Age-appropriate vaccinations include BCG, three doses of DPT-HepB-Hib, four doses of oral polio vaccine and one dose of inactivated polio vaccine, three doses of pneumococcal vaccine, two doses of rotavirus vaccine, and one dose of measles and yellow fever vaccine. 5. County-level childhood mortality rate estimates are for the 10-year period before the survey and national level childhood mortality rate estimates are for the 5-year period before the survey.




Total Fertility Rate

Use of Modern Methods of Family Planning


Percent of married women age 15-49 using a modern method of family planning






Delivery in a Health Facility

Percent of live births in the 5 years before the survey delivered in a health facility




Basic Vaccination Coverage

Percent of children age 12-23 who received all basic vaccinations





Recent Physical Violence
