A.I.D. and the Cooperating Government have obligated for commitment to this contract the amount of ¥2,835,040 (herein called "obligated baht funds") which may be used for baht costs, (previously incurred since the inception date of the contract as well as Baht Costs to be incurred) as set forth in Article VII. Additional sums may be obligated to this contract by the Contracting Officer, in which event upon written notice to the Contractor, the obligated funds shall be increased by the additional sum or sums so obligated. The obligation of the Cooperating and U.S. Governments for baht payments to the Contractor hereunder shall not exceed the baht funds obligated to this contract, in accordance with the foregoing provision.

Under Article II. C - Reports, the following is added:

"In lieu of quarterly reports, 'Stage (Planning) Reports' shall be furnished. The Stage Reports, to be identified by numbers, shall discuss the planning processes by focusing on the elements making up comprehensive planning. Final Draft Plan(s) shall be attached to, or included as a part of, the Stage 5 (Final) Report. A summary of problems encountered with recommended solutions, methods of work used, and recommendations regarding any unfinished work shall be included in the Final Report. If possible, comments of RTG and/or other International Agencies on the draft plan and/or the planning process should be included. The Final Report shall be distributed as follows: 295 copies to USOM Bangkok; five (5) to AID/W (SA/IR/LT/T). Final Report printing plates shall be furnished to RTG upon RTG or Mission request."

Article III - The estimated level of effort is revised to: 187 man-months for key personnel; twenty-one (21) man-months for short-term experts; and twenty-four (24) man-months for general home office technical support.

Article IV - Period of Contract - While performance of all other work in Thailand will complete by 31 August 1971, field and home office performance of the contract may continue past this date for the purposes of Final Report completion and administrative close-out actions. The target date for the completion of administrative activities is 31 January 1972; however, within the amounts provided in the budget, the Contractor will be permitted to disburse funds for contractual obligations incurred until such obligations are satisfied.

Article Paragraph A: The total estimated cost, exclusive of fixed fee is changed from \$1,076,548 to \$947,200.

Paragraph B: The amount presently obligated for commitment to the contract is changed from \$950,000 to \$1,045,542.

Article VI - The following dollar Budget is substituted for that now shown:

Third Year Scope of Technical Services

A. General Provisions

Continued assistance to the NEDB in the preparation of a five-year plan for Northeast Thailand, including:

(1) Submission (to NEDB for appropriate ministries) of proposed projects, programs and policy alternatives based on (a) the collective findings, including sufficiency surveys, of the consultants and their counterpart staff; (2) evaluation of on-going and proposed programs by other agencies with all proposals to be tested against the regional framework for benefits (e.g., impact on gross regional product).

Evaluation by operating ministries and departments of the preliminary plan targets and proposals generated by the NEED participants in relation to their individual programs and projects, and their presentation of revised and detailed individual budgets and programs to NEDB.

NEDB review of any differences which exist and presentation of final strategies, including policy, priorities, programs, projects and both capital and recurring department budgets for the Five Year Plan to the NEED Sub-Committee and NEDB Executive Committee.

Final draft plan to include the basic regional model and adjusted targets and budgets, together with sector programs and projects which are consistent with the model, as well as with relevant institutional constraints.

B. Tasks Concurrent

To supplement the regional production model already set up, consumption (especially public sector) expenditures to be determined and a method proposed to estimate savings and capital formation.

On-going research on public development expenditures, together with analysis of current budget allocations in the major sectors, to be used to establish sector expenditure requirements and constraints.

Examination of private expenditures to be based on household expenditure surveys, rice balance sheets, etc., in order to determine demand parameters which may affect sector target estimates to date, also to determine distributive shares.

The emerging completed model to be used to test general sector strategy and particular programs and projects in terms of regional benefits (impact on GRP and income distribution), demand constraints and expenditure requirements, providing preliminary benefit/cost relationships and priority determinations for individual programs.

Sectoral programs to be checked for internal consistency, as well as with regional and national goals, and allocation of resources to the region from the national budget under the Third National Plan to be compared with these programs and policy alternatives.

Restatement of strategy based on consistency checks and integration of proposed project and program, including basic quantifiable justification and preliminary intra-regional distribution.

Proposed project and program submission to NEDB to include project identification and financing.

Recheck plan projects and programs with operating ministry and departments. This includes specification of programs in terms of budget and location, with special emphasis on intra-regional requirements. Make appropriate revisions of draft plan for submission as final proposed Five Year Plan.

### C. Basic Tasks of Staff Members

Chief of Party: Supervision, integration, recommending the establishment of procedures of RTG planning units, and general policy coordination of regional and national planning aims, as well as liaison with IBRD, ADB, Mekong Secretariat, etc., concerned with planning and program inputs for the Northeast; assistance in the industry and transport sectors. Responsible for project/program reports submission as required by the contract.

Deputy Chief of Party: Assistance in general supervision advisory inputs on basic data inputs for each sector and procedures for data collection, storage and processing (including NSO Regional Data Bank), and its relationship to National Planning requirements and integration of intra-regional (changwat) data.

Agriculture Advisor: Provide basic inputs for the sectoral plan and strategy in Agriculture, which is the lead sector in the Northeast. Assist in critical institution building aspects in order to enhance the implementability of the proposed agriculture sector plan.

Marketing Advisor: Responsible for relevant market research involving demand for domestic and export goods produceable in the Northeast and the functioning of the marketing process for each of these goods. Assist in the target and program evaluation for agriculture, trade and manufacturing.

Social Services Advisor: Responsible for Social Services Sector plan inputs requiring continued elaboration for inclusion on a meaningful plan.

Water Resources Advisor: Assist the NEDB and RID to conduct a survey of irrigation facilities, including principal dams and tanks, to determine their effectiveness in raising agricultural productivity, to be used as a guide for future public expenditures in water resources.

Transportation Advisor/Program Engineer: Complete Transportation

Sufficiency Survey and NE Transportation Plan; complete basic five year plan for NE. Consider candidate programs from RTG departments and subject them to pre-feasibility studies for NE. Determine preliminary benefit cost ratios concentrating on projects of highest priority and help prepared them for presentation to financing agencies for more detailed study. Cooperate with need Water Resources Advisor preparing similar projects in that field. Complete a program for adequate highway maintenance including personnel training and equipment requirements not now directly responsibility for Thai Highway Department.

Analyze the more detailed cost/benefits relationships need to be determined on priorities and specify investment needs with other proposed pre-feasibility studies.

Work closely with transportation section of Economic Projects Division, NEDB, assisting overall transportation plan methodology as applied to both region and nation.

Infrastructure Planner: Complete the highway sufficiency survey.

Short-term Manpower Requirements: Includes data presentation systems sick as operations rooms, analyzing census data as available, and general home office support in terms of technical production and editing and possible programming appropriate computerization.


