## I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report provides a summary of project activities carried out from August 13 through November 12, 2008 under the *Community and Humanitarian Assistance Program for Conflict Victims in Republic of Georgia* (CHAP/Georgia) emergency project in accordance with grant agreement number 114-G-00-08-0077-00 (including modifications #1-3).

The U.S. Agency for International Development awarded Counterpart International the sum of \$165,046.00 to provide support for CHAP/Georgia from August 13 - November 12, 2008 with the purpose of providing humanitarian assistance to the people of Georgia who were uprooted by the conflict between Georgia and Russia. The CHAP/Georgia project goal was to support the safe delivery of all donated medical supplies and critically needed shelter items, such as mattresses and pillows under this project.

### **The specific Project Objectives were:**

- Import of all medical commodities of the US Humanitarian Airlift in coordination with USAID and UMCOR
- Facilitate distribution of donated commodities in coordination with USAID, Department of State funded PVOs and Ministry of Labor, Health, and Social Affairs of Georgia (MOLHSA)
- Procure and distribute mattresses and pillows for approximately 2,500 IDPs
- Distribute 108 pallets of food and non-food items to IDP collective centers in Tbilisi and Gori

Counterpart International successfully reached the project goal and met, and in some instances, exceeded the targets established for the grant by organizing the receipt and handling of all humanitarian commodities transported to Georgia by eleven U.S. airlifts. Our work resulted in the procurement and distribution of almost \$4.5 million in U.S. aid to over 35,000 new Georgian IDPs.

All Counterpart International activities were planned and implemented in close coordination with USAID, U.S. Department of State (EUR/ACE), MOLHSA, Ministry of Refugees and Accommodation of Georgia (MRA), UNDP, UNHCR, WFP, WHO, and five U.S. Department of State Private Volunteer Organization (PVO) implementing partners in Georgia.

## II. PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

### Background Information

On August 7, 2008 Georgia launched a crackdown on separatist fighters in autonomous region of South Ossetia. The following day Russian troops and tanks moved into South Ossetia and pushed the Georgian forces back. Fighting between both sides led to heavy shelling and bombing of Ossetian and Georgian villages in South Ossetia and areas adjacent to South Ossetia including the city of Gori, and Georgian-controlled Kodori Gorge in Abkhazia. Many areas of Georgia proper were bombed by Russian war planes causing damage to civilian housing and forcing residents to flee their homes and towns. On August 12, Georgia and Russia reached a cease-fire agreement, however, later Russian troops and South Ossetian militia moved to Akhgori causing further displacement of people.

According to information provided by the Government of Georgia, the military conflict resulted in over 150,000 IDPs at the peak of displacement. The displaced were housed in collective centers primarily located in Tbilisi, Gori and Kutaisi. Still today almost 20,000 displaced people remain in Tbilisi alone.


From the onset of the crisis, the U.S. triggered its humanitarian response partners to provide immediate delivery of assistance to the affected population in close coordination with the Georgian Government, the UN system and the NGO community. The response focused on the provision of essential support to newly displaced populations across the country and the setting up of a camp hosting 2,500 IDPs in Gori. Food and non-food items were made available; health care and psycho-social support mechanisms were put into place; and vital repairs were made to water and sanitation systems in collective centers to enable the continued accommodation of IDPs.

### Strategies and Activities Undertaken and their Corresponding Results

Counterpart, with extensive experience in emergency preparedness and disaster response and mitigation activities, began crisis relief activities within the mandate of its Community and Humanitarian Assistance Program in Georgia on August 10, 2008. CHAP immediately responded to the emergency humanitarian needs of the new wave of Georgian IDPs by providing food and first-priority medical, shelter and hygiene items.

#### *Disaster Package Distributions*

Prior to the events, Counterpart had administered pre-staged items in Georgia from the U.S. Department of State Disaster Package (DP) that were almost entirely and immediately distributed during the first days of the crisis from August 10-13, 2008. The distributed commodities included high-capacity tents, sleeping bags, cots, field beds, wool blankets, bed sheets, pillowcases, pneumatic mattresses, and mixed medical equipment and supplies to serve the influx of IDPs into newly opened collective centers in Tbilisi.



The direct primary recipients of the DP commodities were N. Kipshidze University Hospital, Tbilisi City Hospital #1 and the Ministry of Refugees and Accommodation. Medical equipment and supplies were used by hospitals to treat the influx of wounded; tents, sleeping bags and household items were handed over to the MRA to meet the needs of IDPs coming to newly organized collective centers, mainly in Tbilisi, but Bazaleti, Mtskheta, and Gori as well. The total value of the commodities distributed from the DP was over \$1.5 million.

### *Airlift activities*

Under contract with USAID/OFDA Counterpart provided necessary logistical support to organize an air bridge to receive and distribute humanitarian commodities that began to flow in from U.S. military transport planes. USAID/OFDA tasked Counterpart to handle the first two U.S. C-17 aircraft. Subsequently, from August 13-18 Counterpart was the on-the-ground coordinator for the first eleven U.S. military airlifts coming from Ramstein Air Force Base, Germany. In close coordination with the Tbilisi International Airport authorities, the commercial operator TAV Urban, and other airport customs, logistics and cargo services, Counterpart organized the off-loading of the airplanes, cargo movement to the commercial cargo terminals, customs clearance and further transportation to the pro-bono warehouse provided by the MRA.



### *Shelter and Food Item Distribution*


Beginning on August 18, OFDA's Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART) assumed full coordination responsibility for the incoming US humanitarian assistance airlifts and Counterpart concentrated its activities on distributing arriving humanitarian assistance commodities to IDPs. One container with 20,736 meals ready-to eat (MREs) consigned to WFP arrived in Poti, which was still under the control of Russian troops. Counterpart was tasked with resolving ownership, port-related and customs issues and move the container out. It was successfully delivered to Kutaisi Administration for distribution among IDPs located in IDP collective centers in Kutaisi and nearby areas. Assistance in the form of MREs and humanitarian daily rations were distributed among IDPs located in different centers of Tbilisi in coordination with the MRA and the corresponding district administrations, particularly Vake, Saburtalo, Gldani, Nadzaladevi, Chughureti, Isani, Samgori, and Mtatsminda districts in Tbilisi. In many instances, local administrations were providing vehicles for distribution without charge.

### *Procurement of Shelter Items*

Having assessed the priority needs of IDPs and addressed the most pressing needs for mattresses and beddings with the funds allocated by USAID/OFDA for emergency project, Counterpart procured, transported, cleared, and distributed 2,400 mattresses and 4,000 pillows from Georgia, Armenia and Azerbaijan. The MRA provided a truck and driver to move mattresses from Armenia to Georgia.


### *Final Distributions in Coordination with USAID/OFDA*

Finally, Counterpart was tasked with distributing 112 pallets of mixed hygiene supplies and baked goods received from DART. All of the items were distributed to IDPs located in different IDP collective centers of Tbilisi.


*US Mission Support Activities*

During the project implementation period, Counterpart was asked by the U.S. Mission to support the arrangements and greet and brief U.S. delegations.

Special Envoy and Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs Matthew Bryza, and Minister of Labor, Health and Social Affairs Alexander Kvitashvili met the first C-17 airplane. These were the first in a series of U.S. Government emergency airlifts that came from United States European Command (EUCOM) Ramstein Airforce Base in Germany in response to the Government of Georgia request for humanitarian assistance. The airplane cargo contained cots, sleeping bags, blankets, medicines, and medical equipment such as syringes, needles, and surgical items as requested by the Georgian Ministry of Labor, Health and Social Affairs. Counterpart's staff received and distributed the mentioned assistance among IDPs located in hospitals and other centers.





Counterpart's team members met Senator Joe Biden at the airport during the receipt of the airlift and accompanied him during his visit at IDP collective centers.

Senator Joseph Biden (D-Delaware) and future Vice-President, visited Tbilisi Georgia on August 17 on a one-day fact finding mission. Biden viewed the off-loading of a U.S. Air Force humanitarian assistance flight with sleeping bags and other priority items requested by the Georgian Government. He met with USAID personnel and NGO contractors, among them, Counterpart representatives, who were distributing US Government aid to the more than 158,000 persons displaced by the conflict. Senator Biden also visited

an internally displaced person collective center and talked to IDPs and the implementing partners. U.S. Ambassador John Tefft was also present along with several representatives of the U.S. Embassy and USAID.

CHAP/Georgia staff together with other US DOS grantees participated in the visit to IDP collective centers in Tbilisi, where he was briefed on the current situation of the displaced persons and witnessed distribution of different commodities among IDPs.

All the official visits were highlighted via international and local press and televisions.

### *Coordination*

Counterpart planned and implemented all activities in close coordination with the U.S. Mission, the USAID Country Mission, DART, and U.S. Department of State (EUR/ACE). All humanitarian assistance distributions were thoroughly coordinated with the Ministry of Labor, Health, and Social Affairs of Georgia and Ministry of Refugees and Accommodation of Georgia.

An additional level of coordination occurred with the DOS PVO implementing partners in Georgia-UMCOR, IRD, Hellenicare and ACTS. The consignment of medical commodities that were delivered by the aircraft was coordinated with UMCOR. Moreover, IRD privately sourced 100,000 doses of antibiotics that were added to one of the airlifts. Counterpart delivered to UMCOR assistance in the form of sleeping bags and bed sheets, which have been distributed among 125 IDPs in located in the building of musical school of Isani-Samgori District of Tbilisi. Counterpart arranged coordination meetings with Hellenicare regarding organizing Mobile Medical Team visits to collective centers identified by Counterpart. On August 17, five PVO partners organized joint complimentary distribution of assistance to the collective center at the old Ministry of Finance building.

### *Monitoring and Further Needs Assessment*

Counterpart was actively involved in the monitoring of effective use of the distributed assistance. In some case redistribution occurred quickly to meet the latest arising needs and challenges. For instance, folding beds that were originally distributed to the Kipshidze University Hospital to provide the surge capacity and treat the incoming wounded were redistributed to serve IDPs in the newly opened Gori Tent Camp. During distributions Counterpart's staff was actively involved in monitoring and rapid needs assessments and was providing recommendations about the needs to the U.S. Mission and U.S. Department of State (EUR/ACE). Counterpart provided and information to UN agencies and inputs to UNDP's Flash Appeal submission.

## **III. SUMMARY**

Overall, the coordinated and timely response of CHAP/Georgia allowed for the delivery and distribution of almost \$4.7 million of U.S. aid to 39,300 Georgian IDPs from August to October 2008.

The distributed humanitarian assistance items consisted of medical equipment and supplies, tents, mattresses, blankets, pillows, beds, sleeping bags, hygiene supplies, and food items with total value of \$4,694,009.00. See attachment #1 – Detailed List of Counterpart-distributed Items.


