
1. AIDS Financing

- Significant increase in AIDS funding
 - PEPFAR; GFATM
 - WB-MAP
 - EU & DFID (?)
- IMF ceilings
- Disease specific interventions & health systems strengthening
- Transparency, accountability to communities
- Reaching communities, particularly MARP organisations

2. Civil society capacity

Key recommendation for future of PEPFAR

(IOM report, 2007)

“...PEPFAR should continue to transition from its focus on emergency relief to an emphasis on the long-term strategic planning and **capacity building** that are necessary for a sustainable, long-term response.”

2. Civil society capacity

- **HIV / SRH linkages**
- **Emergency relief / long-term: LO model increasingly relevant**
- **PEPFAR / WB / GFATM**
- **High quality toolkits**
- **TA needs - Regional TS Hubs; Global Implementation Support Team (GIST)**

Supporting community action on AIDS in developing countries

3. AIDS policy

- **Good international policy framework**
 - Pricing of 2nd line drugs
 - Civil Society and Health Systems Strengthening
 - Civil society / MARP participation
- **Human rights vigilance**
- **National level**
 - Stigma and discrimination remains high

Supporting community action on AIDS in developing countries

4. AIDS programming

- Scaled up response - service gaps, esp. for MARP
- Treatment / testing / prevention haven't shown expected synergies
- PMTCT coverage remains low
- Comprehensive OVC support
- New technologies: MC implementation; microbicides & vaccines remain elusive
