Food Security Situation*

- Mozambique is one of the poorest countries in the world and is affected by high poverty, recurring natural disasters such as a cyclones and floods, and a very high HIV/AIDS rate. The national adult HIV/AIDS prevalence rate is 16 percent.

- Despite some improvement in the overall food security, in the semi-arid districts of southern Tete province and northwest Gaza province, and the semi-arid district of Sofala province, households are at high risk of food insecurity in the very near future, and moderate levels of food insecurity are expected to continue throughout the consumption year. One projection estimates 175,000 people will need food aid by August with an additional 72,000 requiring food assistance in Maputo and Inhambane provinces from October 2009-April 2010.
