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# Program Goal

- To Increase access to FP, STI and ART Services for HIV Positive patients in 8 Provinces



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# Program Objectives

- Increase access to FP services by 3000 HIV positive patients/ clients in Kenya
- Improve knowledge and skills of 350 SP on STI and FP
- To give providers working in healthcare settings the essential knowledge and skills to support prevention with positive persons



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# Program Activities

1. Three Planning and advocacy meetings for target provinces
2. Conduct baseline surveys in 2 sites per province  
( Total 16 sites)
3. Development & review of training materials underway  
( STI and FP OP)
4. Printing of training packages, job aids, wall charts and posters
5. Orientate 350 HIV SPs from 8 provinces on STI and FP using the JHPIEGO/NASCOP OP
6. Train 160 TOTs from 8 provinces on Prevention with Positives and Support training of 160 PLHAs support groups in 80 districts
7. Conduct support supervision visits at target facilities
8. Stakeholder meeting to review program results and identify critical lessons learnt.



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# Program Design

- Joint program implementation by NASCOP & JHPIEGO.
- Program coverage: Nairobi, Eastern ,Central, Coast, Nyanza, Western, RV and Nairobi Provinces
- Target group: primarily clinical officers, nurses, PLHAs in support groups
- Target facilities: district, provincial hospitals and support groups
- USAID-PEPFAR Funding: From the American people.
  - Different program that complements USAID-APHIA II
- Builds on 2005-7 JHPIEGO/NASCOP success in ART training in Eastern, Nairobi, Central and Coast provinces



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# Program indicators

**Objective 1** : Increase access to FP services by 3000 HIV positive patients/ clients in Kenya

## Indicators:

- Increased number of ART facilities providing FP services
- % increase in ART clients counseled on various FP methods

**Data Source:** Training reports, end of project repo



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# Program indicators

**Objective 2** : Improve service providers knowledge and skills on FP and STI

## Indicators:

- 350 HIV Service providers trained in FP/STI using the national approach and orientation package

Data source : Training reports, supervision reports.



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# Program indicators

## Objective 3 :

- To give providers working in healthcare settings the essential knowledge and skills to support prevention with positive persons

## Indicators:

- Number of Service Providers Trained on Prevention with Positives
  - 160 Service providers and EPTs trained as Pwp TOTs
  - Number of PLHAs reached in support groups
- Data Source ; Health facility records




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# Materials

## Prevention with positives

## STI/FP

- STI/FP Orientation package
- STI national guidelines
- Other STI/FP educational materials for clients/patients



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# Implementation plan FP/STI

- Immediate identification of MOH/NASCOP target districts and/or facilities
- Develop, reproduce and print 400 copies of STI/FP OP
- Print existing IEC materials on STI and FP
- Develop a Training Schedule: Standard for all districts  
3-day
- Identify district trainers who are also supervisors
- Select Participants as per stated criteria and agreed breakdown per province( participants should be working in the CCC or HIV clinics)



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# Implementation plan Pwps

- Immediate identification of MOH/NASCOP target districts and/or facilities
- Develop, reproduce and print 300 copies each of Pwps materials
- Develop a Training Schedule: Standard for all districts
  - 1-day for TOTs and 1 day for PLHAs in the support groups
- Conduct a one day TOT training in all the provinces for 160 participants ( 80SPs and 80 EPTs) using already developed Pwp curriculum
- Support training of PLHA support groups- 2 SGs per district ( Total of 160 SGs in 80 districts) approximately 1600 PLHAs will be reached



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# Expected Results of Program

- Increased service providers skills in both FP and STI Service provision in HIV comprehensive care centers
- Increased detection and diagnosis of STIs by the SPs in CCCs
- Increased access to FP services by patients in HIV care in all the provinces.
- Increased awareness by positive persons on how to prevent transmission of HIV virus to others
- Increased number of HIV Patients/Clients who are able to make informed decisions about health choices, including contraception and pregnancy



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# OTHER SUPPORT

- ❖ Mentorship
- ❖ ART-Secondary level training Curriculum

# Mentorship NASCOP Support

- Provide NASCOP with Technical assistance in the development and harmonization of the mentorship materials
- Support 3 material review meetings (one day meeting) in Nairobi
- Support a 3 days retreat to finalize the mentorship tools/materials
- Print 200 final copies of mentorship materials



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# ART- SECONDARY LEVEL TRAINING CURRICULUM

- Support the harmonization of already developed ART- secondary level training modules by the task force
- Support a 3 days retreat to finalize on the curriculum
- Print 300 copies of the new curriculum
