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Introduction

The Sustainable Forest Products Global Alliance is a public/private partnership that seeks to make markets work for forests and people. Together, the partners in the Global Alliance work to advance a new model for forest conservation and community development in USAID-presence countries in which sustainable forest management is rewarded in the global marketplace. By reducing trade in illegally harvested or unsustainably managed forest products, opportunities for resource-dependent communities and low-income producers will grow. The objectives of this project are to:

1. Enhance demand for legally produced products from well-managed forests through implementation of responsible purchasing practices by global businesses and other organizations.
2. Increase supply of products legally produced from well-managed forests that generate social, economic, and ecological benefits through improved forest management.
3. Increase efficient trade of legal forest products from well-managed forests through the development and dissemination of information that enhances decision making of willing buyers and sellers.

In over six years, the Global Alliance has become an effective forum for addressing issues of common concern, creating consensus on solutions to challenges and coordinating approaches among diverse stakeholders from the public and private sectors. The principles of the Global Alliance have been incorporated into the operations and management of companies and organizations around the world.

This report summarizes the accomplishments of one of the non-governmental partner—WWF—for the second half (April 1, 2008 through September 30, 2008) of the sixth funding year of the Global Alliance. During this period, WWF made substantial progress towards accomplishing the expected achievements defined for the year.

The following is the key achievement during the second half of the Year Six.

- The number of trade participants¹ in the Global Forest & Trade Network (GFTN) decreased slightly to **278** companies.² These companies currently trade **248** million cubic meters of round wood equivalent (RWE) per year (approximately 15% of the global harvest of industrial round wood based on FAO estimates in 2005), which represents nearly **\$61** billion in forest product sales per year. At the end of Year Six, there are 10 trade participants on suspension due to their lack of progress against their action plans. - The number of forest participants³ in the GFTN has increased to **84** companies managing over **27** million hectares of forests, of which **23.7** million hectares are now under effective management. At the end of Year Six, there are two forest participants on suspension. (See Figure 2a: GFTN Trade Participants Progress and Table 2: Annual Summary of Effective and Improved Hectares)
- In addition, a total of **78** applicants are at various stages of application process. Those applicants manage additional **4.9** million hectares of forests, trade approximately **\$942** million of forest products per year.
- As of the end of Year Six, GFTN has generated **424** enquiries from trade participants or applicants who wish to purchase more responsibly from forest participants in the network. To date **183** of these enquiries have become market links where the two organizations are now trading. These market links have an estimated value of **\$80 million**. The remaining 241 enquiries remain open for current or future GFTN participants. These enquiries have a value of in excess of \$323 million and range from plywood and paper to sawn wood and logs. This represents considerable demand for responsibly produced forest products and is a useful indicator of market trends. (See Figure 3b. GFTN Market Links Progress)
- GFTN estimates approximately **2.34 million** employees and **5595 community families** are currently benefiting from the GFTN participating companies. (See Annex 2: Annual Summary of Economic Indicators).
- During Year Six, GFTN trained **945** professionals (architects, designers, contractors and building owners); forest products companies, trade associations, NGOs and federal agencies) on purchasing, specifying, and financing responsibly produced and/or traded forest products. In addition, **27,026** people in communities, local NGOs and private sector (forest management companies, primary processors, cooperatives) are trained on how to access markets for responsible forest products. Following Section 1 gives an overview by each objective and activity and Section 2 highlights major accomplishments and activities made during the second half of the Year Six.

In addition, annual summary of leverage by WWF is listed in the Annex 3 and the list of GFTN participants and applicants as of September 30, 2008 is available in Annex 4.



At the end of Year Six, there are 10 trade participants on suspension due to their lack of progress against their action plans.

North America

- During the second half of Year Six, GFTN North America (GFTN-NA) welcomed two new participants – Walmart and Williams-Sonoma, Inc.
- Walmart committed its U.S. operations (retail stores, Sam’s Club, and walmart.com) to increasing the proportion of wood products originating from credibly certified sources. Walmart’s annual wood turnover is approximately 2 billion USD, and they source from areas including but not limited to China, Brazil, Russia, India and Indonesia. Walmart’s scope of participation includes the importation and sale of all wood-based products with an initial focus on wood-based furniture. GFTN is already utilizing the global network to assist Walmart in their commitment. GFTN has provided Chain of Custody training to a Vietnamese supplier, and GFTN-China is already working with the Walmart office in Shenzhen to help them understand certification standards.
- Williams-Sonoma, Inc. committed to increasing its proportion of wood products originating from credibly certified sources and phasing out unknown and unwanted wood sources from its supply chain for Williams-Sonoma, Inc. brands (Pottery Barn, Pottery Barn Kids, PBteen, West Elm and Williams-Sonoma Home) in the United States and Canada. Williams-Sonoma, Inc. has annual sales over 3.7 billion USD and sources from WWF priority areas including the Amazon, Borneo, Sumatra, China and the

	<p>Mekong.</p> <p><u>Europe</u></p> <p><i>WWF's activities in Europe are supported by matching funds.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Celebrating the GFTN's expansion to Portugal, one of the major tropical timber importer from Africa, GFTN-Iberia welcomed four Portuguese companies; Listor (Flooring manufacturer); Ambiodiv (specifiers); Susdesign (specifiers); and Cork Supply (cork supplier).• Listor is a Portuguese flooring manufacturer that produces approximately 100,00 m3 of flooring products per year with trading relationships established in North America, Asia, Brazil, and Europe.• GFTN-UK participant Saint-Gobain Building Distribution has made significant progress towards a fully certified supply base. International Timber, Saint-Gobain's specialist timber importing and distribution business, has received its first two bills of landing of FSC-certified sapele – one from Cameroon and the other from Congo. In July 2008, six GFTN-China participants from three GFTN-China companies: Yingbin-Nature, Fuxiang, and Dongning Jixin visited the Irkutsk region of Siberia along with the China and Russia GFTN managers. <p>The study tour was designed to give the Chinese companies a clear overview of FSC certification and legal suppliers in the region. During the visit the companies visited a number of potential supply companies in Siberia, which allowed them to identify new sources in the region. In addition the Chinese companies met with local government officials and gained an understanding of the regional concession allocation process and how legislation can be complied with. The study tour resulted in a 15 million USD investment project. This tour was especially useful for Dongning Jixin as a major importer from Siberia and the Russian Far East. Dongning Jixin is under pressure to demonstrate legality for a major customer in Japan and wants to increase their customer base in Europe and North America by utilizing the growing market for credibly certified products. The visit gave Jixin a number of sourcing options as they move forward and gave them clear guidance on how and where to establish a new mill in the region.</p>


- **Companies committed to responsible purchasing of wood and paper products.** GFTN is working with companies who have signed 356 MOUs and are implementing their commitment to make a significant progress on sourcing forest products responsibly by creating or improving their responsible purchasing policies.
- **Ghana and the European Union enter into the first Voluntary Partnership Agreement.** On September 3rd 2008 Ghana became the first country to enter into a Voluntary Partnership Agreement (VPA) with the European Union under the European Forest Law Enforcement, Governance and Trade (FLEGT) Action Plan. The VPA requires Ghana to establish a licensing scheme for EU-bound timber exports that certifies that all of the goods have been legally harvested. On the EU side, the deal requires the EU to establish a system that ensures that uncertified Ghanaian timber is not able to enter the market. More broadly, the deal is also intended to promote better enforcement of forest law and has been designed to facilitate active involvement by both civil society and the private sector. GFTN-Ghana and WWF have been key players in the FLEGT-VPA process in Ghana. GFTN-Ghana made critical inputs to the elements under negotiation particularly in developing a definition for "Legal Timber" and the development of a Wood Tracking System for Ghana. The GFTN-Ghana manager was nominated as a member of the Verification and Licensing Working Group of the VPA processes in Ghana, and as Chairman of the working group he led six different meetings to offer technical advice and invaluable input into the Ghana Wood Tracking System and the overall Legality Assurance System of the VPA.
- **United States Amendment to the Lacey Act.** On May 22, 2008, the United States Congress passed a groundbreaking amendment to the Lacey Act that bans the import, sale, and trade of illegally sourced plants and wood products. WWF lobbied strongly for the provision and is working to disseminate information and maintain broad based multi-stakeholder support.

Objective 2 - Increase supply of products legally produced from well-managed forests that generate social, economic, and ecological benefits through improved forest management.

Asia

WWF's activities in Asia are supported by matching funds.

- *China:* GFTN-China successfully recruited Fujian Yong'an Forestry (Group) Joint Stock Co., Ltd. The Yong'an Company manages a large forest management unit in the south of China and exports fiberboard and flooring products to China, South Korea, Canada, United States and Australia. The Yong'an Company received FSC certification of 116,217 ha of their forests, the largest FSC Forest Management certificate in the region. The company's two subsidiary manufacturers acquired FSC Chain of Custody (CoC). During Yong'an's application process, WWF and Tetra Pak jointly supported the company in identifying High Conservation Value Forests (HCVFs) and provided technical training on the government's policy, both of which increased Yong'an's technical capacity. GFTN-China will work with the Yong'an Company to maintain their certification.
- *Malaysia:* GFTN-Malaysia welcomed two new forest participants, Kumpulan Pengurusan Kayu Kayan Terengganu (KPKKT), and Sabah Forestry Department (SFD) Ulu Segama Malua forest reserves.
- KPKKT is a major timber producer in Terengganu state. KPKKT manages forests that have high biodiversity and provide habitat for 51 species of mammals including tigers, Seladang, bears and 184 species of birds. KPKKT has already achieved FSC certification for 108,900 ha of forests so GFTN-Malaysia will work with KPKKT to maintain their certification and will carry out the assessment of High Conservation Value Forests

	<p>(HCVF) within KPKKT's concession. KPKKT also manufactures approximately 144,000 m³ of sawnwood, doors, and furniture per year to major export markets including the United Kingdom (UK), United States, and Middle East.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Ulu Segama Malua forest reserve covers 241,098 hectares of forests located in the Heart of Borneo including areas of important habitat for the endangered Orang Utan. GFTN-Malaysia will collaborate with the Sabah Forestry Department to pursue credible certification for the USM forest reserve. <p><u>West Africa</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Ghana:</i> GFTN-Ghana provided assistance to GFTN-Ghana applicant, Ayum Forest Products Ltd., as they underwent a weeklong certification pre-assessment. Ayum manages a 101,539 hectares concession and produces 20,000 m³ of dowels, flooring, sliced and rotary veneer, mouldings and sawnwood per year with exports to Europe and the United States. <p><u>Central Africa</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Cameroon:</i> Rougier-Cameroon, who manages 550,921 hectares, applied for CAFTN membership. Rougier-Cameroon produces 65,000 m³ per year with major exports to Europe. GFTN-CA will work with Rougier-Cameroon as it prepares for pre-audit in September 2008. <p><u>Latin America and Caribbean</u></p> <p><i>Bolivia:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • GFTN-Bolivia is working with three new forest applications: San Juan Pando, Boltial, and Ipacarai, who are expected to sign participation agreements in the next reporting period. In addition, three new forest management companies have started the application process: Pontons, Wood House Rinfa and Cururú. • San Juan Pando manages 60,000 hectares of Southwestern Amazonia Moist Forests. The conference brought together over 240 people from industry, government, financial institutions, NGOs and academia to discuss the latest trends and developments in China’s role around certified forests, forest products and markets. GFTN-China gave a presentation on the work and success of the GFTN program. In addition a GFTN-China participant, Yingbin-Nature gave a presentation titled, “To Promote Forest Sustainable Business is to Promote Forest Industry Sustainable Development”. Their presentation centered around their experience promoting sustainable forest businesses and gave clear examples of the business case behind certification. The conference helped solidify the multiple benefits of certification including using certification as a risk management tool, and the opportunity to participate in a growing market for independently verified “green products”. • <i>Indonesia:</i> In May 2008 GFTN-Indonesia, in collaboration with the Association of

Forest Concessionaires Indonesia (APHI), hosted a half-day workshop for forest sites in the Borneo area. Entitled “Socialization of Sustainable Forest Management Practices Programs in Heart of Borneo Areas”, the workshop focused on greening local businesses and revitalizing their sense of responsibility in sustaining Borneo’s forest. More than thirty companies, high level government officials and forestry stakeholders attended the workshop. Representatives of GFTN-Indonesia participant PT Sari Bumi Kusuma (SBK) presented their company’s firsthand experience with the certification process. Learning about the benefits and challenges of the process from a company perspective allowed those in attendance to better understand the business case for pursuing credible certification. GFTN-Indonesia expects that the workshop will assist them in recruiting progressive forest concessions in the Heart of Borneo.

Central Africa

- *CAR:* GFTN-CA organized the national workshop on Sustainable Forest Management in Bangui, Central African Republic. Thirty-five people attended the workshop including the Minister of Forestry. The workshop increased awareness of GFTN-CA and promoted the opportunities around sustainable forest management.

Latin America and Caribbean

- *Bolivia:* GFTN-Bolivia completed and launched their website. The site is designed to discuss the objectives, benefits and requirements of joining GFTN-Bolivia. In addition, the site hosts a database of Bolivian producers and has a “Business Centre” where participant companies can offer their products and show photos. The site will raise awareness about GFTN-Bolivia, and serve to strengthen market links services provided to GFTN-Bolivia participants.
- *Brazil:* GFTN-Brazil hosted a booth at the 3rd annual FSC Trade Fair (Feira Brasil Certificado) held in the city of Sao Paulo, with approximately 5,000 people in attendance. The Trade Fair booth provided an opportunity for discussion among companies, NGOs, and government representatives about the positive role of GFTN in moving companies toward responsible forest management and trade. GFTN-Brazil also created an impromptu forum for facilitating market links and promoted their program. The event was an overall success in furthering GFTN’s work in Brazil and raising the awareness of the importance of certification for the conservation of forests, especially those of the Amazon.

GFTN-Brazil also used the occasion to launch their Boletim Mercado Florestal Certificado (Certified Forest Market Bulletin). This quarterly bulletin showcases the economic benefits associated with investing in credible certification. By providing the prices of certified products such as lumber, flooring, decking, copaiba oil, açai, and Brazil nut oil, the bulletin informs companies and communities about the profitability of the certified products industry and certification.



Although a series of links were facilitated, the number of actual trade relationship did not meet the annual target. <p><u>Market links:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • As of the end of Year Six Quarter Two, GFTN has generated 425 enquiries from trade participants or applicants who wish to purchase more responsibly from forest participants in the network. To date 183 of these enquiries have become market links where the two organizations are now trading. These market links have an estimated value of \$80 million. This represents considerable demand for responsibly produced forest products and is a useful indicator which GFTN offices are using to inspire new participation. <p><u>Highlights</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Central Africa/France links:</i> GFTN-CA and WWF-France organized a Press Trip to Cameroon to promote certified timber from the Congo Basin and encourage market links between GFTN-CA and GFTN-France. • <i>Bolivia/Spain links:</i> GFTN participants in Bolivia and Spain have agreed to trade two containers of credibly certified products per month starting in 2009. • <i>Bolivia/Netherlands links:</i> GFTN participants in Bolivia and the Netherlands agreed on a credibly certified wood-flooring contract starting in November 2008. • <i>Peru/Brazil links:</i> - GFTN-Peru participant Aserradero Espinoza sold 120 m3 of hardwood to GFTN-Brazil participant Precious Woods. • <i>North America/Indonesia links:</i> Two GFTN-Indonesia participants are selling garden furniture to two GFTN-NA participants. • <i>Malayasia/UK enquiries:</i> GFNT-UK participants Christina Meyer Sustainable Wood Products and Saint Gobain each sent an enquiry to the McCorry Group. • <i>Enquires for the UK:</i> GFTN-UK has provided GFTN-UK participants with the details of products available from GFTN producers. Examples of this are for products from GFTN participants in Bolivia, China, Russia, and Central Africa. • <i>Iberia/Bolivia enquires:</i> Five market enquires resulted from the GFTN-Bolivia/GFTN-Iberia business mission.
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- *Iberia/Cameroon enquires:* Five market enquires were established from the International Business Seminar on promotion of Responsible Timber Trade between Spain and the Congo Basin countries which was reported on in the last semi-annual report.
- *Enquires for Russia:* Russia, China, Germany, UK, the Netherlands, Vietnam, Spain, France, and Belgium all generated enquiries to GFTN-Russia participants for paper, pulp, sawnwood, joinery, construction materials, plywood, veneer sheets, roundwood, (equivalent to 750,000 USD).
