Food Security Situation

- Food for Peace has been mobilizing all available resources to bring urgently needed food assistance to those affected by the devastating 7.0 magnitude earthquake which has caused massive death and destruction.
- Extreme poverty and recurring natural disasters combine to make Haiti one of the poorest countries in the world.
- Hurricanes and tropical storms proved especially devastating in 2008, and their impact has lingered.
