PROJECT AUTHORIZATION

Project Title: A.I.D./Peace Corp Small
Project Assistance
Project Number: 936-1421

1. Pursuant to Section 103, 104 and 105 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, I hereby authorize the "A.I.D./Peace Corps Small Project Assistance" project involving centrally funded planned obligations of not to exceed \$1,415,000 of Food and Nutrition, \$100,000 of Education, and \$2,250,000 of Health Funds over a 3 year period from the year of authorization subject to the availability of funds in accordance with the A.I.D. OYB/allotment process, to help in financing foreign exchange and local currency costs for the project.

2. The project will enhance A.I.D./Peace Corps collaboration and facilitate local self-help efforts by combining Peace Corps Volunteers' knowledge of local conditions with A.I.D. financial and technical resources. It will provide a "fast funding mechanism" that will respond quickly and flexibly to self-help initiatives in the areas of health, food, energy, competitive enterprise development and income generation which will have an immediate impact at the community level.

3. The agreements which may be negotiated and executed by the officer(s) to whom such authority is delegated in accordance with A.I.D. regulations and Delegations of Authority shall be subject to the following essential terms and covenants and major conditions, together with such other terms and conditions as A.I.D. may deem appropriate:

a. Source and Origin of Commodities, Nationality of Services
Commodities financed by A.I.D. under the project shall have their source and origin in the cooperating country */ of the United States, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing. Ocean shipping financed by A.I.D. under the project shall, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing, be financed only on flag vessels of the United States.

*/ Each country in which research training, technical, or other assistance takes place under the project shall be considered a cooperating country.

ACTION MEMORANDUM FOR THE SENIOR ASSISTANT ADMINISTRATOR
BUREAU FOR SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

Problem: To authorize and approve an A.I.D./Peace Corps Project that will provide a Small Project Assistance program (SPA) for rural development and health activities and technical and programming assistance to activities supporting that SPA fund.

Background: On January 28, 1983, the Administrator of A.I.D. and the Director of Peace Corps signed a Memorandum of Understanding establishing the A.I.D./Peace Corps Small Project Assistance program. This program was designed to enhance A.I.D./Peace Corps collaboration and facilitate local self-help efforts by combining Peace Corps volunteers' knowledge of local conditions with A.I.D. financial and technical resources. It was to provide a "fast funding mechanism" that could respond quickly and flexibly to self-help initiatives in the areas of food, energy, competitive enterprise development and income generation which would have an immediate impact at the community level.

The program currently has two major components, a Small Project Assistance Fund and a technical assistance PASA. The Small Project Assistance Fund component currently provides up to \$40,000 per year to each of the 34 countries in which both A.I.D. and the Peace Corps operate to support small-scale village level activities. (These funds are allocated by PPC to the regional bureaus.) The Office of Rural and Institutional Development has managed the technical assistance components with a Peace Corps PASA under the "Field Services and Program Development project (931-1096). This technical assistance PASA has provided technical and programming assistance to the field to complement and support the individual village level projects in the technical areas covered by the SPA Fund. (Beginning in FY 1985 the technical assistance component will include a Peace Corps liaison person who will develop and implement strategies for future A.I.D./Peace Corps collaboration.) The Rural Development Office obligated \$795,000 in FY 1983, \$339,000 in FY 1984 and \$650,000 in FY 1985 and expects to obligate \$435,000 in FY 1986 and FY 1987 for this component.

This year, in addition to the above mentioned areas, the Agency and Peace Corps have decided to expand the SPA program into the health area. PPC has made available \$1,500,000 in health funds

that will be used over the next two years (FY 1985 and FY 1986). Of this amount, \$1,020,000 will be for the Small Project Assistance fund (34 countries at \$15,000 per country per year) and \$480,000 will be made available for technical and program assistance, both of which will be obligated by the current PASA with the Peace Corps.

With the addition of health activities and the possible addition of other sector areas, it has been decided that the Peace Corps activity should become a separate project with its own project number and be managed for administrative purposes in the S&T Program Office with technical support from the appropriate technical offices. Thus for administrative purposes, this new project will begin in FY 1985 with the obligation of health funds. Food and Nutrition funds obligated and reserved through FY 1984 will remain in project 931-1096; Food and Nutrition funds obligated in FY 1985 and after will be shown under the new project. The funds managed by S&T will continue to be obligated under the current PASA agreement with the Peace Corps.

It should also be noted that all funds for this project in all future years are to be added on to the original or initial S&T OYB. S&T will not be required to fund this activity unless these funds are made available to the Bureau by PPC after the original S&T Bureau OYB has been agreed upon. PPC has agreed to follow this exceptional procedure because this is a joint program with another U.S. government agency.

Recommendation: That you sign the attached PAF authorizing a new project for FY 1985, FY 1986 and FY 1987 to be administratively managed by the S&T Program Office.
