
1. Pursuant to Section 104 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 as amended I hereby authorize grant funding of \$10,000,000 for a new project, 936-5951, Child Survival Action Program - Support (\$1,000,000 Child Survival Fund; \$9,000,000 Health).
2. The project will:
 - Identify, evaluate and promote child survival technologies and programs
 - Promote an exchange of information on child survival technologies and programs
 - Promote long-term planning for child survival among developing country leaders and health care providers
3. Funding for project activities, such as technical publications, evaluation and operations research, conferences, training and technical assistance, shall be approved via action memoranda to be signed by the Agency Director for Health as these activities are identified and funds made available.
4. Agreements with Johns Hopkins University and other implementing agencies and groups shall be subject to the following terms and conditions together with any other terms and conditions which A.I.D. may deem appropriate.

Source and Origin of Goods and Services

- a. Commodities financed by A.I.D. under the project shall have their source and origin in the cooperating country or the United States, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing. Except for ocean shipping, the suppliers of commodities or services shall have the cooperating country or the United States as their place of nationality, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing.

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- b. Ocean shipping financed by A.I.D. under the project shall, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing, be financed only on flag vessels of the United States.
- c. Each country where training and other assistance takes place under this project shall be deemed to be a cooperating country for the purpose of permitting local cost financing.

SUBJECT: New FY 1985 Project, 936-5951, Child Survival Action
Program - Support

Problem: Your approval is needed to authorize a new \$10 million five-year project, Child Survival Action Program - Support, and to authorize the following activities:

- A new five-year cooperative agreement with Johns Hopkins University Institute for International Programs (IIP), including incremental funding for CSAP Tier Three evaluations
- Incremental funding for Mass Media Health Practices (MMHP) for video and other educational materials on child survival
- An IQC work order with Westinghouse Health Systems for a compilation of child survival data

Discussion: A prime goal of A.I.D.'s Health Sector is to reduce mortality and morbidity among infants and children under five years. In Fiscal Year 1985 the Congress appropriated additional funds which permitted the Agency to sharpen the focus of its health and related activities on child survival. The Administrator, on February 22, 1985, launched a Child Survival Action Program to extend the availability of child survival technologies (STATE 054199).

This new project provides us with the means to accelerate the Agency's Child Survival Action Program. The project will:

- Identify, evaluate, and promote child survival technologies and programs.
- Promote an exchange of information on child survival technologies and programs.
- Promote long-term planning for child survival among developing country leaders and health care providers.

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We estimate the five-year cost of these activities to be \$10 million. As appropriate activities are identified and resources for their support made available, we shall seek the approval of the Agency Director for Health on a case-by-case basis. Many of these activities will be international and regional in nature. For any country specific sub-projects, we will confirm the eligibility of that country for assistance with the appropriate desk.

Several activities have already been identified and are described below:

1. Of the funds appropriated for the Child Survival Fund, Congress directed that \$1,000,000 be used to establish an international health program at Johns Hopkins University and indicated its intention that \$1,000,000 be provided each year for up to five years for that purpose. We have received a proposal from Johns Hopkins Institute for International Programs (IIP) to support applied research, training, country activities and evaluation in support of child survival technologies and programs. We intend to develop a cooperative agreement with the IIP and plan to obligate up to \$2,000,000 in FY 85 including \$1 million from the Child Survival Fund and up to an additional \$1,000,000 from the Health Account. Future levels of A.I.D. support will be based upon the submission and approval of a work plan as described in the cooperative agreement and will be subject to the availability of funds. Because this was included in the legislation, competitive procurement requirements do not apply.
2. One of the important functions of CSAP-support is to provide information - both technical and programmatic - to the PVO's, host country counterparts, and international organizations who are carrying out child survival programs. In addition, in support of country programs and to educate the U.S. public on key development issues, materials are needed for use in Development Education programs for schools, universities, professional and other private organizations. \$95,000 of incremental funding for the Mass Media Health Practices Project is provided to support dissemination of programmatic and technical material on child survival.
3. CSAP-Support seeks to make effective use of existing data sets to highlight child survival issues. Under the S&T/POP Project Demographic Data for Development, Westinghouse Corporation is developing a valuable data

base that can provide important baseline information for tracking A.I.D.'s Child Survival Action Program. Under an IQC work order, this activity will result in an easy to use reference volume analyzing and providing ready access to existing data on current and future trends in child survival.

An Advice of Program Change has been submitted to Congress and will expire on August 2, 1985.

Recommendation: That you sign the attached project authorizations which 1) provides general authorization for a new five-year \$ 10 million project; and 2) authorizes the following activities:

- A new cooperative agreement with Johns Hopkins University Institute for International Programs (IIP) - (\$2,000,000) *
- Incremental funding for Mass Media Health Practices (MMHP) for video and other educational materials on child survival (\$95,000)
- An IQC work order with Westinghouse Health Systems for a compilation of child survival data (\$30,182).
