Pursuant to the authority contained in the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, the Government of the United States acting through the Agency for International Development (hereinafter referred to as "A.I.D." or "Grantor") hereby provides to Medecins Sans Frontieres/France (hereinafter referred to as "MSF/F" or "Grantee") the sum of Two Hundred Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$211,000.00) to assist the victims of flooding and landslides by providing a six-person expatriate staff, materials for shelter and water purification/sanitation, and basic medical equipment to re-establish destroyed health structures as more fully described in Attachment 1 of the Grant entitled "Schedule" and the Grantee's application entitled "Emergency Assistance Program towards the victims of the floods and landslides in Nepal" dated July 24, 1993, which is incorporated herein by reference.

This Grant is effective and obligation is made as of the date of this cover letter and shall apply to commitments and expenditures made and/or incurred by the Grantee in furtherance of the program objectives during the period July 25, 1993 through August 31, 1993.

This Grant is made to the Grantee on condition that the funds will be administered in accordance with the terms and conditions as set forth in Attachment 1, the Schedule; Attachment 2, Mandatory Standard Provisions for Grants with Non-U.S., Non-governmental Grantees; Attachment 3, Additional Standard Provisions for Non-U.S., Non-governmental Grantees; and the Grantee's application, cited above, which have been agreed to by your organization.

The total estimated amount of A.I.D. support is \$211,000.00, which is hereby obligated. A.I.D. shall not be liable for reimbursing the Grantee for any costs in excess of the obligated amount.



SCHEDULE

A. Background

A very significant Monsoon has led to many floods and landslides in wide areas of Nepal. As a result, an estimated 1,000 people have perished, nearly 1,000 are listed as missing, 100,000 are considered badly affected, and thousands are homeless. GON estimates that as many as 500,000 persons have been affected in all areas hit by the floods and landslides. Bridges, roads, and railroad lines have been inundated or washed away which has left Kathmandu isolated. Access to safe water and health care is very difficult in many areas. The government of Nepal is presently focusing on two main goals: 1) to provide relief to those in need; 2) to work quickly to reopen the road that links Kathmandu to the south.

Stock levels in the affected areas for food, clean drinking water, fuel, and medical supplies are virtually exhausted. The Kulekhani Hydropower Plant, which provides electricity to the city of Kathmandu is functioning at less than 50% capacity which has left major sections of the city without power, while the remaining areas experience intermittent outages. Unfortunately, the weather forecast continues to call for more rain.

B. Purpose of Grant

1. This disaster relief project provides for Medecins Sans Frontieres/France (MSF/F) to deliver air shipments of emergency assistance supplies from Bordeaux to Kathmandu. MSF/F will fly 12 metric tons composed of disaster kits, emergency drug kits, tents, generators, water tanks, and plastic sheeting. MSF/F's intervention will reduce mortality and morbidity linked with this disaster of flooding and landslides.

2. MSF/F will:

- * assess the situation to establish the priorities and needs in terms of shelters, water and sanitation, and health problems.
- * implement shelters for homeless persons.
- * implement water supply, treat the water, and distribute the clean water (Goal: 5-10 liters of safe water per person per day.)

- * implement two dispensaries and/or help the existing structures in the re-establishment of their activities.

MSF/F will be responsible for all procurement and transportation actions related to this grant. MSF/F also will be responsible for overall monitoring and problem solving of its program. USAID Mission in Kathmandu, Nepal will provide in-country oversight for the project.

C. Period of Grant

1. The effective date of this Grant is the date of the Grant Cover Letter and the completion date is July 25, 1993.
2. As set forth in the Director of U.S. Foreign Disaster Assistance's letter dated July 25, 1993, funds obligated hereunder are available for expenditures for the period July 25, 1993 through August 31, 1993.

D. Amount of Grant and Payment

1. The total amount of this grant for the period shown in Section C.1 above is \$211,000.00.

A. Medicines purchased hereunder shall be found on the World Health Organization's Essential Medicines List and shall be purchased from either the International Dispensary Association (IDA), Amsterdam, Holland or UNICEF.

B. In accordance with Special Provision 40.1 and 40.2 of A.I.D. Handbook 15 Commodities, procurement of pharmaceuticals and related products will meet the following requirements:

Supplier or agent will with respect to such guarantee, make full and complete refund of any sum received by the supplier as A.I.D. financing for any product which is the subject of such a violation. Supplier/agent guarantees that the time of shipment, each item for which payment is claimed was in compliance with World Health Organization's Good Manufacturing Practices and Standards."

Sir,

Following our today phone calls, we are informing you that Médecins Sans frontières (Doctors Without Borders) is sending relief materials and a medical and sanitation team to Kathmandu on Saturday, July 25.

A special plane will leave Bordeaux (France) around 4.30 PM (local time) on the 25 th and will reach Kathmandu on Monday the 26 Th. around 4 PM (local time).

The 12 metric tons freight will be composed of disaster kits, emergency drugs kits, tents, generators, water tanks, plastic sheetings....

The six persons team will include one medical doctor, two nurses, one sanitation officer, one administrator and one logistic officer. The objective is to provide shelters, water and medical assistance to the relevant people. A second plane is already scheduled to land off from Bordeaux on Tuesday the 27 Th.

You will find enclosed the program of our intervention and the 253,700 USD budget (for the first plane).

We are kindly requesting OFDA for funding 211,000 USD.

Emergency assistance programme towards the victims of the floods and landslides.

Nepal. 24.07.93.

1) Introduction.

A very important Monsoon has led to many floods and landslides in Nepal (Kathmandu area). The number of victims has been increasing since the beginning of the week (around 80 deaths on Tuesday, 550 deaths and 550 missing today). These figures are incomplete (a lot of villages have not yet been reached) and unfortunately these figures might be worst.

According to the Nepalese authorities, 100 000 persons have been badly affected by this disaster. Thousands of people are now homeless and safe water access is very difficult in many affected areas.

2) Background.

Médecins Sans Frontières is a humanitarian and medical organisation specialised in health assistance towards the populations living in precarious situations.

We have been working in a lot of natural and man made disasters situations all over the world.

3) Programme.

The purpose of this emergency programme is to assist the victims of the flood with shelters, materials for water and sanitation and some basic medical equipment in order to re-establish some health cares where the health structures have been destroyed.

The global objective is to reduce mortality and morbidity linked with the floods and the landslides.

The specific objectives are:

- to assess the situation in order to establish the priorities in terms of shelters, water & sanitation and health problems.
- to implement shelters for the homeless people,
- to implement water supply, treat the water (in order to get safe water), distribute the water. The objective is to get at least between 5 and 10 liters of safe water per person and per day.
- to implement 2 dispensaries and / or help the existing structures in the re-establishment of their activities.

4) Strategy.

This work has to be done in a close collaboration with the authorities and the relief coordination committees.

Due to the emergency situation this project has to start as soon as possible. It is planed to last around 15 days.

1 nurse and 1 "sanitation" officer will arrive in Kathmandu on July 25 Th. They will contact the authorities and will get the last information about the victims and the prioritary areas. They will prepare the arrival of a plane and the rest of the team July 26 Th.

The team will make exploratory missions in order to implement the programs in the prioritary areas.

Shelters will be done with plastic sheeting. This plastic sheeting will be used as well to repair the destroyed houses or buildings.

15 000 liters water tanks will be used to store and chlorinate the water. It will be distributed to the people and individual water tanks will be given to the relevant people.

If necessary, the team will implement two autonomous medical dispensaries in order to re-establish basic health cares in the places where the health structures have been destroyed. Basic medicines and medical materials will be used. A very quick hanging over with the Nepalese health staff will be organised.

The evaluation of the teams will allow us to provide targeted materials. According to this assessment, a second freight with tents, blankets and individual water containers will be ready to land off on Tuesday.

5) Means.

Staff:

Expatriate:

- 1 medical coordinator.
- 2 Public health nurses.
- 1 administrator.
- 1 logistic officer.
- 1 sanitation officer.

National:

Drivers, translators, store-keepers... will be employed for this mission (around 10 national staff).

Medical means:

- 2 Disasters kits and 1 emergency drugs kit will be sent.
- 6 tents, generators, water tanks,..etc... will allow the implementation of 2 dispensaries.

Non medical means.

100 rolls of plastic sheeting, 5 water tanks (15 000 liters: 4 and 2 000 liters: 1).

Generators, chlorine, water pumps and logistic supplies.

Transportation.

Transportation is always a problem in case of floods and landslides. The minister of Home Affairs has allowed us to use the army transports to go in the affected areas (helicopters). Nevertheless, in order to transport the goods and the teams, cars and lorries could be rented.

Communications.

2 VHF kits will be used by the team.

3. CASUALTIES: THE GON ANNOUNCED ON JULY 25, THAT THE DEATH TOLL HAS NOW REACHED 801. 872 PERSONS ARE STILL LISTED AS MISSING WITH ANOTHER 210 INJURED. AS SEARCH AND RESCUE EFFORTS CONTINUE, THE GON EXPECTS THAT THE CASUALTIES FIGURES WILL CONTINUE TO RISE. THOSE AFFECTED IN ALL AREAS HIT BY THE FLOOD AND LANDSLIDES IS ESTIMATED BY THE GON TO BE AS HIGH AS 500,000 PERSONS. NO AMERICAN CITIZENS HAVE BEEN REPORTED AS MISSING OR INJURED.

4. GON RELIEF EFFORTS: STOCK LEVELS OF FOOD, CLEAN DRINKING WATER, FUEL AND MEDICAL SUPPLIES IN THE AFFECTED AREAS ARE REPORTED TO BE ALMOST EXHAUSTED. THE NEPALESE POLICE HAVE SET-UP A NATURAL DISASTER CELL AT POLICE HEADQUARTERS IN KATHMANDU TO HELP COORDINATE RELIEF EFFORTS. THEY HAVE ALSO ESTABLISHED REGIONAL RELIEF CENTERS IN CHITWAN, SARLAHI, RAUTAHAT, AND MAKWANPUR DISTRICTS. FIVE HUNDRED POLICE OFFICERS AND CONSTABLES HAVE BEEN ASSIGNED TO EACH RELIEF CENTER. A POLICE MEDICAL TEAM FROM KATHMANDU HAS SET-UP FIELD HOSPITALS IN PALUNG AND MAKWANPUR, AND THREE CIVILIAN MEDICAL TEAMS HAVE ALSO BEEN DISPATCHED TO THE DISASTER AREA. THE POLICE REPORTED THAT 21 POLICE STATIONS IN THE AFFECTED AREAS HAVE BEEN DESTROYED BY FLOODING.

5. INFRASTRUCTURE DAMAGE ROADS: ONLY SMALL AMOUNTS OF RAIN HAVE FALLEN IN THE LAST 24-HOURS. HOWEVER, THE WEATHER FORECAST CONTINUES TO CALL FOR MORE RAIN. KATHMANDU REMAINS ISOLATED BY ROAD AND WILL CONTINUE TO BE FOR AT LEAST ANOTHER SEVEN TO TEN DAYS. A DAMAGE ASSESSMENT BY BRITISH ARMY ENGINEERS OF THE PRITHVI HIGHWAY REVEALED THAT THREE OF THE SIX BRIDGES SUFFERED DAMAGE FROM MUD AND ROCK SLIDES ONLY. THE REMAINING THREE BRIDGES HAVE BEEN REPORTED TO BE IN WORSE CONDITION WITH A NUMBER OF BRIDGE SPANS EITHER SEVERELY DAMAGED OR WASHED AWAY BY HEAVY FLOODING. IN ADDITIONAL BAD NEWS, THE ROPE WAY, WHICH WHEN OPERATIONAL CAN BRING SUPPLIES TO KATHMANDU OVER THE MOUNTAINS FROM HETAUDA, SUFFERED THE LOSS OF FOUR OF ITS SUPPORT TOWERS. THE GON BELIEVES THAT IT WILL BE AT LEAST TWO MONTHS BEFORE THE ROPEWAY CAN BE REESTABLISHED. THE GON ANNOUNCED THAT ITS TWO PRINCIPAL OBJECTIVES ARE TO PROVIDE RELIEF TO THOSE IN NEED AND TO QUICKLY REOPEN THE ROAD THAT LINKS KATHMANDU WITH THE SOUTH.

6. THE GON ANNOUNCED THAT BEGINNING ON JULY 26, THE ARMY AND POLICE WILL BEGIN REPAIR WORK ON THE SOUTHERN ROUTE TO KATHMANDU. IN ALL, OVER A THOUSAND SOLDIERS AND POLICEMEN WILL BE INVOLVED IN THE EFFORT TO CLEAR THE HIGHWAY AND MAKE THE BRIDGES PASSABLE AGAIN. THE POLICE HAVE TOLD US THAT A TOTAL OF 42 BRIDGES THROUGHOUT NEPAL HAVE BEEN DAMAGED BY FLOODING AND HEAVY RAINS.

7. THE PRIME MINISTER IN A MEETING ON JULY 25 WITH THE BRITISH AMBASSADOR AND CHARGE' MALINOWSKI, REQUESTED U.S. AND U.K. ASSISTANCE IN OPENING THE HIGHWAY BETWEEN KATHMANDU AND MUGLING. (NOTE: DAO IS PROVIDING THE SPECIFICS OF THIS REQUEST VIA DAO CHANNELS AND CHARGE'S FORMAL REQUEST AND JUSTIFICATION FOR U.S. ASSISTANCE WILL BE SENT

8. INFRASTRUCTURE DAMAGE KULEKHANI HYDROPOWER PLANT: THE CITY OF KATHMANDU IS NOW BEGINNING TO EXPERIENCE MORE FREQUENT OUTAGES OF POWER. IN AN EFFORT TO CONSERVE ENERGY, THE GON ANNOUNCED ADDITIONAL HOURS FOR LOAD SHEDDING. THE NIGHT OF JULY 24, MAJOR SECTIONS OF KATHMANDU WERE WITHOUT POWER FOR FOUR OR MORE HOURS.

9. CROP DAMAGE: NO ADDITIONAL DAMAGE ESTIMATES ARE AVAILABLE FROM THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE THAN WHAT WAS REPORTED IN REFTEL (D) ON JULY 24.

10. KATHMANDU'S ISOLATION - SUPPLIES: IN HIS MEETING WITH THE CHARGE AND THE BRITISH AMBASSADOR, PRIME MINISTER KOIRALA STRESSED THAT AFTER DELIVERING IMMEDIATE AID TO THOSE AFFECTED BY THE FLOOD THE GOVERNMENT'S TOP PRIORITY WAS TO REOPEN SUPPLY ROUTES TO KATHMANDU. HE ASKED THAT THE U.S. AND THE U.K. WORK TOGETHER TO PROVIDE BAILEY BRIDGING MATERIAL TO HELP RESTORE THE PRITHVI HIGHWAY, THE MAJOR HIGHWAY LINKING KATHMANDU TO THE WEST.

11. KOIRALA'S MINISTER FOR SUPPLY NOTED A CRITICAL NEED FOR KEROSENE, OF WHICH THERE WAS ONLY A 12 DAY SUPPLY IN THE VALLEY. DIESEL, GASOLINE, AND AVIATION FUEL WERE IN BETTER SHAPE. A LARGE SUPPLY OF KEROSENE WAS IN THE GOVERNMENT'S DEPOT AT THE BORDER TOWN OF BIRGUNJ, BUT THE ROAD SITUATION PRECLUDED ITS DELIVERY TO KATHMANDU.

12. SURVEYS OF KATHMANDU'S MARKETS ON JULY 25, REVEALED THAT FRESH FRUIT AND VEGETABLES WERE AVAILABLE, HOWEVER, PRICES CONTINUE TO CLIMB AND STOCKS CONTINUE TO DWINDLE. THE GON ANNOUNCED ON JULY 25, THE RATIONING OF PETROL, DIESEL AND KEROSENE WOULD BEGIN ON MONDAY, JULY 26. THE BREAKDOWN FOR RATIONING IS AS FOLLOWS:

JULY 25 DONOR GROUP MEETING

13. NEW DEVELOPMENTS: AT THE DONOR GROUP MEETING JULY 25 IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE GON WAS IMPROVING ITS COMPILATION OF INFORMATION REGARDING THE EXTENT OF THE DISASTER. THE GON'S DISASTER COMMITTEE, HOWEVER, WAS NOT ABLE TO PRESENT THE PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT OF NEEDS THAT ALL OF THE DONORS AWAIT. UN REPRESENTATIVES TO THE GON COMMITTEE INDICATED THAT THE NEEDS ASSESSMENT WAS EXPECTED TO BE PRODUCED JULY 26.

UNICEF AND THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH HAD MADE MAJOR PROGRESS IDENTIFYING THE MEDICINES AND HEALTH RELATED MATERIAL THAT WOULD BE NEEDED AND WAS TRYING TO PUT

TOGETHER KITS TO SERVICE GROUPS OF 5,000 PEOPLE. ON FOOD, THE COMMITTEE WAS DETERMINING THE NUMBER OF THOSE IN NEED, AND THE PERCENTAGE OF THOSE UNDER THE AGE OF ONE AND UNDER THE AGE OF FIVE. GROUPS ALSO WERE WORKING HARD ON DRINKING WATER AND ON SHELTER. A UN TEAM WAS TO TRAVEL TO SIMRA JULY 26 TO BEGIN LIAISON WITH THE GON EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE UNIT THAT HAD BEEN ESTABLISHED THERE IN

MEDECINS SANS FRONTIERES REQUEST: THE EMBASSY RECEIVED A FAX MESSAGE (COPIES ALSO SENT TO USAID OFDA IN WASHINGTON) FROM MEDECINS SANS FRONTIERES (MSF) FOR USG SUPPORT OF AIR SHIPMENTS OF EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE SUPPLIES FROM BORDEAUX TO KATHMANDU. MSF IS FLYING 12 METRIC TONS COMPOSED OF DISASTER KITS, EMERGENCY DRUG KITS, TENTS, GENERATORS, WATER TANKS, AND PLASTIC SHEETING. THE AIRCRAFT DEPARTED FRANCE JULY 25 AND REPORTEDLY IS SCHEDULED TO ARRIVE IN KATHMANDU AT 1630 HOURS JULY 26. MSG HOPES TO SEND ANOTHER AIRCRAFT ON JULY 27. MSF REPORTS THAT THE FIRST AIRCRAFT WILL BE AT THE EXPENSE OF U.S. DOLLARS 253,700 AND MSF IS SEEKING OFDA FUNDING IN THE AMOUNT OF U.S. DOLLARS 211,000.

16. (1) THE USG'S FAVORABLE RESPONSE TO THE DISPATCH OF A C-141 WITH EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE SUPPLIES FROM OKINAWA REQUESTED REFTEL D. THIS MATERIAL COULD BE TURNED OVER TO THE RED CROSS FOR RAPID DISTRIBUTION. (2) FAVORABLE RESPONSE TO THE REQUEST FROM PRIME MINISTER KOIRALA FOR THE U.S. TO WORK WITH THE BRITISH TO PROVIDE BRIDGING EQUIPMENT TO NEPAL. (3) USAID OFDA TO CONSIDER THE REQUEST FOR FUNDING BY MEDECINS SANS FRONTIERES.

17. THE GON AND THE DONOR COMMUNITY CONTINUE TO IMPROVE AND TO DEVELOP PROCEDURES TO DEAL WITH THE DISASTER. WE BELIEVE THAT THERE IS A PROPER ROLE FOR THE USG TO ASSIST IN IMMEDIATE RELIEF EFFORTS TO HELP THOSE DIRECTLY AFFECTED BY THE FLOODS AND LANDSLIDES. WE ALSO BELIEVE THAT WE SHOULD PLAY A ROLE WITH THE BRITISH IN REOPENING THE LAND ROUTE TO KATHMANDU VALLEY.

Kelly:

Today's Kathmandu Post reported that three people were killed and many more injured in clashes with the police on Monday. Most of the reported clashes took place in the Terai area. However, this information has not been confirmed and the Embassy is working on getting more detailed information. Kathmandu has had some problems but nothing quite as serious. The situation cable sent out by the Embassy which covers the weekend and Monday is KATHMANDU 4033 (Confidential). You might like to read it to get a better picture of what's happening. I have not had a chance to see it since we still can't get across town to the Embassy.

The rains continue (heavy at times) and have already created some problems. Three major bridges have been damaged and closed to traffic. Two are on the new road between here and Mugling, the ones at Malekhu and Balekhu. The third is at Bhainse near Hetauda. Consequently, all access into Kathmandu from Calcutta and Birgunj have been cut off. I talked to Vinod Shah, our transportation contractor, and asked him to try to find out how long the bridges will be closed. I have also contacted Sunder Gurung, our man in Birgunj, and asked him to check on the bridge situation.

If the bridges are closed for a long period, there will be a fuel shortage, as well as of other consumer items, in Kathmandu. I've discussed this with Mark Jacobs, the new Embassy Admin Officer, and he and I will work up a plan to ration gas and diesel should the need arise. Mike Malinowski is also aware of this.

The last bit of bad news is that the communist group is calling for the transportation strike to continue for the rest of the week. I'll know more tomorrow.

PER CHIEF OF MISSION'S DISASTER DECLARATION, AID/FHA/OFDA IS ESTABLISHING AN ADMINISTRATIVE RESERVATION OF DOLS 25,000, TO BE USED FOR THE PROVISION OF RELIEF TO THE VICTIMS OF MONSOON FLOODING ACROSS CENTRAL AND EASTERN NEPAL. OF THE TWELVE DISTRICTS AFFECTED BY WHAT IS DESCRIBED AS THE WORST FLOODING IN TWENTY YEARS, THE WORST ARE MAKWANPUR, SARLAHI, DHADING, RAUTAHT AND TAPLEJUNG. HIGH VELOCITY FLOOD WATERS HAVE RENDERED IMPASSABLE 150KM OF ROADS AN AND EIGHT MAIN BRIDGES THAT CONNECT KATHMANDU WITH ALL PARTS OF THE COUNTRY, EFFECTIVELY MAROONING THE MOST POPULOUS URBAN CENTER. FUNDS WILL BE USED TO MEET IMMEDIATE RELIEF NEEDS OF THE DISPLACED POPULATION. USE THE FOLLOWING FUND CITATION:

THIS INFORMATION IS ALSO NEEDED TO RESPOND TO CONGRESSIONAL AND PUBLIC INQUIRIES. OFDA FURTHER ASKS THAT WHEN MISSION IS REQUESTING OUR ACTION, SUCH ACTION BE STATED IN SUMMARY PARAGRAPH CLEARLY IDENTIFIED AS QUOTE ACTION REQUESTED UNQUOTE.

3. OFDA REQUESTS USAID/EMBASSY PROVIDE DETAILS ON SPECIFIC NEEDS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. NEEDS SHOULD BE VERIFIED THROUGH CONTACTS WITH OTHER AGENCIES FAMILIAR WITH THE SITUATION. APPRECIATE YOUR CONTINUING ADVICE OF ACTIONS BY OTHER DONORS. TO FURTHER ASSIST DONOR COORDINATION, PLEASE INFO PERTINENT CABLES TO GENEVA FOR UNDR0 AND LRCS.

4. THESE FUNDS ARE TO BE USED FOR IMMEDIATE DISASTER RELIEF OR REHABILITATION, NOT FOR LONG-TERM RECONSTRUCTION. RELIEF ASSISTANCE IS THAT AID WHICH IS PROVIDED TO SAVE LIVES AND REDUCE HUMAN SUFFERING AND MAY BE PROVIDED FOR AS LONG AS THE CONDITION OF THE VICTIMS RESULTING FROM THE DISASTER REQUIRES THIS SUPPORT. OFDA WILL CONSIDER THE RELIEF PHASE ENDED NINETY DAYS AFTER A SUDDEN EVENT, UNLESS THE U.S. MISSION REQUESTS AND OFDA APPROVES A CONTINUATION OF THIS PERIOD. RELIEF ASSISTANCE FOR ONGOING DISASTERS SUCH AS DROUGHT AND CIVIL STRIFE CAN LAST MORE THAN ONE YEAR DEPENDING ON THE CIRCUMSTANCES, BUT WILL REQUIRE ANNUAL DISASTER DECLARATIONS. REHABILITATION CONSISTS OF ASSISTANCE THAT ADDRESSES THE PROBLEMS CREATED BY THE DISASTER EVENT AND IS NEEDED TO RESTORE VICTIMS AND AFFECTED COMMUNITIES TO SELF-SUFFICIENCY. RECONSTRUCTION IS ASSISTANCE WHICH REBUILDS THE STRICKEN COMMUNITY BEYOND THE CONDITION NECESSARY TO RESTORE SERVICES REQUIRED BY THE PEOPLE OR WHICH AIMS TO BRING THE COMMUNITY TO A STATE BEYOND IMMEDIATE SELF-SUFFICIENCY. THIS TYPE OF ASSISTANCE CANNOT BE FUNDED FROM THE DISASTER ASSISTANCE APPROPRIATION, AND IS SUBJECT

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TO THE STANDARD A.I.D. PROGRAMMING PROCEDURES FOR DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE AND ESF.

5. THESE FUNDS MAY BE USED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT, A PRIVATE VOLUNTARY AGENCY, OR THE U.S. MISSION FOR LOCAL PURCHASE AND OR OTHER RELIEF ACTIVITIES. PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT ANY ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE BEYOND THIS INITIAL 25,000 DOLLARS REQUIRES PRIOR APPROVAL FROM AID/OFDA PER AID HANDBOOK 8, FOREIGN DISASTER ASSISTANCE (2 FAM 060).
