SILLIMAN UNIVERSITY, REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES

Pursuant to the authority contained in Section 214 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Government of the United States of America, acting through the Agency for International Development (hereinafter referred to as "A.I.D.") hereby makes a grant of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) to the United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia (hereinafter referred to as "Grantee") to be used solely for the benefit of Silliman University located in Dumaguete City, Philippines, in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Appendices hereto attached and made part of this grant, as follows: Appendix A (Special Provisions), and Apperdix B (General Provisions: (3) Procurement of Commodities, (5a) Disbursement Procedures for Actual and Accrued Expenses, (6) Administrative and Other Provisions).

This grant is to cover authorized expenditures incurred from the date of execution of this grant and ending June 30, 1984.

APPENDIX A

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE I - PURPOSE OF THE GRANT

1. Under Section 214 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the United States Government is authorized to provide assistance to schools located outside of the United States, founded or sponsored by United States citizens, and serving as study and demonstration centers for American ideas and practices.

2. The Grantee, a non-profit corporation, was founded in 1911 and incorporated in the State of New York in 1956. Grantee has been the U.S. sponsor for Silliman University since 1957. Among other activities, Grantee provides financial support to the University, recruits and supports American teachers and consultants, and provides graduate fellowships for Silliman faculty members.

3. Silliman was founded by the Presbyterian Church of the United States in 1901, became a university in 1938, and has grown in enrollment to almost 7,000 students. The University has a graduate school and seven colleges -- arts and sciences, business administration, education, engineering, law, nursing and agriculture, and also operates an experimental farm as a base for the College of Agriculture and its extension programs.

4. A.I.D. granted \$1.3 million in 1976 for the construction of a library which has had a major impact on the development of the University.

5. Grantee has requested Fiscal Year 1983 assistance to procure books and equipment for selected academic departments of the University.

ARTICLE II - AUTHORIZED EXPENDITURES

Except as otherwise provided by A.I.D. in writing, the \$500,000 provided by this grant shall be expended only for the following:

Procurement of books, equipment and accessories for the Colleges of Agriculture and Engineering, the Departments of Chemistry and Biology and the University's marine laboratory. Commodity related costs such as shipping, insurance and installation are chargeable to the grant. Prior to the disbursement of grant funds, Grantee shall submit to A.I.D. a procurement list with the appropriate costs of the items to be procured.

ARTICLE III - OTHER SPECIAL PROVISIONS

No funds provided by this grant shall be used for payment of customs duties or any other tax levied by the Government of the Philippines on commodities imported to the Philippines for this project.
