1. INTRODUCTION

A resurgence of guerrilla major attacks on strategic towns surrounding the capital cities and main roads marked the past quarter.

Over 200 rebels attacked Caxito, a town of 50,000 people 60 km north of the capital Luanda, on May 4. About a 100 people including soldiers, police officers and civilians, were killed. Aid workers from the United States, Canada, France, the Netherlands, Brazil and Hungary were very traumatized after being interrogated by rebel soldiers.. Sixty children and one of the teachers were abducted from the Children's Town, a children's home run by ADPP about 10km outside Caxito. After increasing pressure by the civil society and international bodies, the children were released after being forced to march about 80 km.

In the same week, the rebels staged another attack 13 km from the town of Uije and a few days later, they attacked the outskirts of the provincial capital. Our staff had to be evacuated twice from the project areas and OCHA restricted humanitarian workers presence to essential personnel only for the time being.

A week later, also in the northern Angola, Golungo Alto, a city of 15,000 inhabitants was attacked and eleven humanitarian workers from World Vision, MSF-Belgium and AMI went missing for over a week while trekking 50 km to the provincial capital.

On the other hand, as the government forces liberate new rebel areas, entire populations suffering staggering rates of malnutrition are being reached by humanitarian workers in the central highlands. In Bie Province, six children are dying per day and adults are in critical condition. Overall the humanitarian situation is deteriorating in Bie, Uige, Moxico, Malange and Kuando Kubango. Most of the humanitarian relief supplies continue to be delivered by air.

Ibrahim A. Gambari, USG and Special Advisor on Africa lead a UN delegation to Angola from May 06-10. The objectives of the mission were to

- a) discuss with the GOA and with other parties the way forward in helping to bring the war to an end.
- b) assess the humanitarian situation.

2. Highlights of IACYF Project

2.1. Assistance to ADPP's workers and abducted children

Following the attack on ADPP school in Caxito, the CCF team was requested to assist aidworkers and teachers. The accounts by the survivors described the abduction of the younger children (most ageing 10 to 13 years old), the murder of one of the children, the looting of the facility, and the murder of one of the teachers in a barbaric fashion.

A workshop followed by de-briefing sessions three times a week was organised to support the surviving victims. Teachers have been trained in simple techniques to help the children to cope with the situation. For the children, after their release on May 26, special de-briefing sessions using puppet shows and theater were organized and are expected to continue in the next quarter.

3. Follow up on the development program interventions

Program activities are summarized as follows:

Training

11 training seminars were organised with a total of 241 participating adults.

19 training seminars were organised for a total of 386 adolescents.

Income Generation

A total of thirty adolescents in Huila and Benguela are in their third cycle of loans. Some of them are struggling against inflation to reimburse their loans, but the majority are ready to apply for the third loan. Although it is still too soon to evaluate the economic impact of the program, the adolescents report changes in their attitudes and behaviour. All of the adolescents who benefited from loans participated in workshops and solidarity groups meetings dealing with "Psycho-Social Reintegration" and "Beginning a Business". All of the participants refer to feeling "better in themselves" or "as good as other people" because they have been able to buy clothes and some of them bought radios to listen to music and the news. They describe

- feeling more confident in being able to pay back their loans;
- having the confidence to save money to buy something they need;
- being willing to keep rules;
- being willing to work in a group.

Professional Training

Fourteen tailors from the displaced camps in Huambo and Bie provinces attended a training seminar on teaching methodology. Although very skilled in their professions, they lack the

skills to plan training and coach the trainees through the acquisition of new skills.

Community Projects

The playground of Sao Pedro da Barra neighborhood in Luanda was completed and inaugurated. Huila completed the soccer field in the neighborhood of Lalula. In Benguela, two playgrounds started their construction works in Kassanji and Mina. All planned playgrounds will be completed by August 2001.

3.1.Assistance to IDP children

Bié Province: the playground of the displaced camp of Cuemba was completed, and two week-long training seminars held for 53 IDP adults in both Cuemba and Chicala camps with the participation of the traditional authorities.

Luanda Province: a training seminar was held for 25 adults living in Bie/Huambo displaced camp. A special training seminar was held for teachers and social workers of the Centro Horizonte Azul at the request of World Learning, an American NGO. The Center assists girls that were street children. Many of the girls have experienced particularly traumatizing events in the street.

Huambo Province: the training of IDP adults in Casseque III camp continued with two new seminars and dialogue sessions on hygiene and conflict resolution. The literacy training for adolescents program was visited by the Provincial Governor who praised the CCF consistent support for literacy efforts while other NGOs had ceased to support literacy. The participants in CCF sponsored literacy programs continue to graduate to normal schooling.

4.ACTIVITIES STATUS: REVIEW OF MARCH/2001- MAY/2001

4.1.CCF Angola Strategic Planning

Our first strategic planning session was on May 2-4, when Luanda's staff gathered to discuss our past and present status. In the following week, May 7-11, Daniel Wordsworth, Jill Coleman, Dola Mohapatra, Adolfo Peters and Mike Wessells joined the team to discuss CCF Angola future and its transition from a Grant's to National Office. The major challenges will be to set a new organizational structure that services efficiently both sponsorship programs and grant project implementation.

4.2.Re-evaluation of the current project implementation status in the provinces of Uíge and Moxico

During this quarter the CCF team reviewed the project implementation in Moxico and Uige. Since the second half of the year 2000, it has not been possible for the Uige field team to

operate normally because of security constraints. In Moxico, the security situation was less tense but the access to Moxico was severely constrained and the local authorities obstructed rather than facilitated project implementation. The decision has been taken to phase out the field operations in these two provinces. The Uige office will be closed in June and the Moxico office in July.

4.3. Budget revision and no-cost extension to December 2001

A revised budget was presented for the year 2001 and subsequently approved. Training and CCF field activities will terminate in August 2001. During the months of September and October, activities and installations where appropriate will be handed over to the community or to other NGOs who continue to operate in these places.

5. OTHER ACTIVITIES

5.1. Study on "witch children"

CCF Angola was invited by Save the Children Norway to participate in the design of a study to look at a new phenomenon in Angolan society, the "witch children". In a context of an increasing number of small religious sects, very young children are being accused of being witches and being in communication with witches. The "witch" children are held responsible for family problems, social and economic. They are also accused of causing disease and death within the family or to neighbours.. "Exorcism" sessions include severe beating and torture of the children and there are reports of child deaths. A significant number of children are already in state care. There is no clear understanding what the basis of the practice is and to what extent the religious sects are a causal factor or are simply using an existing phenomenon to increase their control over the populations.

5.2. "Dialogues in the Jango" Project

African Humanitarian Action - AHA invited CCF to participate in a research project on displaced women and adolescents. The project aims to learn about the impact of displacement on this group and find out the coping and survival mechanisms used by them in the current situation. Other partners in the project are the Ministry for the Family and Women's Promotion, UNICEF, Development Workshop and UNHCR.


