PROGRAM BACKGROUND

The *Rapid Animal Feeding Aid (RAAFA)* program, implemented by ACIDI/VOCA from November 19, 2006 to April 30, 2007 in Eastern and Western Beqa'a, Lebanon, grew in response to a post-war assessment conducted under ACIDI/VOCA's separate USAID-funded economic development program in Lebanon. As such, RAAFA (meaning "compassion" in Arabic) was designed to address the real and urgent needs of vulnerable herder households impacted by the hostilities between Israel and Hezbollah which took place in Lebanon during July and August 2006.

The summer 2006 conflict resulted in devastating damage to the Lebanese economy, with particular impact on rural areas in the South and Beqa'a Valley. The Lebanese Council for Development and Reconstruction reported that the war destroyed more than 900 small and medium enterprises, and caused damage to Lebanon's civilian infrastructure estimated at close to \$2.5 billion. At the end of the war the material damage to the private sector was estimated at \$200 million, which was expected to increase dramatically over time. The summer's hostilities also drastically affected small ruminant herders in the Beqa'a Valley. Roads and access to grazing areas were blocked for over a month, making all options for animal feed inaccessible. This translated into reduced quality and quantity of milk and meat production throughout the region. Milk collection by *hallabs* (milk transporters/intermediaries) was impossible as pick-up trucks and cisterns were targets of air raids. In addition, dairy processors and meat buyers had substantially reduced demand.



The constriction of both supply and demand for small ruminant milk and meat products resulted in little or no income generation for the herders during the critical summer period, which they rely on for the bulk of their income through the rest of the year, particularly in winter months. The resultant cash shortages posed a serious threat to herders, their families, and the animal herds. Herders were forced them to forgo necessary repairs and winterization of their tents in order to use scarce funds for household food provision.

In addition, herders were unable to purchase winter feed for their herds, which need quality feed to be sustained through the late pregnancy, early lambing and the early milk season that occurs in winter and early spring. A major reduction in production would have rendered herders food insecure in the short-term and jeopardize their longer-term economic security and resilience to recover from minor setbacks in economic and food security.

PROGRAM SUMMARY, GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

ACIDI/VOCA was awarded an agreement with USAID's Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance (OFDA) on November 19, 2006 to implement the RAAFA program during an initial timeframe of four months. A no-cost extension was later granted to allow for maximum outreach and impact, and extended the program end date through April 30, 2007.

Based on the outcome of ACDI/VOCA’s assessment in the Beqa’a Valley, RAAFA was designed to respond to both the immediate human needs of remote, conflict-affected herder households for the winter as well as to help them transition to regaining their livelihoods through healthy herds. The program provided assistance in the areas of i) transitional shelter, ii) basic hygiene, and iii) livelihoods recovery, and demonstrated American goodwill in a strategic area of a troubled country. Targeted herders were conflict-affected individuals whose needs were exacerbated by their pre-existing poverty and remote location in the Beqa’a Valley.

RAAFA’s goal was to reduce vulnerability and increase livelihoods security for the most conflict-affected herder populations in the Beqa’a Valley. The objectives were to:

1. Increase access to animal feed for small ruminant herders.
2. Increase access to transitional shelter for small ruminant herder households.
3. Increase access to basic hygiene supplies for small ruminant herder households.

During the five month program period, RAAFA exceeded its original life of program targets by significant levels for all indicators, except the number of hygiene kits distributed, an indicator which was met though not exceeded. In February 2007, ACDI/VOCA received approval to expand the beneficiary pool in order to maximize outreach and impact under its award, and modified proposed targets accordingly. By program’s end, RAAFA met or exceeded most of these revised targets as well.

Below is a summary of final program achievements per indicator targets:

In total, RAAFA reached **508** small ruminant herders and their households in East and West Beqa’a with **1,362** MT of high calorie, high protein animal feed rations feeding **90,158** heads of sheep and goats. Herders also received basic shelter and hygiene materials, including **327** tarps (for **327** of 508 families), **1,399** blankets (for **252** of 508 families), and **400** hygiene kits (for **252** of 508 families). **4,582** individuals (**2,329** males, **2,243** females, **0** IDPs) benefited from the animal feed aid, **2,951** individuals benefited from tarp distributions, and **2,369** individuals benefited from both the hygiene kits and the blankets.

BENEFICIARY PROFILE AND SELECTION CRITERIA

Beneficiaries of OFDA assistance under the RAAFA program were small ruminant herders in Western and Eastern Beqa’a who suffered economic losses as result of the summer 2006

conflict. The average household size equaled 9 and the average flock size was 296 heads of sheep and goats. Losses incurred during the war by these beneficiaries came either through death of livestock and property, inaccessibility to grazing areas, or through inability to sell their products (particularly milk) during the summer season and hence inability to collect enough cash to purchase winter feed.

The following selection criteria were applied during the initial stages of distribution:

- 1) *Their main income is from small ruminant productions.*
- 2) *They have been directly or indirectly affected by the recent war in July 2006*
- 3) *Their household is a minimum of two persons*
- 4) *Preference will be given to beneficiaries of ACDI/VOCA's ASAIL project*

To further limit the beneficiary group to within the scope and resources of the project, an additional criterion (#5) was included:

- 5.a) *In West Beqa'a, preference was given to needy herders who fit the above criteria and were members of efficient and active ruminant herder cooperatives*
- 5.b- *In East Beqa'a, where there is lack of established cooperatives, the additional criterion chosen was that only one herder per family was eligible for relief (i.e. no brother/brother and/or father /son combinations).*

Due to budgetary constraints, many conflict-affected, needy herders were not included in our original proposal to OFDA and had to be excluded from the initial selected group. However, as a result of cost savings in other areas during program implementation, resources became available to reach an additional group with animal feed rations to carry them through the remaining winter season. These beneficiaries were included in the second distribution.

The rationale for targeting existing ASAIL project beneficiaries as outlined in the proposal was to facilitate a quick start-up and to better implement an exit strategy. ACDI/VOCA had already undertaken an extensive assessment of the targeted regions both for ASAIL's beneficiary selection and for its post-conflict assessment, ensuring that RAAFA was able to access these populations quickly and efficiently. ASAIL staff had cultivated close relationships with these beneficiaries which facilitated access and ensured that relief efforts contribute to long-term economic opportunities for these herders under ASAIL long after RAAFA closed.

PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

RAAFA activities were divided into four main stages of implementation, as illustrated in Annex 1 of this report.

1. Program Mobilization: ACDI/VOCA's pre-existing relationships with these communities through its USAID-funded ASAIL project allowed the RAAFA program to quickly respond to needs and mobilize quickly. Within one week of receipt of the pre-authorization letter, ACDI/VOCA hired RAAFA Program Manager, Mr. Ali Chahine, who with his staff quickly traveled to the field to identify and register beneficiaries, negotiate with supply vendors on logistics, quality, branding, and pricing of the feed and non-feed items (tarps, blankets, and hygiene kits), oversee proper bidding of procurement, and establish monitoring and reporting procedures. The RAAFA team consisted of the Program Manager, two Field Monitors, and one Finance and Administrative Assistant. Staff was based at ACDI/VOCA's office in Zahle in Lebanon's central Beqa'a Valley.

2. Verification of Need Assessment and Beneficiary Selection: The rapid assessment undertaken by ACIDI/VOCA's USAID-funded economic development program prior to RAAFA's award identified at least 200 beneficiaries in urgent need of aid. This assessment formed the basis for ACIDI/VOCA's initial estimates for target audience. Upon mobilization, RAAFA staff conducted field visits in East and West Beqa'a to verify this needs assessment. It was found that much more than 200 small ruminant herders were in need of supplementary winter feed aid. This necessitated a review of initial selection criteria to be able to reach those most in need given the limited resources available. As such, the additional criterion (#5, listed above) was added.

Detailed data were recorded including family size, herd size and contact address. A total of 252 beneficiaries were registered during November and December for the first distribution.

3. Procurement and Branding of Supplies: During the registration and needs assessment period, RAAFA staff also assessed which type of tarps, blankets and hygiene kit items would best serve the selected population and modified its procurements appropriately. During this period, RAAFA identified potential suppliers of feed and the other non-feed items (hygiene kits, tarps and blankets) and conducted a transparent bidding process in line with USAID and ACIDI/VOCA procedures for tendering. In accordance with the program's pre-approved Branding Strategy and Marketing Plan, prior to distribution, all items were marked with the program sticker. ACIDI/VOCA included the responsibility to affix the program marking on feed sacks as an integral part of its contract with the feed supplier.

4. Distribution Campaigns: RAAFA conducted two main distribution campaigns over the course of the five month program. During the final weeks of the program, a small distribution of tarps occurred for selected needy herders.

To effectively distribute materials, ACIDI/VOCA utilized a voucher system in collaboration with the selected feed supplier, which served as the distribution point for animal feed as well as hygiene kits, tarps, and blankets. A herder received a voucher from a RAAFA team member prior to the distribution day which listed the items for which the herder was eligible, indicated the supplier's address, and noted the date of distribution. This voucher was signed and stamped by a RAAFA team member. The supplier was also given a list of all beneficiaries. To be able to collect the ration, the beneficiary had to present this voucher which was double-checked against

the supplier's list, as well as a valid original ID document, a copy of which was kept. The beneficiary then signed to confirm his receipt. All distribution activities were conducted with direct oversight by RAAFA staff, who had direct access to the premises and to all related documents maintained by the supplier during and after the distribution.

The quantity of feed and tarps to be given per each herder was determined based on the herd size according to a brackets allocation system. The quantity of blankets and hygiene kits per

family depended on the number of family members. Each feed ration distribution covered animal feed for two months. The non-feed items were a one-time distribution. RAAFA opted to combine several months' worth of animal feed rations into each distribution in order to reduce transportation costs for the herder, who often had to rent a truck to collect the aid.

The majority of herders, especially in East Beqa'a, spend the summer in the grazing highlands of the Western Mountains. These herders usually move with their families and herds to the warmer valley at the beginning of winter, which typically begins in early November. However, herders did not move to the Beqa'a valley until mid December due to winter's late onset and the extra grass in the highlands due to rains in October. As such, the first feed distribution was delayed by two weeks until late December.

Beneficiaries were disbursed among Eastern and Western Beqa'a as detailed below:

The **first distribution** occurred over a three week period beginning December 27, 2006 and reached 252 beneficiaries (84=West Beqa'a; 168=East Beqa'a) with 486 tons of high protein/high calorie animal feed rations, 400 hygiene kits, 1,399 blankets, and 200 tarps. The feed supplier was also contracted to carry out the storage and delivery of all items including the non-feed in his stores in Zahle, which is equal distant between East and West Beqa'a and easily accessible to all herders. Distribution to groups of beneficiaries was evenly disbursed over the three week period to avoid congestion at the distribution point and to allow for monitoring and minor adjustments.



The **second distribution** occurred over a one week period beginning February 28, 2007 and reached 503 beneficiaries (247 from Round I and 256 new) with 876 tons of high protein/high calorie animal feed rations. A new supplier was selected following a tender process; the vendor was located in the town of Qib-Elais which is also equally accessible for herder beneficiaries in eastern and western Beqa'a. The second distribution took less time than the first distribution because it only included animal feed and the new supplier was able to process beneficiaries more quickly. Initially, RAAFA only intended to distribute the second round of feed to the first

group of beneficiaries. However, due to considerable savings in purchasing tarps, it was agreed with OFDA to include new beneficiaries who fit the same criteria and were from the same

geographic area. Five herders from the first distribution were not included in the second round due to additional field monitoring activities that ended their eligibility for aid.

In April 2007, RAAFA also conducted a small **tarp distribution** to reach herders who expressed their need for tarps in order to buttress their temporary shelters in summer as they take their herds up the highlands and also for coming winters. Of RAAFA's 503 program beneficiaries, 200 received tarps in the first distribution. An additional 127 herders were deemed eligible for additional tarp distribution in April, and those with bigger herds were given priority. The distribution of tarps followed the same voucher system successfully utilized for earlier distributions. The feed supplier in Qib-Elias was also sub-contracted again to serve as the delivery point to store and distribute the tarps over a period of two days.

Activities By Component

i) Agriculture and Food Security

The lambing season in Lebanon is in late fall and early winter when relatively cold weather makes pastures inaccessible. Producers therefore depend exclusively on feed supplementation to maintain the condition of their herds, enabling them to produce vigorous offspring, maintain high quality and quantity of milk production, and sustain their young offspring

ACDI/VOCA's activities under the agriculture and food security component were centered on meeting objective 1: *Increase access to animal feed for small ruminant herders*. These efforts involved distributing high protein/high calorie animal feed for herder households to address the need for targeted herders to move quickly from being beneficiaries of relief activities to being active economic actors in a high potential value chain. ACDI/VOCA's extensive knowledge of the Lebanese small ruminant sub-sector informed its activities under this component, as well our understanding of how the timing of the July-August war could affect value chain dynamics for years to come, and our desire to mitigate

such negative impact in order to resume strengthening the small-ruminant value chain.

In the first distribution, the feed combination was 50 percent wheat, 30 percent sunflower, and 20 percent wheat barn. Feed prices vary daily according to international exchange markets, and this combination offered the highest levels of protein and calories at the best cost. During the second distribution, the feed was composed of 50 percent wheat and 50 percent sunflower. Due to higher prices during the second distribution, the wheat barn component was eliminated. In total, RAAFA reached **508** small ruminant herders and their households (composed of **4,582** individuals) in East and West Beqa'a, with **1,362** MT of high calorie, high protein animal feed rations feeding **90,158** heads of sheep and goats.

ii) Shelter

Most small ruminant herders in the region live in tents and practice transhumance. These conditions make herder households particularly vulnerable to the absence or insufficiency of shelter. In the hills of the Beqa'a Valley, winter temperatures can drop to between 0° - 5° Celsius, and thus proper winterization is essential.

ACDI/VOCA's activities under the shelter component were centered on meeting objective 2: *Increase access to transitional shelter for small ruminant herder households*. These efforts involved distributing blankets for herder households, as well as water and climate proof tarps, tarps to support winterization of their tents. Addressing shelter needs was an important compliment to the feed distribution/livelihoods security component as it addressed immediate family needs until they were able to rebuild herds and recover their usual cash-flow in the next milk season. It also helped prevent herders from selling donated feed in order to provide for other immediate needs. In total, RAAFA distributed **327** water and climate proof tarps, marked with the USAID logo and Arabic tagline, to **327** households composing **2,951** individuals, as well as **1,399** warm blankets to **508** households composing **2,369** individuals. Distribution of all tarps and blankets was completed during the first round of distribution.

iii) Water and Sanitation

ACDI/VOCA's activities under the shelter component were centered on meeting objective 3: *Increase access to basic hygiene supplies for small ruminants herder households*. These efforts involved distributing hygiene kits composed of basic hygienic items for usage by various members of the household, including soap, a kettle to boil water, toothbrushes, and dish cleaner. The contents of the kit were modified based on responses obtained from herders during the need assessment verification and the beneficiary registration. Many of the adult herders met during the need assessment visits explained that, instead of toothbrushes or toothpaste, they use the traditional practice of cleaning their teeth with a small wooden branch, which is common but not nearly as hygienic or effective. Hence, four colored child-sized toothbrushes were included in the kit to introduce the children to this personal hygiene practice. Moreover, three sets of five drawings depicting hygiene habits were included in the kit with colored pencils targeting children. The drawings reinforced practices such as washing one's face, brushing teeth, and washing hands before eating and after milking the animal.

In total, **400** hygiene kits were distributed to **252** households comprised of **2,369** individuals. Distribution of all hygiene kits was completed during the first round of distribution.

MONITORING MECHANISMS AND IMPACT EVALUATION

The monitoring tools utilized by the RAAFA team involved several methods for maximum effect, including field visits, questionnaires, direct supervision, database management, and validation with external sources.

RAAFA employed two field monitors whose primary responsibilities were to visit the beneficiaries during the need assessment phase and, after each distribution, verify their situation and check on the utilization of aid. The beneficiaries were interviewed at this time and the data entered into the program database used to ensure compliance with selection criteria and to monitor



distributions. The questionnaire collected information related to their situation, how they were affected by war and how the program has impacted them. A copy of the questionnaire is enclosed in Annex 2. The information provided by the beneficiaries was crosschecked with other herders and other external sources such as mayors, municipality leaders, other herders, vets who vaccinate their herd and feed merchants from whom they buy. RAAFA personnel were also present at the distribution points to monitor the process and receive feedback from herders. In

addition, staff continued to monitor the local market in Beqa'a to check whether cases surfaced where aid was sold or the market became destabilized. RAAFA found that neither of these negative situations occurred.

Impact Evaluation

In addition to monitoring beneficiaries to ensure that selection criteria were upheld, transparency was protected, and data monitoring was conducted, RAAFA also surveyed beneficiaries to document and evaluate the impact of the aid distributed under the program.

RAAFA's evaluations focused on monitoring results in response to the program's indicators (see adjoining text box). Nonetheless, program monitors discovered impact in areas outside the original indicators. These include:

- a) *School Enrollment Maintained:* Without the distributions from OFDA, many of RAAFA's beneficiaries would have been obliged to remove their children (particularly the daughters) from school in order to meet family expenses. Because they were able to utilize the animal feed, many herders were able to keep children in school and continue investing in their future.

RAAFA LIFE OF PROGRAM RESULTS

In total, RAAFA reached **508** small ruminant herders and their households in East and West Beqa'a with **1,362** MT of high calorie, high protein animal feed rations feeding **90,158** heads of sheep and goats.

Herders also received basic shelter and hygiene materials, including **327** tarps (for **327** of 508 families), **1,399** blankets (for **252** of 508 families), and **400** hygiene kits (for **252** of 508 families). **4,582** individuals benefited from the animal feed aid (**2,329** males, **2,243** females, **0** IDPs), **2,951** individuals benefited from tarp distributions, and **2,369** individuals benefited from both the hygiene kits and blankets.

Although most herders send their children to public schools, which are free of charge, transportation, stationary and books constitute large costs for their families with small margins between income and expenses. Similarly but to a lesser extent, some beneficiaries used the savings for medical treatment of a family member or rehabilitating their accommodations.


b) Herder Size Maintained: Herders were able to reserve their investments in their herds and maintain capital by avoiding selling heads from their herd to purchase feed for the remaining animals. Not only did the savings affect herders during the winter, but allowing herders to maintain their animals through the lambing period also insured they would benefit from the newly born animals that arrive in the Spring.

c) High Credit Loans Avoided: The financial situation of the herders after the July war and their loss of cash liquidity forced most feed suppliers to refuse to provide feed on credit as in previous years. Those suppliers who did provide feed on credit charged high interest rates and shortened the repayment period, making it very difficult for the herders. As a result of the distributed feed, 508 households (4,582 individuals) were spared from resorting to high credit conditions of the feed supplier.

d) USAID's investments in economic development in the Beqa'a sustained: The efforts and investment of ACDI/VOCA's USAID-funded \$6.9 million ASAIL program into the small ruminants sector in the Beqa'a were maintained. With few exceptions, the vast majority of RAAFA beneficiaries were also beneficiaries of the ASAIL program, and thus will benefit long-term from animal health training, vaccinations, technical assistance to improve milk quality and yields, organizational assistance, and linkages to trustworthy milk middlemen (*hallabs*) and dairy processors.

e) Personal Hygiene Encouraged: RAAFA monitors witnessed changes in the personal hygiene of herders, and in particular, their children. Field visits indicated that several children used the toothbrushes for the first time when they opened the hygiene kits. Some of the children took the hygiene drawings to their schools classes and shared them with schoolmates.

f) Improved Feed Introduced: Herders were introduced to new feed types and improved feeding methods that reduce costs and increase milk yields. For example, most herders were not accustomed to introducing sunflower into the ration mix and were somewhat hesitant to utilize it initially. However, after some encouragement, most herders actually reported increase in milk yield due to feeding their animals with sunflower.

BRANDING

In accordance with RAAFA’s approved Branding Strategy and Marking Plan, all distributed items were affixed with stickers showing the USAID logo with the Arabic tagline “From the American People,” ACDI/VOCA’s logo, and the program name. Distribution points were also marked with banners on distribution days.

COST ANALYSIS

The table below illustrates the final estimated division of monetary resources by program component. This represents actual expenditures in passthrough plus an estimated division by program component for direct and indirect costs (30% shelter; 60% agriculture and food security; 10% water and sanitation).

ACDI/VOCA was able to negotiate significant savings when purchasing water and climate proof tarps and, with OFDA approval, utilized these savings to reach several hundred additional herders within the program area with much needed animal feed rations for the winter. These beneficiaries were also affected by the war but we were unable to include them in the initial distribution due to budget and time constraints. Selection criteria remained the same, with the addition that new beneficiaries would not be family members (brother-brother/son-father) of those who benefited from first distribution.

CHALLENGES AND LESSONS LEARNED

Reliability of Beneficiary Data When Applying Selection Criteria: It became apparent that several beneficiaries sold their herds in the period between the initial rapid assessment conducted prior to the proposal and the post-award assessment verification in December. In addition, some herders wrongly claimed that small ruminants constituted their sole source of income. To combat this common problem, verify those truly in need, and confirm a reliable beneficiary list, RAAFA contacted mayors, community representatives, and area feed merchants. Staff also carried out field inspection visits to those suspected of providing inaccurate data. By cross-checking fields in the beneficiary database (which listed one's first, middle, and father's name, as well as the place of birth and family registration record number), RAAFA was able to maintain criterion 6.a.

Reliability of Beneficiary Herd Data When Determining Feed Ration Amount: RAAFA found that herders tended to overstate their herd size in anticipation of more aid. In addition, because herders typically leave their homes with their herds early in the morning and return at sunset, verifying the reported herd size (which affected the amount of feed rations allocated to each herder) became a challenge. To address this, RAAFA visited herders on rainy days when they stayed at home with their flocks, and cross checked references with local vets, who typically know the exact herd size as they are paid per head for vaccinations.

Include cost share even for just a small portion: The fact that the aid given is totally free of charge with zero contribution from the herder encourages some to overstate the herd size and others to falsely claim to have small ruminants. Including a cost share of feed cost, even as little as 10 percent, will force the herders to take responsibility and enhance their ownership.

Transport-Associated Costs: Most herders needed to rent a truck to carry the feed from the distribution site back to their dwelling place. RAAFA opted to combine several months' worth of animal feed rations into each distribution in order to reduce transportation costs for the herder. The allocation of distribution dates per herders took into account the possibility that related or neighboring herders could combine their quantities and utilize one means of transportation.

Pressure on the Team: Beqa'a is a tribally controlled area subscribing to a traditional hierarchy of decision-making and direct interference by many community leaders. Team members experienced both direct and indirect pressure, particularly from herders who were not included as beneficiaries or from individuals who were not herders at all. Because most of RAAFA's team, and in particular, the Program Manager, were not originally from Beqa'a, they were able to react appropriately to this pressure without upsetting cultural sensitivities or directly challenging tribal systems of authority. In addition, the network of relationships established under ACDI/VOCA's other economic growth project in the Beqa'a, ASAIL, helped mitigate this pressure.

Limiting the number of beneficiaries in an environment of general, overall poverty. In the beginning, several stakeholders in Beqa'a advised RAAFA to resort to blanket distribution and use the allocated program resources to reach the maximum number of herders, make everyone in the affected area pleased, and spare pressure on staff members. ACDI/VOCA chose not to accept this recommendation, however, and by the close of the program, it was clear that choosing fewer beneficiaries albeit with deeper impact – though it is more difficult to select from an operational point of view and can cause frustration among those who did

not receive, generating pressure on the team – is more sustainable and productive than diluting the outcomes by dispersing the resources to larger numbers. The main strength of this program is that it substantially impacted the livelihood of those targeted, especially those most needy. By providing beneficiaries with a considerable amount of urgently needed aid such as feed, blankets, hygiene kits, and tarps, these conflict-affected herders were able to save cash, invest in their children, provide medical care for family members, or improve their accommodation conditions.

PROGRAM IMPACT

Rapid Animal Feeding Aid (RAAFA) *رافة* Program

Providing relief to conflict-affected rural herders and their households in the Beqa'a Valley, Lebanon

Feed supplies secures school transportation for 5 rural children

The rural inhabitants of Al-Q'aa, Lebanon survive primarily through agricultural or herder livelihoods, and the majority exists in poverty. The town lies in a remote northeastern region of the Beqa'a Valley, near the Lebanese-Syrian border, and was affected by the Israeli bombing campaigns during the summer 2006 war between Israel and Hezbollah in Lebanon. The insecurity and resultant immobility, as well as the physical damage caused as a result of the war, severely damaged milk and live animal sales during the peak season, a time when herders make the bulk of their yearly income to feed their families and their flocks during the winter months in preparation for the following season. The war worsened the already difficult living conditions for the people of Al-Qa'a,

Recognizing this need, ACDI/VOCA incorporated an animal feed ration component as part of its RAAFA (which means "compassion" in Arabic) program, funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID)'s Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance (OFDA). The five-month program, which ended in April 2007, reached a total of 503 remote, conflict-affected small ruminant herder households in eastern and western Beqa'a with 1,362 tons of high protein/high calorie animal feed rations for 90,158 heads of sheep and goats, in addition to providing 327 waterproof tarps, 1,399 warm blankets, and 400 hygiene kits.



Mohamad Flity– or Abou Hassan as people call him in Al-Qa'a - is a program beneficiary and a father of five. He shares a home with his wife, their five children, and his mother and father, who all attend to the family flock of 250 sheep and goats while the children go to school. *"Being unable to milk the sheep and goats during the war, I lost my income for the whole year. Without assistance I would have either to sell more of my herds to cover up for the cost of feeding or take loans with high interest rates that God only knows how I will be able to pay back",* he describes.

During the war, Abou Hassan had to sell 70 sheep at very reduced prices to sustain the lives of the other animals. Without any type of assistance Abou Hassan would have been forced to take even harsher measures. In order to save money to sustain his flocks, Abou Hassan had planned to end the school bus service that carried his five children – aged 10 and younger - to and from school every day, located 5 km (over 3 miles) away from their home. During the harsh winter months of his mountainous region, where temperatures often drop to below zero, this would impose a substantial risk to the children's health and could lead to further hardship. RAAFA's animal feed distribution program not only saved the family's flock and ensured food and economic security for the coming months, but it also spared Abou Hassan's children from enduring a difficult journey twice daily for the whole school year.

PROGRAM IMPACT

Rapid Animal Feeding Aid (RAAFA) *رافة* Program

Providing relief to conflict-affected rural herders and their households in the Beqa'a Valley, Lebanon

Animal feed sustains one household's livelihood; tarps keep children safe from winter elements in mountainous l'rsal, Lebanon

The herder community in l'rsal suffers from high poverty rates and deteriorating living conditions augmented by the July-August war between Israel and Hezbollah in 2006. Conflict-affected herders in this area were targeted by ACDI/VOCA's Lebanon relief program, RAAFA, (meaning "compassion" in Arabic), funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID)'s Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance (OFDA).

Herder Mohamed Abdel-Karim Ghadada lives in l'rsal with his wife, who is pregnant with their third child, his parents, and his brother who is also married with four children. Together, Mohamed and his household of 12 attend to a flock of around 400 sheep and goats and sustain their livelihoods from the proceeds from milk and meat sales. The war came at a time when milk and meat sales yield the bulk of a herder's yearly income. The peak season was nearly entirely lost. The resultant debilitating cash shortag not only affected the ability to purchase crucial animal feed, ensuring next season's sales, but it also forced herders like Mohammed to forgo necessary repairs and winterization of their homes to make scarce funds available for household food provision.

Recognizing the existence of these related needs, ACDI/VOCA incorporated animal feed ration and tarp provision components as part of its RAAFA (which means "compassion" in Arabic) program, funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID)'s Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance (OFDA). The five-month program, which ended in April 2007, reached a total of 503 remote, conflict-affected small ruminant herder households in eastern and western Beqa'a with 1,362 tons of high protein/high calorie animal feed rations for 90,158 heads of sheep and goats, in addition to providing 327 waterproof tarps, 1,399 warm blankets, and 400 hygiene kits.

Directly after the war, Mohamed had to sell 30 sheep to provide income to the households and feed to the remaining herd. After qualifying under the selection criteria, Mohamed received 3 tons of animal feed and household maintenance tarps, supporting the livelihoods of him and his 12 family members, and allowing him to maintain paying for education costs (transportation, papers, and uniform) for his six children and provide medical care for his pregnant wife. With the assistance he received, Mohamed was able to save the remaining goats and sheep and was granted security until next season's income. The tarps he received are keeping the family warm and dry. The family's home is old and, because of leakages in the ceiling, humidity and cold winter air were seeping into the home, exposing this young and growing family to the harshness of the Lebanese winter. The tarps provided now cover the ceiling and have solved the problem. Animal feed sustained the household's livelihood and tarps have allowed Mohamed to protect his family from an additional burden: sickness.
