SUMMARY

The Ministry of Education (MOE) requested that USOM provide the services of three consultants to conduct an evaluative study of the International Bank of Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) Loan for Improvement of Vocational Education (LIVE) Project. The purpose being to determine the effectiveness of program efforts and provide management data for forward planning.

The Mission took the position that the study, to be effective, must be done by Thais and that evaluative instruments and procedures be developed which would enable the Department of Vocational Education to assess the effectiveness of their program on a continuing basis. The Mission responded to the request by proposing that one highly qualified American consultant assist a group of Thai educators in the design of an evaluation system and guide them in making the initial evaluative study of the LIVE Project.

Evaluation of Vocational Education**

The Department of Vocational Education and DTEC agreed to the USOM proposal.

The purpose of this communication is:

1. To present the rationale for the study
2. To outline the scope of work.
3. To suggest qualifications that the consultant should have.
4. To outline the RTG contributions to the study.
5. To request AID/W to recruit a qualified consultant to provide the technical services.

Rationale for Study

The Department of Vocational Education has reached a critical time in the LIVE project. The first phase of the project is approaching completion and the second phase, which will require another loan, is under consideration by the RTG. In order to provide decision makers within the Ministry of Education and the National Economic Development Board (NEDB) with reliable data, the Department of Vocational Education has requested assistance in the design of an evaluative study of the project. The Mission has agreed to provide one highly qualified consultant to work with a group of Thai specialists on this activity for up to 90 working days.

Scope of Technical Services

1. The Consultant assigned to this task will advise and assist a team of Thai educator-researchers in the design of an evaluative study of all facets of the LIVE Project. The study should review the project planning, effectiveness in the implementation of the plan and the accomplishments to date. Professional guidance will be provided in collecting, processing, and analyzing data and in developing the summary and recommendations. The areas of concern should include but not be limited to the following:

- a. **The relevance of the existing LIVE Project, short, medium and long-range objectives and goals.**
- b. **Strengths and weaknesses of the project plan.**
- c. **Ministry of Education staffing of the Project.**
- d. **Adequacy and timeliness of RTG financial support.**
- e. **School construction program.**
- f. **Equipment selection, procurement, receiving, distribution and installation procedures.**
- g. **Record keeping and reporting procedures.**
- h. **Participant selection, training and utilization.**
- i. **Adherence to IBRD administrative requirements.**
- j. **Efficiency or cost/benefit analysis.**
- k. **Review achievements in terms of intended results.**
- l. **Study projected manpower demands and training needs for the Third National Economic and Social Development Plan.**

2. **The evaluative data collected under the study, the analysis of the data and the recommendations of the study group will be submitted in the report. The report, in both Thai and English, should provide the information needed by the MOE and other RTG policy-making agencies to plan effectively, monitor and redirect their programming efforts. Of particular concern is the feasibility of the second phase of the LIVE project.**

3. **In the process of designing the study, an evaluation system should be developed whereby the Department of Vocational Education can continuously assess the effectiveness of the vocational education program. Provisions should be made for coordination and cooperation between the MOE Department of Vocational Education and other RTG government agencies concerned with manpower planning and development.**

Qualifications of Consultant

1. Since the person selected for this assignment will be associating with educators, economists, manpower specialists and planners in relatively high level decision-making positions, he must be a person of maturity and status.
2. The consultant should have educational background, training and recent experience in survey-research system design. His education and experience should have been in vocational education.
3. He should be free of bias and able to develop and foster an agreeable working relationship in cross-cultural situations. Service abroad is desirable, but not required.
4. The consultant will not need access to classified information.

RTG Involvement**1. Personnel**

In order that the evaluation system be viable, it is important that it be institutionalized in the MOE. Thus the Thai educators and researchers from the MOE must be fully involved in the development of the evaluation system and play the major role in conducting the LIVE Project Study. The American consultant should have as his co-worker a full-time Thai Director/Coordinator. Adequate secretarial and clerical help should be available. The professional group with whom the Director/Coordinator and the American consultant will work should include professionals with the following disciplines:

- a. Educational planning
- b. Educational finance
- c. Vocational education curriculum development
- d. Economics of education
- e. Vocational education administration
- f. School architecture and construction
- g. Manpower planning data analysis

2. Facilities, equipment and supplies

Office space, equipment and supplies will be provided by the RTG. Funds will be made available for the printing and distribution of the report.

3. Local transportation and per diem for the American consultant will be provided from the Trust Fund account.

I. Project Description and Explanation

This project assists the RTG Ministry of Education (MOE), Department of Vocational Education, in the implementation of its major program for improvement of vocational education in trades and agriculture. USOM assistance began in FY 66 and will continue on (1) development of curricula for both the trade and agricultural vocational streams, and for the teacher training program; (2) mobilization of equipment as it arrives, and (3) participant training for teachers in the project schools. USOM is providing advisory services and participant training for 5% of the projected 250 vocational teachers to be trained abroad. (For additional information see the FY 1969 Project Agreement).

The program also includes a total expenditure equivalent to \$32.4 million, of which \$6 million has been financed through a loan from IBRD for shop, laboratory and field training equipment.

Buildings are being constructed by the RTG in the 25 project schools and should be completed by the end of FY 70. Shop and agricultural field equipment being purchased with the IBRD loan began arriving late in FY 69 and will continue to arrive through FY 1972.

Delays experienced in procurement of commodities financed by the loan from the IBRD have led the Ministry of Education (MOE) to request from JEPD an 18-month extension in the period allowed for expenditure of the loan funds. Contract services provided by USOM through this project have been restructured and rescheduled to respond to this and other project developments. (See P10/1a contained in this agreement).

During FY 70, six equipment workshops and ten workshops on supervision and specialized curriculum areas are scheduled to be conducted for teachers from the project schools with the help of USOM personnel and the staff from the Thevas and Sangpra teacher training colleges.

B. Purpose of this Project Agreement

This project agreement provides for the continued support by MOE and USOM of the efforts described above to improve vocational trade and industrial and vocational agriculture education in Thailand.

IX. U.S. Government Contributions (See Funding Table)

A. Technical Assistance

1. Direct Hire Services

Three direct-hire technicians -- one in vocational agricultural education, one in vocational trade and industrial education and one in equipment procurement, inspection and utilization -- will assist RCM in overall guidance of the vocational education improvement effort, including the logistical aspects and contractor liaison.

2. Contract Services (See RFP's accompanying this agreement).

Vocational Agriculture Education: Funds (\$500,000) are provided for contracting the services of a team of five advisors who are assisting in the demonstration and establishment of modern techniques for training teachers of vocational agriculture at Rutgers College and in the development of the curriculum for a three-year vocational agricultural program.

Vocational Trade and Industrial Education: Funds (\$250,000) are provided for contracting the services of a team of seven technicians who are performing similar services in the vocational trade and industrial educational program at Rutgers College. Six technicians are already in position, and the seventh is scheduled to arrive in the first half of FY 1970 for a two year tour.

Consultant services, as approved by USGDS and the RCM, will supplement the work of each contract.

B. Training

USGDS will finance (a) masters degree training in the U.S. for nine RCM personnel -- six for trade and industrial education and three in vocational agriculture education; and (b) skill training for three vocational agriculture personnel. (See schedule in Annex B.).

III. Royal Thai Government Contribution

The RFG will complete the construction, renovation and furnishing of buildings at the 25 project schools; provide operational support for the 16 workshops mentioned in Part I above; provide all operational costs for the project schools including teachers salaries, utilities, and maintenance; provide logistic support, including in-country travel costs, for contract and direct hire advisors; provide necessary project secretarial and linguistic services; finance the preparation and printing of necessary manuals, charts and other instructional material; and finance the international travel costs of participants.

MOE regular budget funds of approximately \$280,000,000 are committed to the school construction and renovation program, with actual installment payments to architects and contractors running through FY 1969 and FY 1970. Operational costs of project schools constitute a further contribution of about \$40,000,000 per year.

DEEC will provide technician support (approximately \$1,242,500), local hire office staff (about \$135,000) and materials production (about \$114,000). (See Summary Funding Table and Counterpart Budgets, Annex C for precise details.) DEEC will also finance the international travel costs for project participants as scheduled in Annex B.

The funds made available to this project for the current fiscal year and set forth in the "Table of Funds" which is appended hereto and subject to availability may be withdrawn in accordance with the provisions hereof. The funds so allocated will be utilized in accordance with the following conditions and provisions.

A. U.S. Dollar Contribution

The U.S. Dollar Contribution, where made available for this project, will, where applicable, be utilized for the following purposes:

- (a) Participants: To finance direct dollar costs incurred for the training of the participants named in the approved PIO/P issued under this project.
- (b) U.S. Employed Technicians: To finance the direct dollar cost for salaries, international travel, and other direct dollar costs for services of U.S. Employed Technicians employed under AID standard personnel actions for this project. The amount set forth represents the estimated cost for this purpose and does not constitute an obligation on the part of AID to make the amount listed available for the project.
- (c) Contract Services: To finance the direct dollar costs of contract services authorized by an approved PIO/T.

- (e) Other Costs: To finance those direct dollar costs for this project not provided for in (a), (b), (c) and (d) above.
- (f) It is specifically agreed and understood that all future year funding requirements as may be indicated on the attached schedule of funds are tentative planning figures only and do not constitute or imply any commitment by AID or the United States to make such funds available.

B. Local Currency Costs

Local currency designated as "Cooperating Agency Contribution", where made available for the implementation of this project, is computed at the rate of Bahts 20 equal \$1, and is contributed from the following sources and utilized for the following purposes:

- (a) Counterpart Funds: The counterpart fund is composed of contributions of local currency from these sources.
 - (i) In lieu of deposits by the Thai Government of the commensurate value of commodities furnished under the United States financed grant programs, the Thai Government agrees to provide Bahts to the counterpart fund.
 - (ii) Voluntary contributions by the Thai Government.
 - (iii) Deposit of the sales proceeds of imported commodities under the grant portion of the non-project section of the prior year Supporting Assistance Program; and
 - (iv) Deposit of the sales proceeds of imported commodities under the loan portion of the non-project section of the prior year Supporting Assistance Program.

Contributions made under (i) and (ii) are allocated to meet a portion of the counterpart share of the local currency requirements of the Development Grant Program, with a partial contribution under (iii) providing the balance. a. Counterpart funds for this project are advanced as a grant without obligation to repay to the counterpart fund when used in accordance with this agreement, except as may otherwise be specifically provided under this Project Agreement.

Unless otherwise provided, the total in Block 9 represents the current fiscal year contribution only, notwithstanding the fact that the project may be of a continuing nature for which previous financing may have been provided and future financing may be required.

b. The "Named Ministry" and/or "Named Project Sponsor" designated on the "Table of Funds" have the primary responsibility within the Thai Government for carrying out this project under general administrative project control of DTEC, the agency representing the Thai government in its dealings with AID. As project sponsor the "Named Ministry" and/or "Named Project Sponsor" concur with the terms and conditions of the project as specified herein as evidenced by the signature of its authorized representative on the first page of the agreement.

c. Since the counterpart funds to be released to this project are in whole or in part a United States contribution, such funds shall not be utilized for the acquisition of land nor for the payment of identifiable taxes such as import duties and similar Government revenue items; further, it is agreed that the U.S. Government shall have the same rights with respect to utilization of these counterpart funds as applies under provision "M" of the Standard Provisions Annex.

d. The project dollar aid to be disbursed will not result in revenue accruing to the Thai Government unless otherwise indicated; therefore, deposits to the counterpart fund of sales proceeds of commensurate value are not required under the Economic and Technical Cooperation Agreement of September 19, 1950, provided that the agreement of the Thai Government to deposit into the counterpart fund a lump sum as its contribution to the Technical Cooperation Program remains in effect and is complied with.

e. Additional funds for this project will not be borrowed from any source except upon approval by the parties hereto.

f. Counterpart funds provided herein will not be commingled with other funds, diverted, or loaned for use elsewhere. Moreover, such funds will be used only for purchases made in Thailand and under no circumstances will include payments for bank charges in connection with any imported items purchased with counterpart funds. Counterpart funds may not be used to acquire foreign exchange for any purpose, except for travel outside of Thailand, which is specifically authorized in advance by DTEC/USOM. Commodity purchases in excess of Baht 50,000 and contracts in excess of Baht 500,000 shall be submitted to DTEC and USOM for concurrence on form "Counterpart Project Purchase Authorization Request and Approval".

g. The counterpart obligation period shall be from the date of this agreement but not prior to October 1 of this current fiscal year, through September 30 of the current fiscal year. Obligations incurred prior to the initial date or subsequent to the terminal date shall not be financed with counterpart funds made available hereby.

h. Obligations against counterpart funds will be reported to DTEC by October 31 and liquidated by December 31, of the next fiscal year (except for obligations covering contracts which provide for payment on an extended basis), following the end of this fiscal year, and any excess funds shall be returned to the counterpart fund no later than February 28 of the next fiscal year unless otherwise provided in this agreement.

- (b) Other Government Funds: Contributions of Other Government Funds consist primarily of cash to be expended on the project by the sponsoring Ministry from its own budget appropriated to it from the Thai National budget, and the value in kind of services and facilities furnished by the Ministry for the direct use by the project. Included also are contributions in cash and kind by other Thai Government Agencies including Changwads, Amphurs, and so forth.

Counterpart Funds:

- (a) The General Counterpart Funds are subdivided into the following accounts: Special Account, Sub-Account "D", and Sub-Account "L", with Special Account, and "D", each being further subdivided into a "Trust Account" and Project Account". Special Account is established to support the Development Grant Program Projects, while Sub-Account "D" and "L" support the Supporting Assistance Projects.
- (b) Trust Funds in each instance are used to pay the cost of the local currency support costs of U.S. employed technicians and in some instance of contract personnel assigned to the projects, surface and air transportation within Thailand, travel per diem, quarters allowance and cost of living allowances.
- Project Account funds in each instance are used to meet all other approved local currency costs for the project to be funded from counterpart funds.
- Disbursements of Trust Funds are made by the USOM Controller against actual requirements and the appropriate Fiscal Year operational budget as approved by DTEC and USOM.
- (c) Disbursements of Project Account Funds are to be made by the "Named Ministry", and/or "Named Project Sponsor", in accordance with the following procedure:
- (1) The total amount of Project Account Funds set forth in this Project Agreement as the maximum counterpart requirements for the calendar year to support the project shall be earmarked for release by DTEC to the "Named Ministry" and/or "Named Project Sponsor".
 - (2) Actual release of such funds shall be on the basis of "Counterpart Project Authorization" forms which shall be prepared pursuant to an approved counterpart budget by object classification on standard budget approval forms in accordance with current instructions and procedures outlined in the "Project Fund Control" manual and in the DTEC/USOM Thailand Program Implementation Manual FY 1961 Program." The initial "Counterpart Project Authorization" shall have attached to it a budget breakdown for each object class code indicating the amount and kind of type of services, materials, or equipment to be procured and the estimated unit cost and total cost. Total costs within any object class code may be increased up to 15% by decreasing other codes in a like amount so long as the total of the obligated funds in the budget is not exceeded. Shifts of funds of more than 15%, without increasing the total budget, may be authorized without Project Agreement amendment by submission by the Project Sponsor (Director) of a written request to DTEC, accompanied by a revised budget showing the original (Project Agreement) budget, the increase and decrease by object class code and the new totals. The detailed items to be added and eliminated by object class code must be shown USOM approval of the revised budget will be considered only upon the recommendation of DTEC. Increases or decreases in budgeted funds which result in changes in the total funds obligated by the Project Agreement require Project Agreement amendment.
 - (3) Upon approval of the counterpart budget as provided in (2) above, an initial advance of funds shall be made to the project upon presentation to DTEC of a letter request from the "Named Ministry" and/or "Named Project Sponsor" concurred in by the senior U.S. technician assigned to the project. Subsequent advances shall be made upon similarly approved letter requests provided (1) that a liquidation schedule is presented, indicating funds on deposit are not sufficient to cover three months advance requirements, (2) that the financial reports required under Block 10, 1, are not delinquent, and (3) that an unsatisfactory audit report is not on file. Funds so advanced for each year's project requirements will be deposited in a separate account in the Bank of Thailand entitled with the name of this project and the project number, and separate accounts and records will be maintained thereon.

Other Government Funds:

Simultaneously with the presentation of the counterpart budget as required in 2 o (2), the "Named Ministry" and/or "Named Project Sponsor" shall submit to DTEC and to USOM a local currency budget by object classification detailing expenditures proposed for the project from funds appropriated to the Ministry from the Thai budget together with the value by object classification of the services and facilities being furnished to the project during the fiscal year. A. As used herein, the term "AID" refers to the Agency for International Development, any component agency, or any successor agency. References to "this Project Agreement" shall mean the original Project Agreement as modified by any revisions which have entered into effect.

B. (1) AID will make available the amounts specified in Block 8 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may be further described in Annex A, as required by Block 5 hereof. In addition, as may be further specified in Annex A, AID will, subject to the availability of funds and (where required by AID procedures) as provided for in Project Implementation Orders (PIOs) issued by AID in accordance with its procedures, make available funds (a) to pay costs of furnishing technical services to be performed by United States Government employees in connection with the project, (b) to pay a share of the costs of providing training outside the cooperating country in connection with the project for qualified persons from the cooperating country, and (c) to pay such additional costs as may be specified.

(2) The Cooperating Government Agency will make available the amounts specified in Block 9 of this Project Agreement, as necessary for the project, for use for the designated purposes and as may further be described in Annex A. The Cooperating Government Agency will also make, or arrange to have made, additional contributions of property, services, facilities and funds required for carrying out the project as may be specified in Annex A, or as may subsequently be agreed upon by the two parties.

C. AID and the Cooperating Agency may obtain the assistance of other public and private agencies in carrying out their respective obligations under this Project Agreement. The two parties may agree to accept contributions of property, services, facilities and funds for purposes of this Project Agreement from other public and private agencies, and may agree upon the participation of any such third party in carrying out activities under this Project Agreement.

D. AID shall not be required to make any contribution after the expiration of six months following the estimated final contribution date (Block 13 of the Project Agreement form AID 1330-1) or any amended final contribution date specified herein. Except as otherwise specified herein or subsequently agreed

by the parties, all contributions of the Cooperating Agency pursuant to this Project Agreement shall be made on or before said estimated termination date, or amended date. A contribution of goods or services shall be considered to have been made when the goods or services, provided or financed by the contributing party, are delivered in accordance with commercial practice.

E. The procurement of commodities and contract services to be financed in whole or in part by AID may (where so required by AID procedures) be undertaken only pursuant to PIOs issued by AID in accordance with its procedures.

F. Unless otherwise specified in the applicable PIO, the procurement of commodities financed with the AID contribution referred to in Block 8 of this Project Agreement shall be subject to the provisions of AID Regulation 1.

G. Unless otherwise specified in the applicable PIO, title to all property procured through financing by AID pursuant to Block 8(c) of this Project Agreement shall be in the Cooperating Agency, or such public or private agency as it may authorize. This provision is inapplicable to any property which may be used in connection with the project but is not financed pursuant to said Block 8(c).

H. Any property furnished to either party through financing by the other party pursuant to this Project Agreement shall, unless otherwise agreed by the party which financed the procurement, be devoted to the project until completion of the project, and thereafter shall be used so as to further the objectives sought in carrying out the project. Either party shall offer to return to the other, or to reimburse the other for, any property which it obtains through financing by the other party pursuant to this Project Agreement which is not used in accordance with the preceding sentence.

I. (1) If AID and any public or private organization furnishing commodities through AID financing for operations hereunder in the cooperating country, is, under the laws, regulations or administrative procedures of the cooperating country, liable for customs duties and import taxes on commodities imported into the cooperating country for purposes of carrying out this Project Agreement, the Cooperating Agency will pay such duties and taxes unless exemption is otherwise provided by any applicable international agreement.

(2) If any personnel (other than citizens and residents of the cooperating country), whether United

States Government employees, or employees of public or private organizations under contract with, or individuals under contract with, AID, the Cooperating Agency or any agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, who are present in the cooperating country to provide services which AID has agreed to furnish or finance under this Project Agreement, are, under the laws, regulations or administrative procedures of the cooperating country, liable for income and social security taxes with respect to income upon which they are obligated to pay income or social security taxes to the Government of the United States of America, for property taxes on personal property intended for their own use, or for the payment of any tariff or duty upon personal or household goods brought into the cooperating country for the personal use of themselves and members of their families (not including such personal or household goods as may be sold by any such personnel in the cooperating country), the Cooperating Agency will pay such taxes, tariff, or duty unless exemption is otherwise provided by any applicable international agreement.

J. Any personnel (other than citizens and residents of the cooperating country), whether United States Government employees, or employees of public or private organizations under contract with, or individuals under contract with, AID, the Cooperating Agency or any agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, who are present in the cooperating country to provide services which AID has agreed to furnish or finance under this Project Agreement shall be subject to the approval of the Cooperating Agency and AID, and shall be under the general direction of the Director of the Mission to the cooperating country.

K. If any commodity is furnished to the Cooperating Agency, or any public or private agency authorized by the Cooperating Agency, on a grant basis through financing by AID pursuant to this Project Agreement under arrangements which will result in the accrual of proceeds to the Cooperating Agency or any authorized agency and if the applicable agreement between the two governments referred to on the first page of this Project Agreement does not provide for the establishment of a Special Account and the deposit therein of currency of the cooperating country, the Cooperating Agency will make such arrangements as may be necessary to establish a Special Account and to deposit therein currency of the cooperating country in amounts equal to such proceeds, in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon. Funds in the Special Account may be used only as agreed upon by AID and the Cooperating Agency; provided, that such portion of the funds in the Special Account as may be designated by AID shall be made available to AID to meet the requirements of the United States.

L. The Cooperating Agency will make such arrangements as may be necessary so that funds intro-

duced into the cooperating country by AID or any public or private agency for purposes of carrying out obligations of AID hereunder shall be convertible into currency of the cooperating country at the highest rate which, at the time the conversion is made, is not unlawful in the cooperating country.

M. AID shall expend funds and carry out operations pursuant to this Project Agreement only in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations of the United States Government.

N. The two parties shall have the right at any time to observe operations carried out under this Project Agreement. Either party during the term of the Project Agreement and three years after the completion of the project, shall further have the right (1) to examine any property procured through financing by that party under this Project Agreement, wherever such property is located, and (2) to inspect and audit any records and accounts with respect to funds provided by, or any properties and contract services procured through financing by, that party under this Project Agreement, wherever such records may be located and maintained. Each party, in arranging for any disposition of any property procured through financing by the other party under this Project Agreement, shall assure that the rights of examination, inspection and audit described in the preceding sentence are reserved to the party which did the financing.

O. Upon completion of the project, a Completion Report shall be drawn up, signed by appropriate representatives of AID and the Cooperating Agency, and submitted to AID and the Cooperating Agency. The Completion Report shall include a summary of the actual contributions by both AID and the Cooperating Agency to the project, and shall provide a record of the activities carried out, the objectives achieved, and related basic data. AID and the Cooperating Agency shall each furnish the other with such information as may be needed to determine the nature and scope of operations under this Agreement and to evaluate the effectiveness of such operations.

P. The present Agreement shall enter into force when signed. Either party may terminate this Project Agreement by giving the other party 30 days written notice of intention to terminate it. Termination of this Project Agreement shall terminate any obligations of the two parties to make contributions pursuant to Blocks 8 and 9 of this Project Agreement, except for payments which they are committed to make pursuant to non-cancellable commitments entered into with third parties prior to the termination of the Project Agreement. It is expressly understood that the obligations under paragraph H relating to the use of property shall remain in force after such termination.

I. Project Description

A. Background

This project assists the Ministry of Education (MOE), Department of Vocational Education, in implementing and operating a project designed to expand and improve the agricultural education and trade and industrial education program. USOM assistance to this phase of vocational education development in Thailand began in FY 1966 and work continues in the following areas: (1) curriculum development at the upper vocational secondary school level and for vocational teacher training at the college level. (2) Commodity procurement, distribution and installation. (3) Participant training abroad. (4) Personnel development in-country.

The program involves a Thai expenditure of \$32.4 million, including an IBRD loan of \$6 million to finance shop and laboratory equipment for the 25 project schools.

Curriculum development for the upper secondary vocational school level and for the vocational teacher training institutions is on schedule. Delays in procurement of commodities financed under the IBRD Loan required adjustments in the time phasing of some elements of the project. Contract services provided by USOM have been restructured and rescheduled accordingly.

Construction in the 25 project schools was completed in September 1970; and as equipment arrives in country, it is inspected, delivered, and installed in school shops.

The 12 participants financed under the FY 70 budget are at the American University Alumni Association Language Training Center preparing for their training programs in to the USA. The two contract teams, California State Polytechnic College and Oklahoma State University, have conducted more than 100 workshops and seminars in the teacher training colleges and in the project vocational schools.

During this fiscal year, Cal Poly and OSU Contract teams will continue their activities as planned. With basic curriculum development well along, the emphasis is being directed towards implementation, evaluation and revision of curriculum materials. The commodity procurement and installation will continue on a reduced scale and the final group of participants will start their training in the U.S.A.

B. Purpose of this Project Agreement

This project agreement provides for FY 71 support by MOE and USOM in their efforts to improve vocational trade and industry and vocational agricultural education in Thailand.

II. U.S. Government Contributions (See Funding Table)

A. Technical Assistance

1. Direct-Hire Services

There are four (4) regular direct-hire technician/advisors assigned to this project - one general vocational education advisor, one vocational agriculture education, one vocational industrial education and one equipment procurement and distribution. They will continue to assist MOE expand and improve the vocational education program through the Vocational Education project. There will be one short-term direct hire consultant who will work with the Ministry of Education in the design of an evaluative study of the Vocational Education Project. The Thai study group with whom the American specialist is to work will conduct the study. However, the American specialist will further assist his Thai associates in the summarization of the findings and the preparation of recommendations. The duration of this assignment is estimated to be 90 working days.

2. Contract Services (See PIO/T's accompanying this document).

Vocational Agriculture Education: Funds of \$250,000 are provided for the continued services of a five-man team of advisors provided under the California State Polytechnic College Contract AID/fe-308. This team will continue to work with their Thai associates in further refinement of curriculum materials and instruction regarding its use in the upper secondary vocational agriculture schools and at the Bangpra Agriculture Teacher Training College.

Vocational Industrial Education: \$350,000 is provided for the continued services of a team of seven (7) advisors provided under the Oklahoma State University Contract AID/ea 23. This team will continue the development and refinement of curriculum materials for the upper secondary vocational industrial schools and at the Thewes Vocational Industrial Teacher Training College.

Consultant Services as requested by the RTG and approved by USOM will supplement the work of each contractor.

B. Training

USOM will provide three to four months training in the US for seven participants in the development and use of programmed learning materials for vocational education. The group will consist of a team leader and six persons selected from the vocational agriculture, vocational industrial and the Mobile Trade Training School programs. Their training will be provided under the RDC Contract AID/ea 55 which was funded in the FY 1969 ProAg for Rural Education Sub-Project A (Textbook and Teaching Materials Development).

III. Royal Thai Government Contribution

The RTG will continue the renovation, land leveling and landscaping of the project schools and will provide: 1) operational support for the seminars and workshops conducted by the contract team personnel and their Thai colleagues; 2) all operational costs such as teachers salaries, utilities and instructional materials; and 3) logistical support for project related contract and direct hire technicians.

MOE regular budget funds of approximately ¥31,500,000 will be provided for operational expenses of the project schools during the FY 1971 Thai Fiscal Year (BE 2514) October 1, 1970 to September 30, 1971.

A. Background

Under this project, USOM assists the Ministry of Education (MOE), Department of Vocational Education, in expanding and improving its agricultural education and trade and industrial education program. USOM assistance to this phase of vocational education development in Thailand began in FY 1966 and work continues in the following areas: (1) curriculum development at the upper vocational secondary school level and for vocational teacher training at the college level; (2) commodity procurement, distribution and installation; (3) participant training abroad; and (4) personnel development in-country. (For additional information see the Review of Vocational Education Project 493-11-610-194 for FY 1972 and previous ProAgs).

The program involves a Thai expenditure of \$32.4 million. Included in this amount is an IBRD loan of \$6 million to finance shop and laboratory equipment for the 25 project schools. (Loan for Improvement of Vocational Education project).

Curriculum development for the upper secondary vocational school level and for the vocational teacher training institutions is on schedule. Delays in procurement of commodities financed under the IBRD loan have made it necessary to make adjustments in the time phasing of some elements of the project, but this has not caused serious problems in achieving the conditions expected at the completion of the project. Contract services provided by USOM through this project have been restructured and rescheduled accordingly.

Construction in the 25 project schools was completed in September 1970. Equipment is inspected, delivered and installed in the school shops as it arrives in country.

The 16 participants financed under the FY 70 budget are in the United States and in training programs requested in the PIO/P's. The two contract teams, California States Polytechnic College and Oklahoma State University, have conducted more than 100 workshops and seminars in the teacher training colleges and in the project vocational schools.

Instruments were designed for the evaluation of the Loan for Improvement of Vocational Education (LIVE) Project, and are being translated for the school-by-school evaluation.

Pursuant to this Agreement, the U.S. Government hereby obligates an additional \$20,000 for participant training (which is in addition to the \$3,000 previously obligated in the original of this Agreement) to finance short-term non-degree leadership training in Vocational/Technical Education for six (6) project planners and directors concerned with the post-high school technician training institutions to be up-graded under the Asia Development Bank Loan proposal. This training activity is to be closely coordinated with the service provided by the consultant if actually funded.

C. Situs Excess Property

U.S. Government owned excess items such as shop and office equipment, vehicles, training aids, and shop practice materials in "as is" condition may be acquired from Situs Excess Property Sources. These items, when available, will be transferred to the Department of Vocational Education for use in the public vocational education program. The RTG will provide transportation from the situs excess property source to the end user and funds for repair and utilization of the items as required.

III. Royal Thai Government Contributions

A. The RTG will continue the renovation of old buildings (rewiring, etc.), land leveling, and landscaping of the project schools; and will provide operational support for seminars and workshops conducted by contract team personnel and their Thai colleagues. In addition, the RTG will finance all

operational costs such as teachers' salaries, utilities, and instructional materials as well as logistical support for contract and direct-hire technicians under this project.

B. The FY 1973 RTG budget for vocational education is approximately \$372,600,000. Of this total, about \$18,029,740 will be provided for operational expenses of the LIVE Project schools.

C. DTEC will provide \$807,000 in Trust Funds and \$221,550 in Project Account to support the project.
