The rate of career progress of participant over non-participants peers has been substantially in favor of the former.

COMMENT: Both on the basis of project-funded commodities and GOB funded commodities procured as a result of project pumppriming, GOB public safety activities which have had the benefit of project support are substantially better equipped in the fields of telecommunications, investigations, identification, transport and training.					
3. Quality of management and technical capability of personnel of GOB public safety activities which have received project support.		COMMENT: Re management, improvements have been most evident in personnel selection, training and employment, budget & fiscal procedures, equipment selection, procurement, utilization and maintenance, accountability. Re technical skills, improvements have been realized in telecommunications, investigations, identification, patrol and police public relations.

IV. PROJECT PURPOSE

A. 1. Statement of purpose as currently envisaged.

To improve the capability of the Brazilian Federal and State civil security forces to maintain law and order effectively and to provide increased security against subversion.

B. 1. Conditions which will exist when above purpose is achieved.

2. Evidence to date of progress toward these conditions.

Federal, State, Territory and Federal District police departments:

(1) Directed and manned by personnel trained and committed to the concept of police service to and protection of the person, property and civil rights of the citizen.

(2) Directed and manned by personnel trained in the technical and professional skills of police responsibility.

(3) Adequately provided with supplies and equipment required to meet their responsibility.

(4) Organized and supported on a continuing, institutionalized basis to provide for perpetuation of 1, 2, and 3 above.

The project has provided direct technical advice, assistance, training and commodity support on a limited basis to the Federal Police Department, the Federal District Police Department and to the police departments of 15 states. Although this support has varied from State to State in length of time provided and in quantity of inputs the purpose as stated above, and the philosophic concept of police as Government instrument of service to and protection of the citizen have been project constants. In addition, approximately 715 public safety personnel received participant training over an 11 year period in the U.S. where they have been purposefully taught in the classroom and exposed on observation trips to U.S. law enforcement and related activities to the concept of service to and protection of the citizen. Many of the GOB public safety personnel who have received project training, advice, and assistance in country and/or in the U.S., today occupy career-elevated positions in which they have a current capability or future potential to influence police policies, programs as project intended.

V. PROGRAMMING GOAL

A. Statement of Programming Goal

To support the improvement of GOB public safety services as a key factor in the growth of a climate of political stability and social serenity in which economic development can be achieved.

B. Will the achievement of the project purpose make a significant contribution to the programming goal, given the magnitude of the national problem? Cite evidence.

Since an effective public safety service is a very important factor in the maintenance of social tranquility which facilitates social development and since it has been established historically that political and social stability are "sine qua non" conditions for the achievement of a country's economic development and integration, it can be stated that attainment of the project purpose will contribute significantly to the programming goal. Evidence of this is given by the economic progress achieved by Brazil over the past two years and may be assessed as at least in part made possible by the ability of the Government to prevent dissident elements from seriously impeding GOB policies and programs for economic and social development.
