SCOPE OF WORK

19. Scope of Technical Services

A. Objective for which the Technical Services are to be Used

To assist the Government of Nepal with strategy and planning for higher agricultural education.

B. Description

The Government of Nepal has determined that it will develop its own College of Agriculture and has sought assistance from the United States Government, through the Agency for International Development (AID), in planning the kind of institution best calculated to meet the needs of Nepal.

Preliminary investigations indicate that it would be advantageous for Nepal to begin now to establish its own higher education capability in agriculture. Studies to date are not conclusive, however. Much more needs to be known before a positive conclusion can be reached as to whether conditions warrant the development of such an institution and, if they do, what kind of an institutional framework and program are best suited to Nepal conditions.

The Team will prepare a draft report in Nepal, in full consultation with Nepalese colleagues, which may be refined in the United States, and which adheres to conditions described in Block 23 below.

The final report must be submitted to AID/W within six months of contract signature.

23. Background Information (Additional information useful to Authorized Agent and Prospective Contractors or Participating Agency; if necessary cross reference Block 19.C(4) above.)

The pre-planning phase will be completed in the U.S. The Contractor will summarize existing prevailing knowledge about "institution building" in agriculture, based on the Esman or some other appropriate knowledge. The Contractor, AID/W, and the Nepalese professionals will meet in AID/W for a period not to exceed two weeks in order to review prevailing knowledge and refine pre-feasibility guidelines. These guidelines will be mutually agreed to. It is expected that conditions precedent to the development of an institution of higher learning in agriculture will be examined, that various key variables will be examined, and that the implications of these variables will be examined. Doctrine, leadership, funding, organization, and program will, of course, be examined.

24. Relationship of Contractor or Participating Agency to Cooperating Country and to AID

The Contract Team will work with GON and USAID officials in conducting the study and formulating a report.

AID proposes to assist the GON with strategy planning, without preconceptions as to (a) the desirability of proceeding to expand a program of higher education in agriculture at this time, (b) the shape and pace subsequent institution building should take, or (c) possible AID assistance to carry out such an institution building program should outside assistance be required.

To facilitate a responsible final decision on the desirability of building such an institution, AID proposes to conduct a rigorous "pre-feasibility study," taking advantage of findings from extensive research that has been done on the institution building process, and relevant information available in the U.S. on similar institution building efforts in the less developed countries.

It is important that the Contractor accept the conceptual framework in which this project is to develop. It is not assumed that a U.S. Contractor will develop institutional guidelines to transport to Nepal. Rather, it is assumed that the Contractor will accept the principle that the institution that results will be uniquely Nepalese, basically planned and supported by Nepalese leaders; the function of the U.S. is to provide them with alternatives and with institutional guidelines and procedures that will assure attention to all variables. Furthermore, it must be assumed that any institution that results will be in keeping with the total Nepal education plan.

This activity will involve four components: (a) development of pre-feasibility guidelines using as a format, if desired, the institution building "model" concept as outlined by Esman; (b) refinement of these guidelines in terms of the Nepal situation; (c) conducting the pre-feasibility study; and (d) developing a logical and orderly plan for developing an agriculture institution in Nepal. This means that the Contractor will, in the United States, develop the feasibility guidelines after a review of contract objectives with AID/W; present the report of the guidelines to AID/W for review and possible modification; take the guidelines to Nepal for revision in terms of the Nepal situation; carry out the pre-feasibility study in terms of revised guidelines; and present a final report to the Government of Nepal, the Mission, and AID/W which encompasses a logical plan for developing an agriculture institution in Nepal, including the probable assistance package that would be required.

- (1) To develop pre-feasibility guidelines for studying an agriculture institution at the higher education level, not in terms of specific buildings, enrollments, etc., but in terms of component conditions, processes, and variables. The words "model" and "guidelines" are synonymous and it should be understood that by the term "model" is meant "an instrument that identifies groups of variables and relationships relevant to institutional change," and that the Esman model of institution building may be taken as a point of departure. This model must consider conditions precedent to the successful establishment of such an institution. It must define the essential functional relationships between significant variables in such a manner and detail as to permit meaningful assessment of alternative courses of action. It is expected that these U.S.-developed guidelines will not be country specific, rather it is expected that it will make fullest use of tested principles, be easily explainable and understandable, and be based on logic.

It is expected, therefore, that this model will not proceed from the familiar base of existing U.S. institutions, or from an assumption that a particular kind of institution or educational concept will be transplanted either in whole or in part. It will not be based on the assumption that a college of agriculture is needed in Nepal, or that the land grant concept with all its components is desirable. It will, rather, build from basic questions about the need for a particular kind of educational institution through to the identification of those variables that must be recognized and controlled if a viable institution is to be built. The first concern is with the identification of those conditions in a society which bring about the need for such an institution; the second is what it is that this institution should accomplish, the third is how it should be planned, organized, administered and supported to carry out its purpose.

- (2) To take these guidelines to Nepal as a set of measures against which to study the Nepal situation. If the model does its work, it will be possible for the Nepalese to understand it, apply it to the Nepalese situation, and proceed step by step to apply the institution building principles to planning their institution. It will, in a very real sense, be an evaluative framework as well as an institution building guide, for it will describe clearly and completely those qualities, conditions, and activities which characterize a successful, mature institution.

The point has been made by writers on the systems approach that if the system is working correctly, the planners are never caught in a situation

of failure when prior thinking would have prevented failure. This is precisely the purpose of this study: to provide a sufficiently complete set of criteria, ranging from questions of "why?" to identification of all components or variables in the institution building process, that the model can be used as the touchstone against which to measure conditions in Nepal, and to plan for a specific institution.

Two senior Nepalese will join the Team early in the planning phase in AID/W and, as full partners, will participate in all planning. They will accompany the Team Chief and possibly selected team members to the Philippines, Indonesia, and India to study higher agriculture education prior to beginning work in Nepal.

A. Purpose: The purpose of this project is to assist the government of Nepal with strategy and planning for higher agricultural education.

B. Actions and Activities: FY 1972

1. USAID and HMG will conduct a study of the findings from the extensive research that has been already carried out by AID in other countries on the institutional building process in the establishment of higher institutions of learning in agriculture.
2. A frame of reference for the study will be developed for Nepal based upon relevant information available in the US on similar institution building efforts in other countries, particularly agricultural colleges and universities in developing countries.
3. A strategy for institutional higher agricultural education for Nepal will be formulated as a result of study in Nepal.

C. Plan of Work: FY 1972

1. Development of guidelines and format target date March 1, 1972.
2. The refinement of guidelines in Nepal target date April 1, 1972.
3. Interpretation of Nepal's situation using the defined guidelines June 1, 1972.
4. Development of a strategy for an agricultural institution in Nepal July 1, 1972.

D. Operating Procedure:

1. AID will provide funds and a contractor to head a Team consisting of the contractor and two Nepalese, one from Ministry of Education and one from Ministry of Food and Agriculture to carry out the study.
2. HMG agrees to appoint two senior, highly qualified Nepalese relevant to the development of an Agriculture College in Nepal to the Team.



3. The Team will spend approximately two weeks in Washington, four days in the Philippines, five days in Indonesia and seven days in India, plus travel time, studying developing agricultural institutions of higher learning.
4. The Team will return to Nepal with a frame of reference as a guideline or format to test their findings within the Nepalese context. The Team will refine the guidelines in Nepal as needed to provide an appropriate frame of reference for Nepal.
5. The Team will then carry out the feasibility study in Nepal using the approved guidelines.
6. The Team will prepare its draft report in Nepal. The contractor will complete the report in Washington. The final report will be a guide for the development of an Agricultural College (Institute) in Nepal.

E. Project Financing

This Project Agreement obligates \$45,000 for the services of a team of U.S. contract employees to work as outlined in para C. and D. above.

This Project Agreement also obligates U.S. owned PL 480, Section 104(g) Indian Rupees 1,14,943 (equivalent of \$15,130 or Rs 1,59,771 NG) for the local currency support of the above team and the 2 Nepalis who will be working with the team.

It is agreed that, wherever possible, local currency shall be expended instead of dollars to meet the contract expenditures of the above team.
