The general aim of the project was intended to provide effective community based health rehabilitation service to the disabled and most marginalized profoundly disadvantaged people of community catchment in area of Ezariyeh, Abu Deis and Sawahreah .

Activity 1: The planed activity was to provide rapid assessment on disability condition within catchment area of el Ezariyeh, Abu Dies, and Sawahreh for total of 32 beneficiaries.

Activity 2: Homes visit to target disabled beneficiaries and direct family members in catchment area for 32 beneficiaries.

Activity 3: Social and cultural recreational activities at the FOHM was include 8 of different activities which include. One Birthday party for two beneficiaries of FOHM, two major outside trips recreational visits. Three music and dance party activity, two watching movies on LCD projector for 160 beneficiaries.

- Output 1: Survey conducted, reports on conditions of disability, identify major categories of disability for, and need assessment for 16 beneficiaries.
- Output 2: Home visits were conducted for 30 beneficiaries out of the assessed 16 to provide them with basic rehabilitation service including family counseling and mobilization and ADL training. And family counseling.
- Output 3: 8 activity were accomplished successfully with the following number of clients participants ;

(One Birthday party for 25 beneficiaries of FHOM, two major outside trips recreational for 44 participants in both trips. three music and dance party activity 45 participants , two watching movie on LCD projector for 42 participants.

Total Number of beneficiaries from residents of the 156 FHOM beneficiaries.

Total Number of beneficiaries from outside of the FHOM 46 beneficiaries.

Section IV: Summary of Major Accomplishments

- This is the 3rd month of reporting, we are working on activity one which is the rapid assessment of the beneficiaries in the catchment area We are now working on objective in the proposal which establishing and strengthen network with the local community organization in which we been able to find new cases through the help of one of the local organizations that used to provide service for them and stopped due to finical crisis.
- Activity two which is working on homes visits for catchment area during theses visits clients were provided with training on independency on self-care like bathing using toilets and teeth brushing in addition to how to maintain the physical and cognitive abilities for 13 individual clients.
- FHOM activity three going to trips like we did one the **Dead Sea (En Fashkha)** for one day for severe disabled residents In the four homes in this total of 47 participants activity 31 residents and 16 employees and volunteers.

- **Tabghah in Tibarias** for five days camping in which clients were able to swim with the help of the staff and enjoy the nature for a long distance trip with the regular social recreational activities in house such as watching moves dance parties birthday parties and so on in which we expected that 20 resident will participate but we got permissions from Israeli authorities for 13 residents and from employees we been able to send 11 employees.
- We have established a new professional relationship with the local community in which we are coordinating with ministry of education to provide service in governmental schools for students with in catchment area and we are on the stage of getting the approval form the ministry to start working in schools.
- Unfortunately our new social work decided to leave us because for personal reasons, we tried to find replacement we conducted rapid interviews and short listing and we decided for a new appropriate 3 candidate waiting for reply from flagship for agreement to employee the new social work, that incident have had negative impact on the achievement of home visits and family counseling activity.
- Total number achieved until date of this report 41 rapid assessments and the goal is to achieve more depending on referral and finding new cases.

Section X: Impact on participants/beneficiaries

In activity - One of the clients that the team visited during doing rapid assessment was suspected to have mental illness his family was unable to delay with him (he has no physical problems) and then he was referred to Dr. Twafic Suliman our psychiatrist for diagnosis and treatment , the diagnosis is now in process and his family now is satisfied because of this professional intervention.

Through assessment many of the participants needed referral for other services and they were unaware of this intervention and our intervention was to raise their awareness and counseling about these needs this was measured by documentation on the assessment stage and on the goals of the intervention.

In Activity 2 Home visit program, many clients were their goals on maximizing their independency in their activity of daily living such as dressing alone eating alone and other and our tools was the occupational therapy scale for independency.

In Activity 3, during this reporting period we were able to plan and conduct two major trips: One to the Dead Sea (El Fashkha) for one day for severe disabled residents. A total of 31 residents and 16 employees and volunteers shared this trip, the severe disabled clients were very happy in this trip and it was therapeutic because of the swimming activity(hydrotherapy) .

And another one to Tabgha (Tabgha) is the traditional location for the calling of the disciples. It is believed that here Jesus walked along the shore and called out to Simon Peter and Andrew who were casting their nets into the lake. Walking along, Jesus saw two other brothers, James and John who were preparing their nets with their father Zebedee. Jesus called all of these men to follow him part of a church which commemorated Jesus' feeding of the 5000.) in Tibarias for five days, we chose this place because it is an appropriate place for wheelchair users and camping in which clients were able to swim with the help of the staff and enjoy the nature for a long distance trip with the regular social recreational activities in house such as watching movies dance parties birthday parties and so on in which we expected that 20 resident will participate but we got permissions from Israeli authorities for 13 residents and from employees we been able to send 11 employees, this activity was important for many reasons one of them is living outside the Homes in which it has stimulation effect and clients were very happy during this period and some of them said if they can stay for more time, they don't have such opportunity in west bank because there is no places with wheelchair accessibility to swim and camp and have fun, during five days clients have had a different program it was recreational based the food play and swim and feel free to do whatever you want as long it was not dangerous for themselves and others , they have had the chance to enjoy the views of the lake and travel by bus.
