The general aim of the project was intended to provide effective community based health rehabilitation service to the disabled and most marginalized profoundly disadvantaged people of community catchment in area of Ezariyeh, Abu Deis and Sawahreh .

Activity 1: The planed activity was to provide rapid assessment on disability condition within catchment area of el Ezariyeh, Abu Dies, and Sawahreh for total of 32 beneficiaries.

Activity 2: Home visits to target disabled beneficiaries and direct family members in catchment areas for 32 beneficiaries.

Activity 3: Social and cultural recreational activities at the FOHM is to include 8 of different activities which include; One Birthday party for three beneficiaries of FOHM, one major open day recreational activity. Five music and dance party activity, three watching movies on LCD projector for 186 beneficiaries.

Section III: Outputs Achieved during this Reporting Period

- Output 1: Survey conducted, reports on conditions of disability, identify major categories of disability, and need assessment for 11 beneficiaries.
- Output 2: Home visits were conducted for 26 beneficiaries out of the assessed 11 to provide them with basic rehabilitation service including family counseling and mobilization and ADL training, and family counseling.
- Output 3: 10 activities were accomplished successfully with the following number of clients participants ;

(One Birthday party for 16 beneficiaries of FHOM, one major Open Day, recreational for a total of 105 participants for both in-house (78) and outpatient participants (27). Five music and dance party activity 30 participants and three watching movie on LCD projector for 35 participants.

Total Number of beneficiaries from residents of the FHOM is 156 beneficiaries.

Total Number of beneficiaries from outside of the FHOM is 36 beneficiaries.

* This is the 4th month of reporting, we are working on activity one which is the rapid assessment of the beneficiaries in the catchment area. We are now working on objective in the proposal which is to establish and strengthen the network with the local community organization in which we were able to find new cases through the help of one of the ministry of higher education that help us to find students with special needs.

- Activity two which is working on home visits for catchment area during these visits. Clients were provided with training on independency on self-care like bathing using toilets and teeth brushing in addition to how to maintain the physical and cognitive abilities for 25 individual clients.
- Fortunately we have new social worker, we have positive impact on the achievement of home visits and family counseling activity and project in general.
- Open day- We had a successful achievement with conducting an open day for the residents in house and out patients on our project which included many social recreational activities like music, drama, face painting, balloons, dancing, puppet

show with nice food outside (P, Q) we had guest from Bethlehem university and Zahrah Al quds local organization with total number of 105 beneficiaries.

Activity 1: One of the clients that the team have visited during doing rapid assessment in Budwin area (AL AJhaleen) near al Eziriaha we found a child age 13 years living in a very poor environment and in need for assessment and intervention and he have had no intervention before at all .

Through assessment many of the participants needed referral for other services and they were unaware of this intervention and our intervention was to raise their awareness and counseling about these needs, this was measured by documentation on the assessment stage and on the goals of the intervention.

Activity 2: Home visit program; many clients were their goals on maximizing their independency in their activity of daily living such as dressing alone eating alone and other and our tools was the occupational therapy scale for independency.

Activity 3: In the open day many of the participants were very happy by participating in the activity and many goals were achieved such as integration with other community members, sharing feelings and emotions with others, expressing themselves through activity and recreational being in enjoyable mood.
