

THE USAID LIBRARY

The USAID Library serves as a point of access to the body of knowledge relating to sustainable development and USAID information for individuals interested in the field of international development. With a particular focus on international sustainable development and economic assistance, the library's collection supports USAID's development efforts in its strategic objective areas: democracy and governance; economic growth; education and training; environment and agriculture; humanitarian assistance; and population, health, and nutrition.

The library is open to the public. Library staff will be happy to help visitors use library resources or to guide them to appropriate information sources elsewhere.

The library is on the mezzanine level of the Ronald Reagan Building. It is located on the side of the atrium with the high neon light sculpture. Enter through the glass doors marked USAID Information Center, and the attendants will direct you to the library. The library is open from 9:00 to 4:30, Monday through Friday, except for government holidays.
