures and criteria* must be adopted – by the Commission and/or the DJA – in order to determine the first pool of candidates that will be allowed to take the November exam, as well as the successive periodic ones (see Appendix C).

Co-Head Kelmendi and the Bar Exam Commission, in order to update the curriculum of the exam and to write a preparatory manual for use bar exam applicants, have appointed a special working group. (See Appendix D for the composition of the curriculum-working group.) While it is expected that the working group will finalize the

new curriculum during this reporting period, the manual may or may not be ready in time for the prospective exam applicants to use to study.

CEELI made several suggestions to help ensure the successful administration of the first bar exam in November (see also the timeline attached in Appendix E):

- The Commission (possibly in agreement with the DJA) must set as soon as possible a *precise date* for the holding of the first post-conflict bar exam. The timing of all other organizational measures is related to the date of the exam. A date should therefore be picked no later than by the end of June.
- Next, the Commission should determine the *number* of the eligible candidates that will be allowed to take the first bar exam. It is preferable that the Commission develops a timeline of additional exams dates within a relatively short period in order to eliminate the backlog of unlicensed lawyers.
- In order to do these two things, the Commission will need to set clear and reasonable *criteria of priority*, as well as transparent procedures, for the selection of the *first (and subsequent) pool of candidates*. It appears that the DJA intends to encourage the first group of successful candidates to fill vacancies within the ranks of the judiciary and the prosecutorial system. It is important, however, that the first candidates are not "hand-picked" but selected based on fair and transparent criteria from among all those eligible.
- The Commission should make, no later than the first week of July, a *public invitation* for all applicants interested to take the November exam. The *announcement should include information* on (a) the date of the exam; (b) the number and the criteria for the selection of the first pool of candidates; and (c) the curriculum and study materials for the exam. In addition, the announcement should define the documentation the applicants must submit to prove their eligibility. Lastly, the announcement should set an *end of July deadline* for submitting applications.
- During the month of August, the Commission, through its Secretary, must receive and process the applications. The names of the first group of candidates that will be allowed to take the November exam must be *announced no later than by the end of August*. Given many of the candidates' long "break" from legal studies and legal practice, it is essential that they receive at least two months of notice. Such a time frame is also critical for interested organizations (such as the OSCE, the Bar Association of Kosovo, CEELI and possibly others) to organize training sessions for the candidates.
- The Commission should develop more detailed *rules* (than those set forth in the 1985 Regulation) *for grading the exam*. The Commission may consider, among others, introducing the anonymous grading of written answers, a procedure that is used in most old and new democracies. It may also consider setting up a points-based system for grading both the written and oral parts of the exam. If adopted and properly implemented, these changes would greatly enhance the apparent and actual integrity of the grading process.

Database

To enhance its work on the bar exam and on its praktikant program with the Chamber, CEELI coordinated with the DJA during this reporting period to update its database of law graduates in Kosovo. Earlier in the year, DJA had gathered a significant volume of information, in response to a public advertisement, about persons potentially eligible to take the bar exam. The estimates of between 800 – 1200 persons interested in taking the bar exam originated with this information collection effort.

CEELI hired a local computer consultant to sift through the information in DJA's possession and update its database. This database will assist OSCE (and/or DJA) in their efforts to hold the exam, CEELI and KJI in their combined bar exam training efforts, and the Chamber in starting its praktikant project.

ECMI Seminar

At the request of the European Centre for Minority Issues (ECMI), CEELI Country Director Greg Gisvold participated as an international expert in a seminar organized by ECMI on the administration of justice in Kosovo. The seminar was the third in a series (called the Standing Technical Working Group), which features younger participants representing civil society and the major political parties. The seminar involved an introduction to various topic areas, such as the selection of judges and the protection of human rights, by the international experts and discussion among the local participants. Following lunch, the participants, including the internationals, divided into smaller groups to develop consensus suggestions, which were passed on to UNMIK officials in a closing plenary session. Among the conclusions of the day were

- Local capacity building should be a centerpiece of judicial training;
- Higher status and better pay should be accorded judges in Kosovo;
- The Executive branch should be significantly more transparent;
- The independence of the judiciary is of paramount importance;
- Executive interference with the judiciary is incompatible with judicial independence;
- Equal access to the legal system should be guaranteed;
- Distribution of information about the legal system should be made a priority;
- Courts should strive to be able to make verbatim records of proceedings; and
- Pre and post trial human rights guarantees should be observed by UNMIK.

ECMI followed up the seminar with a training program in Flensburg, Germany. It promises to release the conclusions and recommendations of its training program shortly.



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Program: Rule of Law

Project One: Legal Training and Materials

Targets

The targets of the Legal Training and Materials project for the workplan period are:

1. By the end of the workplan period, curriculum for training of judges, prosecutors, and defense counsel will be developed, in collaboration with local members of the legal community. This curriculum will focus on interactive training techniques, including roundtable discussions, case studies, and mock trials.
2. By the end of the workplan period, training workshops will be held, in all judicial districts, for the 135 recently appointed judges and prosecutors on substantive topics. There will be a concentrated focus on applicable law and the practical application of international human rights standards.
3. By the end of the workplan period, a core group of potential judicial trainers will be identified and have received "train-the-trainer" training in order to enhance the local capacity for ongoing professional development.
5. By the end of the workplan period, a benchbook on international human rights standards will be developed and distributed to judges.

Progress Achieved:

- (5) This target was substantially met in Fall 2000. A curriculum was developed as previously reported and several seminars given in three of the five judicial districts.

Additional trainings are scheduled over the next six months, including trainings related to the bar exam, to judicial ethics, to the Constitutional Framework, and to pretrial procedure. These are described below under the heading "Other Legal Training Initiatives."

- (6) This target was met, as previously reported with the final, first-round training seminar held in November 2000.

The Kosovo Judicial Institute (KJI) has a international co-head of KJI and CEELI has approached him offering its cooperation regarding the development of a comprehensive training plan for the KJI. KJI has indicated a general willingness to cooperate in such an effort, but not enthusiasm. CEELI plans to continue to press this issue with KJI during successive workplan periods.

- (7) This target was met during the previous reporting period with the "Train the Trainers" seminar for judicial trainers held in Kosovo in June.

- (8) CEELI has discussed this workplan target with USAID. CEELI believes this workplan target ought to be approached in a more comprehensive manner than previously contemplated. The original plan of simply drafting a benchbook was initially preempted by the AIRE Center's plans of adapting their Russian benchbook to use in Kosovo. CEELI has no new information on progress on the AIRE Center's plans; accordingly, CEELI intends to push the creation of this benchbook itself.

Building on its experience with the Joint Advisory Council on Legislative Matters and its work drafting new criminal and criminal procedure codes for Kosovo, CEELI plans to create a working group to prepare a benchbook. The working group will ideally involve local experts and international human rights and trial experts. CEELI has already discussed this idea with judges and trial attorneys in the United States familiar with benchbooks and with certain key Kosovar judges. In addition, CEELI intends to capitalize on previous CEELI experience developing benchbooks in Croatia and elsewhere. Given the length of the contemplated process, realization of this target will occur in the next year of the grant period. Accordingly, CEELI has discussed with USAID/Pristina building this target and its expanded scope into its next workplan.

*Other Legal Training Initiatives*CEELI-ASF Pre-Trial Procedure Training Workshop

Throughout this workplan period, CEELI has collaborated closely with Advocats Sans Frontieres (ASF) representatives in Pristina to prepare two two-day trainings on the crucial topics of pre-trial procedures and legal writing skills. The training workshop is tentatively scheduled for October. It will be held in two cities, Prizren and Pristina. CEELI will provide the funding for two French experts chosen by ASF, simultaneous translations, videotaping and will host the trainings at CEELI facilities.

CEELI and ASF have actively consulted with the Chamber of Advocates to identify attorneys interested in such training as well as attorneys who might serve as competent local trainers. Based on these consultations, CEELI assembled a committee comprised of lawyers from Prizren and Pristina has been assembled to advise CEELI on the organization of the training. In a meeting with approximately 10 lawyers, CEELI, ASF, and the Kosovar attorneys reached a consensus was that the Kosovars would individually prepare and submit written materials regarding the specific pre-trial procedural issues that they face regularly. CEELI will adapt such current information into its training materials.

Throughout the planning of this training, CEELI has attempted to coordinate with OSCE's Criminal Defense Resource Center (CDRC) and the US Office Pristina (USOP), which together had been planning a similar training on common law trial advocacy. CEELI wanted to avoid the two trainings essentially "competing" for attendees and was concerned that the overlap of dates and the similar topic of discussion of these two trainings might lead to the weakening of both trainings. The result of several meetings was for CEELI to move the dates of its trainings.

Training for Bar Exam Candidates

As previously reported during the last reporting period, CEELI has been actively working to facilitate the organization of the bar exam for Kosovo's approximately 1000 graduated lawyers who would like to become judges or advocates. Inasmuch as the overwhelming majority of these law graduates who plan to take the bar exam as soon as it is offered have had little or no exposure to legal education or practice in the years following their graduation from law school, the consensus of those involved in the bar exam organization has long been that training will be necessary.

During this reporting period, the Kosovar Curriculum Working Group (see workplan project 5 discussion below) endeavored to prepare a preparatory manual by October. The exam was originally scheduled for November, but anticipating potential delays, the exam has been rescheduled to December 2001.

Accordingly, during this reporting period CEELI worked closely with the several organizations involved in the bar exam process, including OSCE, ASF, the Department of Justice (DJA), to organize the resources of these different organizations to help the candidates overcome the accumulated obstacles facing them. CEELI, OSCE, KJI, Council of Europe, and ASF will together offer, using the various resources of each organization, an intensive, eight-week training on a number of core subject matters.

The training will take place in October-November 2001, three days a week, for a total of 120 hours. It will be held in both Albanian and Serbian (with simultaneous translation). The majority of the trainers will be local experts, supplemented by international experts for selected topics, such as international human rights law and UNMIK legislation. In addition, the following areas of applicable law will also be covered in the course of the training: constitutional law, criminal law and procedure, civil law (which includes contracts, torts, property law, inheritance law and family law), civil procedure, administrative law, commercial law and labor law. While it will not be possible to comprehensively cover all these subject matters in two months, it is hoped that the attendants will refresh their knowledge of the fundamentals in direct interaction with the trainers.

At CEELI's urging, and with the support of the Chamber of Advocates, three practicing attorneys and active members of the Chamber will participate as trainers. The trainers will be as follows:

Thanks to this collaborative effort, an excellent body of expert trainers has committed itself to the project. In particular, the extensive participation of legal practitioners (judges and attorneys) will help the attendants acquire practical skills not taught at law school. All trainers will prepare written materials for distribution to the candidates. CEELI will arrange for the videotaping of all training sessions. The tapes can then be reproduced and made available to candidates unable to attend the training in Prishtina, as well as future candidates.

It is anticipated that the training will be offered to an estimated 60 candidates, who will be selected by the Bar Exam Commission to take the first post-conflict bar exam in November. In order to deal with the backlog problem, the Commission plans subsequently to set frequent, additional dates for the exam, possibly every three months. Accordingly, the organizations discussed above plan to repeat the training to the candidates prior to each exam and in each of the five judicial regions. While the training will be entirely optional, anecdotal evidence suggests that it has already been received with great interest by the potential candidates.

Constitutional Training

During the previous reporting period, CEELI identified a need for training on the new Constitutional Framework, UNMIK Regulation 2001/9 (May 15, 2001). CEELI identified particular needs for such a training, namely focusing on the Framework as a crucial component of the applicable law and how to interpret and use it. CEELI continued to meet with Blerim Reka, co-head of the JAC, a Professor of Law at Pristina Law Faculty, and executive director of the Kosovo Institute for Euro-Atlantic Integration (KIEAI) regarding organizing such a training. KIEAI wishes to stage a broader, more introductory training, focusing on lawyers, legislators, and journalists. CEELI has indicated a willingness to sponsor KIEAI's efforts with respect to attorneys, as a preparatory training that would benefit a more intensive training (focusing on the topics identified in the previous quarterly report) to be held next year. CEELI and KIEAI reached a preliminary agreement, with the involvement and blessing of USAID Senior Rule of Law Adviser Benjamin Allen. KIEAI's training is tentatively scheduled for late November and early December 2001, following the November 15 elections.

Project Two: Judges' Association**Targets**

The targets of the judges' association project for the workplan period are as follows:

1. By the end of the workplan period, the judges' association will have adopted an organizational statute.
2. By the end of the workplan period, the judges' association will have established its physical infrastructure and developed strategic, financial, and implementation plans.
3. By the end of the workplan period, the judges' association will have drafted and vetted a code of ethics.
4. By the end of the workplan period, judges will have been trained on the code of ethics.
5. By the end of the workplan period, the judges' association will have been introduced to the concept of *acting as a voice for judicial reform in Kosovo*.

Progress Achieved:

- (1-5) During the previous reporting period, CEELI substantially met the targets of this project.
- (4) However, CEELI understands that UNMIK continues to make progress on adopting a judicial ethics code (*during the previous reporting period, CEELI noted that it organized a roundtable on the draft ethics code prepared by UNMIK*). Accordingly, anticipating that the code might be adopted soon, CEELI continues to work with the Judges Association to prepare a training on the ethics code. The training while important to explain new aspects of the adopted code, is also crucial to emphasize the relevance to judicial independence. CEELI Rule of Law Liaison Beth Miller has met regularly during this reporting period with Judge Qerim Metaj, President of the Judges' Association to discuss the training Code of Judicial Ethics upon its approval by UNMIK. While the Judges Association has shown interest, their recommendation remains that it would be best to wait until the Code has received final approval. The Judges of the Executive Board, who have participated in former discussions on the Code are supposedly very familiar with its contents, and therefore subsequent meetings have been planned to incorporate their advice.

The Judges Association is also currently drafting an *internal code of ethics* to utilize as a guideline for conduct and disciplinary action against member of the association.

- (5) CEELI worked with the judges association to facilitate their work to review and comment upon the draft criminal and criminal procedure codes during the public comment period allowed by the UNMIK Office of Legal Adviser (see Project Three discussion below).

Project Three: Legislative Drafting and Analysis

Targets

The targets of the Legislative Drafting and Analysis project for the workplan period are as follows:

1. By the end of the workplan period, the Index will be updated regularly.
2. By the end of the workplan period, the Index will be available in Albanian, English, and Serbian.
3. By the end of the workplan period, the legal community will have access to the Index and other relevant legal resource materials via Internet and CD Rom.
4. By the end of the workplan period, the revision of the draft criminal and criminal procedure codes will be completed.
5. By the end of the workplan period, drafting of the civil and civil procedure codes will have begun.
6. By the end of the workplan period, if there is progress toward drafting a charter or constitution, a process for public participation will have been developed.

Progress Achieved:

Cumulative Index

- (1-4) CEELI continued this quarter to meet its workplan goal of regularly updating the Index in all three languages.

The Cumulative Index for 2000 is ready in all three languages and expected to be distributed to the courts during the next quarter.

The Cumulative Index for 2001 is currently available electronically in Albanian and English. The Serbian version is being translated and is expected during the next quarterly reporting period.

As previously reported, CEELI has begun assemble a library of UNMIK Regulations and Administrative Directions, which it plans to make available in the CEELI Secretariat office. The library will be based on the model used for the Index. As regulations are issued in English long before they are prepared in either Albanian or Serbian, the library will be ready in English first, with Albanian and Serbian to follow thereafter.

Legal Website

- (7) During this reporting period, CEELI made significant progress towards its longstanding goal of gaining access to electronic versions of ostensibly publicly available regulations, administrative directions, and administrative instructions issued by UNMIK. CEELI plans to put this information on CD ROMs and on a to-be-created website. During this

reporting period, CEELI gained access to electronic copies of most of the regulations from 1999 and several from 2000.

CEELI continues work on the website that would allow the legal community access to these important documents, which are largely unavailable elsewhere (UNMIK's public information staff often report they must have "permission" to hand out these legal acts, which are supposed to be public and effective). CEELI has contacted several web designers and is in the process of obtaining bids for the design work that would be necessary.

Joint Advisory Council on Legislative Matters

- (8) As in previous reporting periods, CEELI continued to support the work of the Joint Advisory Council on Legislative Matters (JAC/LM) in the course of its regular weekly meetings. CEELI provides translation/interpretation during JAC/LM meetings; prepares JAC/LM agendas and participant lists; keeps, compiles, translates, and distributes minutes of all JAC/LM meetings in Albanian and English. CEELI also provides translation, administrative and secretarial support, and transport. During this reporting period, the JAC began holding its regular meetings at the CEELI offices, as CEELI's conference room can accommodate all the members and CEELI has all the necessary materials on hand. The arrangement is working exceedingly well. The JAC members are very satisfied with the new space and all members, national and international, make use of CEELI personnel, equipment (copiers and phones), and supplies.

In addition, during this reporting period, CEELI has continued providing logistical and technical help to the working group on the drafting process of the criminal law and criminal procedure law. The work on these two codes, facilitated by CEELI in close cooperation with Council of Europe, was completed during this reporting period. CEELI integrated the changes and produced numerous copies of the codes, which were then distributed to various luminaries (the President of the Supreme Court and other Court Presidents, prosecutors' offices, police organizations, various UNMIK entities, KFOR, the President of the Chamber of Advocates, the President of the Judges Association, etc).

CEELI provided support to the Chamber of Advocates of Kosovo and to the Judges Association to prepare and submit their comments on the criminal law and criminal procedure law drafts.

Once the comments from various quarters were received, the CEELI Secretariat coordinated with UNMIK the compilation of the comments and the assembling of as many comments in electronic form as possible. CEELI will provide this resource, during the next reporting period, to a JAC working group which will make changes to the two drafts and finalize them. The working group is to be composed of Professors Salihu and Sahiti, the two principle drafters, two experts from the Council of Europe, and a Council of Europe language expert. The group will convene late in October for at least two weeks. CEELI will work closely with the working group, playing the same crucial coordinating role it did during the drafting of the two codes.

The CEELI Secretariat edited the Albanian version of the draft Criminal Code. The Serbian version of the draft Criminal Code was translated by CoE and revised by Professor Ismet Salihu, the main drafter of the code. Professor Ejup Sahiti will translate

the Serbian version of the draft Criminal Procedure Code. The translation into Serbian of the draft Criminal Procedure Code and the revision of the Serbian version of the draft Criminal Code will be financed by CEELI.

- (5) The JAC has determined that it plans to work next on the Juvenile Justice and Minor Offenses codes, rather than the civil and civil procedure codes. In part, this decision reflected the JAC's desire to make a contribution that would not be overly affected by the numerous regulations issued by UNMIK this year; the decision was also based on the fact that the JAC began working (albeit very preliminarily on both codes in early 2000). CEELI has discussed this change with USAID Senior Rule of Law Adviser Benjamin Allen. The JAC has requested that CEELI make available an American expert to assist in the juvenile justice code revisions.

Given the JAC's plans, as well as the relative speed with which UNMIK uncharacteristically approved this plan, CEELI has contacted several juvenile justice experts in the United States to accommodate the JAC's request. It is anticipated that CEELI will deploy a juvenile justice expert in late November.

- (6) This workplan target was attempted during the winter quarter, but vetoed by the Special Representative of the Secretary General. No significant work on this target during the reporting period due to a lack of response from the UN administration.

However, CEELI has been discussing with USAID the prospect of encouraging public participation through a public information campaign focusing on practical aspects of the legal system. It is anticipated that this campaign can and will be conducted with the cooperation of the Chamber of Advocates (see Project Four discussion below).

Other Secretariat Accomplishments:

CEELI Secretariat provided translation/interpreter service to the Kosovo Law Center (KLC) in a session of their legal clinic on contracts. CEELI assisted the international lawyers teaching commercial law at the University of Pristina, Law Faculty, by providing interpretation/translation services. CEELI Secretariat also supported the Department of Public Services by briefly reviewing translations of different regulations and other legal articles from law magazines ("Kosovo Law Review" and "The Justice") and offering suggestions.

Project Four: Kosovar Private Lawyers: Bar Association and Legal Aid Clinics

Targets

The targets of the Kosovo Private Lawyers project for the workplan period are as follows:

1. By the end of the workplan period, the Kosovo Chamber of Advocates will have created an *organizational structure* capable of addressing management, strategic planning, budgeting, and day-to-day operations of the association.
2. By the end of the workplan period, the Chamber's organizational documents will have been assessed, vetted, and adopted.
3. By the end of the workplan period, the Chamber will have identified and contacted potential sources of outside funding.
4. By the end of the workplan period, the Chamber will have developed strategic, financial, and implementation plans.
5. By the end of the workplan period, the Chamber will have begun Implementation of its strategic, financial, and implementation plans.
6. By the end of the workplan period, the Code of Ethics will have been revised, assessed, vetted, and adopted.
7. By the end of the workplan period, the Chamber will be familiarized with its role in legal reform and professional advocacy
8. By the end of the workplan period, organizations capable of placing legal interns will be identified.
9. By the end of the workplan period, CEELI and these organizations will have developed a process for identification, selection, and placement of legal interns.
10. By the end of the workplan period, the *legal community* will have adopted a model for a legal aid system in Kosovo and CEELI will have identified partner organizations for the establishment of legal aid clinics.

Progress Achieved:

- (1-7) During this reporting period, CEELI continued to work with the Chamber of Advocates to follow up on CEELI's very successful U.S. based-training, which was held during the previous reporting period.
- (1,4) CEELI held a Strategic Planning Session with the Kosovo Chamber of Advocates to begin the *process of developing* a long-term plan for the Chamber. The session featured the participation of American Bar Association President Robert Hirshon and CEELI Executive Director David Tolbert. Through presentations and break-out sessions, the attendees learned strategic skills and developed preliminary goals for the Chamber. The planning session was well attended and the Chamber leadership expressed their gratitude for this important information.

Also during this reporting period, CEELI worked with the Chamber to plan its long-delayed annual meeting. CEELI will help the Chamber hold the annual meeting, much as it did during the previous quarter for the founding assembly of the judges association.

- (1, 6) During the annual meeting the Chamber plans to adopt a new statute, ethical code, and strategic plan. CEELI requested the Chamber provide these documents to CEELI for review and assessment. The Chamber has indicated that it does not believe the documents will be done until shortly before the meeting. Accordingly, CEELI has requested that the Chamber plan to form committees to continue to improve on these documents following their adoption.
- (8) In the course of its discussion with the Chamber regarding making continuous improvements to its organizational documents and ethical standards, CEELI again raised the issue of the organizing the praktikant program. Although CEELI has concluded an advocacy grant agreement with the Chamber, it has been slow to move forward on this project. This slow progress is attributable to a number of drains on the time of the Chamber's President; CEELI has attempted to ameliorate this problem through its U.S. Based training and strategic planning workshop (described above) to educate the Chamber on the benefits to forming and using committees for various organizational tasks.
- (10) As previously reported, Council of Europe and the European Agency for Reconstruction initiated a project to develop a formal legal aid system in Kosovo. CEELI will continue to coordinate with both COE and the local project director.

Other Chamber initiatives

In consultation with USAID, CEELI has identified a need for a public information campaign focusing on the legal system. This project would also make use of the Kosovo Transition Initiative (KTI) resources still available in Kosovo.

Accordingly, CEELI recruited and deployed to Kosovo in September CEELI Foreign Legal Counsel Entela Josifi, an Albanian attorney with prior public information and public consultation experience working with the OSCE Presence in Albania. CEELI Counsel Josifi designed a public participation project that will work closely with the Chamber, USAID, and the International Organization for Migration (IOM), the contractor for the KTI program. The program is intended to build awareness among ordinary Kosovar citizens of their legal system and recent changes to it. CEELI's initial goals will be to conduct a short needs assessment to help both what information to include and how best to distribute it. During this reporting period, CEELI created a draft questionnaire to be use in this needs assessment.

CEELI will prepare brief descriptions of key legal issues in a way that is understandable to the general public as part of this campaign and translate this information (for likely inclusion in pamphlets and/or brochures) into the three languages used in Kosovo, English, Albanian, and Serbian.

During the reporting period, CEELI met with IOM staff and the staff of the National Democratic Institute to ascertain the best way to make use of their significant field contacts in this project. CEELI plans to meet also with representatives of Catholic Relief

Services' (CRS) Kosovo Education Program in order to discuss possibilities of reaching minority communities.

Project Five: Structure of the Judiciary

Targets

The targets of the Structure of the Judiciary project for the workplan period are as follows:

1. By the end of the workplan period, clear judicial disciplinary procedures will be in place.
2. By the end of the workplan period, mechanisms for implementing the judicial disciplinary procedures will be in place.
3. By the end of the workplan period, public awareness and understanding of judicial disciplinary procedures will have increased.

Progress Achieved:

- (1-3) As previously reported, UNMIK has largely obviated these workplan targets. However, CEELI is organizing substantive areas of training on UNMIK's proposed code of ethics and its associated judicial disciplinary procedure (see discussion under Workplan Project 2).

Other Workplan Related Activities

Bar Exam

CEELI continued during this workplan period to provide logistical and administrative support to the reestablishment of the bar exam. It has worked with OSCE and UNMIK to prepare a compilation of legal instruments which will be distributed in hard copy and CD ROM to bar exam applicants.

The updated curriculum of the bar exam includes international human rights instruments applicable in Kosovo as well as the regulations promulgated by the UN Administration (UNMIK). Obtaining the text of these new instruments is not always easy, though. It takes sometimes months for the new regulations to be generally available in English and even longer for the Albanian and Serbian versions to be published in Kosovo's Official Gazette. In addition, the Official Gazette is not easily available for the general public (and sometimes not even for the institutional users, such as the courts).

In view of this state of affairs, CEELI decided to put together and publish a compilation of legal materials for distribution to the bar exam candidates. The compilation will be bilingual (Albanian and Serbian) and will include the full text of UNSC Resolution 1244, Kosovo's new Constitutional Framework, the official translations of the European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR), as well as selected UNMIK regulations. CEELI will use the official UNMIK translations of the regulations, and where they are not available, its own unofficial translations by the staff of the Secretariat. CEELI is still in

the process of collecting the UNMIK regulations. They prove to be very difficult to obtain due to a lack of cooperation.

CEELI delivered a database of law graduates in Kosovo to the Department of Justice to use in vetting applicants to take the bar exam. Vetting candidates will be a major challenge for the Bar Exam Commission. The two main elements of eligibility to take the exam are a law degree and subsequent legal practice for one or two years. The bulk of the applicant body are graduates of the parallel educational system created by the Kosovar Albanians in the early 1990s when the Serbian regime prevented the Albanian students and professors from attending the University of Prishtina. While the degrees granted by the parallel law faculty before 1999 have been recognized by the UN Administration, verifying the authenticity of the documents of a sheer number of candidates will not be a simple task. Verification of the legal practice requirement presents even greater challenges, given the multiplicity of *individual attorneys*, public institutions and private entities authorized to issue certificates of attendance. In anticipation of such problems, CEELI created an electronic database of potential bar exam applicants, using data from the most reliable sources available.

CEELI will reproduce and distribute exam materials and the preparatory manual once they are complete. During this workplan period, CEELI continued to work with OSCE and Council of Europe to streamline the process and iron out details related to the training these materials will supplement.

Other issues provided by this Regulation are protection of foreign investments regarding takings, redress for extraordinary losses, guarantees for unrestricted use of income, protection from intellectual property abuses, access to public information, protection against the retroactive application of adverse laws, prohibition against favoritism and discrimination, labor and employment and resolution of investment disputes. This Regulation comes into force
