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Background

This report details the results on the FP Influentials interviewed in the three survey runs: the baseline (conducted last July 2004), first wave (conducted November 2004) and second wave (conducted February 2005).

DETAILED FINDINGS



Profile of FP Influentials

Based on this wave's correspondence, there were several fall outs, however the profile of the interviewed Family Planning Influentials remains the same:

- Mostly females
- Largely coming from Cebu and Metro Manila
- Majority belong to the Informal Sector/ Urban Poor



- Majority (84%) of the FP Influentials interviewed have spoken publicly about family planning at least once in the past 3 months. This is similar to the results of wave 1.
- They have spoken to different persons/ groups:
 - **Formal groups** (42%): individuals that work together for a particular purpose. More would mention a general group rather than the specific name of the organization. They have still spoken to women's group, however it is significantly less than the previous wave. Barangay officials are still constantly spoken to.
 - **Informal groups** (40%): individuals who gather together for certain events or occasions, not on a regular basis. They have spoken to various informal groups with barangay residents still the top mention, but to a lesser extent.
 - **Specific organizations** (23%): those with particular group names. In aggregate, vendor associations were still the most mentioned.

- Majority of the FP Influentials mentioned the occasions when they spoke about family planning. Similar scenario as the baseline and previous wave, formal and organized meetings or gatherings were mentioned the most. These occasions were during seminars/orientations (25%) and meetings of members/ officers (25%).
- More than half of the events or occasions happened recently as indicated within the past 1 month. This is keeping their promise of speaking about family planning in the next 3 months since the last interview (Wave 1).

Messages Given About Family Planning

Base: Total Core Respondents

- Messages conveyed during these speaking occasions were about the definition and importance of FP (58%), the different methods of FP (51%), the effect of lack/no FP (32%) and benefits of FP (32%).
 - Similar to the previous wave, specific messages most mentioned were the importance and definition of FP program.
 - As for the methods, influentials encouraged the use of modern methods and discussed the different contraceptives. A new message being imparted is the discussion of natural and modern methods.




Currently doing other projects not related to FP

- For this wave, 16% were not able to speak publicly about FP in the past 3 months. Out of these, only 4% are not willing to speak publicly about FP in the NEXT 3 months. The reason given was due to current involvement in other projects outside FP.
- Those who are willing to speak about family planning in the next 3 months, they would most likely cover similar topics (importance and benefits of FP). They are optimistic that no person would most likely object or ask questions. Members of Associations and Women's groups are most likely to approve of them speaking about family planning.



- Results show a good downward trend in the level of objections/questions raised about talks on family planning.
- Objections/questions encountered still come mostly from the Catholic church and other religious groups.
- The objections/questions raised remain to be on faith related issues. Notably, there was a significant decrease in the perception that modern methods have side effects.
- As a response to the objections or questions, FP Influentials explained that they are not forcing them to use modern methods, but are giving them a choice (4%), family planning is not abortion, but a means to prevent the sperm and egg to meet (4%), and that they are suggesting to space children and not to abort them (4%).



- Involvement to this initiative remains high with almost all committing to continue supporting FP activities in the next 3 months.
 - Efforts will still focus on training and information campaign on family planning.
 - Similar to the previous wave, these plans are perceived to happen mostly during preset seminars/ orientations (23%) and monthly meetings of members/officers (14%). There was an increase in mentions of activities happening within the next month which is probably in line with the International women's day celebration.
- Aside from integrating discussions of family planning into their regular meetings, special events provide an opportunity as well to advocate.



- There is a slight decrease in other groups or persons approaching the influentials regarding their initiatives on family planning with only a fifth mentioning it .
- Similar to the baseline and wave 1, FP Influentials were approached by agencies such as Marie Stoppe (7%), and Friendly Care (5%) as well as government offices like POPCOM (5%) and DOH (4%).
- The different organizations approach FP Influentials, mainly to (1) offer their support to conduct seminars (5%), or (2) to invite them to a training on family planning that they have set up (5%), or (3) invited to help them plan their activities.
- These other organizations approached FP Influentials during informal occasions or various dates in the past 3 months.



- Consistent with their high involvement in the FP program, most FP Influentials (84%) admitted that they strongly support the family planning concept. The current situation in their area is the main reason for their support in family planning (58%). They believe that welfare of children suffer in big families (23%), that the rise in population heightens poverty (18%), that FP is needed in their community in general (18%), and the health of the mother is neglected having to care for many children (11%).
- Another reason for strongly supporting family planning appears to be personal experience which is mentioned significantly higher for this wave (42%). This gives them the inclination to help other people by explaining FP (21%).
- Less than 10% gave negative reasons for rating “somewhat support” – reasons related to conflict in schedules are key mentions.



- Same suggestions were given by FP Influentials on how to improve their personal capability. They still see the need to have more trainings (82%).
- Consistently, the specific training topics that should be tackled were similar to the baseline and wave 1: interpersonal communication skills (30%), updates on FP information (26%), and specific FP methods (19%).
- Providing materials/ products (16%) would aid FP Influentials in improving knowledge about family planning and can also help them be more effective in speaking about family planning.

Suggestions on How to Strengthen Advocacy on Family Planning

- Suggestions of FP Influentials to further strengthen advocacy of family planning include the support of various groups (46%), but mainly from the different leaders (16%) and barangays (14%).
- Providing FP influentials financial assistance (35%) to be able to implement their different activities on family planning (i.e. seminars, handouts, and contraceptive supply) is still seen as helpful.
- They also stressed the importance of having various trainings/ seminars about family planning (39%) and educational materials/ handouts/ visual aids (16%) for people in the community to be aware of and understand better family planning.
