PROJECT AUTHORIZATION AMENDMENT

Name of Country: Interregional Project Title: Population
Information
Program III

Project Number: 936-3032

1. Pursuant to Section 104 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, I hereby authorize an increase not to exceed \$27,100,000 in the funding level for the centrally funded project entitled "Population Information Program III" to a new life-of-project total of \$35,100,000 in grant fund for the period FY 1984 to FY 1991. Obligations will be in annual increments subject to the availability of funds in accordance with the A.I.D. OYB/allotment process, to help in financing foreign exchange and local currency costs for the project.

2. The project is a key means of providing scientific and technical information to population and health personnel worldwide. Through the maintenance of a comprehensive technical information base, it transfers essential information to policy makers and service providers.

3. The contract which may be negotiated and executed by the officer(s) to whom such authority is delegated in accordance with A.I.D. regulations and Delegations of Authority shall be subject to the following essential terms and covenants and major conditions, together with such other terms and conditions as A.I.D. may deem appropriate.

4. Source and Origin of Commodities, Nationality of Services.

- a. Commodities financed by A.I.D. under the project shall have their source and origin in the cooperating country* or the United States, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing. Except for ocean shipping, the suppliers of commodities or services shall have the cooperating country or the United States as their place of nationality, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing.

*Each developing country where research, training, technical, or other assistance takes place under the project shall be deemed to be a cooperating country for the purpose of permitting local cost financing.

- b. Goods and services, except for ocean shipping, financed by A.I.D. under the project shall have their source and origin in a cooperating country or in the United States except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing.
- c. Ocean shipping financed by A.I.D. under the project shall, except as A.I.D. may otherwise agree in writing, be financed only on flag vessels of the United States.

Action: Your approval is required to amend the authorization for the Population Information Program III, project 936-3032, to extend the duration from three to eight years and increase the life-of-project funding from \$8,000,000 to \$35,100,000.

Discussion: LDC officials, program managers, family planning clinicians and other population and health professionals need access to current, reliable information on population, family planning, and maternal and child health in order to make decisions on appropriate policies, program alternatives, health safeguards and allocation of limited resources. The relative newness of most programs, the desire to provide services on a national scale to hard-to-reach populations and the evolving nature of the technology itself, make such access to up-to-date, scientifically-sound information particularly important.

A key element in this important technology transfer and information dissemination effort has been the Population Information Program (PIP). This project supports the collection and analysis of worldwide population information and its rapid diffusion among professionals, the public, and government users working with or in the LDCs. By giving these users better information for more accurate decision making, the PIP project helps transfer scientific and technological know-how to LDC institutions which implement family planning, health and child survival programs. Reports from LDC officials, AID Mission health and population staff, an external evaluation team and others, indicate that PIP is one of the most highly regarded sources of reliable, comprehensive information available to professionals in the field.

The major objective of PIP, which began in 1972, is to provide the latest and most reliable scientific and medical, technical and legal, program design and management information available. This will be accomplished in PIP III through the continued operation of a Technical Inquiry Service and maintenance of an Information Resource Center, an overall clearinghouse for providing family planning, health and child survival information to LDC family planning and health personnel.

The project will continue publication of serial technical reports and other studies (especially Population Reports) and maintenance and regular updating of a comprehensive population information system, including collections of printed and audio-visual materials and computerized databases.

The project information services will be directed toward government program leaders and policy makers, physicians, health professionals, academicians, researchers, and mass media communicators.

The PIP project responds to guidance set forth in the Agency Population and Health Policy Papers. It supports "dissemination of family planning information and education, including natural family planning," and it "provides information and education on family planning and population, both for individual users and also for government policy makers."

A ten-year project paper (FY 84-FY 93) was approved in FY 1984; therefore, review and approval of this action by the Population Sector Council is not required. An external evaluation of this project was completed in March 1987, and the team found that the assumptions upon which the project were based were still valid and that PIP is providing services needed by LDC health professionals. The recommendations made in the evaluation report have been discussed with the Sector Council members and will be incorporated in the workscope for the follow-on contract.

This authorization (a) reflects no commitment on your part to go beyond eight years and (b) will encompass activities which can be accomplished in that period of time. The required Advice of Program Change has been drafted and is in the process of clearance.

Recommendation: That you sign the attached Project Authorization.
