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I. General Description

The alpaca, llama, vicuña and guanaco are species of South American cameloids native to the Altiplano regions of Peru. The vicuña and guanaco are protected species. The alpaca and llama are of particular value to the people living in the Altiplano due to national and international demand for their high quality fiber and skins. They also produce a high protein meat which is a major source of food in this region of Peru. INIPA is planning a workshop to address several factors affecting the production, improvement, and promotion of the cameloid. The workshop will take place in the city of Lima from August 23 through August 27, 1982. A total of 100 participants will be selected from various public, private, and international organizations in order to coordinate, define and recommend strategies to the Governments affected for the development and more efficient use of the South American cameloid.

II. Purpose

To coordinate activities between institutions and organizations involved in research, production, marketing, industrialization, credit and socio-economic aspects of raising and improving cameloids.

III. Responsibilities of the Parties

(1) The AID contribution will finance the following items: publication of abstracts, air and railroad tickets for lecturers, per diem for lecturers, publicity and photographic materials.

(2) INIPA will assume responsibility for the overall coordination and administration of the Workshop. In addition, INIPA will defray costs related to supplies and equipment as indicated in Item IV, Budget.
