### Food Security Situation\*

- Poverty and large-scale internal displacement due to conflict threaten Colombians' food security.
- Threats to rural populations by illegal armed groups increasingly restrict movement and limit access to markets and agricultural land, and consequently to food and other goods.
- Assessment results and past trends indicate that 530,000 people will require World Food Program assistance each year until 2011. Many who are forced to flee their homes due to conflict do not register as internally displaced persons because they are afraid of being stigmatized or threatened. WFP is addressing the needs of the displaced and vulnerable populations who cannot be reached through government humanitarian and social sector programs.
