

**Rational Pharmaceutical Management Plus
Participation in the GFATM Procurement and Supply Management
Workshop in Bangkok, Thailand, July 25-31, 2005: Trip Report**

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About RPM Plus

The Rational Pharmaceutical Management Plus (RPM Plus) Program, funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (cooperative agreement HRN-A-00-00-00016-00), works in more than 20 developing countries to provide technical assistance to strengthen drug and health commodity management systems. The program offers technical guidance and assists in strategy development and program implementation both in improving the availability of health commodities—pharmaceuticals, vaccines, supplies, and basic medical equipment—of assured quality for maternal and child health, HIV/AIDS, infectious diseases, and family planning and in promoting the appropriate use of health commodities in the public and private sectors.

Background

WHO, GFATM and Malaria, HIV/AIDS and TB partners conducted a regional procurement and supply management workshop for SEARO and WPRO Countries in Bangkok, Thailand on July 25–30, 2005. The purpose of this workshop was to assist GFATM resource recipient countries to develop procurement and supply plans for HIV/AIDS/TB and Malaria commodities.

Management Sciences for Health's (MSH) Rational Pharmaceutical Management Plus (RPM Plus) Program receives funds from USAID to develop strategies and to provide technical assistance in pharmaceutical management issues for TB, HIV/AIDS, and malaria. RPM Plus is a key technical partner in the global initiatives, including the Global Drug Facility and Roll Back Malaria, PEPFAR, the Mekong Malaria Initiative, and in the USAID Malaria Action Coalition (MAC), a partnership among four technical partners: The World Health Organization (WHO), working primarily through its Africa Regional Office (AFRO), the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the ACCESS Program of JHPIEGO, and RPM Plus. RPM Plus was asked to provide presentations on TB drug management, rational drug use, and to provide technical assistance in facilitating work sessions during the meeting.

Purpose of Trip

To participate in and provide technical assistance and facilitation at the Procurement and Supply Management (PSM) Workshop for WPRO and SEARO countries. In addition, to collect relevant tools and materials and identify and apply the lessons learned to an upcoming PSM workshop planned for November 2005 to be held in Dakar, Senegal which will be co-hosted by RPM Plus.

Scope of Work

- Provide a presentation on rational drug use at the Procurement and Supply Management Workshop for SEARO and WPRO Countries, Bangkok, Thailand, Siam City Hotel: 25 - 30 July 2005
- Provide technical assistance during work sessions for country review of implementation
- Assist in facilitation and provide technical assistance for development of PSM plans
- Collect relevant tools and materials and identify and apply the lessons learned to the upcoming PSM workshop planned for November 2005 to be held in Dakar, Senegal to be co-hosted by RPM Plus.

Activities

Participate in the workshop

RPM Plus staff participated in the six-day workshop and provided technical assistance in the area of drug management of HIV/AIDS, TB and Malaria commodities during the sessions

Day one focused on introducing the objectives of the workshop and an overview of the PSM plan and the GFATM template. Presentations on product selection and forecasting were made with perspectives on each of the three diseases. Thomas Moore (MSH) and Hugo Vrakking (MSH/GDF) presented on issues related to TB medicines and commodities. This was followed by group work whereby the participants were divided into the three focus disease areas. Countries that already had PSM plans that had been approved by the GFATM discussed their implementation status and associated challenges. Those that did not have PSM plans ready used this time to work with their country counterparts to develop them.

Presentations on day two were on procurement and planning which included a discussion on policies, systems, capacity and price monitoring. As on day one, participants divided into their respective working groups for writing PSM plans or discussing implementation.

Day three had presentations on inventory control and management information systems, distribution, rational drug use and pharmacovigilance followed by group work.

On day four, presentations on quality assurance and quality control were made including prequalification as well and intellectual property rights. This was followed by group work. During the working groups, participants were asked to identify areas in which they needed technical assistance (TA), both national and international.

Day five focused on planning laboratory support and national PSM coordination mechanisms. At the beginning of the workshop, participants had been asked to write down their expectations of the workshop. The organizers collated and presented these responses on day five and asked the participants if the expectations had been met in an effort to address any outstanding issues or concerns. The organizers concluded that most of the expectations had been met and would address the few remaining issues. This discussion was followed by group work.

The last day consisted of discussions on sourcing of TA and finalization of PSM plans as well as distribution of evaluation forms for the workshop. An external evaluator was present throughout the workshop to observe and determine if the workshop objectives had been met.

Provide a presentation on rational drug use

A presentation on rational drug use was made by Andrew Barraclough on day 3. The presentation is attached in annex 2. Other presentations made by MSH staff were on product selection, quality assurance and quantification of TB medicines.

Provide technical assistance during work sessions for country review of implementation

TA was provided during the malaria, TB and HIV sessions for the country review of implementation. RPM Plus documents on the various aspects of implementation of malaria policy were shared with participants of countries. Several participants (Vietnam and Indonesia) requested electronic copies of documents particularly on pharmaceutical management and quantification. Although workshop organizers did not allow time to actually practice quantification calculations, MSH provided handouts to participants as a guide for estimating TB drug needs. The handouts are based on the RPM Plus TB workshop training materials.

The RPM Plus “*Checklist to assist with defining needs for technical assistance for policy change and implementation of ACT*” was shared with participants to use for defining needs for technical assistance in the various aspects of implementation of antimalarial drug policies.

Assist in facilitation and provide technical assistance for development of PSM plans

RPM Plus staff assisted several countries in specific areas of their PSM plans including Indonesia (HIV/AIDS, TB and Malaria), Laos and Sri Lanka (Malaria).

Discuss with organizers with participants the lessons learned from the workshop

Discussions were held with Vincent Habiyambere (WHO), Patrick Osewe (World Bank), Remy Prohom (MMSS), Françoise Renaud-Théry (WHO) as well as participants from Indonesia, China, Vietnam, Thailand, Nepal and India on what aspects of the workshop were useful and what could be done to make the workshop more effective. Most participants stated that the workshop was too long although they felt that the information provided was all relevant and important. Some participants thought that the disease specific issues should be discussed within the disease specific working group. Other participants stated that they wanted more information on aspects of pharmaceutical management including quantification (especially on how to actually do an accurate quantification). Several participants stated that they did not have all the stakeholders necessary to accurately complete their PSM plans as well to identify the areas in which they would need additional TA support. They were of the opinion that this process needed to be completed in country over a longer period of time. In addition some facilitators felt that they could have been more effective in providing support to the countries if the processes had made provision for this.

Next Steps

Immediate Follow-up Activities

1. Send specific RPM Plus malaria reports to participants that requested them (participants from Vietnam and Indonesia)
2. Send Vincent Habiyambere a list of training tools available from RPM Plus so that these can be shared with the participants.

Recommendations

Recommendations for the PSM Workshop in Dakar, Senegal (November 2005):

1. Long term TA is required by countries to help them develop and formulate PSM plans. It is difficult for this process to occur at a workshop setting with limited number of individuals from the country present. It is recommended that one of two options be used a) Technical partners in collaboration with the GFATM can provide TA to specific countries over a period of time to develop PSM plans. The result of this TA may culminate in a workshop such as this where initial drafts have been prepared by relevant people with the processes of appropriate consensus building and buy-in having been achieved before-hand. The purpose of the workshop in this case would be to answer any concerns or questions that may have arisen during the process. Alternatively b) a workshop could be convened first, with the workshop focusing on providing the tools for countries to develop their PSM in-country with a variety of presentations from appropriate technical experts. Key point technical experts (from partners) would then be identified to follow up with specific countries to answer any queries and a timeline for final submission of the plans should be made.
2. Allocate more time to the presentation and discussion of the PSM template on Day 1.
3. Prepare bullet point of issues under each heading in the PSM plan that should be discussed to provide some guidance to countries that are involved in completing the plan.
4. More guidance is needed by the GFATM and WHO to guide them through the required documentation and budgetary process.
5. The workshop should be no more than five days.
6. The workshop should have presentations specifically for providing background information for participants in order to develop their PSM plans. Other presentations on implementation should be part of a second workshop on implementation.
7. After the initial presentations the working groups should split by disease focus. The result of the discussions of the smaller working groups should be shared among participants in each disease group (not the plenary).
8. There is a need to provide more structure to facilitators during subsequent workshops on how to provide support to participants including allocation of specific experts to certain countries for specific TA.
9. There is a need for clear tools to help countries quantify requirements and develop appropriate systems.

10. There is a genuine need for MSH to provide appropriate tools and training in specific areas in drug management such as quantification.
