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INTRODUCTION

The Agency for International Development (AID) has over the years funded many data collection activities as a part of AID projects for developing countries. A large number of social, demographic and economic data sets which have been collected by AID through these projects are now available to the research community. The Economic and Social Data Services Division in the Office of Development Information and Utilization, Bureau of Science and Technology (S&T/DIU/ESDS) serves as the AID focal point for data collection efforts, such as identification of data sets collected in developing countries, and preparation of an inventory of data collections finished so far. As part of an effort to computerize the vast quantity of project documents, AID has developed the Development Information System (DIS) which contains abstracts of project documents submitted to the AID libraries and the Office of Development Information and Utilization. Besides an abstract, other items that DIS provides include document type, publication data and other bibliographic information, as well as identification of the project and the contract.

Prepared by Abt Associates Inc. for the Economic and Social Data Services Division, this annotated bibliography of selected AID-assisted data collection serves to illustrate the output of a useful supplementary data base to the present Development Information System. The bibliography contains names, addresses and telephone numbers of principal contacts who are knowledgeable about the data collection activities. In addition to this information, which DIS does not provide, the brief abstracts in this bibliography also supply data on key variables about the data collection activities. Using these supplementary data items, interested AID personnel can obtain further information about the project findings, the questionnaires used in the surveys, and the accessibility of the micro-data sets. The goal of this project is to increase the utilization of AID's information resources such as project papers, final reports, evaluations, and survey documentations, so that lessons of past projects can be used in the design, implementation, and evaluation of future data collection activities.

An index of the annotations by primary subject categories and regions is included in this annotated bibliography.

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---BRIEF ABSTRACT---

This study aims at understanding the relations between religious beliefs and fertility behavior, and the value of children. Completed in 1980, this multi-round of surveys was conducted on a nationwide scale using both sampling and case study approaches. Women of child-bearing age in 17 communities were asked questions on such socio-demographic variables as date of birth, children ever born, marital status, child health and mortality, occupation, and educational attainment of respondents. In particular, data on the caste system, religious beliefs and practice were gathered. Both tabulated and machine readable data are available.

---BRIEF ABSTRACT---

The Socioeconomic Farm Survey was a nationwide single-round data collection effort completed in 1978. Using statistical sampling techniques, the survey queried between 1000 and 4999 farms and farm enterprises. For the purpose of sector assessment, it collected data on demographic, household, child health, income, wealth, and education of the respondents. Extensive farm related characteristics such as area planted, fertilizer, yield, harvest loss, irrigation, farm income and credit, marketing, and consumption were collected. The data tape is available from Ministerio de Asuntos Campesinos y Agropecuareis of Bolivia (MACA).

Completed in 1977, this single round sample survey covered 500 to 999 households, families, farm and farm enterprises in Southern Valleys of Bolivia. The data collection effort was intended to assist project design at the provincial level. Extensive data on economic and agricultural aspects of rural households are available in both machine readable and non-machine readable forms, including income, wealth and ownership of land, expenditures, employment and occupations, crop areas and yield, livestock, and other input factors of agricultural production. Between January and April 1978, the Nutrition Institute of the Egyptian Ministry of Health completed a national nutrition status survey of preschool children. A total of 9794 children aged 6 through 71 months were included in the survey. The weight for height index relating body mass to length or stature was used as the primary index for assessing the prevalence of acute undernutrition. The results of the survey indicated a high prevalence of acute undernutrition. The objective of the follow-up nutrition status survey was to provide nutrition status information for 1800 preschool children in two rural universes in 1980. Compared to the 1978 results, the follow-up survey can: search for temporal changes in anemia prevalence among children and mother, and to see the availability and utilization of oral rehydration salts.

The Guatemala Rural Water Supply Cost-Benefit Methodology Project included a survey component which explored the problems of food wastage and sanitation. The objective of the multi-round surveys was project evaluation. All surveys were completed in 1976. Individuals, households, families, farms, farm enterprises, and village officials were surveyed in two villages. Statistical samples, case study approaches, and institutional records were utilized in the data gathering process.
