EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This 2016 Work Plan outlines program strategies, core activities and milestones for IMDAJ's final year of implementation from October 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016. These activities are detailed within the context of the overall program objectives and desired outcomes set forth in IDMAJ's M&E Results Framework. They also assume familiarity with achievements to date as outlined in the Fiscal Year 2015 Annual Report and quarterly reports.

FY 2016 marks the final year of the IDMAJ program following a year of launching new grant partnerships and expanding the reach of the program to new communities and geographical areas. Based on IYF's experience to date, IDMAJ partners require significant technical assistance and capacity building in a range of youth domains including, but not limited to, youth screening and selection, youth follow-up and mentoring, and finally, demand driven employability skills training that integrates structured career services, employer outreach and labor market assessments. Alongside the need for enhanced capacity in the design of effective youth training and employment programs is the need to create stronger culture of program effectiveness and quality assurance through monitoring and evaluation systems and the integration of assessment metrics and performance based indicators. In the area of organizational domains, IDMAJ partners have demonstrated a need for more effective program and human resource management.

Over the last two years, IDMAJ has focused on working with its partners to lay the foundations for effective youth employability programming through the integration of life skills training models that have reached over 700 youth. In the final three quarters of implementation, IYF will work with program partners¹ to complete planned life skills activities under their grants, integrate stronger M&E and quality assurance systems, and capture key learnings and lessons learned. Emphasis will be placed on building sustainability through the integration of training of master trainer models and targeted capacity strengthening workshops focused on key technical and organizational domains where partners have needed the most support.

Key activities from October 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016 include:

- The completion of life skills training and other planned activities for youth under IDMAJ's
 four grants, as well as continued technical assistance and coaching to partners to ensure the
 integration of life skills assessment metrics and quality assurance systems to improve
 training outcomes.
- The organization of a Training of Master Trainers workshop on IYF's Passport to Success
 program to allow the partners to sustain and scale their Life Skills activities beyond the end
 date of the IDMAJ program.

¹ IDMAJ has four NGO grantees including: Association Nationale d'Échanges entre Jeunes (ANEJ), Réseau Algérien pour la défense des Droits de l'Enfant (NADA), Le Collectif d'Initiation des Activités de Recherche Appliquée (CIARA), and the Association Santé Sidi El Houari (SDH).

- The promotion of knowledge exchange and cross-learning between IDMAJ four partners through the organization of at least two to three structured capacity building and learning workshops/ sessions.
- At least one follow-on grant to provide models of Employability training and job placement services.
- The organization of a study tour to Morocco for IDMAJ partners to learn first-hand about youth-programming models implemented by IYF and its partners in Morocco.
- The organization of an IDMAJ closing event to share accomplishments and lessons learned

The following section provides a detailed breakdown of activities and deliverables planned for FY 2016 in order to achieve the program's three main outcomes under IDMAJ's overall Results Framework.

IDMAJ Goal: A greater capacity for local organizations to provide unemployed/out of school youth (ages 18-35) with increased access to effective employability, entrepreneurship, and community service programs that support their active participation in the job market.
