

B. Period of Grant

Activity Description

The Don Bos Youth Training and Recreation Center, whose non-religious activities take place in the Church of St. Jean Bosco, houses the "Comité de Planification des Vacances" (COPVAC) and is located in Anorland, Carrefour, which is in the West Department approximately 10 kilometers from Port-au-Prince. According to the last census, the population of Carrefour was approximately 109,000 in 1978. Carrefour has experienced a tremendous growth rate in the last 10 years and it is presently one of the most densely populated areas of Haiti.

COPVAC is an umbrella youth organization for six youth groups in the district of Carrefour. A Salesian church is currently being used for COPVAC's many activities which include training programs in electronics, sewing, culinary arts, theater, and dance. The church is also used for seminars and conferences on a variety of topics. Although space is limited, COPVAC currently provides services to approximately 440 poor youths between the ages of 10 and 25. With a center and sports court of its own, COPVAC could easily quadruple the number of youths it serves.

COPVAC and Father Elan Florival, the Salesian Father in charge of the center, have requested a grant from USAID for a recreation and training center and a basketball/volleyball court. The grant funds will be used for technical assistance (an engineer) and to purchase construction materials such as cement, reinforcement bars, and other construction commodities. COPVAC and Father Florival have agreed to provide rocks, sand, gravel, labor, transportation and other construction materials not included in this grant. The land on which the youth center will be constructed has been donated by the Salesian Fathers.

The Recreation and Training Center will include a large multipurpose room for seminars, conferences, and audiovisual presentations, a library, a bookstore, the COPVAC office, a shower room for the youths and a basketball/volleyball court.
