EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This quarterly progress report covers the activities and achievements of the USAID-funded Civil Society and Democracy Strengthening (CSDS) project from October 1, 2006 through December 31, 2006. During the reporting period, CSDS managed a semi-final round of grants to Palestinian civil society organizations (CSOs), embarked on a major assessment, and initiated project close-out activities. We also continued discussions with USAID about the possibility of a no-cost extension to March 31, 2007.

CSDS issued a modest portfolio of grants at the end of the third and beginning of the fourth quarters, returning the project to its primary role in supporting democracy and governance initiatives in Palestinian civil society through grant-making. We designed the two simplified grants and 11 fixed-obligation grants (FOGs) to achieve tangible results in the limited timeframe. We also tailored the grants to address challenges raised during meetings with CSO partners and USAID, as well as current security, political, economic, and regulatory constraints. In total, we issued 13 grants valued at \$341,848, bringing the total value of grants issued over the life of the project to \$17.058 million.

The entire team helped manage and oversee the grants during the quarter, working closely with our CSO partners. Most grantee activities were completed before the end of the year, with final conferences, reports, and grant close-out slated for completion in January 2007. If USAID accepts CSDS's current proposal to extend the project's end-date and realign the budget (submitted in December 2006), we will issue a final round of four to five grants in January.

The 13 grants managed by the project during the fourth quarter achieved significant results, especially considering the short implementation period and limited budgets. For example, Al-Mawrid Teacher Development Center successfully encouraged the UNRWA education department to mandate student parliament elections in all of its junior high schools in the West Bank. For the elections and to manage the student parliaments, UNRWA also accepted manuals developed by Al-Mawrid. With these achievements, Al-Mawrid fully achieved the main objective of the grant, institutionalizing student parliament elections in UNRWA schools.

In the Gaza Strip, a coalition of five CSOs conducted democracy and governance after-school programs for children (aged 12 to 15) in underserved areas. In total, more than 900 children participated in the program, more than half of them girls. The program incorporated rule of law modules developed by the USAID-funded Arkan project. CSO partners also facilitated student-parent dialogue sessions and allowed children the opportunity to express themselves in peaceful, democratic ways. CSDS team members and CSO partners reported that this program provided valuable opportunities for the youths, both girls and boys, to experience different, more democratic ways of interacting; discuss issues freely; and build an awareness of peaceful, law-abiding ways of resolving disputes in an environment where violent conflict and militaristic rhetoric is spinning out of control.

We have included more information on all 13 grants later in this report (see Section I). In addition to grant-making, CSDS launched a study of the role of civil society in increasing civil peace and helping strengthen formal systems of justice and rule of law. Dr. Glenn Robinson, a noted academic and expert in Middle East politics, conducted the study, in

partnership with two highly qualified Palestinian consultants engaged through the USAID-funded Arkan project. We will present the results of the study to USAID during February 2007. We also continued to evaluate the project's overall impact and draft a final report.

In parallel to restarting the grants program, CSDS restarted compliance spot checks. We conducted spot checks on all current grantees during the quarter, verifying that proper procedures are in place and recommending corrective actions. We will follow up with some grantees prior to the issuance of final tranche payments in January to verify compliance with US Government and USAID rules and regulations, as well as with the project's rigorous grants manuals. Also related to compliance, external firms subcontracted by CSDS worked to finalize seven audits of previous grants. We are pleased to report that neither the spot checks nor the audits have uncovered any serious indications of impropriety on the part of grantee-CSOs, although we are working with partners to resolve a wide range of minor issues.

The current budget realignment and no-cost extension request pending with USAID for approval recommend a project end-date of March 31 to maximize available resources for the benefit of Palestinian civil society. In the coming quarter, we will step up close-out efforts and resize our staff to prepare for the end of the project and change in workflow. At the same time, we expect to issue a small round of grants, present the findings of the civil peace study, complete and deliver a final report, and conduct a final conference.

SECTION I

Technical Achievements

A. CSDS Issues Grants, Starts Civil Peace Study, and Drafts Final Report

For the first time since the January 2006 elections, CSDS issued a modest portfolio of grants at the end of the third quarter and beginning of the fourth quarter, returning USAID and the project to its role in supporting democracy and governance initiatives in Palestinian civil society. The two simplified grants and 11 fixed-obligation grants (FOGs) were designed to achieve tangible results in the limited

timeframe remaining in the life of the project. We also tailored the grants to address challenges raised during meetings with CSO partners, as well as the current security, political, economic, and regulatory constraints. In total, the round of grant was valued at \$341,848, bringing the total value of grants issued by the CSDS project to \$17.058 million.

In addition to grant-making, CSDS, in partnership with the USAID-funded Arkan project, launched a study of the role of civil society in increasing civil peace and helping strengthen formal systems of justice and rule of law. We will present the results of the study to USAID during February 2007. We also continued to evaluate the project's overall impact and draft a final report.

This section of our quarterly report summarizes the project's technical activities during the reporting period in line with the extension proposal and budget realignment request currently pending USAID approval (submitted during December 2006). The next section summarizes our financial and administrative achievements.

B. Task 1: Supporting Civil Society Reform Initiatives Through Grant-Making

After intensive discussions with USAID and receiving final approval, CSDS issued a round of 13 grants valued at \$341,848 in the last week of the third quarter and first week of the fourth quarter. Partner CSOs completed most of the technical activities related to these grants during fourth quarter. We will complete final close-out procedures during January 2007. As discuss below, it is possible that CSDS will issue four to five more grants in January to account for the remaining funds in the proposed budget realignment request submitted to USAID during December.

The two simplified grants were:

- Al-Mawrid Teacher Development Center. Al-Mawrid worked with UNRWA schools and the UNRWA administration to help institutionalize student parliament (council) elections in UNRWA junior high schools in the West Bank, continuing an effort started under CSDS grants in 2004-2005. Al-Mawrid produced teacher and student manuals for student parliament elections, receiving input from teachers, principals, and education administrators throughout the West Bank. They also drafted a bylaw to

mandate yearly student parliament elections in all of UNRWA's junior high schools in the West Bank.

At the end of the project, UNRWA said it would mandate annual student parliament elections in all junior high schools, achieving the main objective of the project. To support this process, it will use manuals and other materials prepared by Al-Mawrid under this CSDS grant. As a result of the success of this project, UNRWA has asked Al-Mawrid for assistance in developing a five-year strategy to combat violence between students in schools. Pending USAID approval and available funds, CSDS may assist Al-Mawrid in this endeavor.

Beyond the project, Al-Mawrid recommends that UNRWA fully implement the manuals it developed for student parliament elections and establish student parliaments on the district and, perhaps, national levels. They also recommend further developing the enabling environment for student parliaments, which involves more work with teachers, administrators, students, the local community, and council members themselves. Finally, they recommend that the project be extended to public and private schools in Palestine.

- Palestinian Center for Democracy and Conflict Resolution/Gaza (PCDCR). The PCDCR developed a coalition of organizations, training their volunteers to develop and lead a campaign to reduce gender-based violence in the Gaza Strip. The participants received training in how to conduct a public campaign and advocacy efforts, then, with support from the CSO, launched advocacy efforts. The campaign included posters and signs, which were placed throughout the Gaza Strip, a song that was played on the radio, and public meetings on gender-based violence. We expect to receive a final report on the project in January, after conclusion of the final conference.

The simplified grants were originally developed before the January 2006 elections and, with nine other grant proposals, provisionally approved by the CSDS grants committee in February. Subsequently, USAID placed CSDS's grant-making activities on hold pending a review of the US Government's assistance policy to the Palestinian people. When technical activities resumed in September, USAID and CSDS determined that the PCDCR and Al-Mawrid grants were the only ones in this group that were valuable and viable in the current implementation environment.

In addition to issuing the simplified grants, CSDS also issued 11 FOGs as part of resuming grant-making activities. With CSO partners, we developed these grants during August and September, based on a series of meetings and concept papers submitted by prospective grantees earlier in the year. Again, we looked carefully at the implementation environment, political considerations, and the needs of civil society when selecting and developing these grants. The grants that emerged focused on building grassroots support for moderate, democratic organizations, as well as on delivering needed services in the hard-hit Gaza Strip.

The 11 FOGs were:

- A four-grantee initiative in the West Bank to jointly increase the capacity, visibility, and level of coordination between grassroots women's organizations and

cooperatives. Al Hares for Media and Studies (Bethlehem area), Bani Naim Charitable Society (Hebron area), Juhoud for Community and Rural Development (north Ramallah and Tulkarem areas), and Ta'oun for Conflict Resolution (Nablus area) participated in the program, coordinating activities and sharing experiences throughout.

The program consisted of three phases. In the first phase, partner CSOs each identified and selected six grassroots women's organizations to work with during the project (two clusters of three organizations). Each of the CSOs then signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with their grassroots partners, formed a steering committee, and jointly identified participants for the next phase of the program. In the second phase, women nominated by the grassroots partners conducted joint needs assessments in targeted villages, presented the plan to the ad hoc coalition and selected members of the local communities, and started to build a strategy for addressing these needs. Partner CSOs provided training in needs assessment and strategic planning, as well as individualized technical assistance for program participants. Finally, each group presented their strategic plans to local CSOs and community members.

Despite the relatively short implementation period and limited budgets, partner CSOs successfully implemented the projects. They report that their efforts empowered members of women's grassroots organizations by providing them with advocacy, communication, planning, and management skills. The program also served to reactivate a few nascent grassroots organizations, and helped all of the organizations to increase their level of cooperation and coordination. Longer grants would have allowed the coalitions to establish more durable, long-term relationships and to conduct some of the activities outlined in the strategic plans. We hope that the CSOs will be able to identify alternative funding sources to continue these efforts. To this end, we will help the four partners to organize a presentation for donors and donor-funded projects during the first quarter of 2007.

- With Our Rights, a Gaza-based CSO that recently opened an office in the West Bank, CSDS implemented a pilot project designed to create a network of youths concerned with democracy and governance at the village level. Our Rights recruited and trained youth network members in three villages north of Ramallah. As part of these efforts, it developed a toolkit and poster to promote the network, as well as training materials in advocacy, network building, and social activism. At the conclusion of the program, participants in each of the three networks identified and started to conduct voluntary activities in their villages, most of which will be conducted after the end of the CSDS grant.

An external evaluator noted the very high level of enthusiasm among program participants, especially young women. Women proved very motivated to participate in both educational and voluntary activities, if they are provided with opportunities to do so. Recruiting young men into the network proved more difficult. On the whole, local community leaders praised the work of the youth volunteers and showed their willingness to provide in-kind contributions for small, community improvement projects.

The external evaluator recommended that Our Rights help the newly formed groups conduct more activities, as a way of making them more sustainable and durable. As part of these efforts, the evaluators suggested that Our Rights consider developing a news bulletin where members can discuss issues of interest and share ideas, use the media to promote the network, and help the networks organize cultural, sporting, and other events for village youths. The external advisor also recommended that Our Rights seek way to involve more young men in the program. The CSO is currently seeking additional funding for these and other activities to strengthen and expand its nascent youth network

- With CSDS funding and technical assistance from the USAID-funded Bayan project, Ramallah-based CSO Filastiniyat developed an index to assess the effectiveness of the Palestinian Legislative Council. It developed the index with input from experts and academics nominated by CSOs in the West Bank and Gaza Strip. The index can be used as a tool for civil society to monitor PLC performance, as well as to recommend and advocate for improvements in the legislative process.

The index has 52 questions covering the legal structure governing the legislature, level of transparency, effectiveness of committees, work of members, participation of civil society in the decision-making process, and other topics. The index also includes a weighting and scoring system developed by a professional statistician.

Filastiniyat concluded the short project with two conferences—one in the West Bank and the other in the Gaza Strip—to introduce the index to the CSO community. In the future, it plans to seek additional funding to implement the index for the current PLC. But, at this point, it is very difficult, if not impossible, to evaluate the legislative body’s performance because of political and other factors. Filastiniyat would also like to adapt the index for use in neighboring Arab countries.

- In the Gaza Strip, five CSOs conducted democracy and governance after-school programs. The CSOs developed and implemented the grants in partnership, conducting a joint final conference in December. In total, the program reached approximately 940 children, aged 12 to 15, in underserved locations throughout the Gaza Strip. The USAID-funded Arkan project provided training to the CSO facilitators on a new rule of law (ROL) program that they developed for junior high school children. The facilitators then piloted the modules as part of the CSDS-funded after-school programs. More information and success stories on the rule of law portion of the program are included in the Arkan quarterly progress report.

Feedback on the program from children, parents, and CSO program managers, leaders, and facilitators was very positive. During the final conference and in other meetings, CSO leaders said that the program was very successful in developing a basic understanding of major democracy and governance concepts among children, including concepts like rule of law, free expression, respect for the opinions of others, etc. The program also increased dialogue between parents and children, and anecdotal evidence suggests that it changed some behaviors and relationships in the homes of participating students.

Beyond the impact on the children, participating CSOs developed simple databases of the children and their parents for use in future democracy and governance efforts. Finally, CSDS team members and CSO leaders report that the experience strengthened networking between the five participating CSOs and established common ground that can be used for future cooperation.

If repeated, CSDS recommends that the length of the democracy and governance after-school programs be increased to six months or more, perhaps with a summer camp. Other donors and projects should also consider launching a nation-wide effort using a large coalition of CSOs in both the West Bank and Gaza Strip. Such a program could achieve a national impact and generate a great deal of discussion around major democracy and governance concepts.

All of the grants discussed above will be closed in January 2007 as originally planned. Beyond these grants, the current budget realignment request includes sufficient funds to issue approximately \$105,000 in additional grants to Palestinian CSOs in the first quarter of 2007. CSDS will work closely with USAID to identify, develop, and award these grants.

C. Task 2: Analyzing Civil Society Support and Impact

CSDS is conducting one large analytical study during its no-cost extension period. By mutual agreement with the project's cognizant technical officer (CTO), four smaller studies originally proposed in the budget realignment of November 2005 were eliminated in the budget realignment request submitted in December 2006 to allow for a more effective project close-out and maximize funds available for sub-grants.

USAID and CSDS agreed to focus the large study on investigating the roles of civil society in building civil peace in the Palestinian territories and strengthening formal systems of justice and law and order. During the fourth quarter, we recruited a consultant and executed the field portion of the study. A draft report is due in January 2007, with a presentation of the findings and final report due in February. With USAID approval, CSDS and the USAID-funded Arkan project are cooperating on the study, combining resources to maximize the quality and impact.

Working under CSDS, Dr. Glenn Robinson leads the assessment team. He is currently on the faculty of the Naval Post Graduate School in Monterey, California and has written extensively on issues related to democratization and social movements in the Middle East, including his dissertation thesis, a major academic book, and several articles focusing on the Palestinian territories. Dr. Robinson is supported by two highly qualified Palestinian

consultants: Walid Salem, director of the Jerusalem office of the Panorama Center for the Dissemination of Democracy and Community Development and a noted independent academic; and, Firas Melhem, professor of Law at Birzeit University. Dr. Melhem is an expert on the relationship between formal and clan-based forms of dispute resolution and justice, the topic of his Ph.D. dissertation and several academic articles. Mr. Salem is an expert in Palestinian civil society and issues related to democracy and conflict resolution, subjects on which he is the author of several books and numerous articles. Mr. Salem and Dr. Melhem are engaged by USAID through the Arkan project.

During Dr. Robinson's field visit, CSDS and Arkan conducted four workshops for CSO leaders, lawyers, and representatives of rule of law and human rights CSOs and law schools. A total of 23 external participants attended the Ramallah workshop, 10 the Nablus workshop, 11 the Bethlehem workshop, and 32 the workshop in Gaza City, which was held in the midst of a major flare up in internal violence.

In addition to the workshops, Dr. Robinson conducted one-on-one meetings with wide range of civil society leaders and academics, including Dr. Hisham Awartani, Abdel Rahman Abu Arafah, Mohsen Abu Ramadan, Iyad Krunz, Dr. Farid Al-Jalad, Dr. Khalil Shakaki, and Dr. Liza Traki. He also met with a senior leader of a "*sulha* council" (traditional dispute resolution councils) and the mayor of Beit Fajjar near Bethlehem. Other interviews included the head of the USAID-funded Netham project, a senior consultant for the USAID-funded Local Democratic Reform project, and the West Bank/Gaza directors of the International Republican Institute and the National Democratic Institute. Unfortunately, vacations and the short time period for Dr. Robinson's field visit made scheduling some meetings difficult. As a result, CSDS and Arkan may conduct follow-up and/or additional interviews to supplement Dr. Robinson's work in January 2007.

A previous impact assessment of CSDS's election-related efforts from December 2004 through January 2006 was approved by USAID at the beginning of the quarter. The results are summarized in previous reports, and the full study is available upon request from CSDS.

C3. Conduct Final Conference and Produce Final Report

With USAID expected to extend the end-date of the project until March 31, 2007, CSDS is currently planning to schedule the project's final conference for the end of February or beginning of March. In partnership with USAID, we will start planning the conference in January.

Also to prepare for the end of the project, USAID approved a professional writer and editor to work with CSDS on a final report. Ghada Khouri, a senior writer/editor for Chemonics International, completed a rough draft of the report prior to the end of the quarter. Ms. Khouri has a long association with the project. She helped write the original project proposal in 1999 and has been involved in helping to edit reports and write success stories and other reports since that point. By late January, we expect to discuss the preliminary draft of the report with USAID.

To feed into the final report, CSDS conducted two evaluation sessions with CSO partners, one in the Gaza Strip and the other in the West Bank. The roundtables, part of an internal evaluation process, were designed to generate feedback on grantee lessons learned and the impact of grant initiatives. During the first quarter of 2007, we plan to follow up these

roundtable sessions with a series of one-on-one meetings and interviews with former grantees, CSO leaders, and project managers.

SECTION II

Project Management and Staffing

A. Management and Staffing

A1. Full-time Project Team

We maintained our management and staffing structure throughout the quarter but also prepared for the eventual close out of project activities. With the approval of USAID, CSDS's Gaza director worked 50 percent of his time on the project, using the other 50 percent to serve as Gaza director for the USAID-funded EMAP III project. In partnership with subcontractor CARE International, we engaged Ibrahim Sourani to replace another of our Gaza Staff members who left to the US to pursue his Ph.D. under a US Government fellowship.

At the end of January, we will begin reducing the project staff to focus on close-out activities and managing a small portfolio of grants. As proposed to USAID in the current budget realignment request, we will maintain the following positions during February and March 2007:

West Bank Office:

- Chief of party (Chemonics International)
- Senior financial officer (Massar Associates)
- Office manager (Massar Associates)
- Grant program coordinator (Massar Associates)
- Senior grant and capacity building officer, West Bank (Amideast)

Gaza Office

- Gaza office director (CARE International, 10 percent of time)
- Grant and capacity building associate (CARE International)
- Senior financial analyst (Massar Associates)
- Senior IT manager (Massar Associates, 10-20 percent of time)

In the first quarter of 2007, we will work closely with our subcontractors to ensure a smooth transition for our very valuable and highly qualified employees who will be leaving the project.

As currently planned, we will close our Gaza and Nablus offices on January 31, with the remaining Gaza staff slated to work out of the CARE International offices. Our Nablus-based staff member will work alternatively from home and travel to Ramallah, depending on work-flow. We will keep the Ramallah office open until the contract end-date, currently expected on March 31.

A2. Home-Office Support

Chemonics provided consistent back-stop support to the project throughout the reporting period led by a three-person project management unit (PMU). The CSDS PMU is led by Project Director Jennifer Stewart and Project Manager Amy Lawrence. Kristen Scott, a project associate, provides day-to-day administrative support. The home-office team was instrumental throughout the quarter in developing alternative budget scenarios for the project to account for the modified end-date, changing technical assistance priorities, and issues related to accounting for the payment and credits for value-added taxes (VAT). The team also led the recruitment and fielding of Dr. Glenn Robinson to conduct the civil peace study.

A3. Short-Term Technical Expertise

In addition to the short-term assignment conducted by Dr. Glenn Robinson for the civil peace study (see Section II.C), USAID also approved a trip by Chemonics field accountant John Shinn. Mr. Shinn's field assignment was the first of several related to project close-out. He reviewed the project's administrative and financial procedures, filing, and helped CSDS plan for project close-out, especially ensuring that all files and accounting systems are in order. Mr. Shinn will finalize an internal report and recommendations during January. In his preliminary report to project management, Mr. Shinn noted that the project has no major deficiencies.

B. Grants Management and Compliance

As described in Section I, CSDS issued 13 grants valued at approximately \$342,000 in the last week of September and first week of October. With these grants, CSDS has issued 429 grants valued at \$17.058 million over the life of the project.

To strengthen grantee compliance with USAID rules and regulations governing subgrants, CSDS' financial team, led by Osama Nabahin and Reem Kort, conducted financial and administrative spot checks to all current grantees. In cases where deficiencies were noted, they will conduct follow-up spot checks prior to the issuance of final tranche payments in January 2007.

The spot-checks in the Gaza Strip showed the high level of progress that has been made by grantee-CSOs in recent years, with very few significant findings noted, most of which are easy to correct. These results show the payoff of CSDS's intense spot-check program in the Gaza Strip, as well as the positive results of extensive one-on-one capacity building assistance provided by Mr. Nabahin.

In the West Bank, spot checks revealed some significant weaknesses in a couple of CSOs. While we have no indication of any impropriety, some CSOs systems and procedures could be improved. On some issues, we are requiring corrective action prior to the disbursement of final tranche payments. In other less serious and procedural areas (for example the lack of procedures manuals or out-dated accounting systems), we will make recommendations for improvement in the future. In the West Bank, spot-checks were led by Mr. Nabahin, with assistance from Ms. Kort.

C. Audit Program

CSDS initiated a final round of audits in accordance with its contract and US Government regulations. Audits are mandated for all CSOs that receive grants valued at more than \$100,000 during a particular calendar year. At the end of the quarter, we receive initial findings for seven audits. All audits will be finalized in the first quarter of 2007. On the whole, the preliminary reports show no major negative findings or significant disallowable costs. Nevertheless, a number of smaller issues and findings will be clarified in the coming weeks.

D. Project Communications and IT Systems

CSDS continued to maintain its IT and communications systems during the quarter. We transferred our email system to an external server and made some other changes to the internal IT infrastructure. These moves are more cost-effective and reduce risks associated with catastrophic server failure, a very real concern with the project's six-year-old IT equipment. As the system was being changed, we experienced some interruptions in service.

E. USAID Reporting

Throughout the quarter, we delivered an update on project and grantee activities at the end of the week to USAID, Chemonics, and our subcontractors. With the resumption in technical activities, the weekly once again included updates on grantee activities and future grantee events. We also continued to provide updates on current developments in Palestinian civil society. As technical activities come to a close in the first quarter of 2007 and we reduce the size of the staff, we will also reduce the scope and size of the weekly report.

USAID approved the project's quarterly progress report for the second quarter of 2006. Approval of the third quarter report, submitted as required on October 15, was pending as of writing of this report.

F. Project Closeout

The project team started implementing a detailed close-out plan during the quarter, while at the same time updating the plan to reflect a new projected end-date. On project close-out, there is increasingly close coordination between the home- and field-office teams. The field visit by John Shinn (discussed in A3) was one element of this coordination.

G. Project Retreat

CSDS conducted an all-staff retreat in the third quarter. We are currently planning a final all-staff meeting at the end of January 2007.
