This PIO/T Amendment makes available partial funding in the amount of \$1,160,000 which brings the total amount of funds available and obligated under this grant to \$11,606,790. Appendix No. one, A.I.D. Sponsored Students Second Semester 1978-79, lists all students currently enrolled and financed under this grant. Information regarding each student's class and major, starting and estimated completion dates is given. There are 275 regular students: 36 expected to complete their study in 1978-79 school year; 70 in 1979-80; 55 in 1980-81; 53 in 1981-82; 39 in 1982-83; 12 in 1983-84; and 10 in 1984-85. II. Objective

To assist USAID/Lisbon with current program-development efforts relative to Portuguese Agriculture, appraising its past/current performance; by identifying major policy and institutional/organization weaknesses related thereto; and, evaluating alternative approaches of bringing AID assistance to bear upon these deficiencies.

III. Scope of Work

The contractor is to provide a 2-3 person team to: (1) assess the past and current performance of Portuguese agriculture, with a view to determining its major strengths and weaknesses, including the potential for expanding production; (2) identify the major constraints to increasing production, including needed policy and institutional changes; as well as steps to overcome them; and, (3) recommend possible AID (loan-financed) assistance in supporting these actions.

Specifically, the team will:

(1) Review the past and current performance of Portugal's agriculture sector, as well as its potential and future role relative to the overall economy, particularly in terms of its contributions to GDP, balance of payments and impact of the country's entrance into the EEC.

(2) Assess the effects of past policies and public interventions (tariffs, prices, subsidies, interest rate, public investment, etc.) on this performance and specify needed changes to improve sector performance, especially with regard to increasing productivity and production.

(3) Examine the present production structure, identifying the major constraints to increased agricultural output, including rural infrastructure, land tenure patterns, adequacy of institutional/Support systems (both public and private), levels of technology being applied, availability of market information and labor-supply and skills of rural/farm populations.

(4) Evaluate public and private investment levels and needs for agriculture; examine income and net return patterns of agricultural producers; and, identify weaknesses in terms of incentives to farmers, credit availability, etc.

(5) Review past and current use of PL 480 funds relative to addressing above identified problem-areas and weaknesses and bringing about needed policy/institutional/structural changes.

(6) Recommend to USAID/Lisbon approaches and critical areas where possible AID loan-financing and PL 480 funds could be used to promote agricultural development (both long-term and short-term), through the support of needed policy and institutional changes.

IV Reports

Prior to departing from Portugal, contractor (team) will present oral briefing for USAID/Lisbon personnel, presenting major findings, conclusions and recommendations; contractor should also leave preliminary summary and outline of full report with Mission prior to departure: Fifteen copies of final report is to be submitted to USAID within 30 days of team departure from Portugal.

Statement of Work

A. Purpose of Grant

The purpose of this grant is to provide support for a program to assist Arab Local Charitable Organizations on the West Bank to sustain and develop educational activities in the areas of Nutrition, Home First Aid and Child Development. The grant will enable Catholic Relief Services to develop curriculum and train teachers of mothers from 60 local community organizations. An estimated 2,500 mothers will benefit from the nutrition courses, 7,500 from the first aid and 1,500 mothers from the child development courses.

B. Specific Objectives

The specific objectives of this Grant are as follows:

1. Catholic Relief Services (CRS) will assist 60 Local Charitable Organizations in developing and conducting courses for mothers in nutrition, home first aid and child development.
2. Lesson plans (curriculum) will be developed for courses in first aid and child development. The lesson plan for nutrition education already developed by CRS will be utilized as well. These lesson plans should include appropriate content and means of presentation designed for both West Bank mothers and LCO (Local Charitable Organizations) women who will be their teachers.
3. CRS will train staff of the LCO's as follows:
 - 40 staff trained in Nutrition Education teachers
 - 90 staff trained as First Aid teachers
 - 75 staff trained as Child Development teachers.
4. CRS will assist the LCO centers to develop necessary records and follow-up techniques to determine the impact of the classes on child and family health and health/nutrition habits. Where there is a need, a system of follow-up visits to the homes of mothers will be developed.
5. CRS will develop a plan for evaluating project progress and impact of educational programs on family health behavior and assessing the value of the teaching and training materials used in the program. This information will be submitted as part of the two interim evaluation reports and the final report on the project.

C. Implementation

To achieve the above objectives, the Grantee shall carry out the following activities with funds provided by this Grant:

1. CRS will recruit and hire the following staff for residence in the West Bank:

- 1 Nutritionist, M.S.
- 1 Child Development Specialist
- 1 Nurse (local)
- 6 Teachers (local)
- 7 Clerical and supporting staff (local)
- Consultants as appropriate

The American Nutritionist will supervise the project.

2. CRS Staff will prepare lesson plans for training of LCO trainers and train staff from 60 LCO's to conduct courses for mothers in the 3 technical areas. The child development curriculum will be transmitted to AID for review as soon as it is available.

3. Following the training, CRS project staff will supervise the work of the newly trained LCO staff members in conducting classes for community mothers. CRS staff will also monitor the distribution of Title II PL 480 Commodities and the weighing and recording of the weight of the children. A system for follow up visits to the homes of mothers attending the LCO courses will be utilized where there is a need.

4. CRS teachers in training LCO staff will make use of visual aids and demonstration materials provided under the project. Where necessary, new materials will be developed.

5. CRS will evaluate project progress and behavioral changes in the population.

6. Short-term consultants will be utilized where appropriate in development of materials and review of progress.

D. Reporting

1. Semi-Annual Progress Reports will be submitted to AID/Washington (NE/TECH/HPN) 3 copies; the American Embassy Liaison Officer in Tel Aviv, 1 copy; the American Consulate in Jerusalem, 1 copy, and the Government of Israel Ministry of Social Welfare, 1 copy.

Such reports will provide specific details involved in carrying out the objectives and implementation activities and will include data on training of LCO trainers, training of mothers, status of equipment and commodities procured and how used, home visiting and follow-up activities by the staff, and mothers and children reached. The reports will identify problems in carrying out these programs and attempts to resolve the problems.
