Management Sciences for Health LMG Ethiopia Success Story: Harari Regional Health Bureau, "Harmonized and Aligned Plans for Better Health Outcomes in Ethiopia"

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The Leadership, Management and Governance Project (LMG) is a United States Agency for International Development (USAID) five-year Cooperative Agreement, designed to strengthen and expand the people-centered capacity building strategy pioneered under the Leadership, Management and Sustainability (LMS) Project, LMG's successor project. The LMG Project's objective is to support health systems strengthening by addressing the gap in leadership, management and governance capacity of policy makers, health care providers and program managers to implement quality health services at all levels of the health system. Governance functions – distinct from leadership and management functions – are an important focus of LMG because they provide the ultimate commitment to improving service delivery, and foster sustainability through accountability, engagement, transparency and stewardship.

Leadership from the Harari Regional Health Bureau are reaping the benefits of USAID-funded leadership, management, and governance training.


CHALLENGE

The Harari Regional Health Bureau works to reduce morbidity, mortality, and disability within the region. To help achieve its goal of a ensuring a healthier community, the health bureau

works with stakeholders. Despite its best efforts, in 2014, only 40% of health partners had aligned their plans with those of the government.

INITIATIVE

To increase partner participation in health care planning, the USAID-funded Leadership, Management, and Governance Project conducted workshops from July 2013 to March 2014. The Harari Regional Health Bureau's Planning, Monitoring, and Evaluation Department is one of the nine teams that participated in this six-month workshop series, which centered on improving leadership, management, and governance skills.

RESULTS

After attending the workshop, the Planning, Monitoring, and Evaluation Department team felt more prepared to engage partners in health care planning. The team is now able to identify the root causes for poor alignment of plans, apply a stakeholder analysis, and utilize resource mobilization tools. Perhaps the most crucial result of this leadership, management, and governance workshop was the increase of stakeholder participation in health care planning. The number of partners who have now aligned and harmonized their plans, budgets, and reporting with government plans has increased from 40% to 87%.
