Haiti – Storms

Humanitarian Assistance in Review, Fiscal Year (FY) 2008 – Present

- On September 2, 2008, U.S. Ambassador Janet A. Sanderson issued a disaster declaration in response to Hurricane Gustav and resulting flooding throughout Haiti. In FY 2008 and to date in FY 2009, USAID/OFDA has provided more than \$13.3 million in humanitarian assistance to disaster-affected populations in Haiti, including support for logistics, emergency relief supplies, economy and market systems, shelter and settlements, coordination, health, agriculture and food security, protection, nutrition, and water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) interventions.
- USAID/Haiti redirected \$5 million in funds toward humanitarian assistance and emergency relief activities to meet critical needs resulting from FY 2008 hurricanes and storms. In addition, USAID has begun programming more than \$96 million in assistance through the Haiti Integrated Growth through Hurricane Emergency Recovery (HIGHER) program.
- USAID continues to respond to emergency needs in Haiti through USAID's Office of Food for Peace (USAID/FFP). In FY 2009, USAID/FFP has provided nearly \$28.3 million in P.L. 480 Title II emergency food assistance to Haiti in order to address the needs of flood-affected populations. The contribution has enabled the U.N. World Food Program (WFP) and private voluntary organization (PVO) partners to respond to relief and recovery food aid needs in Haiti.
- The U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) provided logistics and transportation support (helicopters and landing craft) valued at more than \$2.6 million in response to a USAID request.
