Food Security Situation*

- Poverty, droughts, HIV/AIDS, arid and semi-arid lands, and demographic trends all combine to threaten Kenya's food security situation.
- Poor rains in coastal marginal agricultural lowlands and significant parts of agropastoral and pastoral areas, are likely to accentuate food insecurity. Substantial crop losses are expected to occur in the marginal agricultural areas in the southeast and on the coast, which will likely heighten food insecurity.
- Scarcity of maize has driven prices up to unprecedented levels, some 180 percent above normal, in markets situated in pastoral and marginal agricultural areas, underlining the erosion of purchasing capacities for cereal-deficit households.
