## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The USAID-funded Southern Sudan Interactive Radio Instruction (SSIRI) Project designs, develops, produces and broadcasts interactive radio instruction programs in coordination with the Southern Sudanese Ministry of Education, Science, and Technology (MoEST). SSIRI implements three interrelated, radio-based education programs:

- **The Learning Village**
- **TERBIA - Teaching English through Radio-Based Instruction for All**
- **Professional Studies for Teachers**

*The Learning Village* consists of English, literacy, and mathematics for primary grades 1 to 4.

*Terbia*, which means “education” in simple Arabic, provides English language instruction to youth and adults, and engages the learners in important issues around the Comprehensive Peace Agreement (CPA) and civic education.

*Professional Studies for Teachers* is a non-traditional, radio-based, distance-learning course to improve the teaching practice of Southern Sudanese teachers and help them to earn credit toward certification. The first module of twelve lessons is PS 101 focusing on classroom management.

This report outlines activities and achievements of SSIRI during its 10<sup>th</sup> project quarter, from October 1 to December 31, 2006. Highlights of the activities completed this quarter include:

- Start of Primary 4, Terbia and PS101 plus the extension of SSIRI to the three urban areas of Juba, Malakal, and Wau, plus the Three Areas of Southern Kordofan, Blue Nile, and Abyei;
- Primary 1 and 2 on the air for 470 classrooms;
- Continued development of the Primary 3 series;
- Start of the Primary 4 series development;
- Distribution of the Primary 2 Teacher’s Guide; and
- Outreach Staff training.

## SSIRI TECHNICAL ACTIVITIES

### ***THE LEARNING VILLAGE- Primary Grades 1, 2, 3 and 4***

#### **Broadcasting Primary 1 and Primary 2**

Primary 1 and Primary 2 lessons were aired on the shortwave frequency 15205 kHz. Upon completion of 100 lessons for each grade, the broadcasts were concluded on December 8 at the end of the academic year. SSIRI will resume broadcasting P1 and P2 and introduce P3 next school year, which is expected to begin early April 2007.

#### **Reception**

Reports from SSIRI Outreach staff indicate that SSIRI reception is loud and clear in target locations and that there are no interferences from other radio stations. Though occasionally there is variation in volume during the broadcast, staff report that teachers can manage this without any significant loss in the lesson. Generally, the P1 reception between 9:30 and 10:00 AM was better than the subsequent P2 reception between 10:00 and 10:30 AM.

#### **Using FM Stations**

Mr. Huub Gales, Manager of UNMIS FM Radio, agreed to provide free radio time for SSIRI in 2007, after listening to sample lessons provided by the Outreach Advisor and sharing them with supervisors of the United Nations Mission in Sudan, pending the signatures on a formal agreement between the MoEST and UNMIS.

#### **P3 Development and Scriptwriting**

The scriptwriting team completed the first drafts of the scripts of programs 94 – 100. They reviewed, edited and prepared them for recording.

#### **Development of P4**

The planning and development of the Primary 4 series began this quarter. The approval for this additional grade was authorized in the last week of the previous quarter. EDC staff member Fiona Edwards, based in the UK, completed the Scope and Sequence for Literacy and English, as she has done for the other SSIRI primary grades. With the completed Scope and Sequence, the Nairobi-based scriptwriters began to develop the master plans for each of the lessons.

The scriptwriting team, all from Southern Sudan, came up with examples of stories, festivities, and legends from Southern Sudan to support lesson activities. They developed a rich set of materials that will enrich the Primary 4 programs.

The planning for the P4 Math segments also began this quarter. With the support of the IRI Advisor, the scriptwriters analyzed the official MoEST syllabus and allocated the different topics over the twenty-week timeframe of the radio series.

Two segments per week on the topic of Peace Building Education are planned for P4. Through contacts with Benoit d'Asemberg from Refugee Education Trust (RET) and others, SSIRI developed a working relationship the UNHCR Interagency Network for Education in Emergencies (INEE) and UNESCO to obtain materials and assistance for the creation of these programs.

UNESCO provided the printed material from the Interagency Peace Education program. Margaret Sinclair, former UNHCR officer and creator of this program, laid out the topics for these lessons via email and agreed to work with the SSIRI Team on the peace building segments of the P4 program. Her contributions were pro bono.

### **Formative Evaluation**

Formative evaluation was carried out for the Primary 3 lessons 49 – 85 at SUD Academy. Staff report that, at this stage of the program, teachers and students are very familiar with the various activities and are able to focus better on the content of each lesson.

In December, SSIRI hosted a visit to SUD Academy by Mary Hobbs of USAID. She observed a class Primary 3 lesson and actively participated in the program.

### **Production**

The production team finalized the recording of the P3 programs 94 to 100 and also edited programs 8 to 100 based in preparation for formative evaluation. The production team also began inputting changes into the P3 programs 1 – 10 after the formative evaluation. A sign-in tune (intro) and a sign-out tune (outro) were added to the P3 programs 1 – 10, making them ready for broadcast next year.

The production staff worked with SRS technical staff to upload P1 and P2 programs to VT Merlin for broadcast.

The last five programs (95 – 100) of both P1 and P2 carried an announcement informing our listeners of the suspension of broadcasts until next school year. The announcement was also broadcast on the Sudan Radio Service English language broadcasts.

### **Teacher's Guides**

Twenty Teacher's Guides were sent to Kurmuk this quarter. Distribution to Pochalla, Julud and Yabus was delayed due to lack of transport.

Procurement was carried out to reprint the Primary 1 and Primary 2 Teacher's Guides for distribution to the field for the 2007 school year.

All 100 lessons of the P3 Teacher's Guide were completed, edited and the final version was submitted to the desktop publishing consultant for final layout. In addition, the introduction to the P3 Guide was adapted to the new grade level as were the teaching materials, i.e., the Village piaster currency used for counting and the rulers. The new guide also includes a map of Southern Sudan.

A copy of the Teacher's Guide was sent to the MoEST Curriculum Unit and the General Education Division for approval. The procurement process for the printing was also carried out this quarter.

# **TERBIA**

## **Terbia A and B Development**

A consultant, Nick Boke, prepared the Scope and Sequence for the Terbia A program after selecting topics from SRS's *Road to Peace* program and identifying the appropriate English topic to teach from it. Among the civic education topics to be included in Terbia are: DDR - Demobilization, Disarmament and Reintegration, media support development, media voice for people, land ownership, land regulations, democracy, internally displaced people and returnees, role of leaders in preserving peace, Garang's vision, vote, women's rights, corruption, civil society organizations, citizenship, and HIV/AIDS and education for all. The English segments of the program cover advanced and intermediate topics that include: prefixes, verb tenses, questions, irregular plurals, the verb *to get*, contractions, comparatives, qualification and quantification.

The Scope and Sequence for Terbia B was developed, reviewed and edited this reporting period and the master plans were created for the first 11 programs.

## **Terbia Scriptwriters**

Four scriptwriters were hired in the beginning of October to develop the materials for Terbia. They have adapted well to their new assignment, delivering high quality scripts in a timely fashion. These scriptwriters are: Joyce Abe Geri, Jesca Wude, Sebit Evans and Bior Ajak Nicodemus, all Southern Sudanese.

## **Terbia Production**

New actors were recruited to record the Terbia programs. Auditions were held and 6 new actors were contracted. Training was held for the new actors giving them an orientation to the Terbia program and instructions on how to portray the various characters. This quarter production staff recorded Terbia Advanced (A) programs 1 to 17 and edited programs 1 to 10.

## **Terbia Formative Evaluation**

SSIRI negotiated with the Sudan Women's Action Network (SWAN, formerly known as Sudanese Women's Association in Nairobi) to conduct formative evaluation of Terbia. SWAN will convene a group of 15-20 Southern Sudanese adults who will listen to the programs. All 60 programs of the Terbia A series will be evaluated during the first half of 2007.

# **PS101 TECHNICAL ACTIVITIES**

An Education Advisor, placed in Juba, was hired during this reporting period. The Education Advisor held several meetings with various MoEST staff, including Edward Kokole, Department of Teacher Education and Training. Discussions centered on the implementation of PS101/OA in pre-service and in-service settings, as well as criteria for selecting teachers and local instructors. It was agreed that the first broadcast cycle of PS101 would be aired in April 2007, to coincide with the start of the new academic year. Successful participants from the MoEST Fast Track Training Program will be enrolled in the in-service teacher training program to be delivered through 20 selected County Education Centers. They will also be enrolled in PS101/OA as part of that in-service program. SSIRI and unqualified non-SSIRI teachers in SSIRI schools who meet the

criteria for selection can be enrolled in PS101/OA. Because it is likely that the in-service program will not begin until July the first PS101/OS broadcast cycle will likely target SSIRI schools.

Pre-service student teachers will not be directly enrolled in PS101/OA. However, Teacher Training Institutes and Colleges will receive a CD-Rom of PS101/OA broadcasts, along with copies of the written materials (student teachers and local instructors books). Pre-service staff will be orientated on the materials and how they can use/modify the materials for their classes. In this way, the materials become an extra resource for the pre-service tutors to refer to when preparing lessons for “Classroom Management and Administration.”

It was also agreed with Edward Kokole that EDC be timetabled for a session(s) with the TOT training for Fast Track Training in Maridi in January 2007. Preparation for SSIRI participation in that training is underway.

The Education Advisor also revised the PS101/OA Teachers Guide which was developed during the PS101/OA pilot. The Education Advisor also provided the Outreach Staff with a thorough orientation on PS101/OA at the Outreach Staff Workshop in Lokichoggio in November, to prepare them to promote and support the program in their locations.

## **SPECIAL ACTIVITIES AND PROMOTION**

### **Outreach Staff Training**

Training was held in Lokichoggio, Kenya for the Field Staff in November. The workshop was held in Lokichoggio given the travel restrictions imposed on American Citizens, which prevented the COP and Technical Advisor from traveling to Southern Sudan. Participants included: 2 Outreach Advisors (including a newly hired one expected to oversee the Three Areas); 4 Outreach Coordinators (including a newly hired Outreach Coordinator for Malakal); as well as the recently hired Technical Advisor for the Three Areas, Education Specialist, and M&E Specialist. Two additional Outreach Coordinators (for Kurmuk and Kauda) were not able to attend due to the unavailability of flights.

The workshop was held so as to:

- Provide a forum for field staff and Nairobi staff to share ideas and experiences that promote successful SSIRI implementation.
- To strengthen the relationship between Outreach Coordinators and Outreach Advisors with an emphasis on developing relationships among new staff members.
- To discuss the implications of implementing SSIRI and develop practical solutions to challenges in the field.
- To strengthen communication systems between and among Outreach Staff and Teachers, MoEST, and Nairobi-based supervisors.
- To train staff on IRI, new SSIRI activities (Terbia and PS101) and on successfully carrying out their duties and responsibilities.

Participatory sessions were held on M&E and reporting; improving communication; collaborating with NGOs and government counterparts; updates on MoEST meetings (including a debrief by the

Outreach Advisors who attended the Training Work Group and ERDF meetings in November); and planning for 2007, including the launch of two new programs, Terbia and PS101/OA.

A full day was devoted to reporting and M&E. The M&E Specialist provided a thorough orientation on the importance of monitoring and evaluation, as well as the process, including a review of existing M&E forms. The Outreach Staff shared experiences using the M&E forms and provided input into revisions. Revised instruments were subsequently sent to the Outreach Staff later in the quarter, including draft Terbia and PS101/OA monitoring plans. The Technical Advisor for the Three Areas worked with the Outreach Staff to develop a reporting template highlighting key information they should be collecting on an ongoing basis and reporting regularly.

A workshop session and out-of-session time was devoted to computer training and satellite phones in an effort to improve communication between staff..

The workshop provided the Outreach Staff with a valuable opportunity to share experiences in implementing SSIRI. Such workshops are critical given that the Outreach Staff largely work in isolation, rarely having an opportunity to meet with each other. The workshop also provided a great orientation for new staff (four new staff were introduced at the workshop, including the Technical Advisor for the Three Areas, the Education Specialist, M&E Specialist, and the Malakal Outreach Coordinator).

### **Advertisements**

An announcement was developed, produced and aired regularly on Sudan Radio Service (SRS) to advertise Primary One and Two broadcasts. A similar announcement also aired regularly as part of the SSIRI Learning Village broadcasts.

Another radio spot was developed and aired both on SRS and SSIRI to announce the end of transmission for Primary One and Primary Two on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2007.

## **OUTREACH ACTIVITIES**

### **Radio Distribution**

SSIRI received 160 Free Play radios from the National Democratic Institute (NDI) and stored them at the new shared AED/SSIRI office space in Juba. NDI informed SSIRI that another 1,017 Free Play Radios are available to SSIRI immediately and are being kept with NDI until SSIRI locates adequate storage space and/or can distribute them. SSIRI Outreach Staff has already begun to negotiate space and prepare the distribution schedule.

### **Coordinating with the MoEST**

The Outreach Advisor continued to work with representatives of MoEST in Juba on the SSIRI endorsement letter.

SSIRI Outreach Coordinators have been working closely with local education authorities and, in many cases, have developed productive partnerships to manage program implementation. In Pochalla, the county officers held meetings with the Outreach Coordinator in order to assess the

program following the first term of the broadcasts. In Panyagor the county officer is much involved and offers as much help as possible. In Kurmuk transport is provided when possible. In Malakal, the County Education Officer has agreed to give office space to the new Outreach Coordinator located there.

### **Participation in the Thematic Working Group Meetings**

Outreach Advisors Joseph Liya and Bullen Nginzo attended Thematic Working Group Meetings in Juba the week of November 6th. The Thematic Working Groups (TWGs) provide an opportunity for the MoEST, donors, and NGOs to share views, experiences, and lessons learned on issues related to basic education in Southern Sudan; and enable the MoEST to integrate partners' activities into their major operational activity plans for the education sector. Four TWG meetings were held: Basic Education; Vocational Training and Youth Education TWG; Alternative Education Systems; Primary Teachers Education and Training.

In all the meetings, partners gave updates of their activities and the MoEST requested that partners develop a 2007 Academic Year plan to be included in the MoEST overall plan.

As part of each TWG, Outreach Advisors Nginzo and Liya made brief presentations on the SSIRI program and progress to date. They also used the TWGs to network with other NGOs. Initial contact was made with three local NGOs:

- **AMURT** is an NGO operating a women's literacy program in Northern Bahar El Ghazal at Malual Akoon (in Aweil East County).
- **Echo Bravo**, an NGO supported by the British Council, operates a literacy program in Yei and intends to open branch offices in Maridi and Juba. Echo Bravo's literacy programs target government employees/civil servants, as well as community members using taped audio material and training modules. Liya discussed their possible involvement in Terbia.
- **International Aid Service (IAS)** also expressed interest in SSIRI and wanted to tune into some of the radio broadcasts.

The initial interest expressed by these organizations will be followed up with during subsequent meetings.

During the Alternative Education Systems meeting, government officials reiterated GOSS's commitment to reducing illiteracy to 50% by 2010, with a particular emphasis on government officials. This emphasis on government officials could represent another important target group for Terbia. During the Primary Teachers Education and Training TWG emphasis was placed on the use of media in teacher professional development and continued support was given to SSIRI, Terbia and PS101.

### **ERDF**

Outreach Advisors Nginzo and Liya also attended the ERDF meeting in Malakal the week of 15<sup>th</sup> November. ERDF serves as a platform for information sharing and monitoring and evaluating progress in the education sector. The forum brings together the MoEST at all levels, with stakeholders and partners. The MoEST Undersecretary briefed the participants on policy issues and priorities. Among priorities identified by the Ministry were reconstruction of schools, teacher training, accelerated education. A number of cross-cutting issues were also discussed, including

Disarmament, Demobilization, and Reintegration; HIV/AIDS; gender; the environment; special education; and community involvement in education. The MoEST also highlighted some notable achievement, including the success of the “Go to School” initiative which has significantly increased the number of children going to school. The MoEST appealed to NGOs to work with their respective departmental counterparts in Juba to better coordinate activities.

**Teacher Selection and Training**

The Maridi Outreach Coordinator conducted training for 34 new teachers and provided refresher training for 18 existing SSIRI teachers. No training took place in Kurmuk as expected this quarter since we were not able to send funds to the local staff there.

By the end of this reporting period, SSIRI has trained 504 teachers in IRI in 15 locations throughout Southern Sudan, the Three Areas and the Three Urban Areas. Not included in this tally are the teachers trained in Nairobi for formative evaluation or those trained by the NGO representatives, who were first trained by SSIRI.

**Implementation**

The Outreach Coordinators from Panyagor, Pochalla, Maridi, and Malakal attended a week-long workshop in Lokichoggio, Kenya in November (described above). Unavailability of flights prevented two other OCs from Kauda and Kurmuk from attending. A polio eradication campaign in Southern Sudan late in the year severely effected the ability of the Outreach Staff to reach their locations. Despite this, the OCs have been very active in mobilizing schools and communities to participate in SSIRI and Terbia in 2007. The OCs have met with local authorities to discuss SSIRI programs, in particular Terbia, and identify target participants for the programs. Below is an update of Quarter 10 SSIRI implementation activities by location.

***Southern Sudan***

**Juba**

An Education Advisor was hired during this quarter and following discussions between EDC and AED, she has been provided office space with the AED Diaspora Skills Transfer Project and Windle Trust. She will assume the technical lead on Terbia implementation and refinement and implementation of PS101/OA. Her involvement in PS101/OA implementation is described above.

### **Maridi**

As noted above, the Maridi Outreach Coordinator conducted training for 34 new teachers and provided refresher training for 18 existing SSIRI teachers. The Outreach Coordinator interviewed a SSIRI teacher to contribute to the success story being written by the Chief of Party. The Maridi OC was scheduled to implement a post-test to *Learning Village* pupils, but due to flight delays he was unable to return to Maridi before the school year ended. The OC is working with the M&E Specialist to trace students for possible implementation of the post-test when pupils return to school in 2007.

The Outreach Coordinator also received a project motorcycle to facilitate transportation.

### **Panyagor**

The Outreach Coordinator distributed data collection forms to SSIRI schools and visited four new schools in Pongborong, Matikac, Alet and Aluer to mobilize them for participation in the program. He also trained 42 new teachers.

### **Pochalla**

The Outreach Coordinator visited schools to observe SSIRI classes and provide support. All the teachers reported that they have been implementing the programs in their classrooms without problems. He also monitored SSIRI reception in three locations around Pochalla and found that reception is clear. He informally surveyed a group of children regarding *The Learning Village* lessons and learned that the majority enjoyed the program.

The Outreach Coordinator also received a project motorcycle to facilitate transportation.

### **Malakal**

A new Outreach Coordinator was hired for Malakal during this quarter and he was able to attend the Outreach Workshop in Lokichoggio in November, which provides him a good orientation to SSIRI programs. His return to Malakal after the workshop was delayed due to the insecurity in Malakal Town at the end of the year and subsequent cancellation of flights. Despite this the Outreach Coordinator has been busy meeting with local officials. This has already borne fruit as the County Education Officer has promised to give the Coordinator space within the CEO. An early January trip by one of the Outreach Advisors is planned to continue orientation and training of the new Malakal OC.

### **Rumbek**

In Rumbek the SSIRI IT specialist visited 5 schools that are implementing SSIRI in primary 1 and 2. The teachers were pleased to see a SSIRI visitor and were enthusiastic to participate in Terbia and primary 3 classes next year.

### **Waat**

SSIRI implementation partner CUSH Community Relief International (CCRI) has trained over 50 teachers from 32 schools in Waat and surrounding areas.

### **Yambio**

An Outreach Advisor visited two Community Girls' Schools around Yambio (Nangbiimo and

Asanza) to mobilize teachers for The Learning Village. The Advisor also discussed the SSIRI program with the Bishops of the Episcopal Church of the Sudan and the Catholic Diocese of Tambura-Yambio. The Church administers the SSIRI Program. Non-payment of teacher salaries, especially teachers of private and church schools, has the potential to seriously disrupt the SSIRI program as some teachers stop teaching.

An unexpected outcome the visit to Yambio was hearing that shopkeepers at the local market were regularly listening to SSIRI broadcasts. Some of the shopkeepers learned about the program from their children.

The Advisor met with the paramount chief and community leaders in Yambio to discuss the SSIRI Program and the important role it can play in improving the quality of education. The Terbia program was also discussed.

### ***Three Areas***

#### **Kauda, Southern Kordofan**

On account of the cancellation of flights, the Kauda Outreach Coordinator was not able to attend the staff training this quarter. Communication continues to be a problem between the Nairobi office and Kauda. Outreach staff scheduled a visit in December but flight cancellations once again prevented travel. A trip is rescheduled for January 2007.

#### **Kurmuk, Blue Nile**

Teaching within Kurmuk was disrupted during this quarter due to the large number of returnees occupying school premises and the fact that teachers were not being paid. The Kurmuk Outreach Coordinator registered one new SSIRI school for participation, Jerdani Primary School, even at this late date in the school year. He also met with local authorities to identify potential Terbia target groups and individuals.

#### **Abyei**

Working closely with local authorities a new Outreach Coordinator was recruited and hired at the close of the year. The Outreach Advisor oriented and trained the new Outreach Coordinator on all SSIRI programs, as well as financial and administrative matters. With support from the Outreach Advisor, the new Outreach Coordinator has been active in mobilizing for SSIRI and Terbia. While in Abyei, the Outreach Advisor had meetings with local authorities, including SSRRC Deputy Director, SPLM Secretary, the Chairman of the Abyei Development Committee and Paramount Chief of Abyei Area, Education Director for Abyei, and Commission, as well as four payam Administrators. The OA also had productive meetings with several local NGOs, including Abyei Community Action for Development (ACAD) and War Affected Rehabilitation and Development (WARD). Both expressed interest in working with SSIRI, and they might be in a position to offer the OC space within their offices. Further discussions will be held early next year when the OA returns to Abyei to continue orientation and training of the new Abyei OC.

## **MONITORING AND EVALUATION**

The new M&E Specialist conducted a review of the existing SSIRI data collection tools. Following consultation with the project staff, it was decided to reduce the number of forms and to simplify the existing ones, all without losing vital information needed for reporting.

The Specialist led training sessions for new outreach staff on the use the data collection forms.

A second task was the start of the TERBIA and PS101 monitoring plans. A draft plan was created including results indicators.

To facilitate the rolling out of the TERBIA A program early in 2007, several tools were developed. For the identification and registration of listeners, a new registration form was developed. In addition, a radio distribution form was developed.

The M&E Specialist joined SSIRI staff during the formative evaluation sessions at SUD Academy. His observations indicated that formative evaluation, still under the purview of the IRI Advisor, is conducted effectively, enabling staff to improve the production and quality of the radio programs. These lessons will enhance the creation and production of future programs.

## **PROJECT ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT**

### **Staffing**

The Technical Advisor for the Three Areas, Mr. Michael Cacich, joined the project this reporting period. His main area of responsibility will be to oversee the implementation of program activities and to supervise the Outreach Staff, the Education Specialist, and the M&E Specialist, all based in Southern Sudan and the Three Areas. He will also serve as the Deputy Chief of Party.

Monitoring & Evaluation Specialist, Mr. Martin Omukuba, joined the SSIRI team in November. Though based in the Nairobi office this quarter, he will be based in Maridi, Sudan beginning in January 2007.

The Education Specialist Ms. Maree Melican also joined SSIRI in November. She is based in Juba, Sudan. Her main responsibility is the development and implementation of Terbia and PS101. She will also work closely with MoEST staff, strengthening the link with the Nairobi office.

Another new staff member, Outreach Advisor, Mr. Joseph Liya, continued to “shadow” veteran Outreach Advisor Bullen Ngzingo as part of his orientation to SSIRI. In addition to attending the Thematic Working Group Meetings in Juba and the ERDF meeting in Malakal, the Advisors identified a new Outreach Coordinator in Malakal, Achuil Otong Arop, who was hired in November. Liya also hired a new Outreach Coordinator for Abyei and provided preliminary training and orientation just before the close of the year.

Four scriptwriters were hired in the beginning of October to develop the materials for Terbia. They have adapted well to their new assignment, delivering high quality scripts in a timely fashion. These scriptwriters are: Joyce Abe Geri, Jesca Wude, Sebit Evans and Bior Ajak Nicodemus, all Southern Sudanese.

Josphine Osike and David Duku joined the SSIRI Team as scriptwriters for *Learning Village* program in November. They started by editing the Primary 3 programs and the Teacher’s Guide and began to plan for the Primary 4 series. All scriptwriters work under the supervision of the IRI Advisor.

SSIRI Information Technology staff conducted a workshop for the new staff on how to use a computer to write and edit scripts and how to use the internet and email. Following the course, the scriptwriters showed more confidence in their computer skills and their output improved. The SSIRI IT Specialist also conducted some preliminary training for Outreach Staff during the Loki workshop.

Originally hired as a consultant, Anthony Mwamodo became a full-time SSIRI staff member to provide logistic services in Kenya and Southern Sudan in order to distribute funds, radios and other materials to the field, arrange airfare and lodging, and provide a general link between the field and the Nairobi office.

Desktop publisher David Ndi continued to work this quarter to complete the layout of the Primary 3 Teacher’s Guide.

**Nairobi Office Relocation**

SSIRI moved from its location in Lavington to Umeme Plaza at Dagoretti Corner, joining the staff of Sudan Radio Service and the EDC Anglo Africa Regional Office. This consolidation should yield cost savings and facilitate communication and collaboration between the two sister radio projects.

**Collaboration with the Diaspora Skills Transfer Program**

Colin Lasu served as a short-term volunteer under the USAID-funded Diaspora Skills Transfer Program for Southern Sudan administered by AED. Insecurity in Malakal Town prevented Colin from taking up his assignment there and required a last minute re-posting to Panyagor. There he worked closely with SSIRI Outreach Coordinator, Chol Bol, to orient local authorities to Terbia, and register participants for the Terbia broadcasts beginning in January; and continue outreach of SSIRI. He also provided on-site technical support and capacity build capacity of the SSIRI OC.

SSIRI negotiated with AED to co-locate offices in Juba. The SSIRI Education Advisor will be housed there and is currently setting up the office.
