Books

USAID Library. Books available in the library can be found by searching the catalog (at <http://library.info.usaid.gov>). You can search by Author, Title or words in a title, Subject, Series, Periodical Title or Keyword. Search the subject Democracy to find general works. For specific books on fragile states, anti-corruption, security sector reform, political Islam and poverty reduction, search either the subject or title. If you do not get any results, try searching all fields by clicking on the “Everything” link.

Electronic Books. The World Bank e-Library is a good source for Democracy and Governance issues. You will find full text of books and working papers in PDF format on rule of law, corruption, youth, infrastructure, and others at www.worldbank.org/elibrary.

Articles

The Library provides access to databases of news, journals articles, book reviews, and speeches. From the USAID Library intranet site (ppc.usaid.gov/library/resources/databases.cfm), you can access these and other databases from your desktop:

- **Academic Search Elite.** A multidisciplinary full-text and citation database containing both scholarly and popular articles
- **Ebsco EJS Enhanced.** A full-text database of USAID Library’s subscription journals. You can search for articles across all available journals or in specific journals using keywords, subject or author.

You can Access the following databases from within the Library or via a librarian.

- **Lexis/Nexis.** Provides full text of articles from newspapers and business and general periodicals from around the world as well as transcripts, newswires and legal information. Access is from the Library. *Interested in daily news about your area of interest? Want information on a current issue? E-mail your request to Cdie_info@usaid.gov*
- **Factiva.** Full text of newspapers, magazines, newswires, trade journals, and transcripts of electronic media. Includes Wall Street Journal and Financial Times. Access is from the Library. *Looking for an article from today’s Wall Street Journal? Just send an e-mail to Cdie_info@usaid.gov*

- **FirstSearch.** Allows you to search for citations in databases such as Dissertations, PAISInternational, ECON, Econlit, WilsonSelectPlus, ArticleFirst and others. Access is from the Library.

The Library holds print copies of over 200 journals. Some of the titles that have specific bearing on Democracy and Governance are: *Conflict, Security and Development; Democratization; Economics of Transition; Foreign Affairs; Foreign Policy; Journal of Democracy; Third World Quarterly; World Development.*

- **Columbia International Affairs Online.** Source of scholarly materials related to international affairs, including working papers, conference proceedings, journal abstracts, and other resources from think tanks, all updated regularly. Search from anywhere but access full text from the Ronald Reagan Building only, at <http://www.ciaonet.org/>
- **Economist Intelligence Unit Reports.** Includes country profiles and reports. Request a report by emailing Cdie_info@usaid.gov.
