


Matching Grant Program

The Matching Grant Program allows a U.S. PVO to expand a successful program in new places or initiate new projects. It also enables a U.S. PVO to undertake an experimental or innovative project on the cutting edge of developmental efforts that offer potential for learning and replication.

Now in its 20th year, the Matching Grant Program is the Office of Private and Voluntary Cooperation's (PVC) principal vehicle to help U.S. private and voluntary organizations (PVOs) develop their community-based programs overseas. Matched dollar-for-dollar by the PVO's own resources, Matching Grants support programs consistent with the U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID) evolving priorities (such as small enterprise development and democratic pluralism) and geographical interests (such as the special needs of Africa, Central Asia, and Central America).

The Matching Grant Program awards competitive grants to PVOs to support clearly defined, field-oriented programs administered in a number of countries. The programs must be well conceived and incorporate rigorous evaluation criteria. Such a program may be as broad as the overall scope of a PVO's work, or as specific as community-based health services or small enterprise development. It must be within USAID's legislative mandate and development priorities.

PVOs are awarded matching grants based on their demonstrated ability to implement successful, sustainable development programs. The four major objectives of the Matching Grant Program are:



- to expand and strengthen the field programs of U.S. PVOs in order to increase prospects for sustainability and results in program areas that are consistent with USAID policies and priorities;
- to assist U.S. PVOs to further enhance their planning systems, management systems, and technical competencies to carry out development programs;
- to build the capacity of local nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), governmental, and community-based organizations (CBOs) through formalized partnerships with U.S. PVOs; and
- to increase U.S. private resources directed to development assistance by matching private contributions on a dollar-for-dollar basis through a combined public and private partnership.



The Child Survival Program brings simplistic lifesaving and preventive health care to areas with traditionally high rates of infant mortality, focusing on maternal and pre-natal care, as well as life-long nutrition for mother and child.

Since 1985, the Office of Private and Voluntary Cooperation (PVC) has funded and administered a competitive grant program intended to enhance the participation of U.S.-based private and voluntary organizations (PVOs) in reducing infant, child, and maternal mortality in less developed countries, and to strengthen their organizational management and technical capacity in these areas. The program is open to all U.S.-based PVOs registered with USAID that engage in international health care development.

The Child Survival Program has two main objectives:

- Meet the critical health needs of infants, children under five years of age, and mothers in developing countries with high infant, child, and maternal mortality rates; and
- Improve the capacity of U.S.-based PVOs and their local partners to carry-out effective Child Survival Programs.






Cooperative Development Program

Cooperatives enable people to achieve self-reliance and lasting economic independence. These member-owned democratic and community-based businesses spread economic benefits and provide opportunities for millions of people to participate directly in democratic processes.

The Humphrey Amendment to the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, along with other legislation, has allowed the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to dedicate substantial support and financial assistance to U.S. Cooperative Development Organizations (CDOs) to carry-out development overseas. PVC administers a competitive grants program for cooperative development. The Program uses the expertise and resources of long-established U.S. cooperative organizations, their members and volunteers to respond to the needs of cooperatives and other group-based businesses overseas.

The objectives of the CDO Program are to:

- Build the organizational commitment of U.S. CDOs and their members to support international cooperative development activities;
- Promote the growth of cooperative systems in developing countries and emerging democracies;
- Increase the capacities of indigenous cooperatives through technical assistance, training, and advisory services;
- Encourage the establishment of long-term partnerships between U.S. CDOs and host country organizations, based on sound service, information sharing, and/or economic links, to ensure program sustainability;
- Support the program development activities and services of indigenous cooperative development activities internationally; and
- Support efforts to broaden the development resource funding base of U.S. CDOs and enhance long-term sustainability of cooperative development activities overseas.

CDOs work in many areas, including: credit; agribusiness; technology transfer; housing; micro-enterprise and small business development; financing and marketing; rural telephone and functioning electric services; insurance; and capital formation. In addition, cooperatives are effective grassroots organizations representing member interests in democratic societies.


CDOs that have long-term association with USAID's CDO Program may mentor eligible U.S. cooperatives that are interested in partnering to implement cooperative development activities overseas.



Development Education Program

The Development Education Program provides grants to support the efforts of U.S. non-profit organizations in educating American citizens about developing countries, the development process, and the importance of developing countries to the United States.

The U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID) Development Education Program was authorized under the Biden-Pell Amendment to the International Security and Development Cooperation Act of 1980. It was established in response to the Report of the Presidential Commission on World Hunger (1980) and was designed to promote widespread discussion and analysis of the causes of hunger and poverty. In 1982, the Program was established as a grants program by the Office of Private and Voluntary Cooperation (PVC) and is referred to as both the Development Education Program and the Biden-Pell Program.

PVC has awarded grants to a broad cross-section of over 100 organizations including private voluntary organizations engaged in development assistance; universities; radio, television, and print media; cooperatives; service clubs; trade associations; and national membership organizations. Grants are used to help educate the public on U.S. development activities overseas as they relate to poverty and hunger.

The Biden-Pell Development Education Program is a public/private initiative designed to foster interest and participation in international development among U.S. citizens. The Program supports activities by private, not-for-profit organizations to educate large segments of the American public about U.S. humanitarian relief and economic development programs overseas and to build national understanding for these programs.

Programs supported by the Biden-Pell grants have a theme of "global-local links." In other words, they demonstrate the connections between domestic and international concerns and communicate why international development assistance is in the best long-term interest of the United States.







Ocean Freight Reimbursement - World Wide Program

The Ocean Freight Reimbursement (OFR) Program provides subsidies to enable private and voluntary organizations (PVOs) to ship humanitarian supplies and equipment in support of the PVOs' overseas activities.

OFR-World Wide Program is the oldest on-going PVO support program. Recipients ship a wide variety of goods overseas for use in privately funded development and humanitarian assistance programs. The Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, Section 123 (b) authorized the creation of the program and, as amended, allows the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to subsidize registered U.S. PVOs in their ocean freight transportation costs.

The OFR-World Wide Program is unique because it offers subsidies to PVOs to ship commodities overseas for use in privately funded development and humanitarian assistance programs. It is also unique because it allows small and newly registered PVOs to participate in a PVC grant process that is highly competitive, yet less complex.

The OFR-World Wide Program provides small competitive grants to over 50 U.S. PVOs each year. Funds are used to reimburse the PVO's costs to transport donated commodities, such as medical supplies, agricultural equipment, educational supplies, and building equipment, to developing countries.

The OFR-World Wide Program helps USAID expand its pool of developing partners by reaching out to small and/or newly registered PVOs and by providing grants to many first-time applicants. About 20 percent of the 1996 grantees were new to the program. While USAID reimburses the costs of ocean freight, participating PVOs are responsible for ancillary costs, such as commodity acquisition, warehousing, insurance, local transportation, and distribution. The Program leverages resources many times the size of the USAID funding. The overall private-public match of OFR activities is 68 to 1.






Farmer-to-Farmer Program

The Farmer-to-Farmer Program provides voluntary technical assistance, on a people-to-people basis, to farmers, farm groups, agricultural education institutions, and agribusinesses to enhance the potential for substantial increases in food processing, production, and marketing, which in turn, stimulates private enterprise and democratic institutions.

The Farmer-to Farmer (FTF) Program was initially authorized by Congress in the 1985 Farm Bill. It began as a pilot project to provide technical assistance to farmers in Central America and the Caribbean. In 1986, the Program was expanded for worldwide operation. In early 1987, the Peace Corps began implementing FTF activities through a Participating Agency Service Agreement (PASA). The FTF Program was re-authorized through 2002 in the 1996 Farm Bill. The original FTF Program is commonly referred to as the Worldwide FTF (WW-FTF) Program.

In 1991, a Special Initiative of the FTF Program was authorized as one of the first U.S. assistance programs for the New Independent States (NIS); and it continues to operate in twelve of the NIS countries. The Program is referred to as the NIS-FTF Program.

As stated in its authorizing legislation, the purpose of the FTF Program is “to assist farmers in increasing food production and distribution by improving the effectiveness of farming and marketing operations.” The Program relies on the expertise of volunteers from U.S. farms, land grant universities, cooperatives, private agribusinesses, and non-profit farm organizations to respond to the local needs of host country farmers and organizations.

The Farmer-to-Farmer Program is an effective and flexible mechanism for transferring technology, knowledge, and skills of U.S. agricultural volunteers to farmers, farm groups, agricultural education institutions, and agribusinesses worldwide. Volunteers have been recruited from all 50 states and the District of Columbia. In general, they are not overseas development professionals, but rather individuals who have domestic careers, farms, and agribusinesses, or are retired and want to participate in development efforts. They spend about a month in the host country.


FTF volunteers have provided assistance to individual farm enterprises, cooperatives, farmers' associations, agribusinesses, rural credit institutions, and agricultural youth groups. Many times, partnerships develop between host country organizations and U.S. organizations, some of which are formalized by written agreement. For example, the American Farm Bureau Federation, at the State level, has partnered with many private farmers' organizations in the NIS.

In the WW-FTF Program, over 1,400 volunteer assignments have been completed since 1991 in more than 70 countries. In the NIS Program (NIS-FTF), more than 2,700 assignments have been completed since 1992.


