## INTRODUCTION

This directory has been compiled to enable senior officials involved in evaluation of governmental programs to know their counterparts around the world. The need for this directory has been identified by many officials. In particular, this initial compilation received encouragement from the Development Assistance Committee, OECD; the United Nations; and the World Bank.

All nations and many major international organizations were requested during late 1980 to submit information for this directory. Countries are not included only if they did not submit information in time for this publication.

It is clear that there are some differences in interpreting the term "evaluation." Our intention was to include units which examine the efficiency and effectiveness of governmental activities which are being carried out or which have already been completed. However, some units listed seem to focus principally on reviewing or conducting feasibility studies; activities which fall outside this directory's definition of the term "evaluation."

While I believe this initial compilation will be useful, it does contain some obvious gaps and omissions, and I encourage the United Nations or another major multilateral group to take on the task of compiling a future edition in the hopes that a more complete listing will become available.

As the chairman of the new Development Assistance Committee (OECD) evaluation group, I think it worth noting that many governments are in the process of establishing evaluation units. Others are expanding existing units. I can only encourage international donors to note both the importance of this trend and the usefulness of international support for such efforts.

This directory is published in the hope that the people and institutions mentioned in it will establish and strengthen international ties with each other so that eventually a world evaluation community can be said to

exist. The mutual exchange of reports and lessons learned in the conduct of public programs will undoubtedly be valuable.

While every attempt has been made to accurately reflect the information furnished, I accept full responsibility for any errors or omissions.
